John Whisler Wins The WCST Ebonite Singles at Linbrook Vaughn Doody Wins Super Senior Finals Great Turn-out For Super Seniors

ANAHEIM-For the second straight year our WCST Ebonite Singles held at Linbrook Bowl in Anaheim, CA was very close at the finish among 5 of the 10 finalists of the regular division. Last year, the defending champion for this tournament Larry Nordstrom had a similar finish among 5 bowlers. This year Larry started tied for 9th and 10th and finished very strong for 3rd place. John Whisler (Bakersfield) took a commanding lead after the 8th game and had a 96 pin lead over 2nd place going into the position round, 2nd to 5th had only 51 pins separating those 4 places. Alex Hernandez (Palmdale) in 3rd place, down by 109 pins, beat 4th place John Cocchi 267-256, and John Whisler lost to 2nd place Larry Nordstrom, 228-214, and Alex finished 2nd to lose by only 26 pins. John Cocchi's loss dropped him down to 5th as Mike Rick who was in 5th and only 28 pins down from 4th, rolled a 258 game and with his bonus of 30 pins edged out John by 5 pins. All in all, it ended up a difference of 68 pins from 1st to 5th. This was John Whisler's 1st WCST

Regular Division Title, He qualified 5th on Saturday, and was close to the leader of the 1st 5 game block.

This was John's 3rd tournament with us. He placed 3rd in our last tournament in Laughlin. John and Alex both won 8 of their 10 matches, the difference was their qualifying scores. Mike Rodriguez, also a finalist had the high game of the tournament of 298, that was rolled in the qualifying on Saturday.

63 bowlers entered the tournament, with 42 to the regular division, and our biggest turn-out of 21 super senior entries in over 5 years. The super senior entries increase is due to the return of the original format the WCST had from 1993 to 1999. 16 Checks paid out in the regular division, and 6 super senior checks for their division finals. A grand total of \$8,295.00 was the pay-off. TOP 3: 1st, John Whisler, \$1000.00. 2nd to Alex Hernandez, \$700.00, and 3rd to Larry Nordstrom (Garden Grove), \$575.00. For 8 tournaments in 2005, \$55,720.00 paid out, and for 223 tournaments a total pay-off of \$2,430,563.00. There are now over 45 bowlers that have earned \$10,000.00 or more in this organization, and 40 other bowlers that have earned \$5000.00 plus.

The WCST would like to thank our host for this tournament, Mr. John Havales, the GM of the center, his good cooperative helpers, and to his lane mechanic Joe Herandez, who was there to help in every way on both Saturday and Sunday.

The scores were good, and fair for both the left and right side. Our thanks also to Karen Black, wife of Ray Black a WCST member, who went around and got all scores for the side-pots and the brackets.

To Ebonite International, our thanks also, as we sold two more great Ebonite Bowling Balls and added another \$200.00 to our end of the year singles fund, now up to \$1800.00, with 4 WCST Ebonite Tournaments to go before the final one on December 17-18 at La Habra "300" Bowl for current WCST members that had bowled in at least 4 WCST Tournaments this year.



National Deaf Bowling News 15 Early Entries In Kansas National Deaf Master Bowlers Tournament

ANAHEIM HILLS-As the deadline of August 10 passed, Bill Cozad, founder and director of National Deaf Master Bowlers Association reported that only 15 bowlers had paid their entry and several had asked for extra time to pay. He is not concerned because as in the past three NDMBA tournaments the deaf bowlers were mostly late with their entry fees. Cozad says that after the deadline the late entry fee goes up \$20.00 to \$210.00 for walk-ins in this 4th annual NDMBA tournament. The tournament with \$3,000 guaranteed first place prize is being held at Olathe Lanes East in Olathe, Kansas on September 30 to October 2.


The early entries are important, Cozad said, for the bowlers to have their names and their lanes schedule printed in the program book for the fans to follow. As shown in previous three NDMBA tournaments, the other deaf bowlers did not care for that. About half of late entries were walk-ins and had their names written in the book and lane schedule. The first one in 2002 at Cleveland drew 47 bowlers including one brave woman and five walk-ins. The 2nd tournament at Dallas in 2003 also drew one woman among the 30 bowlers before press time and 5 walk-ins.

