When qualifying concluded on Saturday evening at Copperfield Bowl in Houston, Anthony Simonsen and Danielle McEwan sat in 30th place, more than 250 pins behind the tournament leaders.

But rather than run from the massive deficit, they ran straight at it.

"Hey, I get it was a rough day, but tomorrow's a new day," Simonsen said he texted McEwan on Saturday night. "And it's more enjoyable to run the lead down than it is to lead and try to hold on."

Simonsen and McEwan embraced the challenge and emerged with

What's Up With All The Classic Bowling T-Shirt Designs?

It has been almost a year since I ordered one of those classic t-shirt designs from a company called <u>m00nshot.com</u>, so I decided to take a look at the offerings and possibly add to my collection. As anyone in the senior set can attest, the memory begins to fade when it comes to information... not so much for faces or images, but definitely for names.

How I could not remember a name like <u>m00n-shot.com</u> is beyond me, but as a result of doing a word search for "old bowling center t-shirts," I was quite surprised at all of the internet sites that are now including bowling as part of their vintage t-shirt offerings. The list was headed by <u>m00nshot.com</u>, followed by <u>fineartamerica.com</u>, <u>redbubble.com</u>, <u>etsy.</u> <u>com</u>, and many, many more.

Most of these new offerings are not just old bowling centers, but general listings of bowling nostalgia applied to t-shirts, including retro photos of people bowling in leagues, as a family, date night, etc. There are even many shots of former president Richard M. Nixon, who made the bowling lane in the White House popular with its renovation, and subsequent visits during the 1960's and 70's as America's number one bowling fan.

And any list of bowling nostalgia would not be complete without The Big Lebowski (starring Jeff Bridges) and Kingpin (starring Woody Harrelson, Bill Murray, Randy Quaid, and so many more). One of the sites had at least four pages of t-shirts devoted to nothing but the Big Lebowski. As I reviewed the

pages of <u>m00nshot.com</u>, there were new listings for Walnut Bowl in Walnut Creek, Calif., "The Magnificent" Millbrae Bowl, in Millbrae, Calif., and Lucky "60" Lanes in San Pablo, California.

Lucky Lanes was a part of the American Recreation Centers chain that I remember so well. It originally opened in July of 1960 as a 40 lane center, but like so many others added an extra twenty lanes to the split house within a couple of years. Unlike most bowling centers, Lucky was an "A" frame construction, with all of the amenities (bar, snack shop, billiards, reception desk and pro shop housed within the giant "A" frame, and the lanes constructed on either side.

One of the ads that ran in the Oakland Tribune in 1960 announcing the grand opening of the bowling center included an innovative new "Electronic Micro-Wave Snack Bar... with hot sandwiches prepared in seconds, at any hour. Good to eat, and inexpensive!" One of the downfalls of Lucky Lanes was its prime location at an I-80 exit. In spite of ARC's efforts to save the location with a massive renovation and petitions in the 1990's, it eventually succumbed to a wrecking ball to make room for a new casino, providing more tax dollars than a bowling center for the city and state.

Continuing my search in the <u>m00nshot.com</u> listings for vintage bowling centers, I found a new entry for Zangs Bowl in Dallas, and another for Pee Wee Reese Lanes in Louisville, Kentucky. Reese was another in a long line of famous baseball players that became bowling proprietors. You can check out some of the others in an article that appeared in most publications in either October or November of 2022: *'It Ain't Over Til It's Over'... Many Famous Baseball*

Play It Again, Matthew

The Etsy website has an interesting feature that allows you to custom make your retro style two-tone shirt (the ones that Chandler, aka Matthew Perry, made popular in the sitcom *Friends*) with your text or logo. The corresponding price, like that of <u>m00nshot</u>. <u>com</u>, is quite high. There were no vintage bowling center designs offered at <u>etsy.com</u>, but <u>fineartamerica.com</u> did provide a couple of new locations, including Ray Bluth's Crestwood Bowl in St. Louis, Celebrity Lanes in Denver, Paris Lanes in Paris, Texas, and the Pro 300 Lanes sign that we wrote about a few years ago, appearing in most publications in August or September of 2021: *Target Stores Takes Unique Approach In Memorializing Bowling Center*.

Then I stumbled upon <u>teepublic.com</u>, another website offering a myriad of bowling center art from yesterday, and today. As I went through the pages of offerings, I noted many new designs, including: Midtown Bowl (Los Angeles), Midway Bowl (San Leandro, Calif.), Beacon Bowl (Southgate, Calif.), and Gnoles Bowl in Chicago. There were also some other interesting logos available, including: the Fresno Bombers bowling team from the National Bowling League, "I Bowl At Gil Hodges Lanes" (the famous bowling center in Brooklyn - now closed), and Bowling for Dollars on WJKW-TV 8 in Cleveland.

