Field Set For Semi-Finals at U.S. Women's Open

LAS VEGAS—Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of Keller, Texas, and Missy Bellinder of Fullerton, Calif., secured the last two spots in the semifinals at the 2009 U.S. Women's Open, a United States Bowling Congress event on Sunday afternoon.

Dorin-Ballard defeated Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 258-225, while Bellinder knocked off top seed Shannon O'Keefe of Arlington, Texas, 279-213, as the winners moved on to Sunday night's semifinals. They are joined by Tammy Boomer-shine of North Ogden, Utah, and Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix, who advanced to the semifinals on Saturday.

After leaving a 10 pin in the opening frame, Dorin-Ballard rattled off six consecutive strikes to pull away from Barnes. Four 10-pin leaves in the first eight frames kept Barnes from staying close to Dorin-Ballard.

Nation Wins BWAA July Bowler of the Month

ARLINGTON, TX — Stefanie Nation of Arlington, Texas has been named the July 2009 Kegel Bowler of the Month by the Bowling Writers Association of America.

Nation captured the singles gold medal at the World Tenpin Bowling Association Women's Championships in Las Vegas. After qualifying as top seed, Nation defeated Krista Pollanen of Finland, 220-195. Nation then downed Mexico's Sandra Gongora in the final match, 167-131.

Nation became the third

American woman to win the gold medal at the WTBA Women's Championships, following Kelly Kulick in 1999 and Shannon O'Keefe in 2007.

Other nominees capturing substantial votes were Stephen Conn, Crestwood, Ky. and Maggie Zakrzewski, Palatine, Ill., USBC Junior Gold Boys and Girls Division winners and USBC Youth Open All-Events Boys and Girls Division winners Andrew Koff, Miami, Fla. and Katie Thornton, Chesapeake, Va.

CA State Queens to be held at Yorba Linda Bowl

YORBA LINDA—The California State Queens concluded their qualifier through the Women's State Championships that was held at Forest Lanes. Qualifiers used their scratch Doubles and Singles scores. The last weekend of the tournament added one last qualifier to the 14 seeded positions that will compete in the finals this weekend at Yorba Linda Bowl in Orange County. Paula Vidad from Moreno Valley was top qualifier through the Championships with a score of 1,359 and teammate Laurie Soto was not far behind in second with 1,320. The last person to make the cut was Chevonne Christian from Ontario with a 1,199.

For those that did not qualify, we urge you to compete in the Last Chance Squad to be held this Saturday, August 15 at 1pm (Check-in at 12pm). We will be filling 16 seeded spots from that qualifier to complete the field of 30.

The cost is \$125, but if you bowled in the Championship qualifier, the price is only \$100.

And, if you already qualified from the Championships but want to “practice” that day at Yorba Linda, the cost is only \$45 to bowl as a pacer.

MOMS RULE AT 2009 QUBICA AMF INTERNATIONAL FAMILY TOURNAMENT

Top Teams Each Net \$5000 Scholarships

ARLINGTON—It was mother's day at the 34th QubicaAMF International Family Tournament (IFT) where moms led four of the six top finishers in the two-day event held July 30-August 1 at Main Event Entertainment in Grapevine, a few miles north of the International Bowling Campus in Arlington. In the Parent/Teen division, 15 year-old Mark Williams and mother Melissa (Ind.) took home the big trophy, while 12 year-old Erica Durbin and mother Donna (N.C.) won the Parent/Youth division capping two days of competition.

In the Parent/Teen Division, the Williams' posted a 212-200 score to beat

14 year-old Mariah Maugham and dad, Joe (Texas), while 17 year-old Joshua Phillabaum and his father Robert (Md.) finished third. In the Parent/Youth Division, the Durbin doubles team bested 10 year-old Melecia Martho and mom, Tandreya Jackson (Calif.), 247-201. Third place went to 11 year-old Conner and Melissa Mumm (Neb.).

Both champions each earned scholarship checks worth \$5000 toward their college education according to the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America. Second place was worth a \$3000 scholarship and third place, \$2500 in each division.

