ARLINGTON, TX—It has been a few years since this writer has had the privilege of attending the BPAA International Family Tournament finals, but everything we remember from previous trips is still true. It is, without question, an event all of bowling can be proud of.

Sponsored by QubicaAMF and presented by Pepsi, Nestle, and Frito Lay, this unique sporting event promotes family togetherness, emphasizes that bowling is a lifetime sport, and draws attention to all corners of the game.

This year, 67 doubles teams advanced from State Finals to compete in the National Finals at the Main Event Entertainment Center in Grapevine, Texas, near the New International Bowling Campus in Arlington.

What makes this event so special is that it gives families a bowling trip together that they will remember their whole lives. Parents, Grandparents, and Great Grandparents being with and bowling with their kids . . . priceless memories are made in this event.

The BPAA staff goes the extra mile in this event to make sure every contestant is included in all the activities, and every youth bowler goes home with a scholarship prize. The winners of the two divisions, Parent/Teen and Parent/Youth each win a \$5000 scholarship award.

In addition to having several meals together in a first class hotel and at the center, the families were treated to a night at a Major League baseball game, and they got to spend quality time with three of the best professional bowlers in the sport – Bob Learn, Mike Machuga, and Norm Duke.

The pros put on an exhibition, did trick shots, talked to the kids one-on-one, signed posters, photos and souvenir pins. "This is the most fun event I do the entire year," said Duke. "When I was a kid, we had a family league where I bowled with my mom one year, and my dad for two or three, but we didn't have anything like this. This really shows how important bowl-

ing is in bringing families together."

"Bowling is all about passing it on from one generation to the next," said Machuga. "This is grass roots bowling at its best, and it is fantastic to be a part of it."

A great example of what Duke saw was the team from Missouri – 11-year-old Trent Everhart, and his 70-year-old great grandfather Bill Lorton. Trent's mom Sarah came along for support, and it was hard to tell which of them was having the most fun.

"This was our fourth Family Tournament," said Lorton. "We made the state finals twice, but this is our first national finals. I wish we could do this every year. This is wonderful, and we will never forget it."

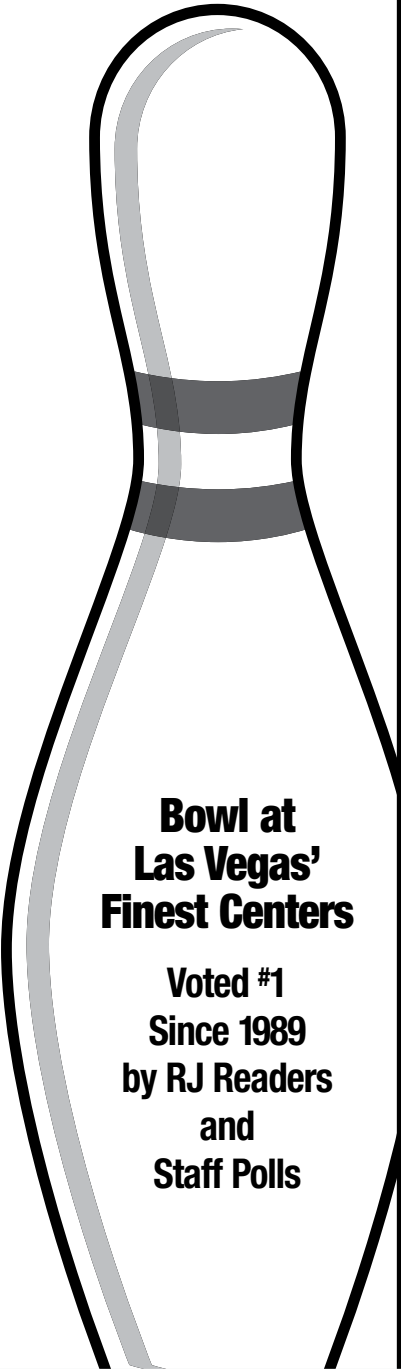

LAS VEGAS TRAVEL LEAGUE By Alice Meglemre

LONG BEACH—The 16-team 675 Classified foursome will start it's 52nd consecutive season Monday 10 a.m. August 17 for a 52nd consecutive season. I keep using the word consecutive because many leagues may be discontinued and restarted at later dates but this one has not missed a year since 1956 it's kick-off at long gone Virginia Bowl, which was located on the Long Beach Pike only a half block from the also long gone Ken Mar Lanes.

