


# **AI Schnakenberg** 1931 - 2018

## **EJ Tackett, Liz Johnson Win PBA-PWBA Storm Striking Against Breast Cancer** Mixed Doubles Title with Dramatic Come-From-Behind Finish

**New House Record** at Gold Coast





HOUSTON, Texas - EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., and Liz Johnson of Palatine, Ill., survived a dramatic final game to win the 19th PBA-PWBA Storm Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles title at Copperfield Bowl Sunday, sending Australia's Jason Belmonte and Chicago's Diandra Asbaty to their third straight runnerup finish.

Tackett, PBA's 2016 Player of the Year, and

(Peggy) and left his service in the Air Force after his second tour of duty.

They went home to Nebraska and Brunswick Corp. sent The Schnakenberg's to Southern California to open Baldwin Park Bowl.

After a few years there, he was recruited to Five Points Bowl by Carl DiCiola. He was the San Gabriel Valley Bowler of the Year in 1965-66 and turned down numerous offers from Brunswick and AMF to be sponsored on the PBA Tour, but Al didn't want to be away from his family and said no to their generous offers.

He left the bowling business in the early 70's to enter Transportation Management positions. He retired and enjoyed retirement living in Walnut, CA. where he spent his time working for the Walnut Sheriff Dept. as a volunteer patrolling the streets of Walnut. He was awarded Volunteer of the Year by the Los Angeles County Sheriff Dept.

Al is survived by his wife Peggy Schnakenberg, son Steve Schnakenberg, Daughter-in-Law Dorcas Schnakenberg and Grandchildren Jasmine Hyland and Sabrina Schnakenberg. Al was laid to rest on July 24, 2018 at Riverside National Cemetery.





SAN BERNARDINO - Toni Futch, Scott Hatmaker and David Wilk were inducted into the Citrus Belt Hall of Fame on Saturday. Association President MIKE RADDEMAN presided over the affair and CURT SNYDER was superb as Master of Ceremonies.

What does it take to be inducted into the Hall of Fame? The ultimate honor comes after years of SUPERIOR PER-FORMANCE or MERITORIOUS SERVICE. This year's Hall of Fame class has performed on the lanes and served our bowlers off the lanes as admirably as any of our honorees in the past.

Toni Futch (Meritorious Service) could easily be named the best league secretary in Citrus Belt history. She was selected Secretary of the Year in 2014 and could easily be so honored every year. Toni is a people person, always providing her bowlers with outstanding service. She is a outstanding league promoter, organizer and grower. She has served thousands of bowlers over decades at bowling centers throughout the Inland Empire.

Scott Hatmaker (Superior Performance) has bowled at a outstanding level for decades. He has averaged over 200 throughout those decades and has performed so consistently that his league teams have probably won more league championships then anyone in the southern tier. Of late he is dominating in senior league play. Over the years he has rolled 11 perfect games and three 800s, with a high of 846. He has a Citrus Belt Senior Doubles Title to his credit.

David Wilk (Superior Performance) is one of the most talented bowlers to ever bowl in the Citrus Belt. He has bowled in the Association for over 35 years after impressing bowling aficionados in the Chicago, Illinois area as a young bowling prodigy. He rolled his first 300 at the age of sixteen in the late 1960's in the era of rubber bowling balls! That was an Illinois State record for years. At seventeen he won a state junior team title and was averaging over 200 by the age of 18. During those early years David won 38 tournament titles in seven different Midwestern states!

For the past 48 years David has averaged over 200, with a high of 224 in 1971. He has 28 perfect games and seven 800s. He won a CALIFORNIA State Doubles Title in 1982 and a HOINKE Classic Title in Cincinnati, Ohio that same year.

David is proudest of his accomplishments at the USBC National Open Tournament where he has averaged 202 for 32 years and placed second in 2007 in Singles. His 804 in that event makes him the second oldest bowler ever to roll an 800 at the National Tournament. Congratulations to our inductees and thanks to the Hall of Fame Committee: CURTIS COVEY, PHOSIE LOTZE, DANIEL LORENZ, NITA SCHMIDT, CURT SNYDER and NORRIS TURNER. 

me, it's the best of both worlds."

