Presenting: Bowling News Feature Writer...

Fred Eisenhammer and Eric Soundheimer have been friends and work colleagues for over 30 years.

As sportswriters, they’ve tackled their share of live grid-iron contests, but they’ve also approached the game through the lens of history.

Eisenhammer and Soundheimer co-authored “College Football’s Most Memorable Games” in 1992. Eighteen years later, they’ve updated the book, which is expected to be released at the end of September.

“We want these games to come alive,” Eisenhammer said.

“College Football’s Most Memorable Games” highlights some of the greatest moments since 1913.

Most folks know Soundheimer for his tireless work covering prep sports for the Los Angeles Times. Eisenhammer, an Agoura Hills resident, started his professional career in 1974 with the Pekin (Ill.) Daily

Times. He spent 20 years at the Los Angeles Times as a copy editor in the sports, business and metro departments.

The friends met as budding sports reporters at the Los Angeles Daily News. In fact, Soundheimer replaced Eisenhammer as prep sports editor at the DailyNews in 1980.

“It’s a fun situation,” said Soundheimer, who lives in Tarzana. “As the years have gone by, we said if we ever write another book, which games should we add? And there have been some great games since it was published in 1992. . . . People who love college football will enjoy the book. We tried to present the facts but make it somewhat entertaining. Obviously schools that have very loyal fans will want to read about the games over and over.”

The book encapsulates the rich history of college football in compact, riveting chapters.

“I’m excited that history’s being preserved,” Eisenham-

“Along with the Bowling Proprietors’ Association of America, our partners in youth bowling, we are honored to receive this award that recognizes the outstanding work of youth volunteers across the country and the efforts of the International Bowling Campus Youth Development team,” USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy (right) said. “Programs such as Junior Gold, USA Bowling and

Bowler’s Ed represent the values of the STRIVE Award and we are thrilled to be selected from a group of such outstanding youth organizations.”

USBC was among five finalists for the award. Other finalists were the Great Lakes Adaptive Sports Association of Lake Forest, Illinois, the Greater Lafayette (Indiana) Regional Soccer Alliance, Pop Warner Little Scholars of Langhorne, Pennsylvania, and the York (Pennsylvania) Jewish Community Center.

Online voting results com-

bined with judges’ scores determined the award winner. The STRIVE Award for Organization of the Year will be presented on NCYS Youth Sports Day on Tuesday, July 14, on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C., during National Youth Sports Week.

Along with the award, USBC will receive a \$5,000 donation that will go the Youth Education Services (YES) Fund, which has provided such programs as the High School Grant Assistance Program and USA Bowling.

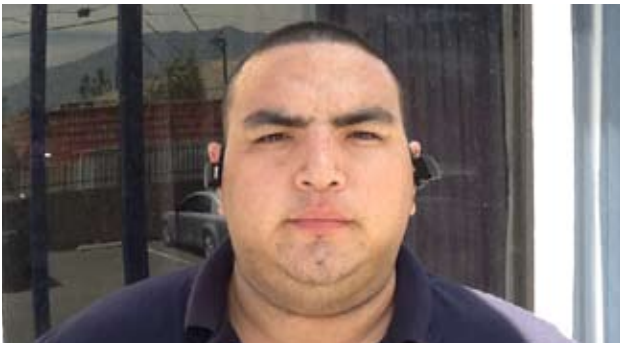

a couple good days of bowling and i hope there will be more events like this to compete in" Bidwell said who now lives in Wichita after graduating a couple months ago from Wichita State where he bowled in college.Earlier in the week Bidwell and Tommy Jones of Simpsonville,South Carolina, placed third in Men's doubles. The had dropped to fifth after nine games then pulled within three pins of third place Mexico heading into the final game. Bidwell rolled a 245 game,but Jones was having problems but still had a chance in the final frame with a mark on a pair where he had thrown five splits in eight frames.Jones stepped up and and buried the first two shots to push Team USA in Bronze position!!!!" Thank goodness Devin bowled 245 because i was on a 150 pace" said Jones who finished with a 164, this game is very frustrating,and thats one thing that makes it great. While they may reflect a bowlers physical abilities they do not necessarily reflect on how well a bowler performs when a game is on the line. A big time bowler is one who performs when a game is on the line. Rudy Powell is a BIG TIME BOWLER.