As mentioned in the past, as area bowling centers vanished so has our travel sites. For the first several years we never bowled twice at the same center during the season. I also wonder how many recall the first Vegas dbls and sgls. It was Dusty Springston's popular 24-lane Las Vegas Bowl, located on the Las Vegas Blvd strip. We remained there until it closed and the newly built Showboat Lanes became our sweeps site until it closed. We have been to a couple of other centers since then but the past few years. The Orleans seems to be home now.

However, our first trip in 1955 was not a bowling event. It was a "free-bee" because we used the then popular Hacienda Special, which flew out of Long Beach every night and featured Dick Winslow at a piano bar. It was promoted by the long gone Hacienda Hotel, and after several hours of gambling, we were returned to the plane at 2 a.m. for the return trip to Long Beach.

In 1957, the Vegas league format was changed to include bowling doubles and singles sweeps in Vegas and to stay longer. 62nd Pacific Coast Deaf Women’s Bowling Association Tournament

DUBLIN— The women bowlers will like reading this as it is not often that I write about deaf women’s tournaments because I do not get the results from them. This 62nd annual tournament (a record scoring one) was held last May Memorial Day weekend in connection with the men’s PCDBA tournament at Earl Anthony’s Dublin Lanes.

Just Strike!!!! Sets New Records In Winning Team Event

A team of Northern California women, Just Strikes!!!! led by JoDee Dike-Johnson’s 235-279/655, set three new PCDWBA records with team game 839, team series 2222 and handicap 2612 total in winning the team event over 9 other teams. The rest of Just Strike!!!!, Wendy Spanton scored 500, Jennifer Kutcka 201-561 and Coreen Harting 505 as the team added 390 handicap for the huge winning margin of 255 pins over 2nd place Ladies Strike Four’s 2357. Third place went to South West’s 2319.

Donegan-Lee Duo Wins Doubles Title With 1283 With Lee’s Record 726

Las Vegas’ Melchoria Lee rolled 257-190-279-726 for PCDWBA’s first 700 in 62 years as she teamed with Hawaiian Younisi Donegan for 1130 total plus 153 handicap for 1283 to win the doubles title. Diedri Hines and Agree Taylor placed 2nd with 1245 and Theresa Gutierrez and Cella Salcedo third with 1243.

Taylor Takes Singles Title With 639

2009 U.S. Women’s Open Set To Begin

LAS VEGAS - When the 2009 U.S. Women’s Open, a United States Bowling Congress event, kicks off at Sunset Station Hotel and Casino in Henderson, Nev., on Tuesday, the tournament will have more of an international flavor than in recent years.

Thanks to the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Women’s Championships, which concluded it’s six-day run at nearby Cashman Center on Sunday, more than 50 international competitors have decided to spend the extra week in Las Vegas and take a shot at the event’s \$25,000 top prize.

Last year, Australia’s Maxine Nable, Colombia’s Clara Guerrero and Malaysia’s Shalin Zulkifli all finished in the top 16 and found themselves competing on American television as part of the tournament’s five-week presence on ESPN.

This year, the U.S. Women’s Open will feature an exciting new format with the top 12 players advancing to the five-part ESPN series.

“I think it will be nice to have so many different countries participating, and it can only be a good thing,” Nable said. “It’s also nice, especially for all of the people who don’t bowl full-time, to be able to come and bowl a number of events in one trip.”

All U.S. Women’s Open participants this year will bowl three eight-game qualifying blocks over three days (Aug. 4-6) before the field is cut to the top 25 percent, who will bowl an additional 16 games on Aug. 7. The top 12 players then advance to the televised, single-game, match-play portion with the top four players receiving a first-round bye directly into the quarterfinals.

The U.S. Women’s Open, which has an entry fee of \$350, is open to any USBC female member and features a prize fund of \$150,000.

Any competitor who rolls a 300 game on one of the first four TV shows will receive a \$25,000 bonus, while a perfect game in the semifinals or championship match (the fifth show), will earn \$100,000.

