Nation Prepared To Be Tested In **Major Events**

GREENDALE, Wis .-- Over the next few weeks, Team USA's Stefanie Nation feels like she has the opportunity to put her bowling career on the fast track to superstardom.

With two major events on the horizon - the U.S. Women's Open presented by the United States Bowling Congress and the World Tenpin Bowling Association Women's World Championships - Nation will have an opportunity to shine.

"There is no doubt I have accomplished a lot in my years as a youth bowler, but I feel these two upcoming events could help me breakthrough as one of the top female bowlers in our country," said Nation, who won U.S. Junior Amateur titles in 2003, 2004 and 2005. "Even though there might be those out there who believe I have an impressive resume, I feel that I am just beginning. I have come into my own over the past few years, and I intend only to get better and better and continue to add to my list of accomplishments.

Nation, who has been a member of Team USA since 2005 and was the national collegiate player of the year while at the University of Central Florida in 2005-06, will have to beat some of the game's greatest female players at both events if she hopes to break

The U.S. Women's Open, which takes place Aug. 13-18 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., will feature a strong field of not only fellow Team USA members, but former P.W.B.A. stars.

Shortly after that event concludes, Nation, along with five other Team USA members, heads to Monterrey, Mexico, from Sept. 1-8 for the Women's World Championships, which will bring together the top bowlers from nearly 60 countries. Nation will be joined in Mexico by Diandra Asbaty of Chicago; Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas; Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix; Shannon O'Keefe of Rochester, N.Y.; and **Tennelle Milligan** of Costa Mesa, Calif., all of whom are scheduled to also compete in the U.S. Women's Open.

this is the appropriate time for USBC to select an individual to build on what we have accomplished."

'We all thank Roger for his tireless and dedicated years of service. We have asked Roger to continue assisting USBC in its mission in a consulting capacity, and we are pleased he has agreed to do so," said Michael Carroll, USBC Presi-

According to Carroll, USBC will conduct a national search for a successor and that current USBC Chief Officer-National Governing Body Kevin Dornberger is acting as interim Chief Operating Officer until a successor is chosen.

Milligan, Page Golden Again at Pan American Games

RIO DE JANEIRO. Brazil Tennelle Milligan of Costa Mesa, Calif., and Rhino Page of Topeka, Kan., each won singles gold medals as the bowling competition at the Pan American Games came to a close Thursday at Barra Bowling Center.

Milligan defeated Venezuela's Alicia Marcano, 2-1, in the best-of-three, gold medal match, while Page got past Mexico's Daniel Falconi, 2-1, for the men's championship.


Team USA, which also won men's and women's doubles, swept the gold medals at an international event for the second time in two months. In May, the United States won all six gold medals at the Men's American Zone Championships in Guatemala.

Milligan won the decisive

game, 212-204, on the strength of three straight strikes late - the clincher coming on the second ball of the 10th frame on which she received a late messenger pin to knock down the stubborn 5 pin.

"I love the 5 pin ... and I love when it's the last one to fall," said Milligan, who returned to Team USA this year after a successful stint as a professional that saw her win three major titles. "I would have never thought it would've been a 5 pin off my hand. I thought it was pretty good, and the 5 was standing there. All of something came over and knock it over. I don't know what it was, but it was pretty nice to see it fall.'

Milligan won the first game, 256-160, striking on eight of 11 continued on page 7

It came down to the 10th frame, where Chip need to double to win the tournament. He got the 1st one, the next ball a 7 pin count, then the spare to tie the qualifying totals. One extra game roll-off. Kevin beat Chip 223 to 199, and the Title. Russ Davies, who had bowled a 300 game earlier in the finals had an excellent opportunity to win. But in game 8, he rolled a 158 game, and lost the match. He ended up in 3rd place and losing to the leader by 46 pins. Jeff Garrison after winning his 1st 6 matches, never won another match, and finished 7th. It was also a tough day for PBA & WCST Champion, Eric Forkel, as he ended up in 8th place. 





By Juette Holseth The Metro Bowler, publisher The United States Bowling Congress (USBC) has great plans to build a special Training Facility next to their Research and Testing Facility (see separate story to the left). Why in the world would the USBC want to build

separate story to the left). Why in the world would the USBC want to build a facility like this when a very small number of people will use it?