Last year's memorable 3rd annual tournament at Orlando had a hurricane in its path which scared most of the Florida's high average deaf bowlers home. As a result the entries were 25 including a record 4 women at press time and instead of 15-20 walk-ins, only 3 braved the hurricane to enter. NDMBA is the first national deaf tournament that uses a small version of PBA tournament with qualifying rounds and match play rounds with best 3 of 5 games to advance. Cozad has over 400 names of high average deaf bowlers including women in US and he hopes that 10% or more enter in his tournament.

The list includes deaf and hearing-impaired PBA and former PWBA members who are permitted to enter. The defending champion, Lindy Decker, York, PA was the first woman to win this event. The smooth stroking lefty defeated both great deaf PBA bowlers, Pete Kaczmarzyk, Detroit and Frank Gallo, Jr., Landam, MD in order to win the title. The great Kaczmarzyk rewrote the record book with new record 2971 total for 12 games (247.5 average) in qualifying round of two blocks of 6 games. He replaced his old record of 2933 (244.4 ave.) made in the first event at Cleveland. In the first NDMBA tournament an inspired PBA bowler Scott Lindsay, Buffalo beat the much heralded Ken DeGroff, West Lawn, PA for the title. In the 2nd event at Dallas a 188 average Austin, TX bowler Johnny Dominik defeated Gallo in the title finals. In the same Dallas event a lone woman entrant Jerilyn Keller. San Antonio became the first woman to qualify for the match play and finished in 4th place. Except Lindsay who was unheard from, all these names above are entered in this one at Olathe. It will be an exciting event to watch.

SAN DIMAS-Debbie Leighton of Alameda County was crowned the 40th California Women's Bowling Association Queen on Sunday, July 10th at Chaparral Lanes in San Dimas. The runner up was Tracy Castro from San Francisco.

The two day format was used for the Queens tournament this year, beginning with two qualifying squads bowling six games each on Saturday. The top thirty-two ladies returned on Sunday morning and rolled three more games, for total pin fall. In the second round, the top sixteen ladies from the first round bowled another three games for total pin fall and this reduced the field to eight ladies. The eight ladies bowled an additional three games for total pin fall, moving the top five ladies into the step ladder finals. The ladies bowled one game matches in the step ladder finals.

In the first match of the step ladder finals, forth place finisher Amanda Stewart (Orange County) bowled a 233 game, defeating fifth place finisher Missy Bellinder (Orange County), who bowled a 217 game.

In the next match Amanda bowled a 244 game against third place finisher Laura Hardeman (San Diego) 225, to move into the next game.

Amanda continued her high scoring in the next round. She rolled a game of 234, but it was not enough to stop the second place finisher, Debbie Leighton (Alameda County) who bowled a 247 game.

In the final game, the high qualifier, Tracy Castro from Pacifica rolled a 211 game, but again it was not enough, as Debbie rolled a 258 to win the title of the 2005 CWBA Queen.

Debbie began bowling when she was 13, joining her younger brother who was already bowling in a league. By the time Debbie was 16, she was averaging 200 and competing in some very competitive junior leagues, along with bowling the Nor Cal tournaments. The high point of her junior career was when she won the state scratch championship in 1991 at Cedar Lanes in Fresno. Debbie was elected to the Northern California Junior All-Stars four times.

