

TAT Summer Classic July 1 - 8th Results

LAS VEGAS—Bowlers enjoyed our new host center (The Orleans). The positive feedback we received from the bowlers was overwhelming. The Orleans really knows how to pay attention and take care of the bowlers needs.

The final match was exciting to say the least. It went down to the final ball as 4 bowlers could still win 2nd place and 1 ball made the difference between \$5,000 and \$15,000.

The Qualifying scores for the main finals ranged from 590 in the 205 division to 700 in the 35 & under division. The Top 6 prizes were increased over \$16,000 (from last years July event).

All Guaranteed prizes in all events were paid in full. The winner of the main event was Peter Spreadbury from Illinois (274) (\$25,000), 2nd place went to Matt Meyer from Virginia (231) (\$15,000), 3rd place was Mike Warren (Senior Division) from Dallas TX (226) (\$10,000), 4th place Rob Gotchall from Lincoln NE (224) (\$5,000), 5th place was Marvin Hale from Discovery Bay CA (221) (\$3,500), and 6th place was Chris Muldrow from Chicago (189) (\$2,500).

Amateur Bowlers once again ascended on Las Vegas to participate in the TAT Summer Classic Amateur Bowling Tournament.

They received real value for their entry fee. All Bowlers received a Free Ebonite performance bowling ball, (The Total NV) with their first entry.

The entry fees also paid for the 5 - \$25,000 Chance Tournaments, the 3 sweepers, the \$30,000 Ebonite Challenge and the main Tournament prize fund with \$61,000 being paid to the Top 6 with a Guaranteed minimum of \$500 for making the finals. Prizes also increased round by round in the finals. Entries were sightly higher compared to last July (just over 3,950). It was an exciting week as 4 different bowlers bowled perfect games.

Buddies Mystery score paid out over \$15,000 to over a dozen different bowlers (\$10 entry fee).

The Ebonite Challenge paid 16 cash spots, the winner Amy Stoltz. Champion Amy Stolz won \$5,000 with the other top 4 paid \$1,000 each- 2. Derec Morenci, 3. Ramiro Thomas 4. Chad Pierce, 5. Robbie Smith. This event has a \$10 entry fee all Qualifiers received a second Free Performance ball by Ebonite (RXS300). Last cash was \$100. Where else can you bowl for \$5,000 for a \$10 entry fee?

The 5 Chance Tournaments had 141 winners, (with numerous drawings and bonuses for non cashers) the 5 Free events paid out \$25,000 with last cash of \$100. Winners were #1 Kim Bolleby (Sweden) winner #2 was Russ Davies (Las Vegas) #3 David Palojarvi (Illinios) #4 was Don Jackson (Bonita CA) #5 was Klaus Lischka. The other 136 Bowlers needed a 228 to 238 or higher game to win a prize in the 5 Free Chance Tournaments. (2 game squadshigh game counted)

The 3 sweepers paid out over \$20,000 with most bowlers receiving a Free sweeper entry with any multiple entry #2, 3 or 4 entry. 81 bowlers received checks and bonuses from \$\$1,000 to a minimum of \$100 last cash in the 3 Sweeper events.

The Ebonite Demo Days ran from the 1st to the 6th of July and many bowlers who did well used the Demo Days and the Ebonite staff to help them get the right ball reaction. Dino Castillo, Mike Calderon, Paul Enright and Chris Klerk were on hand to help the bowlers with layouts and ball surfacing.

Williams Win Shootout

Duke &

EUREKA, MO—On paper, the team of Norm Duke and Walter Ray Williams Jr. should have been dominant in the first outdoor PBA event since 2001. In reality, they were.

Duke and Williams, two of the most decorated bowlers in history, completed their march through the special summer doubles event, sweeping the championship round matches against Tony Reyes and Robert Smith to win the GEICO® PBA All-Star Shootout Hosted by Six Flags at Six Flags St. Louis.

Although Reyes and Smith came into the finals as the only team to go 3-0 in round robin match play, they were no match for Duke and Williams, who swept the two singles matches – worth one point each – and the final doubles match worth two points for the 4-0 win. The pair of Hall of Famers – Williams a PBA and USBC Hall of Famer and Duke a USBC Hall of Famer — with a combined 68 Denny's PBA Tour titles split the \$50,000 top prize.

The event featured 16 of the PBA's biggest stars split into eight teams for an alternate shot doubles event, where any split converted was worth five bonus pins and teams striking on their fill ball were allowed an extended 10th frame.

In the finals, Duke won the first singles match over Reyes, striking seven consecutive times in frames 3-9 to give "Will Duke 'Em" a 1-0 lead. Duke finished the match with a score of 258, striking on his fill ball to give himself the extra frame possibility. Reyes had a chance to take the lead by striking out in the 10th and throwing one extra strike, but he left a 3-10 split in the 10th frame to fall, 258-233.