First, let's take a monetary look at this question.

A brand new 8-lane center, similar to the Training Facility, will cost between \$2.1 and \$3 million to build. That includes \$,000-10,000 square feet at \$200-\$250 per square foot and approximately \$500,000 for equipment (lanes, approaches, seating, machines and related equipment, etc.) plus CATS and other video equipment.

Using the lower estimate, payment on \$2.1 million (at 7% interest) will be \$14,800+ per month over 25 years. Add to that the salary and health benefits for coaches and a mechanic, utilities (gas, electricity, telephone, internet), lane maintenance (repairs, parts, oil, lane cleaner), insurance (general liability) plus other daily/weekly/monthly expenses.

If an off-the-street customer pays \$200 per day to be coached by the best in the country - more than 15 paying customers per day would be needed - 365 days a year for the next 25 years!

How many people will actually make use of this facility each a

Team USA will travel to the Training Facility perhaps four times anleam USA will travel to the Training Facility perhaps four times annually (high estimate) for practice, coaching and preparation for upcoming national and international events. Their expenses (travel, lodging, food, etc.) would undoubtedly be paid by USBC because Team USA is our country's bowling representatives. No income would come from that grouping of approximately 50 people (bowlers, coaches and related officials) - so their appearances at the facility cannot be counted as income because the money will be coming from USBC coffers. Therefore, the daily 'cost of doing business' remains the same.

We must also assume that with a good lineup of coaches - bowlers from around the country and the world will travel to Milwaukee to use it. too. Not a bad idea if you want to get good coaching in a state-of-the-art facility. But, let's be realistic.

Minnesota bowlers are about five hours driving time from Milwaukee - a two-day roundtrip. If they practice for two days - their trip becomes a four-day adventure (vacation).

How many Minnesota bowlers will travel to Milwaukee each year - and pay to use the Training Facility at perhaps \$200 per day? My estimated number is less than 30. Perhaps Illinois and Wisconsin could have a few more taking advantage of the facility - but bowlers from farther away will

How higher travel costs and time expenses.

How many total bowlers does USBC expect to use the Training Facility to pay for this building? Only the USBC knows that projected answer - but I don't think they're being realistic.

There are other options Option #1: The Kegel Company (www.kegel.net) and John Davis have a tremendous 12-lane training facility at their office and plant in Florida where they manufacture state-of-the-art lane conditioning equipment and are well-known for technological advances within the industry. Their building has everything the Training Facility wants to install - and what's

Davis is a strong supporter of bowling and would probably be glad to be part of this venture. He may even allow Team USA to practice there for

little (or no) cost. The general public is welcome to use the Kegel facility with only a little advance notice.

Option #2: Why not travel around the country, with the CATS system, visiting centers in areas with larger bowler bases? The set-up of the computerized system (perhaps six times a year) in different locations throughout the country would be much less expensive than building a special Training Facility that has no chance of paying for itself Local advertising could be

the country would be much less expensive than building a special Training Facility that has no chance of paying for itself. Local advertising could be done (flyers to bowling centers, ads in bowling newspapers, local mass media, etc.) to attract bowlers which would be less expensive.

Concerning Team USA - wouldn't it be better for the team to go to 'real' bowling centers for practice rather than to the same place every time? When a regular bowler practices - he knows it's smarter to go to multiple centers rather than risk becoming a 'house' bowler. Lane conditions can be changed - but the atmosphere cannot.

Mark Miller, from USBC Public Relations, wrote the following after I sent an email to local bowling entities about the Training Facility. One copy was forwarded to the USBC, and he responded.

"I'd like to provide you with a few facts that weren't included in the original release that further explain why we are doing this.

"First, we are one of the last, if not the last, sports national governing bodies to create such an independent venue. I say independent in reference

"First, we are one of the last, if not the last, sports national governing bodies to create such an independent venue. I say independent in reference to your point on the Kegel facility. That's a private facility for which we have little, if any, control on how it operates. The same goes with commercial centers and the same goes when Team USA travels to Colorado Springs (US Olympic Training Center), since it must use a separate bowling facility to do its on-lanes training. To have a true world-class facility with the type of amenities needed to do it right, it must be independent and run by the national governing body.

