Michael Haugen Jr. Wins PBA50 River City **Extreme Open For Second Title of the Season** *Haugen defeats Bob Learn Jr., 247-246, in title match to tighten grip*

on PBA50 Player of the Year points lead

MONTICELLO, Minn. - Michael Haugen Jr. defeated Bob Learn Jr., 247-246, in the title match to win the PBA50 River City Extreme Open presented by Ebonite Friday for his second title of the season and third of his career.

Haugen. the PBA50 Rookie of the Year, became the first two-time winner this season and further tightened his grip on the PBA50 Player of the Year points lead with four tournaments remaining in the season.

In the title match, Haugen, who finished first, was able to shut Learn out when he struck on the first ball in the 10th frame and then



made the 6-10 spare.

"It was a good thing I got eight and not six or seven on the second ball otherwise I might not be standing here," said Haugen of his second shot in the 10th frame. "I lost focus for a moment and the result of that shot could have been a lot worse."

It was a long road for the 51-year-old Haugen to reach the No. 1 qualifying position for the stepladder finals coming all the way from 20th after the first round of qualifying on Wednesday. Haugen made his dramatic climb with the help of a 5-0-1 match play continued on page 9

During the voting cycle leading up to the 2018 announcement, Page won his first singles title since 2009 in the 2017 PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic in Coldwater, Ohio, and captured his first major in the U.S. Open, defeating top qualifier Jakob Butturff, 256-222, for his sixth career PBA Tour title. He also finished fifth in the USBC Masters earlier in 2018.

Also nominated by ESPN's staff in the Best Bowler category were 2017 PBA Player of the Year and three-time major championships winner Jason Belmonte; 2018 Barbasol PBA Players Championship titlist Tom Smallwood and Swedish two-handed sensation Jesper Svensson.

JOE GOLDSTEIN, SR. – A BOWLER WHO CONTRIBUTES BOTH ON AND OFF THE LANES


Last summer at the EBI Demo Day that was held at AMF Southwest Lanes in Bakersfield, we were honored to have EBI Staffer Joe Goldstein, Sr. there sharing his knowledge of the EBI line helping bowlers select a new bowling ball best for them. He lives in the Bay area, so having him drive five-plus hours to Bakersfield to help run the Demo Day is special. Not only special to us but special to him!

In a couple weeks, Goldstein will be traveling to Bakersfield once again to help with the upcoming EBI Demo Day which will take place on Thurs., Aug. 2, from 3pm-6pm, at AMF Southwest Lanes in Bakersfield, CA. It is probably even more special this year as he is still recovering from a very damaging staph infection he got late last fall in his right foot/ankle. He kept having a lot of pain and when he went to bowl the Storm Mixed in Reno, on his first shot in practice, he said it felt like "my right heel exploded." But he made it through the set-in pain on a three "step" delivery for a 567 series. Three surgeries over the next eight months to rid him of the infection and then to correct his loss of flexibility in his ankle, he is now ready to finally return to bowling and with the help of physical rehab and his dedication, he can return to the PBA life once again.

Goldstein's love of bowling radiates when you meet him. 2018 marks his 15th year on the EBI Staff. His bowling career started 45 years ago when he began bowling at the Sports Center Bowl in San Francisco. His current average has dropped to a 209 but considering his past season and what he has been through, that's phenomenal. He usually averages above 225. His career highest book was 235 in 2013. Although he has never done the PBA tour, he has "always wanted to take a year or two and try my hand at it." Nevertheless, he has some PBA Regional titles, three of them in fact, that he can boast about. The first one came in Visalia in May 2009, "where I had to go up against my good friend, Tony Reyes, for the title." His other two wins are a PBA50 in Daly City (2012) and another in Reno at the National Bowling



When asked if he's every been televised at a PBA event, he said he's come really close and been on Xtra Frame highlights during the PBA50 stops that he competed in. He bowled a 300 on Xtra Frame at the Northern CA Classic in Brentwood where he "nearly" made the show and also "nearly" made the USBC Senior Masters televised finals in 2016. Both tournaments he finished 6th.

If he's not competing in Regionals or Master events, he is involved with bowling through the Bowlers Experience Pro Shop inside Cloverleaf Family Bowl. Not one to say he coaches anyone, he will admit that he's "helped many get better and enjoy the game more with my help." His home center is currently Sea Bowl in Pacifica where he plans to bowl a fun league with his family at the start of this winter season.

