

A Summer Not Soon Forgotten

NEW YORK — Ashley N. Dunn of Palmdale, CA had a summer she will never forget.

As most of you current and past youth bowlers will recall, summer is the time for the major youth tournaments. This summer Ashley competed in three major events, and found success in all three; North Pointe U15 Junior Gold National Championships, the Tournament of the Americas International Competition, and Teen Masters U18 Girls National Championships.

The summer began (and ended) with the Teen Masters National Championships. It started and ended with the Teen Masters because the tournament was split into two dif-

ferent time segments. The National Finals that narrowed the field down to the top four girls and top four boys were held from July 8 through July 12 at Freeway Lanes in Wickliffe, OH, then the Grand Championships would be held August 8th & 9th at Manhattan, NY in Grand Central Terminal's Vanderbilt Hall. In between, Ashley would compete in the North Pointe Junior Gold U15 National Championships, and then as part of an expanded Junior Team USA International competition in the U16 Division of the annual Tournament of the Americas.

First, top U18 boys and girls from across the country competed at Freeway Lanes in an attempt to earn a position in the top four that would advance to Vanderbilt Hall inside Grand Central Terminal in Midtown Manhattan. The road to the final four would not be easy. Ashley is the 2 time defending Champion in the Teen Masters U14 Division, but now she was 15 and would be competing in the U18 Division. Competitors among the talented field included last years Girls U18 Champion Rachel Vaughn from Port St. Lucie, FL, and Semi-finalist Melanie Hannon from Cheektowage, NY.

As in 2010 & 2011 bowling in the U14 Division, Ashley summoned the skills needed to work her way into the #1 seed for the Championship Match.

First she topped the field in Wickliffe, OH by leading the grueling 34 games of qualification that included 6 games on a 42' sport pattern, 6 games on a 35' sport pattern, then 6 games on mixed pairs where the left lane of each pair had the 42' pattern and the right lane had the 35' pattern, culminating in 16 games of match play on the mixed pairs where 30 bonus pins were awarded for a win. Then there was that break in the tournament with the Grand Championships picking back up in New York on August 7th & 8th.

The format in Grand Central Terminal changed to each girl bowling the other once in a best of two match where one game to one game ties were broken by a sudden death single ball roll-off, then the two girls with the best match play record would move on to the best 2 of 3 Championship match.

The matches in Grand Central Terminal were held on a specially constructed single lane flanked by grandstands on either side, and live streaming coverage by the PBA's Xtra

Ashley went 3-0 in the match play portion with only the first match against the #4 seed Melanie Hannon going to sudden death, where Ashley escaped the loss with a 9-8 win in the roll-off, Ashley won the other matches with straight 2 game wins. Ashley would eventually face the #2 seed from the qualifying round held at Freeway Lanes, Haley Rubin from Brandon, SD, in the Girls U18 Championship. Ashley once again claimed the title of Teen Masters Girls National Champion with back to back decisive wins of 206-165, 243-189 over 18 year old continued on page 8

As we prayed for his recovery and wondering how soon Darrell could get back to bowling, we got a nice thank you card from Darrell. The doctors had to do a triple bypass, Darrell wrote, and he is doing better than the doctors thought. So far he is trying to get used to the blood pressure medication. Already missed bowling but have to wait to start bowling in late September.

LANE PATTERNS by Robert Ellison

SAN DIEGO — This week we will look at the variety of patterns on the lanes. For an everyday 'casual' bowler - these people won't notice the difference regarding oil patterns from one bowling alley to the next. Amatuers to pro bowlers will notice differences between "typical house" patterns and the PBA patterns.

The "typical house" shot is generally used among all of the bowling alley's and tend to be higher scoring lanes than the PBA patterns. The lanes basically have the heaviest oil in the middle and dry on the outside which create what is called a "walled" or "blocked" shot. Most bowlers would throw the ball on the outside "wall" to hit the dry spot. This allows the bowling ball to come back to the pocket.