"Second, the business plan calls for the new facility to be profitable and eventually pay for itself (Editor's note: how can it legally 'be profitable' when being owned by a non-profit organization?). How? Through the fees that people will be charged to use the facility. Who would use this? In addition to our Team USA athletes (Editor's note: the team would not pay. The money would come from USBC coffers - money out of your pocket.), college and high school teams, professionals and international teams will

college and high school teams, professionals and international teams will pay to receive world-class coaching and training. And, we believe once the general public knows the facility exists, a good enough number of them will come to learn from the best how to improve their games.

"Finally, if bowling is truly to be considered a sport and wants to be at the same level as other sports, it must create facilities like this. As USBC is dedicated to growing the sport of bowling, we believe that's

USBC is dedicated to growing the sport of bowling, we believe that's what we must do."

Looking at the estimates I've provided, and reading Mr. Miller's response, something is definitely wrong.

Perhaps my assessment of the finances needed to build a center and keep it running are flawed - or could it be USBC's zealous anticipation of how many paying bowlers will be passing through the doors? Either way, this will be a very costly venture for everyone who supports USBC in each and every way. of course, the USBC was the immediate recipient of \$1 million in sav-

ings when they disbanded the Field Representative positions a few weeks ago. These men and women were the go-betweens for local associations/bowlers and national headquarters. The knowledge these people possess and the help they gave with one-on-one familiarity, will be sorely missed. It's unfortunate - but USBC didn't see a need for this type of customer service in its ranks.

In my humble opinion, the numbers just do not add up to a break-even business - and that's what USBC must strive for as they are a registered non-profit entity.

Joes Team USA's current training (without an official facility vide them with the necessary knowledge and expertise to win medals in international competition around the world? YES - and they're doing it

Does Team USA deserve the best coaching available? YES

Is there a more cost-effective way to accomplish this goal? YES Our opinions will probably mean very little to the powers-that-be at the National level, but we have the right to express them. Remember, every league bowler will be paying for this facility through their sanctioning fees

if the facility cannot get to a break-even point. It may be only a few cents from each bowler - but the money has to come from somewhere.

At some point in the future I may have to extend my apology for making incorrect assumptions about the financial stability of a bowling Training Facility when the venture proves to be successful without major corporate sponsorship (which has never been mentioned). Should I hold my breath and wait.





Peters recently graduated from Hillside Bethel Christian School in Decatur, and will use his scholarship to attend Wichita State University this fall, where he will join the powerful Shocker Bowling Team. "I am very excited about going to WSU," said Peters. "Winning the Teen Masters has boosted my bowling beyond belief."

Hamilton will be a senior this year, and since winning the TM, she won the New York State Singles Tournament, rolling an 800 series in the event. She was also named to the Dexter High School All-American Team. (www.dexterbowling.

Both players acknowledge that there is a little more expectation going into this year's event, but they will approach it with a positive attitude. "I'm preparing just like any other event," said Peters. "I'm just going to go out there and try my best to make the best shots and good decisions, and hopefully, if things go right, at the end of the week, I'll be in a position to have a chance to win again."

Hamilton has been getting ready by seeking coaching from some of the best players in the sport. "The past couple of months, I have attended some excellent bowling camps and received instruction from [PBA

player of the year] Doug Kent, Lynda Barnes, and Shannon O'Keefe. I've tried not to focus on becoming champion again, but rather on my game and taking it one game at a time, one cut at a time," she said.

"Until you actually win something this big, you have a little doubt inside," said Peters. "After winning last year, I have a whole lot more confidence in my game and ability." "My attitude really hasn't changed," said Hamilton. "I know I still have to try my hardest and I'm not going to win everything that I compete in, because there is a ton of competition out there. Bowling is something I'm going to do the rest of my life, and I have learned so much from holding this title, and I continue to learn to this day."

Both of these young bowling athletes rely on their family for strength. One of Hamilton's three brothers and one of her aunts will be in Vegas rooting her on. "My family is always the center of my support," she said. "My whole family is still showing me the same love and support they always have," said Peters. Almost 400 youth bowlers will compete in this year's TM national Finals.

The 10th Annual Teen Masters National Finals will roll July 29 - August 3 at the Orleans Bowling Center in Las Vegas. It is presented by Gary Beck's Killer B Promotions and sponsored by Dexter, Kegel, The PBA, The USBC, and The BPAA. 


