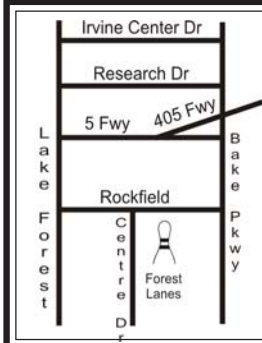

Opposite Directions An Additional Release Technique

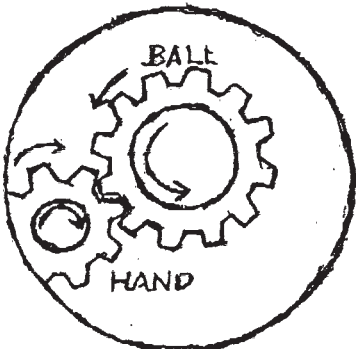
Have you ever thrown a flat stone toward a lake or pond and made it skip across the water several times before it finally sank? As kids, many of us used to have contests to see who could make it skip the most often. Holding that stone between the thumb and forefinger, the faster you could throw it and spin it, the more often it would skip across the water's surface. If you visualize how this is done, you'll remember that the snap of the wrist into a cupped position was what made it possible for the forefinger to create the necessary speed and rotation for a successfully spinning throw.

This is somewhat similar to the normal bowling release, cupped wrist and triggering snap with the fingers so many bowlers use to create the desired revs and rotational angle for a successful release. Most all of us are familiar with this technique because it's so popular. But I mention it only for comparison to a completely different release, which we'll now discuss.

Next question...have you ever thrown a frisbee? Well, even if not, we've all seen others throw one, so you pretty much know how it's done. With a wrist collapsing snap at the release, the frisbee is made to shoot forward, with a spin which sails it through the air due to its flat surface. So...the difference between skipping the stone and throwing the frisbee is that a *cupped* and *cocked* wrist is used for the stone, while a *collapsed* and *uncocked* wrist creates the frisbee.

But what does this have to do with bowling? Well, there is a release, which uses that same basic principle to create ball rotation. The difference from the normal release used by most bowlers is that instead of following the curvature of the ball with the hand and fingers to create the rotation, in this technique the principle of meshing gear rotation is used (see illustration 1). As we all know, meshed gears always rotate in opposite directions. So the smaller driving gear (the hand) will rotate the larger gear (the ball) the opposite way.

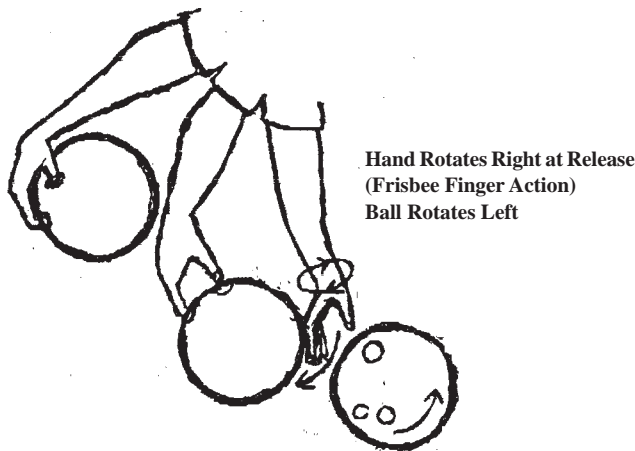

THE METHOD
The stages the hand/fingers go through to achieve this release are shown in Illustration 2. During most of the downswing the wrist is cupped and slightly cocked to the left (right for left handers). Then, to create the frisbee type release, the wrist quickly *uncocks* to the right (left for left handers). This action creates a quick thumb release, simultaneously snapping the fingers outward from the bottom of the ball, thus flicking the finger holes to the right from the bottom of the ball (left for left handers). As the little rotational arrows in illustration 2 indicate, the hand really is turning in the opposite direction of the ball during the release, just like the gears.

This frisbee finger/hand action achieves three main things in terms of ball reaction. 1) The quick finger snap as the wrist uncocks helps create revs. 2) The outward direction of the finger snap tends to keep the hand behind the ball longer at the bottom of the downswing, virtually eliminating the dreaded power weakening early hand turn so many bowlers, including even some professionals, have trouble overcoming. 3) In this release the thumb exits the ball, thus helping eliminate the damaging overturning of the hand in the follow through, which causes chicken winging and also weakens the shot in terms of ball torque. Since torque is an important force in resisting too much ball deflection at the pocket, it's easy to see how this release can be of help in pin fall increase.