In addition, the length of oil pattern makes a difference. The house patterns tend to be 39 feet down the lane. The PBA patterns do not have a "wall" style effect when the lane is oiled; thus oil tends to be flatter (oil spreads evenly across the lane). The length of the oil pattern varies on PBA patterns such as short, medium, and long.

There are 5 different patterns used on the PBA tour: cheetah, viper, chameleon, scorpion, and shark. The cheetah is the shortest oil pattern - 35 feet. This pattern tends to be one of the highest scoring patterns on tour. The next two are medium patterns - viper and chameleon. These patterns are 37 and 39 feet in length. These patterns are similar to house patterns in length measurements (but this does not mean they can score high on these patterns due to the flatness of the oil). Scores on these patterns can be medium to high. The last two are long oil patterns. Scorpion at 41 feet, and shark at 43 feet. These two patterns are the toughest patterns on tour and tend to be the lowest scoring.

Next time you watch pro bowlers on tv, you will hear the announcer or commentator discussing various PBA patterns such as the ones reviewed above. Now you are more aware of a few basic patterns used in competition.

PBA SENIOR TOUR TO BECOME 'PBA50 TOUR' IN 2013 NEW NAMEWILL CELEBRATE AGE MILESTONE AS NEW STARS ENTER TOUR

DECATUR, Ill. (Aug. 13, 2012) — The Professional Bowlers Association Senior Tour will be re-named as the PBA50 Tour beginning with the 2013 season, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced today from the PBA Senior Decatur Open presented by Brunswick, the concluding tournament of the 2012 Senior Tour season.

"The word 'senior' is outdated and the title PBA50 more accurately reflects the vibrancy of the players and our competition in this age group," Clark said.

The change in name is underscored by the continuing stream of stars to the over-50 circuit.

During the 2012 season alone, players including Lennie Boresch Jr., Mike Edwards, Bob Learn Jr. and Amleto Monacelli immediately won titles in their first year of Senior Tour eligibility. Monacelli, the 2012 Senior U.S. Open winner, and Edwards, the 2012 USBC Senior Masters winner, also remain active – and competitive - on the PBA Tour, along with other 50-plus members.

On the PBA50 Tour eligibility horizon are PBA Hall of Famers Pete Weber (Aug. 21), Parker Bohn III (July 13, 2013) and ESPN analyst Randy Pedersen (turned 50 on May 28). Also on the list of future PBA50 competitors are PBA Tour champions Jack Jurek (April 23), Chris Warren (Aug. 27, 2013), David Traber (Jan. 18) and Robert Lawrence (Sept. 29).

The ultimate example of a player having concurrent success on both Tours came two seasons ago when PBA Hall of Famer and all-time Tour career titles leader Walter Ray Williams Jr. made an immediate impact in the senior ranks, winning in his first tournament and going on to earn Senior Rookie of the Year honors. And during the 2009-10 PBA Tour season, at age 50, Williams became the oldest player in any major sport to earn Player of the Year honors.

This season, at the age of 52, he is the favorite to win his first PBA Senior Player of the Year title to go along with his record seven Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year awards.

The 50-plus program also produced previously-undiscovered talent in years past, when highly-talented bowlers who never had a chance to bowl as PBA Tour players reached the age where they could retire and give PBA-level competition a try. Most prominent among that group are Gene Stus, who earned his place in the PBA Hall of Fame as a senior champion, Bob Glass, a three-time PBA Senior Tour Player of the Year, and two-time Senior Player of the Year Ron Mohr.

"There are plenty of good bowlers who are becoming eligible and successful on the Senior Tour each year," Williams said.

Each tournament on the 2013 PBA50 Tour schedule will include the PBA50 moniker along with sponsor affiliation where applicable.

PBA50 also will apply to PBA Regional events that were previously called senior tournaments. The exceptions will be the PBA Senior U.S. Open and United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters which will retain their present names.

In the effort to reach out to younger bowlers, earlier this year PBA introduced the new PBA24 membership program which invites new players 24 years of age and younger to experience PBA competition for a \$49 membership fee.

The 2013 PBA50 Tour schedule will be released later this fall.