The SoCAL Men's Club is a match game league. You have to win individual match games to do well in the league.

You have to bowl well under pressure to be up in the standings. Those bowlers who perform and win matches top the standings. In my opinion those bowlers are BIG TIME BOWLERS.

Rudy Powell is averaging a respectable 203 but better yet he wins eighty per cent of his match games. That is why Rudy is in first place and why Rudy Powell is a BIG TIME BOWLER.

New Sport Bowling Program To Start August 1st

ARLINGTON, Texas – To encourage more bowlers and leagues to take advantage of competing on challenging lane conditions and to improve certified tournament average integrity, the United States Bowling Congress will make several enhancements to the Sport Bowling program for the 2015-2016 season, which starts Aug. 1.

Leagues choosing to compete on Sport lane patterns now will have the opportunity to report as a Sport/Challenge league without submitting lane tapes or requiring bowlers to purchase membership upgrades. The USBC Sport membership, including the awards program, will be discontinued as bowlers no longer will need to purchase a membership upgrade to compete in Sport leagues.

"We are removing what historically has been noted as the two largest barriers to participation – the membership cost for the bowler and the additional work required by those running Sport leagues – so more leagues can take advantage of Sport patterns," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Removing the barriers will improve the average integrity for all certified tournaments, which is the key reason for the adjustment to the program."

The Sport Bowling page of BOWL.com will re-launch July 1 with complete information and reference materials for bowlers, league secretaries and proprietors. The page will have Sport Bowling patterns, video tips on how to play certain Sport patterns, ideas for league formats and more information to help start and run a Sport Bowling league.

"USBC will lose some revenue as part of the switch, but average integrity is important to the future growth of the

sport," Murphy said. "We also want to encourage bowlers and leagues to take advantage of any Sport Bowling options they choose. Whether it is PBA Experience, Kegel Challenge, World Bowling or others, we should see more competition-level patterns in use because the process will be as simple as certifying the league with the new designation with no paperwork or tapes required."

Starting with the 2015-2016 season, leagues that want to compete on Sport Bowling conditions will designate as a Sport/Challenge league on the league application form; bowlers competing in the league will have a corresponding icon next to their average for that league.

Because Sport Bowling conditions are more challenging than typical league conditions, bowler averages on Sport conditions usually are lower. Designating these leagues moving forward will assist league and tournament operators in automatically adjusting averages for a bowler.

The Sport Bowling Average Adjustment Scale also has been modified, based on data of more than 20,000 averages, as part of the Sport Bowling makeover. The new chart can be found here. The scale, of course, does not supersede a tournament director's ability to adjust any bowler's average upward for a tournament.

The Sport Bowling program started with the 2000-2001 season in response to technology changes in the sport. Sport Bowling emphasizes the bowler's ability to make consistently accurate shots and to know when to make necessary adjustments. Most major USBC events, the PBA Tour, PWBA Tour and World Bowling events are conducted on Sport Bowling patterns.



1940 BLASTS FROM THE PAST (Volume I)

NORWALK — Last week I was asked, "When was the Bowling News started and who was the first Editor/Owner?" Of course that led to "who was great", "What were good scores" and "what was happening".