Low, who uses a left-handed two-handed delivery, has won several collegiate honors while bowling with Wichita State including 2017 Intercollegiate Team Championships Most Valuable Player, 2018 National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association First Team All-American, 2017 Second Team All-American, and 2018 International Bowling Media Association Collegiate Bowler of the Year runnerup. His accomplishments as both an outstanding player, as well as demonstrating an outstanding work ethic and qualities as a team player, have also earned him team leader honors for the Wichita State men's team.

He has also won numerous medals as a member of Junior Team USA, most recently winning three gold medals, one silver and one bronze in the 2016 World Youth Bowling Championships and three gold medals, two silver and one bronze in the 2015 PABCON Youth Championships.

Low began to demonstrate his prowess as a bowler at a very young age, competing as an amateur (with parental consent) and cashing for scholarship money at a PBA West Region tournament at age 14. He has won four PBA Regional events under PBA's non-member participation rules, including his first at age 15.

While his priority is to complete his business management degree in the 2018-19 school year, he has left no doubt that he will compete on the Go Bowling! PBA Tour sometime after he graduates.

"We'll have to see what the schedule looks like next year, but my plan will be to go out on tour when I've completed school," Low said. "With the experience I've had as a Junior Team USA member and bowling collegiately, I feel I'll be as ready as I can be to give it my best shot."

The \$1,000 scholarship award was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. Welu, who passed away in 1974, was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the "Pro Bowlers Tour" series. Welu was a two-time PBA Tour champion and a member of the PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural induction class in 1975.

Asbaty. Tackett was unable to strike in his 10th frame, but Belmonte, needing a double for the win, left a 10 pin on his first shot in his 10th frame. While Belmonte out-scored Tackett, 214-208, but it wasn't quite enough. Tackett and Johnson, bowling as partners for the first time in the event, won the final match, 420-406, and earned 30 match play bonus pins to post a composite 20-game total of 8,797 pins to win by a 34-pin margin.

"I'm ecstatic," said Tackett, who earned his 11th PBA Tour title and second of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season. "I'm so happy for Liz. I'm so proud to be part of this win. There was not a single person in this building who could have done what she did in that last game. It was absolutely amazing watching her play outside on one lane, inside on the other. "There are only two people in the world who can do what Liz did – her and Norm Duke. That's one reason she is the greatest woman bowler of all-time."

"I'm pretty numb," Johnson said of her 20th PWBA title. "It's taken me 17 years to win here. People say 'You've won everything,' but this is a major title to me. I'm so proud. This is my favorite tournament of the year."

"This has always been an event unlike any we bowl all year and it's getting bigger and bigger," she added. "When I started bowling this event I think I was one of the only ones coming from out of town. Now players come from all over the country and all over the world."

PBA Tour players will return to competition in a pair of PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling events in August – the PBA Xtra Frame Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic at Mid-County Lanes in Middletown, Del., Aug. 17-19, followed by the PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic at Pla-Mor Lanes in Coldwater, Ohio, Aug. 24-26.

Each weekly edition of the Bowling News had a minimum 20 pages. There were 6 local writers, 2 photographers, 6 typesetters, etc. working 12 hours a day 5 days a week. No computers, no cell phones, no face book. It was real journalism — — not for the money, but the love of bowling and bowlers.