In 1993, in order to spend more time with her son, Ricky, born in March, and due to a serious knee injury, she stopped bowling. While she still had the desire to compete, her son had to come first. Debbie said she is

both lucky and proud to have been around for her son and to watch him grow up. While she did miss bowling, the time she spent with her son was invaluable In 1997 Debbie got the "bug"

back, so to speak. She began bowling again, mostly in leagues, with the occasional tournament mixed in. In 2003, she bowled the National Queens Tournament basically as a test for herself to see if she wanted to try and get back into bowling tournaments and taking her game to the next level. While she didn't make the cut, the experience re-energized her love for bowling and her desire to go back to National Queens and make the top 64. In 2004, she entered the Alameda County Queens tournament, with the Idea of winning an entry into the state queen's tourney. She was successful and did win the entry into the CWBA Queens tournament held at Cloverleaf Family Bowl in Fremont. Debbie bowled well and placed third, losing to eventual winner Tish Johnson in the stepladder. In 2005 she entered the CWBA tournament with the goal of making the top five again and qualified third for the stepladder finals, this time winning her two matches to become CWBA 2005 Oueen.

The win at queens has given Debbie a chance to take advantage of some wonderful opportunities. She will be bowling in the Kingpin Challenge, to be held in Reno, using the free entry she earned. Debbie also plans to bowl the National Queens Tournament, with a goal of a top 64 placement in 2006. Finally she will be back in Sacramento next year to defend her title against some of the best bowlers in the country, if not the world. Competing against the likes of Hall of Famer's, Leanne Barrette, Tish Johnson, Dede Davidson and Robin Romeo, not to mention the many others who have been on Team USA and have won national Titles, is both challenging and exciting. Debbie said she has the up most respect for all of those bowlers and she is extremely proud to be able to say, that for those 2 days in July in San Dimas, she was the best female bowler in the state. To have her name on the list of winners that includes both legends and hall of famers is almost hard to believe. Debbie is extremely pleased and grateful for all that bowling has given her and for the opportunity to bowl and become state champion. Her goal now is to continue to beers Emblems, Judith Ann Hartman, Chaparral Lanes, Rinnander Upholstery, California 15 Year Club, California Bowling Writers, Bowlers Pro Shop at Chaparral Lanes, Trophy Center/Continental Awards & Promotion, and New Century Printing for sponsoring the CWBA Queens event. Also a special thanks to Dave Woodruff for the entry into this years Kingpin challenge and to Jennifer Cunningham from the Circus Circus Hotel/Casino for the hotel accommodations. Thank you CWBA for having this special tournament and thanks to Chaparral lanes for hosting this year's event.

Runner up Tracy Castro averaged 228during the tournament with a high game of 269 and a high series of 742. During her career, Tracy has a lifetime high average of 220, high series of 797, and a high game of 300. At 12 years of age, she was the youngest junior bowler to bowl a 300 game in the United States. In 1997 Tracy was the International Coca-Cola girls scratch champion; in 1998 the

CWBA Star of Tomorrow and in 2001 was the CWBA Queen. Tracy joined her first league at age 6. She has been an adult board member of the CSYABA for over 8 years, giving her knowledge and expertise back to the youth bowlers in her area.

TENPIN SLANTS BY JOE LYOU

RENO-The inaugural Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge is gathering steam. In other words, the tournament-which guarantees \$1 million to the winneris catching on with bowlers.

This bodes well for the Kingpin Challenge, which will be held Oct. 22-30 at the renovated National Bowling Stadium in Reno

When news of the tournament was first announced last March, a majority of people in the bowling industry didn't believe the event would ever get off the ground. After all, similar million dollar events in the past had folded quicker than a cheap tent in a wind storm.

Such skepticism was reflected in an unscientific poll conducted by Tenpin Slants three months ago. I thought otherwise, however, and stated that the Kingpin Challenge would definitely be held. I listed five reasons why.

Briefly, these reasons were: 1) The four Kingpin Challenge promoters had a successful track record in conducting major attractions; 2) the promoters had invested too heavily to even think of pulling out; 3) the Kingpin Challenge had been endorsed by such organizations as the United States Bowling Congress, the Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Bureau, and Reno Tri-Properties (comprised of Circus Circus, Eldorado and Silver Legacy hotels/casinos); 4) NBC-TV had committed to showing the finals (taped) on Sunday, Nov. 13, at 11 a.m., Pacific time; and 5) the promoters welcomed the challenge of staging a successful major bowling event and hoped to stage many more Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge tournaments.

