Lee, who was a Bethlehem Steel weigh-master, in his peak was truly a Southland star. He was a company bowler, active Huntington Park Elk, a consistant Southeast District Bowling Association tournament champion and honor score award recipient.

His friend, Jack Daugherty, would say, "Lee is a shy guy. He wouldn't tell you how many rings and plaques he has. He bowls and cashes in most local, state and national tournaments."

He and Daugherty enjoyed bowling for Jack Diamond's Steak House in the Greater I.A. Traveling League. If we'd

Lee was still active at Del Rio Lanes until a few months ago. He started bowling at H.P. Academy. It was across the street from Bethlehem Steel, then he went to Beacon Bowl rolling big numbers. When Beacon closed he made Gage Bowl home then Del Rio.

He really made himself at home in all the Southeast District centers — yes, he'll be missed.

Mars The Red Planet Is About To Be Spectacular!

This month and next, Earth is catching up with Mars in an encounter that will culminate in the closest approach between the two planets in recorded history. The next time Mars may come this close is in 2287. Due to the way Jupiter's gravity tugs on Mars and perturbs its orbit, astronomers can only be certain that Mars has not come this close to Earth in the last 5,000 years, but it may be as long as 60,000 years before it happens again.

The encounter will culminate on August 27th when Mars comes to within 34,649,589 miles of Earth and will be (next to the Moon) the brightest object in the night sky. It will attain a magnitude of -2.9 and will appear 25.11 arc seconds wide. At a modest 75-power magnification.

Mars will look as large as the full moon to the naked eye. Mars will be easy to spot. At the beginning of August it will rise in the east at 10:00 p.m. and reach its azimuth at about 3:00 a.m.

RIVERSIDE, CA — Jason Altman, Executive Director of the Bowling Proprietors Ass'n of So. Calif. informed members this week with the following notice.

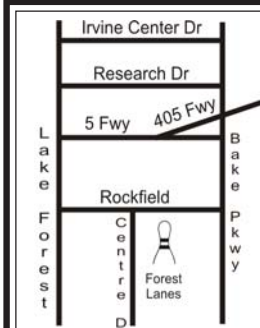
Ladies and Gentlemen:

Daniels Chrisman Appointed To USBC Board of Directors

GREENDALE, Wis. - The United States Bowling Congress Board has selected Barbara Chrisman, Pleasant View, Utah, and Perry Daniels, Carrollton, Texas, to join the USBC Board of Directors.

The USBC Board of Directors is made up of 24 active bowlers and bowling enthusiasts who focus on governance and strategic direction. The Board seeks to direct the future path to “Grow the Sport” while administering rules and policies; creating a vision, mission and values; and providing financial oversight.

Chrisman successfully managed and operated her own industrial supply company and in 1985 Chrisman and her husband Bill started Storm Products, Inc. Through her business knowledge and bowling awareness, she assisted in growing Storm Products, Inc. from an unknown entity into an internationally recognized manufacturer of bowling balls, bags and accessories. With a genuine concern for the sport of bowling Chrisman was instrumental in developing sponsorship programs for all areas of bowling competition. She is an advisor to the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame board and has been an invited industry advisor to the Bowling Proprietors Association of America. Being the first manufacturer to serve on the USBC Board, she will bring valuable insight from an important segment of the bowling industry, however, in insuring the neutrality of USBC’s rulemaking authority, will not be party to rulemaking discussions or decisions affecting ball manufacturers.

Daniels has been involved in The National Bowling Association for nearly 30 years as a member, and during that time has held TNBA leadership positions such as National President, Southern Regional Tournament Director, National King and marketing director. He retired from IBM Corporation with 30 years of service and had owned his own service industry business for five years.

“Barbara and Perry are great additions to the board,” said USBC President Michael Carroll. “They bring a blend of industry knowledge, business acumen and bowling enthusiasm that will grow the USBC”.

Bowling Still A “People” Business

ORLANDO, Fla.—Coaches and pro shop employees must inspire their customers and remember that bowling is a “people” business, said Professional Bowlers Association President and Chief Executive Officer Steve Miller in his address today to coaching and pro shop professionals.

Miller was the main speaker for today’s conclusion to the 15th annual International Bowling Pro Shop and Instructors Association International Educational Conference and third annual Bowling Coaches Summit at the Wyndham Orlando Resort. Nearly 300 coaches and pro shop personnel from around the world attended the three-day event.

“Inspiration and aspiration are two critical elements in coaching and business,” said Miller, 61, a five-time National Collegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year. “That athlete must be inspired by something. As far as coaching is concerned, you must understand the technical aspects (of bowling). You’re coaching people. You’re not coaching technique.”