- BARRY ASHER opened his Bowlers Supermarket in January. Friends stopping by included MARK ROTH, MARSHALL HOLMAN and PETE WEBER.
- Visitors to the Hall of Fame in St. Louis saw oil paintings of So. Calif. stars DONNA ZIMMERMAN, D.D. JACOBSON and JANET HARMON — — all from So. Cal.
- Another Brunswick center was scheduled for the Summer of '85. VALLEY BOWL in Simi Valley.
- PAULA VIDAD was named Ladies Pro Bowlers "Rookie of the Year."
- Stan Lawon tried to start a new weekly tournament, THE BOWLERS HANDI-CAP CHALLENGE. What a dreamer. His ad read "limited to 128 entries." He was competing with HARRY GRANT, LILA BORNHAUSEN, BIG ANK, BERT STRAIN, BOB SMITH and every weekly "house event."
- DOWNEY was action city every week-end. WONDERBOWL had their "Shootout" and DEL RIO had their "POT SHOT".
- KABC TALKRADIO was the official bowling station for So. California. It never replaced Dr. Toni Grant's "sex" interviews. How interesting can "talk" bowling be?
- ROB CALVERT rolled AZUSA BOWL's first 800 series. 300, 255, 279/834 after he switched from right to left hand. (And 50 practice games a week.)
- FRANK BABORE predicted he would win "Big Ank's" No-Tap . . . . and did!
- Junior house columns were being written by LINDA QUIROZ (Keystone), ROSANNE HEINZ (Village), BARBARA VEGA (SED Travel), JIM BENAFEL (Canoga Park). They were the Saturday scribes.
- PIONEER BOWL in Norwalk advertised for waitresses, bartenders, desk persons, mechanics. Sounded like a clean sweep or a new owner!
- BRUNSWICK POM LANES was renamed CELEBRITY LANES, owners GREG BADERDEEN and STEVE CAMERON.
- HO-HUM TISH JOHNSON won ROBBY'S WINTER CLASSIC, beating out DONNA ADAMEK, ROBIN ROMEO and VIRGINIA NORTON, all top five performers.
- RON GAUDERN, owner of COLUMBIA BOWL, Big Chief at Western Columbia, owner of two centers in Texas and great bowler was inducted into Texas Hall of Fame.
- ROGER CURNS took over the helm at INGLEWOOD LANES, an Active West center. He transfered from MIDTOWN BOWL. He was co-founder of a juvenile delinquency prevention program.
- BRIAN BRIAN PRODUCTIONS presented a "TV Championship Bowl Off" every Saturday 11 a.m. on Channel 56. (Don't know what it was all about, do you?)
- GARY KOWARACH was SEDBA secretary. His main job was certifying lanes plus averages, plus league sanctioning, awards, etc., etc., etc. Seven days a week job for all association secretries. Add in average books, tournaments, personnal league play, convention, award ceremonies, uniforms, elections - - --WAIT - - - - I'M TIRED!
- SPORTS CENTER ran an ad for a Valentine's Day No-Tap - named "T-BONE". What the -? TOM CRISTI - - - was that you? ?
- A home video cassette (VHS) was being marketed, introducing the La Magna Formula. The living room instructions we called "The Playing of the Game". Anybody have a copy? Anybody got VHS player?
- The number of Pro Shop ads was back up to 23. New equipment was tempting and offered to "up your average".

- INDIO, CALIF. had a center called MAGNUM LANES. The proprietor was STEVE PINKOCZI.
- 16 pages of the March 1, 1985 issue was dedicated in pictures and stories to the Grand Opening of Brunswick UPLAND LANES!!!! The Mayor, movie stars, Brunswick Execs, Poster Boys, Top P.B.A. stars, 600 guests, So. Calif. Hall of Famers, the press, etc. were all featured. Biggest grand opening ever held —before or after! JIM WOODWARD was the proud Manager.
- BARBARA VEGA was the wheel that the SED Travel League depended on. A couple of the Junior stars were MICHELLE SILVER and KENNY SEIPLE. (Both are still bowling in 2018!)
- CIPPY CAKE (new starlett making weekly headlines) won the DonKee Tour at DUTCH VILLAGE in Lakewood.
- PETER SETTHABOUPHA was first at the ABT paywindow, banked \$1,000.00. Took an hour to verify the correct spelling of his name.
- SUSAN CHERNAN (28 years old, 81 average law student) and ALAN BISHOP (39 years) won the Miller National Doubles in Reno. How much? \$50,000.00! 'Twas her first tournament and first trophy. They were from FOUNTAIN VAL-LEY.
- BOB PERMANN was the first to roll a 300 at HEMET BOWL.
- It looked like "Ladies Only" Donkee Event in March. BARBARA BURGESS won the event and EDNA HOLLAND broke the Double Strike Pot for \$1,000.00. Never saw 2 bigger smiles!
- The latest 2 inducted into PBA Hall of Fame were JOE JOSEPH and TED HOFFMAN Jr. Ted was from San Jose and very well known in California.
- Team U.S.A. was established to pick the best amateurs to compete in international events. Win at the local level, then win at the state level – - then, on to the nationals. That winner would represent U.S.A. To make it that far men would have had to bowl 101 games, women 81 games. What an honor! All expenses were paid from State level on.
- You could earn a career in bowling management thru a home study course. Everything from instructing, management, marketing and mechanics were offered. 36 easy lessons and 36 exams. (Was it a success?)
- Banning had a new center EDGEHILL LANES, owned by Mike Johnson. The first guy to roll a 300 was RICHARD ZIBELL and he got the \$100.00 check.
- The very popular JACK COOK was named manager of the SHOWBOAT in Las Vegas. We will hear more about him as the years roll on.
- Chief Halftown, a full blooded Seneca Indian was a champion bowler and expert instructor. Dressed in Chief Halftown garb, he gave lessons to Junior bowlers. First reported seen at GRANADA LANES.
- Rock and Bowl" hit the lanes with a blast. It started witht just music to bowl by. Soon came flashing lights, fog, colored pins and anything anyone could think of. Many centers in 2018 are still "bowlin' to the music!" Kids love it.
- The 960 Scratch League had 60 teams. Every Monday night at 9, 30 teams took to the lanes at **KEYSTONE** and 30 teams rolled at **DEL RIO**. The prize fund totaled \$156,000! The winning 5 guys received \$20,000.00. If you didn't pay your \$100.00 franchise fee early, you didn't get in. 300 of the greatest bowlers in So. California tackled the lanes weekly.