I had gone through about 8 of the 10 pages of bowling memorabilia on the <u>teepublic.com</u> site when a pop-up ad announced that all t-shirts were reduced to \$16.00, plus shipping and handling, for the next 14 hours. This was about one-third the price of the other websites, so I decided to continue to the end. The very last entry under the bowling nostalgia was a t-shirt design for Golden Gate Lanes, one of the most famous bowling centers in history!

Golden Gate Lanes was also a part of the ARC chain. Like Lucky Lanes, it was the victim of eminent domain, when a Target Store was recommended as a replacement for the bowling shrine, primarily based upon the additional tax dollars that would benefit both the city and state. I spent more than a year of my life trying to defend the recreational benefits of Golden Gate Lanes (in addition to my other duties at ARC). In the end I learned that it's really hard to fight city hall (and win).

My new Golden Gate Lanes t-shirt is due to arrive in 6-8 days. I'm sure that it will be the impetus for another article about Golden Gate Lanes, Quee Prentice, Rod's Hickory Pit, Tony Rosano, and of course the incredible lane conditions that confounded the experts. If you have any memories of this wonderful facility, let us know and we will try to incorporate them

PBA REGIONAL RECAP: JANAWICZ, KNOWLES COLLECT WINS

Over the past few weeks, the PBA Regional Tour crowned champions of all ilks, from ascending talents, Senior Tour stalwarts, to collegiate stars. John Janawicz, while 50 years old, could fit in each of the first two categories. His brilliant debut campaign continued in Illinois, detailed in this week's PBA Regional Recap:



PBA50 BEVERLY LANES MIDWEST/CENTRAL OPEN

Beverly Lanes, that's where I want to be! Scores were sky-high in qualifying, mainly from John Janawicz and Tom Hess. The pair each averaged 253 to top the leaderboard heading into the advancers round.

But as the tournament went on, Janawicz pulled away from the field. In the final advancers round, Chris Barnes needed to top Janawicz by 118 pins, but after a 234 from Janawicz in Game 1, the second game was just a consolation. Janawicz never shot a game below 200 for the entirety of the tournament en route to winning his second regional title of the season.

PBA ST CHARLES LANES MIDWEST OPEN

From a suburb of Chicago to a suburb of St. Louis, the sub-age-50 region bowled a match play event at St. Charles Lanes in Missouri. The cut landed at +42, giving many young guns a chance at a title if they placed inside the top 12. Jorge Rodriguez did just that, qualifying first, then staying on top after the first 11 games of match play. Rodriguez defeated his opponent Timothy Curran in the position round and held off the rest of the field to grab the win and \$3,000.

Dallas started with the lead in San Antonio at the Thousand Oaks Southwest Open — Dallas Leong, that is. He eventually wound up with the two-seed, Deo Benard took the top seed, while Eric Jones and Garrett Andrus squared off in the first match as the three and four seeds. Andrus won the first match 236-215 and followed that up with another 236 to top Leong's 226 in the second match. Andrus was one win away from winning his first regional title, but Benard spoiled the day by grabbing his fourth title with a 224-203 victory.

The Salvino pattern was amiable to the bowlers in West Virginia, as it took a 214 average to make the single-elimination bracket. Graham Fach qualified first and won his first two matches to advance to the finals. He faced off against Zac Tackett, who had just knocked off the Aussie Sam Cooley in the semifinals. Excitement filled the final match: after the pair tied at 257, Tackett took home the title via

St. Charles enrolled many PBA Tour PTQ participants, and so did the Bowlero Spring Hill Open. Carlos Granados smashed the field in qualifying, going +171 for his eight games. He held the lead after each of the first two advancers rounds, but Nate Garcia took over the lead after the third.

Round 4 put the two within just one pin of each other, but a winner-take-all final game would determine the champ. Both bowlers went spare, four-bagger in the first half, but back-to-back single pins from Granados allowed Garcia to pick up a big lead. After an eight-bagger, Garcia converted a 10-pin in the final frame to seal the deal and pick up his second career title and first in five years.

The Holman pattern played quite difficult for the pairs, as a 202 average was good enough to make the cut. In a match play setting the next day, Warren Crawford and Lanndyn Carnate absolutely annihilated the field, to the point where they could have sat out the position round game. Finishing in first by over 160 pins, the duo earned \$1,800 apiece and a title to their names.

Brad Angelo woke up ready to hurt some pins in St. Joseph at the tune-up for the PBA50 World Series of Bowling. A +390 set was good for the one-seed by almost 100 pins. Robert Manning meanwhile snuck into the 16th seed by striking out in the 10th frame as nine guys sat within 25 pins of him after eight games. Fast-forward to the semis and the top four seeds were eliminated to leave Larry Verble, Walter Ray Williams Jr, Rick Galpal, and Steven Badovinac. There, Verble defeated Williams Jr., and Badovinac took down Galpal. Searching for his first title, Badovinac got it done 245-231 to earn a banner and \$3,000.