The introductory issue was dated September 11,1940. The same date La Cienega Alleys opened! Also on September 11, "The Alley Owners Association" held their monthly meeting. John Fawcett was the Editor. Alleys? (Yikes)

Some of the "alleys" advertising in 1940 - - - LUXOR, BIMINI, ARLINGTON, TROJAN, VIRGINIA, HUNTINGTON PARK, SUNSET, ROYAL, WESTERN, OCEAN PARK, ALHAMBRA REC., SOUTHEAST, HERMOSA BEACH, GLENDALE ACADEMY, VOGUE,

CINEMA SPORTS CENTER, PASADENA REC., PICO PALACE, WESTLAKE, LEIMERT PARK, WHITTIER/ATLANTIC, DIXIE LANES, MANCHESTER, BELLFLOWER, CROSS SPORT CENTER and ARCADE RECREATION. Notice there were no centers east of Alhambra, south of Bellflower or north of Westlake. None of these are still around. (That I know of.)

Eight 300's were listed with a short bio of each. No 800's and a scant 700 found space. "900" Major Leagues were spotlighted and their schedules printed.

Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer keglers filmed a "short" called "Strikes and Spares" starring Andy Varipapa. Andy was available for grand openings and is believed to have been at Del

Rio Lanes opening in 1958. Checking a few prices: Matinee Bowling 15 cents a game at one center, 16 cents across the street!

Ned Day rolled his 14th perfect game. Andy Varipapa bowled his 49th. Only 3 ABC bowlers had over a 200 average! None over 202!!!

2,475,000 women had W.I.B.C. Cards. 3,000,000 games were bowled every week in the U.S.A.

Teams were required to wear matching shirts each week or be fined.

Bowling students could earn GYM credits for league play. The coin operated ball cleaner was introduced at Sunset Center.

Tip-of-the-Week — After each delivery — Check your thumb. Is it on your hand or in

the ball? Ha.

Get this? A guy named Ray Young was the anchorman on a five men team. The first four men didn't show up on league nite so he bowled in all five spots, beating the opposing team 3-0 setting a new record for team and individual series for the season. Whaaat???

Doc Hinley was the only ball driller (to advertise).

Jane Wyman was the "pin-up" gal for bowling.

Roy Rogers as the captain of the Drugstore Cowboys" team.

James Cagney's Gang were in a shoot-out at Hollywood Rec.

What a great glimpse into our local bowling history. If you enjoyed the fun facts, let me know an I'll open 1941 and gleen the yellowed pages.



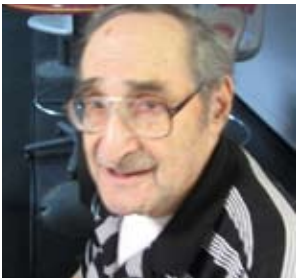

West Coast Senior Tour owner-director Dick Sanders always shoots from the hip

Four months ago, Dick Sanders was forced to come up with a quick decision involving his West Coast Senior Tour bowling club.

At the end of the preliminary round of a tournament in La Habra, his eighth and final qualifier abruptly left the bowling center, apparently believing that he had missed the cut for match play.

Sanders, the WCST's longtime director and owner, couldn't reach the departing bowler so he made an off-the-cuff ruling: The ninth-highest finisher in the preliminaries would advance and would split his payoff – should he win money – with the missing bowler.

That ruling satisfied his 60-and-older bowling group without a fuss and the final round commenced without delay. "That's why I'm there," Sanders said.

That was Dick Sanders in action – the quick-thinking head of the WCST, now in its 23rd year.

"He does a good job," said

Russell Booth, who won the La Habra event, his first WCST championship. "As a matter of fact, he does a VERY good job. He hustles and gets people [to his tournaments]. And he does a good job getting the [bowling] houses.

"He keeps us up to date on the Internet about what's happening and is a meticulous record-keeper. He knows how much he spent [in prize money] on each tournament over many years.

"And he's quick to figure out who's made the finals."

Additionally, the 79-year-old Sanders is feisty, irreverent, often-outrageous and never shy with an opinion. He's funny, too.

A few years back, he talked about how advanced technology had cheapened bowling scores.

"The perfect example is a 300 game in tournaments," Sanders said. "No one knows he did it but the guy who shot it. Three hundred games are so phony baloney, although it's still exciting for the guy who shot it for the first time. Everyone's a pro now. If you collect money in league at the end of the season, you're a pro."

