

#### Peters and Hamilton Capture 2006 Teen Masters National Titles

ORLANDO, FL—17-year-old Jake Peters, Decatur, Illinois and 16-year-old Brittni Hamilton, Webster, New York are the 2006 Teen Masters National Champions, each winning the title at Universal Studios Orlando in the Sound Stage 33 Arena August 6. The show was taped for airing on ESPN2 October 16. The qualifying portion of the event was held at Boardwalk Entertainment Center in Orlando earlier in the week.

Peters, a senior at Hillside Bethel Christian School, defeated Jon Brady, Clearwater, Florida 218-143 to win the \$7500 scholarship award for the boy's championship. Peters started the match with three strikes and never looked back, as Brady struggled to find a line which never appeared. When Peters added a double in the 7th, it was over.

"It's been amazing," said Peters. "I won't really feel it until I look back, but this week has been the greatest experience of my life."

Hamilton defeated Ashley Galante, Palm Harbor, Florida 227-174 to win the girls title. In that match, she rolled a clean game, and a four-bagger in frames 7 through 10 sealed the victory. "The key shot was the strike in the seventh," she said. "I was struggling on the right lane, and I finally found it."

Galante opened the first frame and trailed the entire match. She doubled in the seventh, but it couldn't match her opponents four-bagger. "I guess second isn't too terrible in a big event like this," she added. "I had fun and I'll be back next time."

After the girls and boys champions were decided, they squared off against each other in a third game for an additional \$2500 in scholarship money. In that game, Peters prevailed 223-179 on the wings of a five-bagger in frames four through eight.

The runners-up, Jon Brady and Ashley Galante, each won a \$3,750 scholarship for their outstanding performance.

The 2006 Teen Masters, televised on ESPN2 sports television, is Bowling's most exciting and rewarding youth singles championship event. After he retired he kept in touch with tenpins, working part time at a number of centers and bowled continuously signing up recently as member of Linbrook's Monday Lunch Bunch carrying an OC Book Average of 146.

No, he didnt't make any high score honor rolls. But he did bowl in many national (ABC) tournaments, probably 50 starting back in the 1950s taking the train with Joe Anderson or flying with this writer on a DC-6 or was that a DC-3?

Stan put in many hours working/supporting Cal-State events, recognized as a Hall of Fame member.

If it was tenpin bowling Stan was there working with civic, industry and bowling leaders.

Who should roll the Final Frame for Stan today at Linbrook?

#### USBC Board Changes Rule On High Score Awards

"High Score" awards will not be issued during unopposed bowling sessions

GREENDALE, Wis. —The United States Bowling Congress will no longer issue its "High Score" awards for scores rolled during unopposed bowling sessions before or after regularly scheduled league times.

The USBC Board of Directors has adopted the interim rule change, which takes effect immediately and will be enforced for the 2006-07 season.

"Issuing USBC High Score awards for scores bowled unopposed has become a growing concern," said USBC President Michael Carroll. "USBC member delegates voted about a decade ago to allow awards for honor scores bowled without a league officer or appointed representative present. The objective of this rule change is to protect the credibility of the sport and the USBC awards program."

# Tired Of The Same Old League?

LAKE FOREST — Winter leagues are now forming and it's the same old thing, 4 and 5 person teams scheduled to bowl 34-plus weeks. It's been the same old thing year after year only to be followed by the typical trio summer league. We are breaking the mold at Forest Lanes.

The flexibility of USBC Playing Rules allows members to bowl their league sessions before or after their scheduled league times as individuals or teams, commonly referred to as "pre-bowling" or "post-bowling"

USBC will continue to recognize several accomplishments performed in unopposed pre- or post-bowling sessions with its line of "Special Achievement" awards, including game and series honors not in the High Score category. High Score awards will still be issued to teams that pre- or post-bowl their head-to-head matches.

USBC bylaws give the Board authority to amend rules subject to review by USBC delegates, who will have the opportunity to consider the issue at the 2007 USBC Convention, scheduled for March 28-31 in Nashville, Tenn.

teers man the pins, setting them up and sending back the bowling ball after each shot.

For the United States Bowling Congress Youth members competing in the event, it's a totally different atmosphere than they have experienced in the past.

The most noticeable difference, players said, was the lack of noise inside the Sound Stage. With no pinsetters to hum, clank and set up pins, bowling becomes an eerily quiet sport.

"Having no pinsetters is different, but it's worth it," said defending Teen Masters champion John Szczerbinski of North Tonwanda, N.Y., who advanced to the final four on the boys' side Saturday. "The pure silence is pretty unreal. You don't hear anything. You could hear a pin drop - hopefully you hear 10 of them drop down the lane."

The arena setting itself was a change of pace for the bowlers, who bowled the qualifying and opening match-play rounds at nearby Boardwalk Entertainment Center.

"The lighting is way different, and I'm not used to having this many people watch me bowl," said Brett Cunningham of Clay, N.Y., another member of the boys' final four. "It was definitely different. It seems if you made a bad shot, it made it a lot tougher to get a break. If you went high it was definitely a split. The lanes are really nice, though. It's beautiful."

Although the retro setup is unique, could bowling's past become its future? John Davis, CEO of Kegel, which serves as the official lane maintenance provider for USBC, thinks it's a possibility.

The arena setting his company created this weekend could easily be used for future television finals, Davis said. In fact, the upcoming Women's Challenge in Las Vegas will use one of the lanes.

"This is the first time we've done an arena show and it took us three days to set it up because there are four lanes," Davis said. "In the future, we could do two lanes in one day and one lane in even less time."

Davis estimates that installing lanes without pinsetters cuts

the cost of creating arena lanes in half. Combine the savings and the ability to build the lanes quickly and it creates the perfect scenario for getting arena finals on television even more, Davis said.

A total of 16 players got to experience the Kegel's arena setup this weekend, as action shifted to Sound Stage 33 for the round of eight for both the boys and girls.

The Teen Masters concludes on Sunday at 1 p.m. Eastern when the championship matches are taped for broadcast on ESPN2. The show is scheduled to air on Oct. 16 at 9:30 p.m. Eastern.

The Teen Masters National Finals features more than 300 of the best high-school aged bowlers in the country. Players advanced through local qualifying events and are competing for \$50,000 in scholarships this week. The boys and girls champions will each receive a \$7,500 scholarship.