The cut scores on Saturday night were + 55 for the men and + 18 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Manny Loria +47 and Bud Zagorski +46. For the women it was Carla Sanchez -4. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 49 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Tom Mazzulla with a +167 and for the women it was Cecilia Lung with+89. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top seed Mazzulla drew the Match Series score, and this time it was worth \$676. Tom would draw the score and he drew a 450. We had two bowlers that bowled matching this score, they were Emilio Flores and Teddy Villaroman. They will each get \$676 for that fine 450 series. We will estimate the Match Series at \$450 at Keystone Lanes. The last bowler left in the 3-6-9 roll off was Emilio Flores, Emilio would miss on his first shot, so he takes home a consolation of \$50. We will estimate the pot at \$1,400 at Keystone Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Wilson Cheung and John Phan with a 1392 for \$140. Finishing in second was Samson Kong and John Phan with a 1391, a mere one-pin difference, for \$120. There was a total of \$1,390 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash of

Now to the semi-finals, tops was Jeff Taino with a +105 and finishing in 2nd was Tres Catalsan at a +100. So he will sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Jeff drew a 223. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no

bowlers who shot that score, and so it will continue to carry over. There are three full pots. with a 4th pot that is currently over \$2,155.

We would see Marvin continue his good bowling and send John home with a 226 to 184 and he advanced to the semifinal match. In this match, it was last week's runner-up Beth who would continue her march to try and return to the title match and a 2nd chance in two weeks for a championship. She would advance with a 211 to 193. Wilson and John finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$115 each.

Our semi-final match was set, and would pit the 14th and 9th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses" we would see Beth paying \$101 and Marvin paying \$62 if they would win their match. It was close throughout the match, with an early open by Beth that would give Marvin a mere 1 pin lead. In the 6th Beth would miss a 3 pin, and Marvin stayed clean to take an 11 pin lead after his half of the 7th frame. Beth came up in the 7th and would leave the 1-2-9 and get only the 9 pin. Marvin would jump out to a 22 pin lead and never look back. He would advance with a 194/225 to 166/201

Finishing in 3rd place was Beth Borci this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Marvin Crowder as a horse, he paid \$62.

The title game was set. It would be Marvin Crowder going for his first championship against the top qualifier Jeff Taino, who elected to go first. He would start with a spare. Marvin would leave a four count and miss all the pins, as the nerves were there. In the 2nd Marv would spare, and Jeff in the 2nd got a spare of his own, but in the 3rd he left the 8-10 split and got only one. Marvin would get a strike in his 3rd and 4th frames to lead by a few pins. After an open, Jeff would get a strike in the 5th frame. Marvin came up in the 5th and 6th frames with a couple of marks and he was now up by 15 pins. Jeff would open again in the 6th frame and follow that with a spare. He was down 30+ pins, but it was not over as Marvin would open in the 7th and 8th frames, and his lead would shrink to 12 pins. In the 8th and 9th frames Jeff would get marks and take a slim 1 pin lead.

Dean of Bowling Writers, PBA & USBC Hall of Fame

This guy swaggers up to me and says, "Bowling is a stupid game.

Oh yeah." said I.

"Oh yeah." said he.

"Why?" said I.

"I'll tell you why." said he.

And with all the nice stuff out of the way his mouth was off and running.

Two bowlers are working on a strike. The first rolls a gutter ball or gets two or three off on his next ball. The other bowler throws what looks like a perfect ball, but the 10 pin doesn't go down. If they both make their spares, the score is exactly the same even though the first bowler's performance can hardly compare with the effort of the second."

I told him, "You're all wrong. Things aren't what they seem to be. It all evens out in the end. If a bowler keeps rolling bad balls on strikes he'll leave tough spares and will miss many of them. And if you keep the ball in the pocket you'll get more than your share of strikes. It's like the baseball player who hits line drives right at an opposing player. Sooner or later, they're going to fall for hits.'

I thought I slowed him down a bit but he came right back, saying, "And you bowling writers, always talking about how many pins a bowler knocks down. You never get it right."

This attack raised my ire and in defense of all the overworked and underpaid bowling writers in this world (all three of them) I meanly asked, "And what do you mean by that?'