DEVELOPING CONTROL
Many bowlers will notice a control problem when first attempting this release. This is because the drastic outward motion in the frisbee type finger/hand action has a tendency to make the entire arm want to follow suit and swing outward as well, forcing the follow through too far away from the body. The obvious result may be missing the mark several boards outside, possibly even a gutter ball. But fear not...this is temporary. What usually helps in correcting this problem is to focus on swinging the follow through in a straight line with the bowling shoulder all the way to the finish.

Another trick in getting the feel of this release is to use a little practice exercise which I'll describe below. Again, based on the two meshed gears turning in opposite directions, you can test this release as follows:

•Get into a kneeling position, cradling your ball in your non bowling hand about 3 or 4 inches above the floor;

•Put your bowling fingers in the holes at the bottom of the ball the way it would normally be at the bottom of the swing, *but leave the thumb out*;

•Now...move your finger holes outward (in the opposite direction you want the ball to turn as described above) *at the same time letting the ball drop to the floor from your other hand*. You'll feel the fingers turning the holes (just like the gears) and the ball will hit the floor rotating in the opposite direction of the hand. Be sure to do a little follow through as you complete this motion.

Repeating this little exercise just a few times will help develop the feel of this release so it can be done on the lanes without risking gutter balls. My personal thanks go to PBA Hall of Fame champion Don Johnson, who taught me about this gear action many years ago while still on tour.

THE FANNED FOLLOW THROUGH MOTION
'Fanning' is a term used to describe a wrist/hand action which is done in conjunction with the follow through. It can be executed in combination with any release, including but not limited to the frisbee release. It is used by those professionals who employ it for either or both of two reasons. First it can help create a more powerful ball rotation; second, it is yet another way to aid in avoiding topping the ball, pulling the shot and chicken winging during the follow through.

For this technique, whether your particular style of follow through finishes higher or lower than someone else's doesn't matter. (Actually, in modern bowling a follow through which finishes at about shoulder level with a pretty straight arm pointing in the direction of the break point is preferred. Coach of the pros John Jowdy teaches this and has helped many improve their games with it. But for our purposes it is not necessary for anyone to get involved in changing their style of follow through.)

At any rate, here's how it works: As your follow through gets up to about shoulder level, think of your thumb as pointing toward 12 o'clock above the bowling shoulder. Be sure that 12 o'clock is directly aligned with that shoulder (not in line with your ear or over your head). Now, here's the important part: At this instant, quickly turn the wrist slightly outward so that the thumb points toward 1 o'clock (11 o'clock for left handers). This slight wrist turn is done quickly, with a sort of *snap* of the wrist, the shock of which can be felt when done correctly.

When trying this the first few times, many bowlers will be surprised to notice just how much they've been habitually overturning the hand during the follow through without even realizing it, thus unknowingly topping the ball. But when done correctly, the fan is really the gear action again, except done during the follow through.

One way prove to yourself that this fanning action eliminates chicken winging, is to try the fan movement a few times without a ball. You'll immediately notice that even if you bend your elbow during the follow through, that elbow will stay in front of your bowling shoulder rather than sticking out, chicken wing style. By the way, the fan is almost exactly like the way you use your thumb when trying to hitch a ride on the highway. So it might be easier for some bowlers if they imagine themselves hitch hiking when they do their follow through.

As I said, the fan can be used with any release, not just the frisbee. But once you try it, you'll no doubt find it easier to learn to do it automatically when done in conjunction with the frisbee release. The reason for this is because with this release the thumb is already pointed toward approximately one o'clock (11 o'clock for left handers) as the hand exits the ball, so it is easier to finish that follow through in the fan position.

THE BOTTOM LINE
Remember, this does take practice to become part of your muscle memory. But it really works! When I recently taught it to Betty Morris, PWBA Bowler of the Decade in the 1970s, her comment was, "Rolf, I haven't felt my fingers burn like this since I left the tour!" This was because it helped keep her hand behind the ball longer, without which the fingers can't really create maximum torque.

Today's Rolfism
To avoid turning the ball early. Lead your downswing with the ring finger all the way to the release. Rolf's winning students of the month:




