# Norm Duke Closes the Deal to Win PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship

PBA Hall of Famer beats Ryan Shafer, 236-222, in title match for first PBA50 win of the season and fifth of his career

KOKOMO, Ind. – After two tough losses in PBA50 Tour majors earlier in the season, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., was starting to question his ability to close the deal.

He regained his confidence Tuesday by defeating five-time PBA Tour winner and stepladder finals top qualifier Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 236-222, in the title match to win the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship presented by Track at Dave Small's Heritage Lanes for his first win of the season.

"I'm just elated to get

the monkey off my back," said the 54-year-old Duke, who finished second in the PBA50 National Championship and USBC Senior Masters. "In my opinion a second-place finish is one of the worst places you can finish."

In the title match, Duke got off to a strong start with four strikes in a row and took advantage of an open frame by Shafer in the third frame when he left the 4-6-7-10 split. Shafer, whose second-place finish was his career best PBA50 Tour finish, was able to make a run by throwing five consecutive strikes to close the continued on page 4

### ZAVJALOVA CAPTURES PEPSI PWBA ST. PETERSBURG-CLEARWATER OPEN

SEMINOLE, Fla. – A high-scoring week at Seminole Lanes became a much more difficult test in the stepladder finals of the Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open on Saturday.

But No. 5 seed Diana Zavjalova of Latvia was able to fight through to win her opening match, then climbed the stepladder to capture her third PWBA title with a 201-158 victory over top-seed Daria Pajak of Poland.

The finals of the Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open, which had five bowlers who are



all in their 20s, were televised live on CBS Sports Network.

Zavjalova, who cele-

brated her 27th birthday on Wednesday, admitted that after a high-scoring week, she didn't know what to

expect with the finals on a pair of lanes not used during the week.




### **MARK SCROGGINS**, **JOE ELLISON TO ENTER PBA SOUTHWEST HALL OF FAME**

The PBA Southwest Region has announced that 13time PBA Regional Tour champion Mark Scroggins of Canyon, Texas, and long-time PBA Southwest tournament host Joe Ellison of Junction City, Kan., will be the 2018 inductees into the PBA Southwest Region Hall of Fame on Sept. 8 at the Grand Casino Hotel & Resort in Shawnee,



match but Duke through a nine-count on his first ball in the 10th frame to seal the win.

"The main thing for me was to manage the pocket hits," said Duke, who qualified second for the finals. "You had to work to put a string of strikes together because light hits weren't getting it done. "When you did get on a string you're adjusting on every shot," he added. "It's not like you get lined up and you can stay in one place for a while."

Duke, who won his fifth career PBA50 Tour title, last won on the tour for players 50 and over in the 2017 Race City Open in Mooresville, N.C.

"I've had a lot of second-place finishes," said Duke, a 38-time winner on the PBA Tour. "I knew I would win again but I just didn't know when. I needed this and I'm glad I won it the way I did." In the semifinal match, Duke beat No. 3 qualifier Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 244-226, to advance to the title match. Kretzer' third-place finish was his third top-five of the season.

In the opening match, No. 4 qualifier Dale Csuhta of Wadsworth, Ohio, making his fifth career stepladder finals appearance and trying for his first PBA50 Tour win, defeated No. 5 qualifier two-time PBA50 Tour winner Jack Jurek of Lackawana, N.Y., 236-207.

In the second match Kretzer beat Csuhta, 216-201, to advance to the semifinal match

"I was nervous," Zavjalova said. "I didn't throw it well in the first game. Once I got through the first game, I got more comfortable, kept moving left and the other girls were struggling. I just kept moving left and just got more comfortable as the games went on."

An early double in the title match helped Zavjalova to an 18-pin lead after six frames, and when Pajak, 25, missed a 10-pin spare attempt in 7th, her second open in the match, Zavjalova simply continued to make her spares.