The former Nike executive related the idea of inspiration and aspiration to the ups and downs of the PBA Tour, which is battling to regain its once mighty popularity with the general public. The PBA as a “club” that primarily served its members was not generating excitement with the public * especially on television * like other professional sports, he said.

“Having a membership club is neither an inspiration nor an aspiration,” he said. “We’re getting closer to pro sports, but it’s a struggle.”

However, the PBA is making headway as evidenced by several statistics he displayed, including a 62 percent increase in TV household audience in the 2004-05 season versus the 2000-01 season.

Like the PBA, coaches and pro shop employees must deal with a changing world, Miller said. “If you’re doing the same dance you did five years ago, you better learn some new steps,” he said. “If you live in the past, you’ll miss the future.”

Miller also addressed the absence of a women’s professional bowling tour. “The fact that there’s not a women’s tour is a travesty,” he said. “Where’s the inspiration and aspiration for young girls?”

Ultimately, whether it’s the business of coaching, pro shops, professional bowling, athletic shoes or any other product, it’s the people in the business that matter most, Miller said.

“There are no great businesses, no great jobs,” he said. “There are only great people. People have an incredible capacity to get things done.”

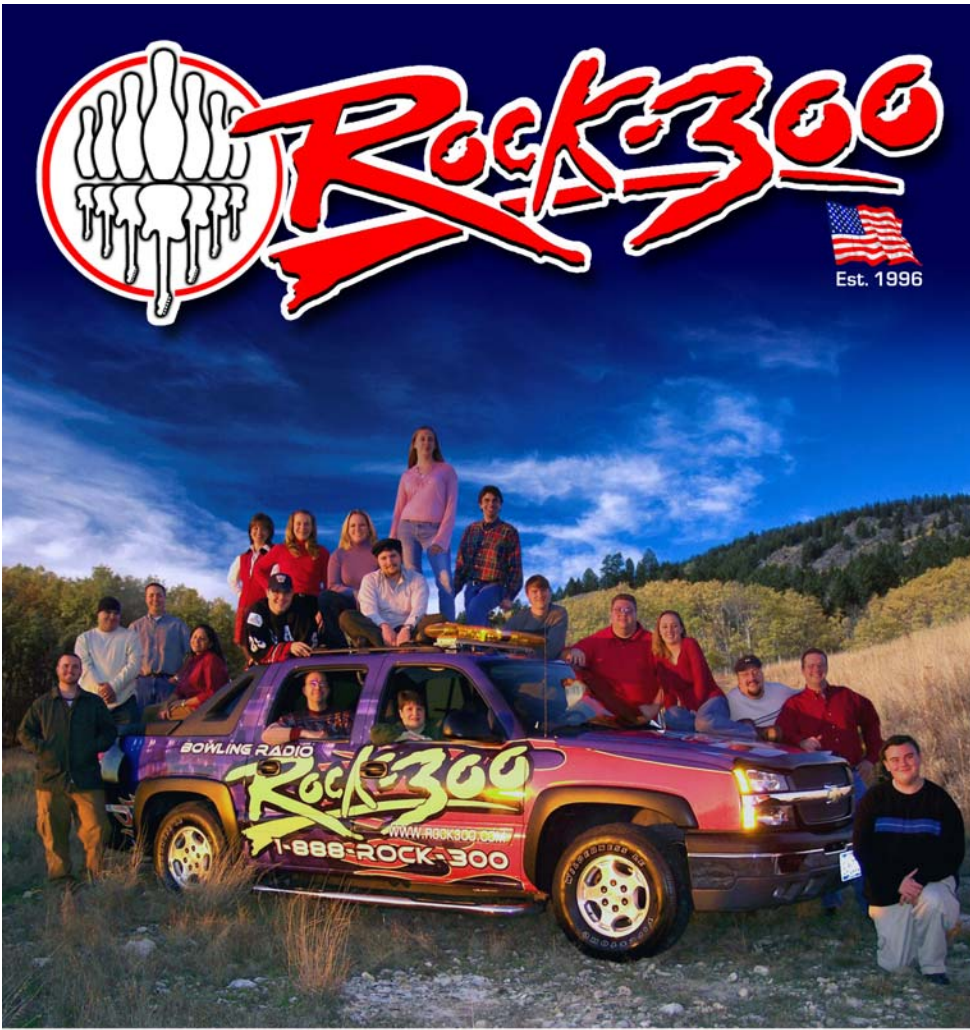
The people in the bowling business * professional bowlers, league bowlers, coaches, pro shop personnel, proprietors and others - all have a chance to accomplish great things together, he said.