The second match also featured some drama as Williams converted a 2-5-7-8 split in the sixth frame to earn five bonus continued on page 2

1st Annual California USBC Queen's Tournament Results

SAN DIEGO—The 1ST Annual California USBC Queen's Tournament was held the weekend of July 14 & 15, 2007 at Kearny Mesa Bowl in San Diego with 50 participants.

Because of the low number of entrants, the committee met on Friday afternoon to discuss the possibility of eliminating the first round of 32 bowlers in the finals on Sunday. This motion was approved.

On Saturday, two qualifying rounds of six games each were bowled. At the end of the qualifying rounds, Dede Davidson was leading with a score of 1440. The high game of the qualifying rounds was a 289 game bowled by Dede Davidson and Christina Wickey. The high series of the qualifying rounds was a 739 series bowled by Laura Lee Daniel.

Sunday morning, the top 16 bowlers began the final rounds. Andrea Snyder completed this portion of the tournament with a 763 series. The high game of this round was a 279 games bowled by Andrea Snyder. Pam Pancoast was the alternate with a score of 1274

The top eight bowlers then began the second round of the finals at 12:00 PM. Those bowlers were: Andrea Snyder (763); Dede Davidson (753); Michele Carter (695); Jennifer Jones (688); Elisabeth Collins (675); Gina Mauk (664); Rachel Elhard (660); and Laura Lee Daniel (659). In this round of competition, Jennifer Jones bowled a very nice 300 game. Rachel Elhard captured the top spot for the stepladder finals with a super 793 series.

The stepladder finals bowlers were from top to bottom, Rachel Elhard (793); Laura Lee Daniel (771); Dede Davidson (732); Jennifer Jones (699); and Elisabeth Collins (696).

The match between Elisabeth Collins and Jennifer Jones ended with Jennifer moving on to bowl Dede Davidson. Dede moved on to bowl Laura Lee. This game ended with a 235 tie, so a 9th & 10th frame roll-off was held. That also ended in a tie, so a second roll-off was completed, with Dede moving on to the final match with Rachel. After the last ball had been rolled, Dede Davidson was crowned the Queen.

No date or place has been chosen to hold the 2008 2nd Annual Queen's Tournament. That will be decided and announced later.

Compliments go out to the bowlers who competed in this tournament, and also to the staff, management and employees of Kearny Mesa Bowl for their help when needed. Fred Pasquarella and his score monitors done an excellent job.

pins which turned out to be the difference. Smith led after a five-bagger in frames 2-6, but a spare in the seventh frame stopped his momentum. After the split conversion, Williams struck four consecutive times to take the lead, but a nine-spare with his second ball in the 10th meant he didn't have an endless 10th frame opportunity.

That gave Smith a chance to double in the 10th to win. After a strike with his first shot, he knocked down just eight on his next shot, giving Williams the 259-255 win and his team a 2-0 lead in the finals.

With the doubles match worth two points, Reyes and Smith could have sent the finals to a one-ball sudden death rolloff with a win.

Both teams had opens early

in the match but Reyes and Smith held a slight edge heading into the seventh frame. Then Duke and Williams stepped up their game and struck four consecutive times, but were unable to strike with their fill ball and finished with 219. They watched as Reyes and Smith left a 2-4-5-7-8 but converted in the 10th then needed a strike on their fill ball to push the match to extra frames. Instead, Smith

left a 10-pin and the game and match went to Duke and Williams, 219-202.

Duke and Williams split \$50,000 for the win, while Reyes and Smith, who beat Doug Kent and Danny Wiseman, 222-219, in the final round robin match to advance to the finals, took home \$30,000. Each team earned an additional \$2,500 for each round robin win as well.



Hong Kha Wins First ABT Championship at Cal Bowl



TEAM USA SWEEPS DOUBLES **GOLD AT PAN AMERICAN GAMES**

Strong starts distance Asbaty and Milligan, Page and Schaub from the field

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil - Powered by strong first games from both the men and the women, Team USA ran away with a pair of doubles gold medals Tuesday at the Pan American Games.

Diandra Asbaty of Chicago and Tennelle Milligan of Costa Mesa, Calif., finished with a 12-game total of 5,356 to win the women's event by 387 pins, while Rhino Page of Topeka, Kan., and Cassidy Schaub of Polk, Ohio, totaled 5,260 for a 158-pin

victory at Barra Bowling Center. Victories by both duos continued the trend of American success at the Pan American Games. Since bowling received medal-sport status in 1991, the U.S. has amassed 24 medals, well ahead of second-best Mexico with 11.