ç PBA MIKE EATON SR. MEMORIAL CENTRAL/MIDWEST OPEN Despite finishing 29th on the PBA Tour in points this season, Justin Knowles was not selected during last week's PBA League Draft. It appears he took out his frustration on the pins at Spectrum Entertainment Complex in Wyoming, Mich. last weekend.

Knowles averaged over 244 to lead the eight-game qualifying round. The twohanded lefty maintained his lead through 15 games of round-robin match play, then held off Gerald Marrs in the position round to bring home the title. This marks his third career regional title and first since 2019.

While there were no reported bigfoot sightings at either of the regionals in Spokane last weekend, there was a Payden Stumpf breakthrough. The 30-year-old has earned three runner-up finishes over the past three seasons, but got over the hump and secured his first career regional title.

Stumpf qualified in fourth place, averaging over 228 across eight games of qualifying on the 46-foot Petraglia oil pattern; fellow Puyallup native Austin Gratzer led the way. Stumpf slipped to fifth after the next four games, but surged into the lead during the three-game second advancer round.

After nine more games across three advancer rounds, Stumpf settled in the No. 2 seed for the three-player stepladder finals. He defeated Shawn Horenberger and top seed Cameron Weier to claim that elusive title.

Back up in the Pacific Northwest, Chuck Harns paced the PBA50 field during seven games of qualifying at the one-day event in Spokane. However, Harns fell to No. 8 seed Blaine Weninger in the first round of the eight-player bracket.

Weninger then took down Spokane native Michael Hanson to meet Michael Kennedy in the finals. Kennedy, who also beat a Spokanite in the semifinals, defeated Weninger 196-180 for his second career PBA50 regional title.

PBA BOWLERO MANASSAS OPEN

The next generation of the PBA South Region put on a show last weekend in northern Virginia. Eighteen-year-old Ethan Fiore outscored the 88-player field by 12 pins per game, leading the eight-game qualifying round by almost 100 pins. Fiore maintained his lead through the first advancer round, but slipped into third after the second.

Oklahoma Christian University star CJ Petrin maintained a top-four standing for the duration of the tournament, finishing fourth. Fiore fought back to reach the title match where he faced Julian Michael Salinas, who fired 264 and 279 to jump into the lead during the third advancer round.

Salinas, a multi-time Junior Team USA member and SCAD-Savannah studentathlete, defeated Fiore 193-183 for the win.

Simonsen led all match play advancers by averaging 243.15 for his 12 games during the semifinals and finals, while McEwan paced the women with a 208.46 Sunday average. That's how they turned a 252-pin deficit into a 118-pin victory.

Despite the final margin, two teams were within striking distance heading into the position round. The defending champions, EJ Tackett and Diandra Asbaty, trailed by 82 pins in third place; Tommy Jones and Shannon Pluhowsky sat just 61 pins back with a head-to-head matchup and 30 bonus pins in front of them.

Moreover, Jones and Pluhowsky had just defeated Simonsen and McEwan by 20 pins on the same pair where the position round would be held. And McEwan's ball reaction had disappeared — she clawed out a 186 that game while never knocking down more than eight pins on any of her final four first-balls.

The 11-time Team USA member remained resilient, starting the final game with a spare and three consecutive strikes.

"I definitely thrive off bowling with a team and having a teammate," McEwan said. "Especially in today's situation, even when I was lost, I had somebody to pick me up and to talk to when I wasn't seeing it clearly instead of having to listen to your own thoughts. I was able to have a conversation with somebody and figure it out and that helped me tremendously."

"I felt like I had a really good ball reaction, so as long as she can keep us close, I can keep us moving up," Simonsen said.

Simonsen's ball reaction was illustrative of how the 26-year-old has rewritten the PBA record books over the past 10 years.

While other players chased the lane transition on the 41-foot pattern left of the sixth arrow, Simonsen did the opposite. He moved nearly 20 boards right and fired his fill ball about four miles per hour faster up the 8-board to close the fifth game of match play. He told McEwan he was going to commit to that move the next game.

"I had full trust in him," McEwan said. "It goes back to our familiarity bowling around the world with each other for at least six years. When he knows what he's doing, he knows how to make it work."

Simonsen shot 298, which propelled them into the lead for good.

With the first-place finish, Simonsen earned his 16th top-10 finish in 16 PBA Tour title events in 2023. He'll have one final test at the Storm Lucky Larsen Masters in September.

McEwan closes out the 2023 PWBA Tour next month in Iowa.