“What’s good for the PBA is ultimately good for bowling,” he said. “We are substantively better than other sports. I think we have the opportunity to be something special.”

Miller was the last in a lineup of heavy hitters from the sport of bowling, a schedule that also included United States Bowling Congress CEO Roger Dalkin and PBA Hall of Famer Carmen Salvino.

Warner! Wins ABTA Title at Premiere Lanes

*Match Game is \$3,500 at Valley View Lanes this week
Match Series carries over/3-6-9 is now \$1,200 this week*

SANTA FE SPRINGS—Rich Warner hadn't done too well in his prior tournaments at Premiere Lanes. But he made up for that in a resounding title win. He won his third ABTA title downing top seed Ping Romero by a 278-202 count to take home a nice prize of \$2,400 including a \$100 bonus for using a Columbia™300™ ball.

Rich hardly misses an ABTA event, showed up for the 7 PM Squad bowling a fine +101 to make the semis. The scoring was good, men taking +47, and the ladies +10 to make the semifinals board.

Rich topped a nice turnout of 202 entrants at Premiere, the popular center located in Santa Fe Springs. 49 bowlers advanced to semis which also added Super Seniors Kenny Puleston, Ely Cruz, and Dodie Sajonas, to the board. Each week the ABTA adds two male and one lady Super Senior to the Semis over and above the regular qualifiers. Men must be 63+ and Ladies 55+ for this perk.

Leading the Semis was the pride of Carson, Mr. Ping Romero +170, he sat out and bowled for the title, with Warner, who had a +124 receiving a first round bye in the top 16 single elim finals. It took a +46 for the men, and -12 for the three guaranteed ladies to make the top 16 single elims.

The top sixteen took to the lanes, and losing in round one of the single elims finals were Tommy Newman, Anna Borromeo, Patricia Lin, Dan Gartin, Billy Chau, Roland Suase, and Seul Kim being eliminated, and they got \$100 finishing in 10-16th places.

Round two had Warner enter the field and down Ben Hurtado in a big way 278-208. Alejandro Vela got to Jeff Taino 218-216. Speedy Bryant got upset by "the Dragon" Alan Aguilar 176-173. J. T. Jackson bumped off Don Johnson Sr. 213-173. The losers of round two got checks of \$105 each in places 6-9th.

Round three saw Warner bowl tough in a big 267-182 win over Vel. J. T. Jackson and the Dragon tied at 191 with J. T. winning a 9-10 frame roll off to advance. The losers got \$115 in 4th and 5th place, with Warner and J. T. Jackson to meet for the right to bowl Ping Romero in the title game .

The Title Match was set and both bowlers are well-known and respected in the ABTA. In fact are friends and ABTA league members and were on

their game so we expected a good match. Romero led off with a strike, Warner a strike, Ping then struck and opened and the roof came down on him as Warner fired up a huge 6 bagger to take a huge lead. Ping gave it his all and finished at 176/202 to Warner's big 259/278 game. The title went to the young gentleman from Placentia and deservedly so. This is Richards's third ABTA title and he has been on a roll. His previous wins have been at La Habra 300 3 years ago and last year at Bowling Square. So he spreads his good bowling around the southland. The crowd was appreciative of his fine performance. Great Bowling Richard on a title well deserved. He now likes Premiere Lanes :) Congrats to You. Great bowling by Ping Romero who is also an ABTA regular and ABTA league bowler. Ping is a two time titleist. Great shooting by J. T. Jackson in 3rd who has been on fire since Las Vegas.

ABTA Notes: Tourney Hi Qualifiers were Don Johnson Sr. (men) +151, and Anna Borro-meo led the ladies +62. They will receive paid entries.

The optional doubles were a family affair as the Johnsons Don Sr. and son Donnie had a huge 1457 as they paired up and won \$130. We paid 9 places with \$740 in doubles action at Premiere. Chris Ko was last standing in the 3-6-9 going for \$1,100 this week. He missed on shot #4, so we will have a sweet \$1,200 in the 3-6-9 pot this Saturday in our One Day Event at Valley View Lanes Lanes in Garden Grove.

The Match Game 3 worth \$3,500 drawn by Warner was an unmatched 220. So we will have \$3,500 in the Match Game at Valley View with a carryover already at \$905 and the other balance going to a back up pot.

The Match Series was also unmatched as the 701 drawn by Don Johnson Sr. was not hit. We have a \$274 carryover in the Match Series for this week also.

The Columbia 300™ ball of the week went to ABTA regular Terry Tucker, whose daughter was selected to draw for the ball and guess what ? She drew dad at odds of 202-1. Terry thanks Columbia 300 our Sponsor for the fine prize.