For Guerrero, who lives in Texas, and Zulkifli, last year’s tournament also offered a second opportunity with the Professional Bowlers Association Women’s Tour Trials, a simultaneous event that gave the bowlers a chance to qualify for the seven-event PBA Women’s Series.

This option again will be available in 2009. The top 12 bowlers from the Tour Trials will join the six champions from last season as exempt players for the 2009-10 PBA Women’s Series.

The upcoming Women’s Series will feature five standard events, the open-field PBA Women’s World Championship, the Don and Paula Carter Mixed Doubles Championship and the season-ending PBA Women’s Series Showdown. Each standard event will have a 20-player field, up from the 16-player field used this season. The final two players in the field will come from the weekly Tour Qualifying Rounds, similar to the PBA Tour.

In all, women will be competing for nearly \$500,000 in prize money with \$10,000 going to the winner of each event.

“Last year, I would’ve qualified for the Women’s Series, and it ended up being a missed opportunity,” Nable said. “This time, I’m at least going to give myself a chance to qualify and see what happens.”

Kim Terrell-Kearney is the defending champion at the U.S. Women’s Open and will be looking to claim the coveted title for the third time. She also won the event in 2001. Competition begins Tuesday at 11 a.m. EDT. For more information on the U.S. Women’s Open, visit bowl.com.

USBC Open Championships Teams Up With Habitat For Humanity

LAS VEGAS—In a few short weeks, the bowling lanes that have occupied Cashman Center for more than seven months will be gone, but the memory of the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships will live on in Las Vegas as supplies from the 2009 tournament are used to build houses for low-income families.

Beginning in December, Cashman Center was transformed into the ultimate bowling venue, complete with 60 lanes, the world’s largest mobile video scoreboard, spectator seating and office and vendor space. The project took 45 days and used enough materials to build five three-bedroom homes.

The venue played host to more than 86,000 bowlers during the record 154-day run of the 2009 USBC Open Championships, which concluded on July 24. What provided those bowlers with a memorable tournament experience now will become the ultimate gift for local families thanks to a continuing partnership between USBC and Habitat for Humanity.

USBC already donated materials leftover from the building process, and those items were used to help complete one home.

“The donation we received from the build supplied much of the lumber and drywall needed to complete one house,” said Roger Cooper, Project Manager Habitat for Humanity-Las Vegas. “Last Friday was the dedication of that house for a family of three.”

Now that the tournament has come to an end, Habitat for Humanity will send between 200 and 250 volunteers to help dismantle the venue and take the material to benefit two more families.

“With the materials from the teardown, two more houses will be built immediately,” Cooper said. “And we’ll take the material we don’t use in building those houses to our Restore program to resell it. The profit would then go to building another house.”

In addition to plywood for roofs and wall sheeting, USBC will be donating chairs, desks and carpet for the Restore program.

“With materials that will go to Restore, USBC will sponsor almost a whole house,” Cooper said.

Habitat for Humanity-Las Vegas is its own chapter and has been helping the Las Vegas community since 1991. Since then, 70 families have benefited with a place to live.

“We try to do this every year,” said USBC Construction and Logistics Manager Chris Chartier. “When the tournament is at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., we don’t have as much in the way of materials since we don’t have too much to build, but every time we build the lanes, we try to get Habitat involved.”

Because of the harsh economy the country is facing, Habitat-Las Vegas has seen an estimated 30 percent drop in sponsorships, but thanks to this partnership with USBC and the help of volunteers, the community can still obtain benefits from a helping hand.

“The biggest thing is the power of volunteer work,” Chartier said. “You bring people from different walks of life to help. I love it when you get it all together and get the partnership to work because we help one last time on our way out of town, and the community sees long-term benefits. Our event does have a sizable economic impact in the host cities, but this opportunity is a pretty special bonus.”

The transformation of venue back into a convention center will begin immediately after the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Women’s Championships, which will occupy the tournament lanes until the afternoon of Aug. 2. The entire teardown process is expected to be completed by Aug. 14.

Pins over average and series, all-spare games, Dutch 200, triplicate series, 7-10 and Big Four split conversions have been eliminated from the special achievement program. However, certificates and a purchasable award program will be available on bowl.com for members who wish to print out or purchase items to commemorate the eliminated accomplishments. The certificate program will be available online when the new bowl.com launches Aug. 3.