His life as an EBI Staffer involves working five or more Demos per year "whenever they are reasonably close to me. I don't mind a road trip to help as well. As a staffer, we have requirements to keep our brand names alive and to engage bowlers

in any possible way. I choose to attend more than our required amount for a couple of reasons. Hammer Bowling and EBI have kept me as a Rep for so many years, through good and bad times and I've stuck by them as well. I believe that we have the strongest family in bowling and growing stronger every day. My District Sales Managers have been very good to me from the great Pam Buckner to Mike Snellbaker to my manager now, Adam Ishman. I will do anything I can for Adam and EBI always."

The EBI Demo Day will bring us brand new balls on the market from Ebonite, Hammer, Columbia and Track. Goldstein said, "as a Staffer, I do get my new releases before the public does and have time to sample and showcase them before the Demos, so I have more personal info on them to share with the Demo bowlers." When asked if he, himself, ever been involved with the creation of a ball, Goldstein replied, "I personally have not been part of the creation of any of our balls, but you never know in the future... Every development began as an idea, and ours are welcome and taken seriously. Maybe I'll come up with a ball idea or name that makes the development process!"

When asked what he enjoys the most when putting on a Demo Day, he said, "What I enjoy most about running a Demo Day is the chance to talk and mingle with bowlers of all skill levels. To be able to help build their games with new equipment and to build their confidence through encouragement.... priceless! During the Demo, I can spend some one-on-one time with a bowler who's looking to find that new piece of equipment that helps with something that's missing in their lineup or that creates a certain shape on the lane that they've been looking for." This is what a Demo Day is all about and it is totally FREE to bowlers to experience. The Demo balls are either 14lb. or 15lb. balls with a broad selection of spans with interchangeable grips and thumb slugs so it is very important that you bring your best fitting ball to help them get the best demo ball fit for you when you arrive to test these new balls out.

Goldstein will be joined by several other Staffers to put on this Demo Day and all local staffers usually join in and offer to help put on this event as well to help service all the bowlers that show up. Local legend, Carlie Medina III, is partly responsible for bringing Goldstein to Bakersfield and when Goldstein talked about Carlie, he said, "Where do I start about Carlie Medina? Well I've known this man for quite a few years by competing against him and watching his scoring clinics to getting to know him as a close, personal friend and teammate and travel companion to a fellow EBI Staffer. This is one individual who exemplifies what a bowler should strive to be. Friendly, generous and what a force to be reckoned with!! I am proud to call this man my friend." EBI is proud to say they have an abundance of big names on the national PBA and PBA50 tours such as Josh Blanchard, Jakob Butturff, Ronnie Russell, Shannon O'Keefe, Andrew Anderson and many more. Their most notable player on the PBA50 tour is the great Amleto Monacelli, who, Goldstein said, "is still in great shape and still throws it great as well." These great balls have 20 National PBA titles and quite a few PBA 50 National titles as well and "there's no end in sight."

So, drop on by AMF Southwest Lanes (3610 Wible Road, Bakersfield) for the upcoming Demo Day on Aug. 2, and meet Goldstein and get to witness what he brings to town— "To say in a nutshell what I can bring to the Demo Day is my love for the game, my willingness to help all bowlers, and to help our labels grow in all areas. I am not the most technical bowler, but I do understand the game and will use what I know to help our Demo Day attendees." This just in.... joining him at this event will be Adam Ishman/EBI District Sales Manager along with Carlie Medina.

SAN BERNARDINO – Toni Futch, Scott Hatmaker and David Wilk were inducted into the Citrus Belt Hall of Fame on Saturday. Association President MIKE RADD-EMAN presided over the affair and CURT SNYDER was superb as Master of Ceremonies.

What does it take to be inducted into the Hall of Fame? The ultimate honor comes after years of SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE or MERITORIOUS SERVICE. This year's Hall of Fame class has performed on the lanes and served our bowlers off the lanes as admirably as any of our honorees in the past.

Toni Futch (Meritorious Service) could easily be named the best league secretary in Citrus Belt history. She was selected Secretary of the Year in 2014 and could easily be so honored every year. Toni is a people person, always providing her bowlers with outstanding service. She is a outstanding league promoter, organizer and grower. She has served thousands of bowlers over decades at bowling centers throughout the Inland Empire.

Scott Hatmaker (Superior Performance) has bowled at a outstanding level for decades. He has averaged over 200 throughout those decades and has performed so consistently that his league teams have probably won more league championships then anyone in the southern tier. Of late he is dominating in senior league play. Over the years he has rolled 11 perfect games and three 800s, with a high of 846. He has a Citrus Belt Senior Doubles Title to his credit.