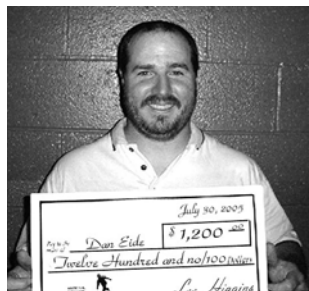

Memories From Dody Montavan

We had our first date in November 1945, got married on February 24, 1946 so we've been married for 58 years. We had four children, Estelle, Beverly, Kathy and Ron. We have 10 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren. We lost our oldest daughter Estelle in 1999 at the age of 52 from congestive heart failure.

I was sponsored by Hank Catalano for many years while

in Southern California, and worked full time at North American Aviation for 29 years. It is now Rockwell and Boeing.

I won the Pickwick Classic, Scratch Division two years in a row. Five games at 1000, in 1965 and 1966. I was named to the All-Star team in 1965; was high average in 1965 with 197 in California; third highest in the U.S. My high series is 727 and high game 286. I am currently still bowling in two leagues at Ft. Huachuca in Sierra Vista, AZ.

I was 80 years young on November 20, 2004. I booked an 181 average in the 2003-2004 season. I am currently carrying a 176 average for 2004-2005 season. But everyone's average was down this year, 10 or 15 pins because of conditions. I bowled in many national tournaments; have slowed down, mainly because of my husband's health. But I will continue to bowl as long as I can throw the ball.

I give a lot of credit for my good bowling to Mary Hoyt, who helped me several years ago, and I went to Buddy Bomars Instructor School and was certified in 1960-1961, which I believe helped me a great deal. I also thank my husband Bob, for all his help and patience. I didn't do a lot, but I enjoyed the game.

United States Bowling Congress Earns National Governing Body Status USOC Accepts New Group As A Pan American Sports Organization Member

GREENDALE, Wis.—The United States Bowling Congress is the newest national governing body in the United States Olympic Committee family.

USBC received its official letter of acceptance from the USOC on June 17 confirming that the USOC Board of Directors approved USBC's application as the national governing body of bowling in the United States. The approval, which came at the USOC board's April 29 meeting in Phoenix, granted USBC membership with USOC as a Pan American Sport Organization, replacing USA Bowling. Until USOC made its final decision, USA Bowling retained its corporate identity to handle any NGB-related issues.

"The USOC greatly appreciates the efforts of those in the bowling community to bring about the merger of the American Bowling Congress, the Women's International Bowling Congress, the Young American Bowling Alliance and USA Bowling into one organization, the USBC," said USOC Chief Executive Officer Jim Scherr. "The USOC is confident that the USBC, with the commitment of its members, its financial strength and its dedication to the sport of bowling will ably serve the needs of all men, women and youth bowlers, both recreational and elite, in the United States."

The approval ended a year-long process that began with USBC's submission last June of its application to become bowling's national governing body. The USOC working group held the first public hearing on the application last October with the second conducted in December. The group later made its recommendation to the USOC Board of Directors to accept USBC's application. USBC was the first sport organization to be considered under a new USOC process for approving NGBs.

"We appreciate USOC accepting our application to become bowling's national governing body," said USBC President Michael Carroll. "USBC is dedicated to growing the sport and we believe this achievement will help us toward that goal."

USBC joins five other Pan American and 39 Olympic sport organizations as respective national governing bodies for their sports. National governing bodies are the determining governing bodies and arbiters for the rules and regulations of their sports. They also determine who represents the United States in international competitions and are eligible for various funding from or through USOC.

Teen Masters Finals

Since its inception in 1997, the Teen Masters has set out to challenge the top teen bowlers, embracing scoring conditions which focused on accuracy and spare making. The event has been a test of skill, endurance and character. Based on their 12-game totals, the top 32 boys and top 16 girls will advance to the match portion of the competition.

Matches will be conducted on two pairs of lanes, one conditioned with a long Sport pattern, the other with a short Sport pattern. The bowlers will bowl their first game on a long Sport pattern and their second on a short Sport pattern. For game three, the higher seeded player in each given match will chose which pattern will be faced. Should a given match reach a game four, the lower seeded player will make the choice of patterns, and if the match should reach a two-two tie, the higher seed will make the decision for the final and deciding game.

The Teen Masters Championship Finals will be contested August 3-6, 2005. To be eligible, a bowler must have been a 9th – 12th grader during the 2004-2005 school year, born after August 1, 1985, and still be eligible for youth competition.

The Teen Masters is presented by the United States Bowling Congress.
