SAN BERNARDINO - For a couple of decades now I have been writing about California bowlers and time and time again these bowlers attribute their success on the lanes to Mark Baker. 

larities, but to identify the fixes as well. Whenever a coach has made suggestions to me (Barnes) regarding my game it's always been my practice to question it. There are two reasons for this. First, to fully grasp the idea behind a suggestion so I understand it and fully grasp the logic behind the it. Second, to see if the coach really knows what the heck he is talking about. According to Barnes, Mark is the only coach he's worked with who could field a seemingly endless series of bowling "whys" and, because his system covers every element of the physical game, he can continue to respond with answers that makes sense

After last weekend's PBA/PWBA Storm Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles Tournament and with just five more PWBA National Tournaments left in the 2019 season, the race for "PLAYER of THE YEAR" has tightened. As I write the race appears to be a twoplayer contest between last season's "PLAYER of THE YEAR" Shannon O'Keefe and this season's U.S. OPEN Champion Danielle McEwan.

The players will be converging on East Hartford, Connecticut on Thursday, August 1 to compete for the East Hartford Open Title and added points toward the coveted "PLAYER of THE YEAR" Award.

While McEwan has been the hottest player on tour recently, I like O'Keefe's chances to repeat as the PWBA's Top Bowler. At the PWBA Tournaments I've attended she appears to be more focused and intense than the other women. While these attributes don't guarantee winning, they are necessary if a bowler is going to be competitive.

WALTER RAY WILLIAMS JR. ADDS ANOTHER UNIQUE FEAT TO HIS RESUMÉ

PBA Hall of Famer and multi-record holder Walter Ray Williams Jr. added another unique feat to his lengthy resumé during the PBA50 River City Extreme Open in Monticello, Minn., when he bowled a 300 game using the increasingly popular two-handed technique. Unofficially (because the PBA has never tracked such a feat) Williams is the first player ever to bowl 300 games in PBA national competition using the traditional one-handed technique as well as two-handed.

In addition to his two-handed perfect game, the 59-yearold Williams also has bowled 108 "traditional" 300 games in PBA competition.

PBA West/Northwest Regional Manager Gary Mage has noted that regional competitor Dean Richards of Tacoma, Wash., also has accomplished the one-handed/twohanded 300 feat in PBA Northwest Region competition.

she increased her lead in the PWBA Player of the Year race, but she's focusing on a different mindset in 2019 as she looks to continue the momentum from another big win last month as part of Team USA.

O'Keefe paired with Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas, to win the gold medal in doubles competition at the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru.

"I haven't even looked at the points once this season," said O'Keefe, who's also won the PWBA Twin Cities Open and PWBA Tucson Open. "I can only control what I'm doing. Last year, I got so caught up in what everyone else was doing, and it made me miserable. I needed to change my mindset. I've really wanted to just have fun and soak in every moment this season. It's made everything much more enjoyable, and I'm going to keep doing what I'm doing."

Pöppler put together six consecutive strikes in the middle of her semifinal win to move past 2018 PWBA Rookie of the Year Jordan Richard of Tecumseh, Michigan, 236-207.

Pöppler, the 2017 PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles champion with Jason Sterner, had to earn her spot in the elite field this week through a pretournament qualifier (PTQ) on Thursday at Silver Lanes, since she sat outside the top 24 in points heading into competition this week.

She led the 60-player field Thursday and continued her momentum throughout the main event. Her second-place finish also helped her move into the top 24 in points, meaning she will not have to bowl in the PTQ next week at the Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open.

"I started pretty well in the first match, but I knew the second match was going to be tougher because Shannon had moved left with some surface, so I had to jump left," Pöppler said. "When I really needed good shots, I couldn't make them, so I can't blame anyone else.

"I had to bowl the PTQ, and I don't think the pattern seemed that different when we practiced later that day. I felt pretty confident, and I just tried to enjoy the fact that I made it into the field. I'm glad I won't have to bowl the PTQ next week in Louisville."

Richard advanced to the semifinals by delivering in the 10th frame against Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez, 199-182. Working on a strike in the ninth frame, Richard rolled a strike and toppled seven pins to shut out Rodriguez.

Rodriguez bounced back from an early miscue in her opening match against Latvia's Diana Zavjalova to collect a 212-193 victory. Rodriguez missed a 10 pin in the third frame but rolled strikes on five of her next six shots on the way to the win.

A total of 32 players earned spots in this week's main field. The top 24 players on the 2019 PWBA points list (through the U.S. Women's Open) secured automatic spots in the field, while a PTQ held Thursday at Silver Lanes determined the bowlers filling the rest of the field.

Three players in the elite field - Erin McCarthy of Omaha, Nebraska, and Singapore's Shayna Ng and Cherie Tan - did not compete this week, which allowed 11 bowlers to advance from the PTQ.

The main field bowled 16 games Friday to determine the top 12 competitors, which bowled an additional six games Saturday. Total pinfall for 22 games determined the five finalists

The 2019 season will continue next week as the Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open heads to Executive Strike and Spare in Louisville, Kentucky, from Aug. 8-10. The stepladder finals will air live on CBS Sports Network on Aug. 10 at 5 p.m. Eastern.