Tenpin Slants also pointed out that the tournament promoters had hired three of the most respected people in bowling: Joan Romeo (as a consultant), Hall of Famer Dave Husted (tournament commissioner) and popular Frank Ellenburg (director of operations).

Since I wrote those words, several sponsors have climbed aboard the Kingpin Challenge bandwagon: Brunswick, Dexter, Lane One, Storm, Columbia 300, Ebonite International and Hammer. Even the influential Bowlers Journal International has joined the growing ranks of sponsors.

Tournament entries-at \$695 a pop-are said to be pouring in. And, with reentries permitted (for only \$295), the Kingpin Challenge may well reach its target number of 2,500. (When

Aug. 6, WIBC Hall of Famer Betty Mivelaz called me with the sad news that Bobbe North, her best friend, had died peacefully in her sleep. Betty and Bobbe were two of Southern California's best distaff bowlers during the 60s and 70s.

Bobbe had developed back and leg problems that were so painful she had to give up bowling. She then turned to giving bowling lessons. One of her pupils was Donna Adamek, who went on to earn four national Bowler of the Year titles.

I knew Bobbe and her husband, Ron, for about 40 years. Ron, who got a lot of pleasure out of watching Bobbe bowl, preceded her in death several years ago.

Although Bobbe was a member of the SoCal Bowling Hall of Fame, most people don¹t remember that she had won two PWBA championships (in 1969 and 1970). Those were the same years Bobbe was named to the prestigious Bowlers Journal All-American team.

The SoCal Bowling Writers voted Bobbe to six All-Star Teams, and in 1969, 70 and 74, she was voted the SoCal Bowler of the Year. It was during that time I dubbed her the Striking Redhead. She loved it.

Her other honors included winning the CWBA Queens title twice (in 1969 and 1974). In 76, the CWBA elected Bobbe to the California State Women's HoF She was also voted into the Citrus Belt WBA HoF.

I'll miss Bobbe. I used to call her every month or so at her La Verne home. She loved to reminisce about the good old days of bowling.

Bobbe had a great sense of humor. I guess I liked her so much because she always laughed at my jokes. One of her favorites was the result of a true incident.

I don't remember exactly how it happened but we were talking about names. Bobbe, who had been married three times, remarked that she had some unusual married names.

My first married name was Bobbe Day, she said. My second one was Bobbe Black and then, of course, I became Bobbe North.

What was your maiden name? I asked her. Ong, she replied.

I don't believe you, I said. Ong is a Chinese name.

Well, it's Scottish, too. No way, I said. I still don't believe you.

Why, she pleaded, don't you believe me?

KIETZ KOMMENTS League People Disappearing?

LAKE FOREST --- "League People" are bowlers who like to bowl, organize, be officers, team captains in league's. Tenpin's backbone where the dues came from to finance the ABC, WIBC and YABA. Oh, yes, you remember.

Maybe you don't, there are not many around. Like old soldiers they slowly roll away. And, no one in the bowling business cares or wants to train or support them, not even the United States Bowling Congress.

The USBC's initial communique, USBowler, loaded with howto: become a coach, bowl better in tournaments, get on the national team, pro tips, enjoy sport (tough) bowling and the chief communicator, Tom Clark, caps the issue about bowling technology.

Not a word about league play. Their "Scoreboard" crunches members about past summer league high roller's scores.

CEO Roger Dalkin writes, "Coaching is Key. People who understand the sport and become more skilled likely to become lifelong members.'

The coaching classes don't teach anything about leagues. They teach you how to overcome those tough sport bowling conditions.

USBC will have "how to" league rule books available after the league is organized. The rule book will teach bowlers how to properly conduct themselves, how to protect their funds, etc..

We need the bowling people now to get those helpless leagues organized. It's common knowledge proprietors own the playing field and it's their duty to organize leagues, tournaments, open play and promote the game.

Proprietors need help. They needed help way back before the ABC was organized. You see, it wasn't the proprietors who got the ABC and their whacky team and tournament program organized, it was Brunswick.