Although he's given up the game long ago, Sanders was no slouch as a bowler himself. He blasted five perfect games during an era when 300 games were really special.

Sanders, a resident of Morongo Valley in San Bernardino County, was named the Southern California Junior Bowler of the Year in 1957 and entered the Southern California bowling Hall of Fame in 1995.

Once the 300-game topic is broached, Sanders has more to

say about the subject.

"There is one problem now with holding a [United States Bowling Congress] card when it comes to the 300-game award. There is only one award now in a [bowler's] lifetime. The one-time ring with a diamond in it, which later became a piece of glass, is no more.

"Yes, [the 300 game] will be recognized in the USBC records. The congress made its own bed when stopping these awards-because they created the high scores we have today in bowling because of the sanctioning of the bowling balls, bowling pins and lane conditions.

"They allowed the industry manufacturers to continue to make the type of products they do. The USBC denies this, but they have spoiled the game to the effect that everybody becomes a star.

"Yes, it's true, you have to have some skills to be a good bowler, but in today's game, all bowling balls hook to the pocket; it is the carry that makes the scores.

"For the sake of my organization, I enjoy a bowler coming out and competing, and if he scores well, more power to him. Some bowlers like tougher lane conditions, where spares become very important, but the majority of our bowlers like the high scores.

"Every bowler cannot be a touring tournament bowler. But if you bowl in league play and carry a decent average, and with our organization of being age 60 or older, you should try at least one time to bowl our WCST tournaments."

Sanders also had this to say two years ago when the Bowl-

mor-AMF Bowling Worldwide Inc. merger was taking shape: "This will do wonders for bowlers who want to learn how to bowl. No leagues, cosmic bowling and birthday parties will [mean] the destruction of the tournament bowler, and you can quote me on this."

Two years later, Sanders' prophecy seems to have come true.

The WCST's next event is 10 a.m. Saturday at Del Rosa Lanes. Sanders expects about 35 to 40 bowlers; players may still be able to find an opening

(WCST: 760-363-6064).

It is the eighth event of 12 scheduled tournaments this year. Sanders has settled on a format of one tournament each month – six being held in Southern California and six in Nevada. In the past couple of years, Sanders has tightened the age eligibility of bowlers – meaning a player has to be at least 60 years of age.

The format seems to have helped the WCST avoid the slide in entries that it experienced in previous years. Sanders says the new rules have paid

off and the current season's entries – which average about 35 – have been a "lot better."

Sanders often reminisces about the days when the WCST averaged about 130 entries per tournament with a high of 237 during a three-day tournament at Buena Lanes in Ventura in 1995.

So the big question is this: How long will the WCST continue to run?

"As long as I'm alive," Sanders said.

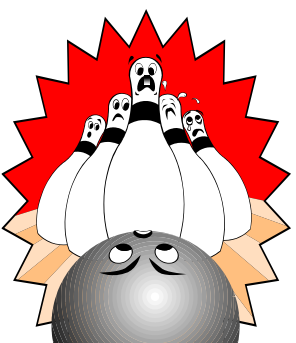

MARATHON MAN GREG KOLSKI FLYING HIGH WITH 727

TARZANA – “That’s one goal down.”

So said an ebullient Greg Kolski, who blasted his first 700 series last week at Corbin Bowl in Tarzana.

Kolski has achieved considerable recognition since he turned in a marathon effort almost three years ago when he slogged through 100 practice games in a single day at AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills.

Kolski, a West Hills resident, has used that celebrated performance as a springboard for a number of personal milestones.

The latest was a 727 series in which Kolski smoked games of 233, 257 and 237.

For the past year, Kolski had set goals of a 700 series and a perfect game. Before last week, his highs were a 698 series and a 278 (twice).