"That's why I bowl right there," the 61-year-old Voss said of his victory. "I wanted the 300 game but it probably turned out more exiting the way it ended. It doesn't matter how old you are or how many times you've done it, winning never gets old.

"I was really into it and Harry was too," Voss added. "We were really pushing each other. I got a little slow with that shot in the ninth frame but fortunately I learned from it."

Voss had a 13-3 overall match play record including a 6-0 run in the final round which contributed to his surge to earn the top seed for the stepladder finals.

"I didn't feel I was bowling that great early in the tournament but when I got to match play I figured out I was just arcing the ball too much," Voss said. "As it turned out I could just move a little further to the right and not put so much arc on the ball."

PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia, 72, led the first four rounds of the tournament but eventually finished sixth, losing to Mohr in the position round match in the final match play round to miss the finals.

The tournament was named in honor of longtime PBA50 competitor Mel Wolf who passed away in 2011. The one-time PBA50 Tour titlist was the driving force in bringing the senior tour to Jackson in 1992.

TEAMMATES TAKE U12 TITLES AT 2019 JUNIOR GOLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

ALLEN PARK, Mich. – Katelyn Abigania of San Diego successfully defended her U12 girls title and her USA Bowling teammate, Elias O'Hollaren of San Diego, won the U12 boys title at the 2019 Junior Gold Championships presented by the Brands of Ebonite International.

Both Katelyn and Elias were the No. 3 seeds in the championship rounds that aired Tuesday on CBS Sports Network from Thunderbowl Lanes.

Not only did each have to win two matches on the TV show, but both had to defeat the opponent who sent them to the elimination bracket during match play.

"It's amazing, I'm just kind of speechless right now," Katelyn said after her victory. "Coming into this tournament, with high expectations and a lot of pressure on me, I definitely pulled it off, especially for me being only 12. And now, winning back to back ... (two-time Junior Gold champion) Solomon (Salama) is like 16 now, and he's doing big stuff, so I can't wait to see what's in my future."

Katelyn was the top qualifier for match play, but lost her second match in the bracket to Abby Starkey of Schaumburg, Illinois, 379-359, in the two-game total-pins match. Katelyn then had to win two matches to earn the No. 3 seed for the televised finals.

In the opening match against Gianna Brandolino of Joliet, Illinois, Katelyn trailed by 15 pins through seven frames. But Gianna suffered a 7-10 split in the eighth frame and then missed a single-pin spare to open the door for Katelyn, who stayed clean for a 180-174 victory.

"Like last year, I said it's never over until the game's actually over," Katelyn said. "I thought I was going to lose the first match. And during match play, since I lost my second match, I thought it was over but here I am again."

In the title match, Katelyn had a rematch against Abby.

Abby could not convert spares in the first, fourth and fifth frames, and though Katelyn did miss a single-pin spare in the fourth frame, she also had three strikes in the first five frames to build a 26-pin lead. She would stay clean the rest of the game, including striking out in the final frame, for a 196-147 victory.

In the boys final, Elias followed his USA Bowling teammate's lead, winning the title as the No. 3 seed. Elias and Katelyn are on the SDLV team in the USA Bowling National Championships.

In the match-play bracket, Elias lost his opening match to Duke Knudsen of Redmond, Washington. But Elias also made it back through the elimination bracket to claim the title.

"It feels great, especially because I was down after I lost that first match," Elias said of winning the title. "I felt like I was done, because I bowled so poorly in the first match. I came in not wanting to get into the elimination bracket, because I think the elimination bracket brings out the best of everyone."

In his opening TV match against Braden McDonough of Coppell, Texas, Elias strung together three strikes, starting in the third frame, to build a 32-pin lead and would go on to take a 200-168 victory.

Elias then faced Duke again, this time with the national title on the line.

Trailing by three pins through seven frames, Elias watched Duke trip a 4 pin for a strike in the eighth frame. In the ninth, Knudson was able to convert his 2-4-5-8 leave, but it left the door open for Elias.

He struck in the ninth and then posted strikes on his first two shots in the final frame to take the title, 211-197.

"I didn't know he was going to miss in the ninth, so I was just thinking to put pressure on him, make him have to double in the 10th to win," Elias said when asked his thoughts heading into the final frames. "And then he missed, and I was like, 'I can shut him out now."

Competitors in the U12 division bowled 16 qualifying games over four days (four games each day) before the field was cut. The advancers then bowled an additional four games to trim the field to the top eight boys and top eight girls for match play.

Match play was a double-elimination bracket consisting of two games with total pinfall determining the winner.

The U12 division had 262 boys and 134 girls.

TITLES DETERMINED AT 2019 USA BOWLING NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The event brought together the top youth teams in the country to compete for national championships in the two divisions. The finals were taped for broadcast on CBS Sports Network

CBS Sports Network will televise the U12 title match on Aug. 20 at 8 p.m. (Eastern) and the U15 final will air Aug. 27 at 7 p.m. (Eastern).