"I did not see the right shape, and when I threw it good, I didn't carry," Pajak said. "I tried to make adjustments, and that's when I threw bad shots. And you cannot win when you miss two spares."

In the semifinal match against Liz Kuhlkin, 24, of Schenectady, New York, Zavjalova was in a groove, striking on six of her first seven shots. Kuhlkin, who ran the stepladder to win the U.S. Women's Open in June, managed only two strikes and suffered her first loss in a stepladder finals,

Zavjalova had missed two spare attempts in the opening five frames of her second match against Jordan Richard, 22, of Tipton, Michigan. After a missed 10-pin spare attempt in the fifth frame, Zavjalova did not miss anything the rest of the match, finishing with seven consecutive strikes in a 226-172 victory.

"I hate missing spares," Zavjalova said. "Once I missed, I sat down, decided to start fresh and said 'Let's do this."

In the opening match, Zavjalova slipped past Verity Crawley, 24, of England, 185-168, in a match that took some big momentum swings in the final frames. Zavjalova had a 10-pin lead entering the ninth frame, but left the 2-4-10 on her first shot and could not convert.

Crawley, with a chance to clear the deficit, hit the pocket only to leave the 7-10 split. Zavjalova struck on her first shot in the final frame to clinch.

For Zavjalova, winning the title meant going through Crawley in the opening match and Pajak in the title match. The three were teammates at Webber International and travel together on the PWBA Tour.

"We've known each other for a long time and I love the girls more than anything," Zavjalova said. "But it's really tough to bowl against them. I'm happy that I won, but Verity and Daria bowled amazing all week. That's the beauty of the game – it comes down to one game in the finals and it worked in my favor."

The Pepsi PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open is the first of three elite-field events that will take place in August. Following the U.S. Women's Open, the top 24 players on the PWBA points list earned their way into the elite-field events with the remainder of the 32-player field determined through a pre-tournament qualifier (PTQ).

Players had 16 games of qualifying on Friday before the field was cut to the top 12. Six additional games on Saturday morning determined the five players for the stepladder finals.



### **HAUGEN HOLDS BIG LEAD AS PBA50 PLAYER OF YEAR RACE ENTERS FINAL TWO EVENTS**

With the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship, presented by Track, in the books, two events remain on the PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling schedule to decide the 2018 PBA50 Player of the Year race plus 12 berths in a new end-of-season PBA50 Storm Invitational that will be held at Planet Fun Bowling and Entertainment Center in Shallotte, N.C., Sept. 28-30.



### **USBC/BPAA ANNOUNCE CHANGES FOR 2018 U.S. OPEN**

The U.S. Open, the final major championship on the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, will include some notable breaks from tradition when it takes place Oct. 24-31 at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kan.

- This year's U.S. Open will use four different lane conditioning patterns for qualifying and match play, with a fresh application of oil planned before each squad. The oil patterns will be posted before the start of the official practice sessions.





# PBA50 PLAYERS IN HAMMOND TEACH A LESSON ABOUT THE VALUE OF A PIN

There's a school of thought in bowling that you should never throw away a pin, and if you need an object lesson, consider what happened during the PBA50 South Shore Open at Olympic Lanes in Hammond, Ind., last week.

- The first cut after 16 games of qualifying saw Ernie Segura Jr. survive with a 3,475 total, one pin ahead of PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III and Rick Zakrajsek, who went home with 3,474 pins.
- In the five-game cashers round, PBA Hall of Famer Tom Baker and fellow PBA50 competitor Leroy Johnson tied for seventh place, advancing to modified match play with 1.086 totals one pin ahead of Dale Traber.
- In the first five-game modified match play elimination round, Tom Baker again slipped through, qualifying eighth with a 1,131 total one pin ahead of Leroy Johnson, who went home.

Thus in three consecutive rounds, players saw their chance to remain in the title hunt disappear by a single pin. It happens more often than you might think. Remember the old adage: when in doubt, go for count...