It was John Brunswick's son-in-law Moses Bensinger who got the unorganized alley owners together in New York City's Bethhoven Hall; put on a seminar convincing them how to make their alleys more profitable, organize leagues and teams to fill them.

Before the owners left the Hall, Moses sold 'em on a system of alley and pin specifications and better than parting the Red Sea got 'em marching on Broadway with banners, "Join The ABC" and bowl the first championships in 1903 in Chicago.

First 41 ABC tournaments were bowled on Brunswick alleys. Moses' dream came through, five-player teams from organized leagues, that's what made our game.

Where can we get our modern day Moses? From AMF or Brunswick, maybe a mixed team, Moses and a Mother Theresa?

ALHAMBRA --- This is a special message to the legends of bowling for the last 50 years — five decades of the game of American Ten Pins. This is a personal invitation to you from Mr. Don Cecil, as this is my last contribution to the game. I have been around for 60 years in this wonderful sport. It's been the biggest part of my entire life, I love the game.

On the dates of September 3 and 4, 2005, that's Saturday and Sunday, I am hosting a get-together at Del Rio Lanes in Downey, CA. FORM, FINISH and FISICS - Part I Did my lousy spelling get your attention? Great! Because in today's bowling climate the importance of some of the laws of physics as they apply to form and improved scoring have gotten lost in the shuffle of "house" lane conditions and easier equipment. No, I'm definitely NOT one of those "I wish we'd go back to the old days" types. On the contrary, looking forward, rather than backward is more

my philosophy. The laws of physics, however, are what they are...and they'll usually break you long before you ever get away with breaking them! Upper body form during the approach and at the line is a case in point. It is

true that there are almost as many ways in which bowlers can individualize their styles as there are bowlers. Look at the many differences, for example, between the approach/release styles of Walter Ray Williams and Pete Weber...or Amleto Monacelli and Chris Barnes. Need I go on? What we often miss when watching such champions is the *similarities* in what they do, because the similarities are hidden by the more obvious differences.

Such bowlers are successful because they are able, for example, to maintain accurate swing alignments, consistent release positions, follow-throughs that vir-tually never vary and an uncanny ability to release the ball from a body position which gets it to the same chosen break point shot after shot. Not to be overlooked, these professionals look at practicing as a JOB; a job which will earn them a living...meaning hundreds of practice games per month, which also contributes to the development of a winning form, though it may appear different from individual to individual.

THE WINNING AMATEUR

You will never hear me say that less practice is better. But for the amateur who has a different career, there is a way to maximize scoring potential without com-mitting six or more hours of practice per day. That is to gain knowledge of and adhere to, a bodily form which utilizes some of the aforementioned laws of physics with less effort, although it may very likely involve more effort to learn to begin with.

This is because it requires change, which most people hate with a passion. But to the high level amateur who seriously wants to improve, change is usually an accepted part of developing winning ways.

So what follows will involve adjustments which help bring what we call "form" into a better relationship with the physical laws designed to get optimum results. THE TRAFFIC SIGNAL

OK; imagine traffic signal in the body, consisting of the green light in the middle of the body just a bit above the hips (which is the body's balance point, by the way), the yellow light in the middle of the chest and the red light in mid-neck.

Now, the importance of leverage in modern bowling is universally accepted, as is the truism that you get more leverage from a balanced position. The problem is that many bowlers bend too far forward (and downward) tilting the torso (traffic light) too much.

From that over tilted position, the all important follow through can't be com-pleted without a destructive early elbow bend and a destructive chicken wing. COMPARISONS

While the ball is heavier in bowling than other swing sports, a few compari-sons might just drive home the above points a bit more clearly. In virtually all swing sports, be it hitting, kicking or releasing a ball, the part of the body used to "lead into" the hit, kick or release is practically always the same...the hip...or mid-section (green light) in which the body's center of balance is located. In a famous photo of Babe Ruth hitting his fourth home run in a single game back in the 1930s

The photographer caught Ruth at the exact moment of his bat's impact with the ball, and at that instant Ruth appears to be leaning AWAY from the ball rather than into it.