Additional scholarships of \$500 each for boys and girls in each division were awarded to Youth and Teen Division bowlers for bowling the highest six-game scratch total during the qualifying round. The overall scholarship purse was worth \$70,000.

67 teams representing 27 states as well as Canada won their state finals to make it to North Texas. After competing all day Friday, the top 8 teams in each division advanced to a 'Baker-format' match play round on Saturday morning. The afternoon session saw the top three teams in each division play in a Baker stepladder final match to decide the winners.

The crowd was treated to a little added excitement on Friday when 17 year-old Nathan Fore (N.C.) nearly pulled off a perfect game, leaving only the 4 pin in the 10th frame to post a scratch 299.

As part of competition weekend, contestants and their families attended a welcome reception Thursday evening at the Sheraton Arlington Hotel (host hotel) that featured a strolling magician, face painter and a tattoo artist who offered temporary body art. On Friday night families attended a Texas Rangers baseball game (vs. the Seattle Mariners) where they enjoyed the game in the all-you-can-eat section of the Rangers Ballpark in Arlington.

On Saturday PBA pros Norm Duke, Mike Machuga and Bob Learn Jr. put on a trick shot demonstration during the lunch break. The trio of tricksters showed off their skills for nearly an hour then stayed a while afterwards to sign autographs.

At the awards banquet Saturday evening, Duke, Machuga and Learn fielded questions from the group and stayed late to sign more autographs. In addition to all the awards, tournament chairman Jack Moran presented Nathan Fore with a special crystal pin, acknowledging his near-perfect game.

Contestants from across North America won their state competitions qualifying them for an all-expense paid trip to Dallas-Fort Worth to compete for the scholarships. The IFT is the only sporting event in the United States in which parents participate with children and youth for an International Championship and scholarship funds.

The 2009 IFT was made possible by the generous contributions of title sponsor QubicaAMF Worldwide and presenting sponsors Pepsi-Cola, the official soft drink of bowling along with Frito Lay and Nestle. 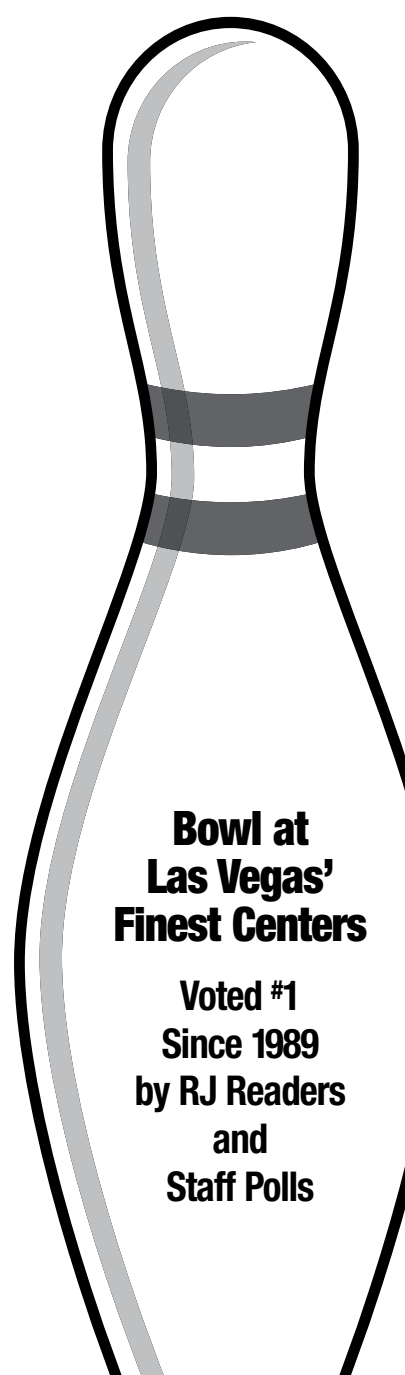

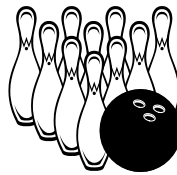

Absolutely no sound when the ball hit the lane on about the third board and hit the one three pocket...result many strikes and they seldom missed the spares.