When Kolski nailed his fifth straight strike in the ninth frame of the third game in

Corbin Bowl’s “Superstars” league last week, he sealed his 700 series. “The moment I knew I got it, I was ecstatic,” said the 31-year-old Kolski, a right-hander with a wicked hook. “I gave everyone a high-five.”

Coincidentally, Kolski’s series was witnessed by Bryan Alpert, one of the super elite bowlers in the area who has amassed more than 30 800 series and 60 perfect games.

Alpert bowls on the same team as Kolski in the “Superstars” league.

“That 237 put him solidly in [the 700 club],” said Alpert, who, incidentally, blasted a 731 series. “It showed he wasn’t affected by nerves.”

Kolski had only two opens in his series – one in the first game and one in the second. He collected 10 strikes in the first game.

“I’m super happy,” Kolski said. “I even won the 3-6-9 [competition].”

The Perfect Game

by Steve Felege

As skills, the stance, push-away, arm-swing and release are the “Four Horsemen” of bowling. Your average relates directly to them because together, they create the accuracy high scores require.

Performed properly, these four actions are repeatable, put the ball on a line to your target and keep it there during your approach. Below is a self-exam which can be used to quantify your progress toward achieving that goal. This test also identifies the weak points in your technique which create frustrating inconsistencies.

To get the greatest benefit from this exercise, I recommend having a friend make two videos of your delivery; one from directly behind, and another from the side (I-pads are great for this purpose). Use those videos to help determine your technical scores. You may be surprised how your average relates to your total score on this test.

YOUR BASIC SKILLS ANALYSIS

SKILL #1: YOUR STANCE

Foot Placement: >1 point if you have a dot or line drawn on the tip of one shoe. 0 if no marker exists on your shoe tip. _____
>2 pts if you pay close attention to the exact board upon which you place that marker/your feet. 0 if you don’t. _____
>1 pt if your feet are close together. 0 pts if a gap exists between your feet. _____
>1 pt if your weight is evenly distributed on both feet. 2 pts if most of you weight is on the swing-side foot. 3 pts if all of your weight is on that foot. _____
>1 pt if one foot is placed a few inches back from the other. Otherwise 0. _____

Shoulders: >1 pt if your swing-side shoulder is dipped. Minus 1 if not. _____

Ball Height: >0 pts if the ball is held at eye level. 1 pt if held chest high. 3 pts if near waist height. _____

Ball Placement: >2 pts if the ball is held in line with your shoulder, minus 2 pts if it isn’t. _____

Eyes: >5 pts if you look at a target arrow, 1 pt if you look at the pins. _____

Direction: >2 pts if your push-away ends with your elbow straight. 0 if not. _____

BURBANK — My love affair with bowling began 52 years ago in a bowling alley (that's what they were called then) located in the La Crescenta area. The marquee read Verdugo Hills Bowl and was styled in that lovely early 60's design. Being within walking distance it became my sec-ond home.

I became a part of the youth bowling association AJBC, aka the American Junior Bowling Congress. We bowled on alleys, not lanes. Our balls went into gutters, not channels. We referred to our scores as being x number of sticks over average. Even the high average big guys put all three dig-its into the ball. There was no such thing as palm bowling or bumpers. In fact no one under the age of twelve could belong to the youth association. The lightest weight ball was 11 pounds.

Bowling was my physical activity, my social club and my early networking. It was open 24 hours, as most centers were in those days, and in my teens many a night was spent sitting at the counter in the coffee shop, drinking cof-fee and writing poetry that no one would ever read. At the age of 18, I worked that counter pouring coffee and serving fries to other bowling addicts and I was sure I had died and gone to heaven.

As a young person, new to bowling other than watch-ing my parents, I had the great fortune to have a really dedicated Youth Coach. Her name was Bobbi Leach. Next week, I will tell you more about her.

In the meantime, I thank you for taking a trip down memory lane with me. I also encourage you old-er, more experienced bowlers to share your bowling memories with the bowling youth in your lives. They will see that bowling as a sport has dignity and grace, respect and revelry and has never been stagnant.