Looks like 1985 had so much action, characters, awards and star performances that we will have 3 parts. Read on friends.





three days in a row," McCune said. "I was really surprised after the way Mike spanked me twice earlier in the day. He's the best there is on the senior tour right now."

McCune, who won three PBA Tour titles in 600 events and another 23 titles in 365 PBA Regional events, made a decision to not renew his PBA membership because of his work load and lack of time. While he won in his first PBA50 Tour event, he won't get credit for a title because he's not a PBA member.

"I work all of the time and the odds of making a show aren't easy out here," said McCune, who turned 50 in June. "These guys are still good; if they can get the ball to the pocket, they'll strike all day long.

"It's not a lack of desire to compete; it's a financial decision now," he added. "It's always good to win, but right now it's all about the money. I looked at the finals like bowling pot games - the first game was for \$4,500, the next one for \$7,500."

Despite losing in his bid for a third PBA50 title this year, Haugen extended his PBA50 Player of the Year points lead. "Eugene isn't a member, so that means no one gained points on me," Haugen said. "He out-bowled me, and if I couldn't win, no one was a better story than Eugene. I always say, if a guy out-bowls me, I'm happy to shake his hand and tell him I'll get him the next time."

In the opening match, PBA50 Tour rookie Greg Thomas of Irmo, S.C., threw an early turkey that proved to be the difference in a 225-197 win over PBA Hall of Famer Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan., who didn't throw backto-back strikes until the 10th frame.

In the second match, Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., the 2017 South Shore Open runner-up, gave Thomas an opening when he left the 4-6-7-10 split in the fifth frame, but Thomas missed a 9 pin in his seventh frame and failed to strike on his next three shots, handing Learn a 209-203 win. McCune advanced to the championship match with a 248-215 victory over Learn in the semifinal match after Learn left a 7-10 split on his first shot and a 3-4-6-7-10 split on his second, failing to convert both. McCune struck on seven of his first eight shots and never trailed.

The tour's next stop is the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship presented by Track at Dave Small's Heritage Lanes in Kokomo, Ind., beginning Saturday and concluding on Tuesday, July 31. After a brief respite, Xtra Frame on FloBowling resumes live coverage with the PBA50 Dave Small's Championship Lanes Classic, presented by Roto Grip, in Anderson, Ind., Aug. 4-7, and the PBA50 Cup, presented by DV8, from Wyoming, Mich., Aug. 9-12, the concluding event of the PBA50 season. PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling wraps up the "senior tour" regular season with the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship for players 60 and older, presented by 900 Global, at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne, Ind., Aug. 14-16.