In the 1995 World Championship we were introduced Chinese Taipei using the Spinner or Helicopter ball for a Gold Medal. And yes three of the bowlers used it this year and one was a lefthander. We had not seen a lefthander before but they defeated TEAM USA for the Gold Medal in the final Championship Round.

Stefanie Nation of TEAM USA with a total of 1361, average 225.83 out scored 227 other bowlers in the Singles semifinals. She then won the first Gold Medal by defeating Krista Pollenen 220-195 and Mexico's Sandra Gongora Silver Medal 167-131 who won a Bronze Medal with Anja Ginge Jensen of Denmark.

In DOUBLES, the four top countries in the semifinals were Korea, Korea, Denmark and Australia with the Gold Medal won by Korea number two team, Silver Medal by Australia and Bronze Medals by Korea and Denmark.

The TEAM USA TRIO Team of Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Liz Johnson and Stefanie Nation in the semifinal rolled the third highest trios score in tournament history and knocked off No. 4 Japan 742-659. Chinese Taipei qualified second behind Team USA. Chinese Taipei defeated Denmark in the semifinals, 610-605. In the Championship for the Gold Medal Chinese Taipei (with their spinner shots defeated TEAM USA 660-602) which won the Silver Medal.

TEAM EVENT top four teams that advanced to championship round behind 1. Korea (with their swinging arms) and TEAM USA with Carolyn Dorin-Ballard with games of 257-248-255-255-212-185/3090 an average of 235.33 (highest six game total in the tournament), Liz Johnson, Stefie Nation, Kim Terrell Kearney bowling three games each and Lynda Barnes and Wendy Macpherson one game each. Singapore and Sweden finished the field. In the Semifinal round Korea defeated Sweden 1041-94 and the United States defeated Singapore 1035-934. In the Championship game, Korea (with their swinging arm) defeated TEAM USA 1175-1071. Another Gold for Korea and another Silver for TEAM USA.

MASTERS EVENT - Top 16 bowlers with highest 18 games score for the previous events with TEAM USA having Carolyn Dorin-Ballard (who won Bronze Medal for third position winner), Stefie Nation, Liz Johnson among them. Clara Guerrero, Columbia won the ALL-EVENT Gold Medal. The Masters Event is Best-of-five-single elimination match play. GOLD Medal: Clara Guerrero, Columbia. Silver Medal: Hwang Sun-OK, Korea. Bronze Medal: Son Yun-Hee, Korea and Gang Hye-Korea.

It was a great week for the Korean bowlers (with the swinging arms) with 2 Gold, 1 Silver, and 2 Bronze medals the most by one country.

TEAM USA won 1 Gold, 2 Silver and 1 Bronze, the second place by one country.

This year's tournament was the first time professionals were allowed to compete at the WTA Women's Championships and 45 countries. It was very satisfying to see all the bowlers that were in good physical shape plus many younger bowlers being such good bowlers. A big banquet on Sunday night finished off this very successful event.

"I knew I had a good shot on both lanes even though I was using a different ball on each lane," Bellinder said. "The shot in the fifth frame I thought I threw it pretty good off my hand. It went high, so I adjusted after that and kept going."

To reach the quarterfinals, Barnes defeated Colombian native Clara Guerrero, 218-164, while Bellinder beat Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., 212-202.

The championship round, scheduled to begin at 9 p.m. EDT, will feature the four quarterfinal winners battling in head-to-head matches until the champion is determined. If a player shoots 300 in the championship round, she will earn a \$100,000 bonus. The shows will air on ESPN on five consecutive Sundays at 2 p.m. EDT beginning Sept. 13. The schedule is subject to change.

The top 12 players after 40 games of qualifying advanced to the televised portion of the event with the top four finishers, O'Keefe, Dorin-Ballard, Kelly Kulick and Boomer-shine, earning byes in the first round.