David Wilk (Superior Performance) is one of the most talented bowlers to ever bowl in the Citrus Belt. He has bowled in the Association for over 35 years after impressing bowling aficionados in the Chicago, Illinois area as a young bowling prodigy. He rolled his first 300 at the age of sixteen in the late 1960's in the era of rubber bowling balls! That was an Illinois State record for years. At seventeen he won a state junior team title and was averaging over 200 by the age of 18. During those early years David won 38 tournament titles in seven different Midwestern states!

For the past 48 years David has averaged over 200, with a high of 224 in 1971. He has 28 perfect games and seven 800s. He won a CALIFORNIA State Doubles Title in 1982 and a HOINKE Classic Title in Cincinnati, Ohio that same year.

David is proudest of his accomplishments at the USBC National Open Tournament where he has averaged 202 for 32 years and placed second in 2007 in Singles. His 804 in that event makes him the second oldest bowler ever to roll an 800 at the National Tournament. Congratulations to our inductees and thanks to the Hall of Fame Committee: CURTIS COVEY, PHOSIE LOTZE, DANIEL LORENZ, NITA SCHMIDT, CURT SNYDER and NORRIS TURNER. Special thanks to the Nita Schmidt for again making the Hall of Fame posters for our inductees.



TOURNAMENT RULES (New late charge in effect; see Rule #1)

1. The 20th Annual Reno Junior-Adult Invitational will be held at the National Bowling Stadium, 300 N. Center St., Reno, Nevada 89501, (800) 304-2695. The tournament will be held from July 27 to July 29, 2018, and will be USBC Certified. Deadline for entries is July 10, 2018. Entries received after the deadline will be charged \$5.00 per entry. Entries will be accepted 30 minutes prior to squad time and are subject to squad and division availability.

Absolutely no refunds after July 10, 2018. Tournament management reserves the right to use substitutes to fill cancellations. No faxed entries will be accepted. Entries WILL NOT be processed without FULL payment and complete information including average verifications. Tournament directors have the right to refuse any entry.

2. ELIGIBILITY: Open to all current USBC members. You MUST show your membership card or proof of membership when checking in. Any bowler not having a USBC Membership Card or proof of USBC Membership must ociate membership prior to bowling. Copies of USBC Membership Cards can be printed from bowl.com.

3. MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION: Entrants may participate multiple times per event. In order to place more than once in the prize list for position standings at least two players on the team must be different and you must change

. ENTERING AVERAGE: Entrants must use their highest 2017-18 book average. If none, entrants will use their January 1, 2018 average with at least 15 games. If none, entrants must use highest current average of 15 games at the time of entry. Proof of average verification must be provided with paid entry. A standing sheet, which must include a date to verify, signed by their coach or league secretary is proof for verification. If no average verification entrants must use a 225 average for all events. If current season average for at least 21 games at time of bowling exceeds last season's average by 10 or more pins, current season average must be used (Rule 319a-2).

Rule 319e (15 or more pin increase in tournament average of 21 or more games in the past 12 months) must be used or bowler will be disqualified. It is the bowlers' responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her average, whether submitted by the bowler, team captain, or others. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify scores if submitted average is lower than correct average, thereby resulting in a lower classification or more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average, if it is higher than the correct average. Corrections in averages can be made up to the completion of the first game of a series, or within 48 hours after completion of the series if the tournament manager, prior to the completion of the first game of a series, has given written consent to the bowler authorizing such extension of time to

- 5. RERATE/ADJUSTMENTS: Tournament director reserves the right to rerate or adjust a bowler's average upward prior to competition. If the bowler does not accept the adjustment a refund will be given. Any adjusted or rerated averages, whether accepted or refused, must be reported. Failure to do so is grounds for disqualification Any entrants, youth or adult, who have qualified for a cash and/or merchandise prize of \$600 or more in any tournament in final standings, brackets, side pots, all events, special/donated prizes in the last 12 months must report their scores, position and amount won to the Tournament Management prior to bowling for possible re-rating. Failure to comply will be cause for forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings.
- 6. FORMAT: There will be two formats for this tournament. There will be a team event consisting of two Juniors and two Adults bowling a 3 game format. There will also be a doubles event consisting of one Junior and one Adult bowling a 3 game format. An optional Junior Gold event may be offered for the USBC Jr Gold members. The entry fee will depend on the division and will be collected at the tournament site prior to bowling. One in five qualifiers will receive a paid entry (not including travel or expenses) to the national tournament. Bowlers must be a current season Jr. Gold member prior to competition. Membership must be purchased prior to or at the tournament. National tournament qualifiers who are not current Jr. Gold members will be disqualified. 7. HANDICAP: Handicap will be 80% of the difference between the team's average and the top of the division (refer to front of entry form for figures).
- 8. <u>DRESS CODE</u>: Matching and/or professional attire is encouraged. Awards for matching teams will be given "Looking Good" pins. Male participants are asked to wear collared shirts and slacks or dress shorts. Female participants are asked to wear skirts, slacks, skorts or dress shorts and proper shirts. Skirts, shorts and skorts <u>must not</u> be more than 3" above the knee. Attire must be neat, clean and proper fitting. We <u>strongly suggest no jeans</u>, tank tops, hats, or attire advertising liquor or tobacco products, no attire with inappropriate language, or any apparel which the tournament director feels is inappropriate will be permitted. Smoking and/or consuming alcoholic beverages during competition is not permitted.
- 9. CONDUCT: Any conduct deemed inappropriate, foul language, obscene gestures or abuse of equipment may be cause for removal from competition, as determined by the tournament director. Any incident that reflects poorly
- on the Reno Jr-Adult Invitational, reported to the Tournament Management, whether at the center or otherwise, may result in denial of further participation. Entry fees will not be refunded.



PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: SEAN WILCOX HELPS DICK ALLEN WIN 21ST REGIONAL TITLE

With help from partner Sean Wilcox of Altamonte Springs, Fla., Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C. picked up his 21st career PBA Regional title when the twosome defeated Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., and Steve Arehart of Chesapeake, Va., 243-213, to win the PBA Beltline Lanes Columbia 300 Baker Doubles title Sunday on the outskirts of Columbia, S.C. Troup and Arehart qualified fourth for the stepladder finals and edged Connor Pickford of Plano, Texas, and Kole Payne of Charlotte, N.C., 183-182, to start the four-team stepladder finals. They then won another squeaker, eliminating Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., and amateur partner Josh Johnson from Callahan, Fla., 198-179, to advance to the title match.

In addition to Allen's 21st Regional title, Wilcox won his first title along with a share of the \$4,000 top prize.

• Michael Haugen Jr. of Phoenix defeated Ron Profitt of Brookville, Ohio by 182 pins to win the PBA50 Fairborn Central Classic presented by Roto Grip at Bowl 10 Fairborn in Fairborn, Ohio.

Haugen, who averaged 221.7 for the tournament, claimed his second PBA50 central region title of the year along with the \$1,500 first prize.

In a unique format, the top 16 players after qualifying bowled 10 games of round robin match play where the winner of each match received 10 bonus pins. After the 10th match, the top four advanced to a two-game, four-man match play final round where bonus pins were given based on two-game totals. The top scorer received 12 bonus pins, second received eight bonus pins, third four bonus pins and fourth received no bonus pins. Haugen rolled games of 219 and 186 for a 405 total, earning 12 bonus pins and finishing with a 4,506 pinfall total to top Profitt's 4,324 total.

• Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., defeated amateur Fidel Marchena of Dominican Republic, 234-194, to win the PBA Tony Grigat Allstate Midwest Open at Poplar Creek Bowl in Hoffman Estates, Ill., Sunday, for his 16th career PBA Regional title and first in the PBA Midwest Region. He also earned \$2,000.

Marchena edged Kenny Calkins of Des Moines, Iowa, 215-214, in the semifinal game to advance to the champion-ship match after also sneaking past Ryan Burks of Valparaiso, Ind., 192-190, in the first stepladder match.

"The lanes were tough for me at the start of the tournament but that just meant I had to do what I do best and that is adjust," said Haugen, who won the Johnny Petraglia BVL Open in May for his first win of the season. "As the tournament went on I started getting more comfortable to the point where I was able to use my ball speed to make the adjustments I needed.

"I'm just keeping it simple and continuing to do what I have been doing all season," Haugen continued. "If I keep executing and making good decisions I'll keep getting good results."

In the opening stepladder match No. 4 qualifier Brian Kretzer beat No. 5 qualifier PBA Hall of Famer and four-time PBA50 Tour winner Norm Duke, 290-228, to advance to the second match. Kretzer left a 10 pin in the first frame, made the spare, and then strung the next 11 strikes.

In the second match Kretzer, who was trying for his first PBA50 Tour title, beat No. 3 qualifier four-time PBA50 Tour winner Lennie Boresch Jr., 202-199, to advance to the semifinal match against Learn. Kretzer, the 2018 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open runner-up, threw three strikes in the 10th to beat Boresch after Boresch chopped the 6-10 spare.

Learn, who qualified second for the finals, then beat Kretzer, 238-225, in the semifinal to advance to the title match against Haugen. Learn was trying for his fourth PBA50 Tour title and first since 2015.