How can this be? How can home run power be generated by a body bending in the opposite direction? Well, what you see in that photo causes an illusion. What he's <u>really</u> doing is moving INTO the hit by first stepping into it, then generating upper body leverage with hips and torso in that order. This allowed his body's central balance point to control the swing. So in reality it's the body's midsection...the hip area...that's the key!

And so it is with golf, tennis, passing or kicking a football, shot put, discus, the javelin throw, on and on. If you'll take a moment to visualize any or all of the above movements you'll see this phenomenon in your mind's eye. Videos of such sports make it even more obvious.

Some, such as golf, exaggerate this motion more than others, but it's nearly always there among top performers, including many top pro bowlers. Many of today's top coaches, as well as hall of fame bowlers turned teacher, will tell you that in modern bowling too much body bend from the waist is detrimental. FACING THE WALL

Why, then, do so many bowlers, including some par bowlers, seem to lunge forward with the shoulders into the release, leaving the hips and butt sticking out behind? Well, part of the reason is that in stretching the bowling arm toward the mark during the release, many bowlers overdo it by taking the shoulder (and therefore the upper body) along with the arm.

At the same time the back leg stretches too far back and around, pulling that hip area back even more. Now the green light is sticking out behind, the red light hangs over past the toes, increasing the over-bend even more (often causing the bowler to hop forward at the line).

Worse, that back leg often pulls so far around behind the body, that the entire body, front foot and all, twists and turns sideways. This overdone back leg action, by the way, is the reason so many high average bowlers get stuck at a scoring level below their true potential. Once it is understood that facing the wall during the release forces a "pull" to get the ball to the target, the problem clears up a bit.

Remember, releasing the ball across the body causes lousy accuracy no matter how many revs may be generated. Result? Splits and too many missed easy spares cause enough open frames to keep the strikes from creating a satisfactory game. To maintain a 215 plus average an open frame <u>must</u> be followed by a turkey. Even then, more than two opens can mess up a potential 200 game!

Stroker, cranker or a combination of the two, you'll never break this law of physics with impunity for any length of time. Even on the PBA tour, with all that practice, few get away with it often enough to make money. So the bowler with limited practice time is far better off working on a form which obeys these laws. **THE NITTY GRITTY** For those who may have had trouble keeping the torso (traffic signal) from

over-bending, take heart; it is easier than you may think. You don't do it by trying to straighten it out at the red light, because that involves moving the entire upper body <u>backward</u> while your approach is moving <u>forward</u>.

Instead, keep your green light (hips) moving forward with your steps and on the last step hit the foul line with the green light. This is more efficient because the center section of the body, having more hinges, is easier to move. Try this test: Stand and bend forward from the waist 35 to 45 degrees or so; now straighten the upper body (red light) but this time, just push your hips (green light) forward instead.

What happened? Right! As your hips went forward the upper body unbent like magic without your ever thinking about it! Much more effortless. Now use it as part of your approach. It won't take too many tries before that traffic light is almost vertical. This form finally allows your arm to finish its follow-through without that devastating early elbow bend, loss of leverage and possible chickenwing.

This works! From this body position at the line you can much more easily create a leveraged release, affording much more lane condition control. The only way you could overdo it is by arching your back, which won't normally happen because when you hit the line the entire body is moving forward...so your nearly vertical traffic signal may actually still be leaning a couple of degrees forward which is OK, but never over-bent!

THE BACK KNEE

Now...at the line, if the front foot is thought of as being at 12 o'clock, the back foot should be at approximately 7 o'clock (5 o'clock for left handers) in order for the body to resist turning away from the target.

To that, let's now add the idea that to help keep the back leg from stretching too far, the back knee must actually be kept a bit more loose, or bent, rather than straightened out completely. Also, the back knee can be pulled forward a bit, finishing closer to the front knee. Since 100% of the body weight is balanced (green light) on the *front foot*, a *bent* back knee creates a stable tripod position. This so lidifies your form at the line into an easily repeated and solid position. This position, or form, turns your body into a launch pad, if you will, from which you can fire a consistently accurate and powerful missile!