The Chesapeake Bay Strikers, the Northeast Region champions, faced South Central Region champion USA Bowl for the 15-and-under team title.

The opening game of the best-three-of-five Baker matches started with a string of strikes before each team went 9-spare in the fifth frame. When USA Bowl failed to convert a 6-8 split in the seventh, the Strikers took a 10-pin lead and held it the rest of the way in a 247-237 victory.

Both teams struggled in Game 2, but James Bennett's pair of strikes in the final frame was enough to lift the Strikers to a 180-167 victory.

With a chance to sweep USA Bowl, the Strikers strung together seven consecutive strikes for a 249-207 victory to claim the U15 national title.

In addition to Bennett, teams members include John Banfield, Nicholas Menendez, Nate Trentler and Laney Wells.

The USA Bowl team was comprised of Jacob Ballenger, Ellie Drescher, Ethan Gomez, Bryant Griffith and Matthew Reed.

In the U12 title match, SDLV opened with a 189-169 victory over DKJ Pro Shop, but then proceeded to drop the next two games, by scores of 136-189 and 166-188, before rebounding with a 174-154 victory to force a deciding fifth game.

DKJ Pro Shop, the Northeast Region champion, had five open frames in the final game, and the Southwest Region champion SDLV Strikers were able to hold on for a 155-144 victory and the title.

The Strikers are comprised of Katelyn Abigania, the two-time U12 Junior Gold champion, Sebastian Huffman, Avery Domaguin and Elias O'Hollaren.

Kai Strothers, who rolled nine consecutive strikes over Games 2 and 3 to pace DKJ Pro Shop, was joined on the team by William Cunningham, Donaven Kline, and Ronin Rivera.

The USA Bowling National Championships brought together the champions from 16 regional tournaments in the U12 and U15 divisions. The 32 teams bowled 15 Baker matches in qualifying to determine seeding for the double-elimination match-play bracket. Teams bowled the best-two-of-three Baker matches to determine the teams for the national title matches.

It was another eventful title match for Carlson as he won the Hamilton Lanes Open in a roll-off with Mohr after tying in the title match 279-279.

"It was unbelievable to win the first one and just as remarkable to win the second one," said the 57-year-old Carlson. "I've always felt I could win out here and I have the confidence. I don't know if there's anything like a normal way to win a match but it seems like every match I've bowled (in a stepladder) has had more than its share of excitement."

After winning the recent PBA50 Spectrum Lanes Open, Eugene McCune of Munster, Indiana finished 10th in the JAX 60 Classic which was good enough to lock up 2019 PBA50 Rookie of the Year honors.

PBA Hall of Fame Walter Ray Williams Jr. had already clinched his third PBA50 Player of the Year honor but his quest for a record 15th career PBA50 Tour title will have to wait until the 2020 season after he just missed advancing out of the first match play round finishing the tournament in 17th. Williams started the season with three consecutive wins, including the PBA50 National Championship, and never finished out of the top 10 in any other event until his 17th-place finish in Jackson.



LIMA – Jakob Butturff, who is in the midst of a career year in Go Bowling! PBA Tour competition, kept his momentum rolling as a member of Team USA in the Pan American Games that concluded Tuesday in Lima, Peru.

The 25 year old lefthander from Tempe, Ariz., broke the Pan Am Games six-game scoring record in his first round of doubles qualifying, and then broke his own record by 22 pins

the next day for a 12-game total of 3,054 pins (a 254.5 avereage). 

Important Important now before I go into this first of all the bowling center has nothing to do with this statement so anyone that has a comment about it or complaint then you make it to me Annette Anderson. Now unless you are working or involved with youth leagues most of you probably don't know anything about what is going on right now. But unfortuantly it is going to effect the adult leagues very much so I hope you read this and pay attention.

Now I have been involved with bowling since I was 5 and have been on local and state boards since I was 14 and running Youth leagues since the age of 17. So it's not like I'm new to the game and I'm currently 51 years old. I love the kids to death and those that know me know I will do anything and everything for the kids know matter how much pain I may be in. So, down to the point here because of a law that has come into effect back in 2017, any sport that has any child under the age of 17 in it all officers and participates over the age of 18 must participate in the SafeSport course to teach about reporting sexual abuse or misconduct or other violations and bullying of a child.

Now I'm all for protecting the children and going through the RVP if we are in charge or helping with coaching but just to be bowling with a child this is going way overboard in my feelings especially when it's the child's parent. So my advice for all you adult leagues make sure you put a rule in your league that nobody under the age of 18 is allowed in your league even if the parent signs the parent consent form. Otherwise everyone in your league must comply with this new law and complete the SafeSport course through Bowl. com or your league could not be certified, your card could be pulled or you could be suspended from USBC all together.

Just tell the youth bowler to stay in the youth league until they turn 18 and come back and you will be more than happy to let them in your league. At least they can earn scholarship for college in the youth league.