He quickly countered my question with his own. "How many pins does a bowler actually knock down when he rolls a 300 game?" I quickly figured 12 strikes times 10 pins equals 120 and told him so.

He smiled. "So the most pins you can actually knock down in a game is 120. Yet, one bowler can knock down 120 pins and scores a 300 game while another can knock down 120 pins by recording nine spares and a triple in the last frame, and all he can shoot is 202 at best.'

He was wound up now and kept going. bowler finishes with a 650 series you writers often say he knocked down 650 sticks, had a total pinfall of 650 or some other phrase that adds up to the same thing, that a bowler knocked down 650 pins. He never did. He may have knocked down only 270 pins and scored a 650 series. So why don't you bowling people wise up and say a bowler scored 300 points or 650 points instead of saying he knocked down 300 or 650."

He pushed on, "Who devised this system of bowling scoring? Has anyone in bowling ever analyzed what I'm saying and thought about changes?"

My adversary was getting to me and whether he had a point or not, he was stabbing pretty good. I weakly defended our position on scoring, telling him that it was such a basic standard that changes in scoring would create havoc and added that it had stood the test of time just fine until he opened up. I had little defense in regard to pinfall and reluctantly agreed that maybe we should say points instead

I finally had to resort to my "get you off the hook" phrase. Whenever a sportswriter friend of mine receives a nasty or critical letter he jots off a note to the sender, saying, "Maybe you're right." That's what I told this critic.

He went away happy and left me in a quandry. The thing that really got me was the simple fact I hadn't thought of some of his criticism long before he brought it up.

It would have made a heck of a column.

Dave Soutar Concludes Career in PBA Senior Decatur Open After More than Half-Century of PBA Competition

DECATUR, Ill. (Aug. 13, 2012) -- Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Dave Soutar ended his career in PBA competition in appropriate fashion during the final day of qualifying of the PBA Senior Decatur Open presented by Brunswick Monday — before a big crowd and throwing three strikes in the 10th frame of his last game.

It brought an end to more than a half-century of PBA competition for the 72-year-old who won 18 titles on the PBA Tour and seven on the Senior Tour.

"He was my roommate on Tour and has been a close friend for 50 years," fellow Hall of Famer and competitor Johnny Petraglia said of Soutar. "It marks the end of an era and it's going to be tough bowling out here without him."

Soutar, who was the only player to win both the United States Bowling Congress Masters (1973) and Senior Masters (2000), finished the Senior Decatur Open in 52nd with a 3,183 pinfall and a 214 in his final game in qualifying.

"It wasn't until the last game that I thought about it being my last tournament," said Soutar, Then I saw people gathering around and it started to hit me. I don't show much emotion but I started to get tears in my mind in the 10th frame—so much so that I couldn't see my target. With everyone gathering around I thought to myself, please let me strike in the 10th frame. It was probably as nervous as I've ever been bowling in a tournament."

Soutar began his care in 1961 and in only his fifth tournament as a professional, he won a major - the PBA National Championship – for his first PBA title. From that launching pad to stardom, he would go on to win 11 titles over the next seven years, finishing in the top 10 in earnings six times over that same period

His best season came in 1970 when he won five titles, the most of any player on Tour that year. In what he admitted was his biggest disappointment, he did not earn Player of the Year honors that season. That distinction went to another Hall of Famer Nelson Burton Jr., who won four titles. Soutar's consolation prize was the PBA's prestigious Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award, awarded by his fellow competitors.

A member of both the PBA and USBC Halls of Fame, Soutar was voted 20th greatest PBA player of all-time in 2009.

"I have to admit that realizing I'm not going to be doing this anymore, is a little depressing, but time goes on," added Soutar, who now makes his home in Bradenton, Fla., but got his start in the sport in his native Detroit.

As the crowd gathered for his last game, Soutar's wife, Hall of Fame bowler Judy Soutar, was also hanging on every shot in the last game of his career.

"I so much wanted him to bowl a good game that last game," Judy said. "As it turned out it was the ultimate ending for a great career. When he got the first strike I was satisfied but the next two were just a bonus.
