Nilsen used his new Victory Road Solid to roll his big set (259 - 277 - 299 = 835). The Kangaroo Kid utilized his Anarchy to score (289 - 203 - 300 = 792).

The third game match was the highlight of Cal Oaks Bowl summer, so far.

The Kangaroo Kid beat up on Nilsen 300 - 299! Both stood side by side at the ball return as the tenth frame began. They agreed to take turns with their final frame shots with Hawkins going first. Five strikes later and Nilsen was alone on the approach trying to match Hawkin’s perfect game.

Nilsen released his final ball perfectly, letting it roll off his hand at the ideal power point, generating maximum speed and revolutions.

Everything looked great, right up to when the ball exited the pin deck. The pins seemed to blow back with a bang, then like a mirage in the desert, there was a lone eight pin standing. A lonely, wobbling eight pin, ready to fall if touched by a mere feather. For a moment it looked like it would fall, but then it stabilized and stood.

The Kangaroo Kid had won the game, but lost the match. He had to be perfect and was. Hawkins was gracious in defeat, congratulating Nilsen for his victory and consoling him for being deprived of perfect.

Team USA’s Smith & Mizo Capture Doubles Gold at Tournament of the Americas

FLORIDA — Steve Smith and Jarret Mizo each collected their first gold medals as members of Team USA, taking the doubles title at the 49th Annual Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas on Wednesday.

In the Adult Men division, Smith and Mizo combined for a 2,627 total at Sawgrass Lanes in Tamarac, Fla., to beat Venezuela’s Amleto Monacelli and Jose Vicente Lander by nearly 100 pins.

“I was really excited yesterday to win my first medal, and to get my first gold medal was awesome,” Smith said. “Jarret and I communicated well and stayed ahead of the transition.”

Smith earned his first international medal on Tuesday when he won silver in the singles competition. He had trailed by 159 pins after the first day of competition, but Smith made a big run on Tuesday to fall just short of Monacelli.

“I always like a challenge, so it’s nice to have someone of his statue to compete against,” Smith said of Monacelli. “He motivates me more to compete.”

Brenda Padilla of Mansfield, Texas, picked up her second gold medal, teaming with Tennelle Milligan of Arlington, Texas, to win the Adult

Women title. Padilla won the gold in singles while Milligan took third.

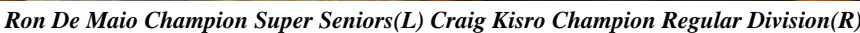

Being a position match each game of these finals, Craig completed his sweep of the 4 games, and 3 of these against Jeff. He trailed Jeff by only 8 pins going into the last game.

Craig exploded for a big 279 game against Jeff's 175 game, and ended up winning the tournament by 126 pins. Top 2: 1st Place, Craig Kisro, \$500.00, 2nd Place, Jeff Gordon, \$350.00. Only 10 bowlers entered in this division, 4 checks, paid out \$1,425.00, and for the year so far, 13 Tournaments, \$70,127.00 paid out, and for 334 tournaments, a total of 3,548,120.00 paid out. ARCADIA — Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to Bowling Square this past weekend for a regular event, and we saw a great turnout of 300 entries in our one day event. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +41 for the men and +41 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Art Lindsey(+40), Man-ny Loria(+31), and Omenza Gaston(-19). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need be a young 55. That would give us 68 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

The day's top qualifier for the Men was Bart Sanchez with a +180. For the women it was Margie Coronado with a +82. Each of them will get a paid entry into a regular ABTA event. The top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$578. Bart drew a 511. Three bowlers matched the score during qualifying, Bernie Navarro, Cecilia Lung, and Jason Miller. Each will get \$192. This Week we will estimate the Match Series at \$450. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, it was Michael Wilson who would miss on his first shot, and got a \$50 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$2,500 at West Covina Lanes Saturday.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Jerry Chang and Michael Kong with a 1441 for \$160. Finishing second were Andrew Lung and Michael Kong with 1414 for \$140. There was a nice total of \$1,700 paid out in doubles and 26 paid spots with low to cash of 1331. Doubles are only \$5 per bowler.

In the semis we saw Ruben Gonzales lead the field with a nice +168 to sit out and bowl for the title this week. Coming in second was Bart Sanchez with a +114 to sit out the first round. It took a +67 for the men and +27 for the women.

Gonzales, the top seed,

had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. We have a back-up pot that is worth \$3,500 also and another started at \$555. Ruben drew a 158. We had three bowlers who shot that score. They were Minh Dang, Manny Loria, and Orpah Toliver. They will share the \$3,500, \$1,167 each for that score. We will have \$3,500 this week at West Covina, and continue to build on the second back-up pot., that is at \$555. This week we had four new bowlers join us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Brian Chieng, James Sweet, Daron Cowart, and Amy Galsim.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Desiree Herrera, Virgil Hilvano, Dana LeCount, Julian Conwi, Monica Path, Donovan Chung, and Javier Avilia. They received checks of \$120 each. In the second round, the losers were Chao Lin, Bonnie Roberto, Leo Silva, and Bart Sanchez. They received checks of \$130 each. This would get us down to the final five bowlers. Our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$32 (Billy Chao) to a high of \$54 (Noel Sicut) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Billy Chao (3rd seed) bowling Noel Sicut (4th seed). In this match, we would see Billy continue his hot bowling though match play and down Noel with a 232 to 164 to advance. In the other match we saw Kelly Wynn (5th seed) bowling Brad Le Count (12th seed). In this match it would be Kelly who would advance to the top 5 again this week with a very close 209 to 203 final, sending him to the semi-final match. Both Noel and Brad finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$140 each. This week only the top 5 would lose handicap, so both would lose only 1 pin.

Our semi-final match was all set. It would be bowled on Lanes 17 and 18 and pitted Wynn 5th seed vs 3rd seed

Chao.

In the weekly "horses" we would see Billy paying \$32 and Kelly paying \$39 if they would win this match. Billy would start with an open, but it was Kelly who had opens in the 2nd and 3rd frames. In the end, it was Billy who would have strikes in the 9th, 10th, and 11th frames to seal the victory with a 177/219 to 161/205 and advance to the title match. Kelly would finish in 3rd place this week and take home \$225, and only lose 2 pins this week. For those lucky "investors" that had Billy as a horse, he paid \$32. Kelly is on a roll the past two weeks and bowling very well

The title game was set and bowled on Lanes 13 and 14. It would be our top seed, Gonzales who would struggle after a double in frames 2-3 but could not find the magic he had in the Semis as he had a nightmare of a game after that double. Billy would jump out into a huge lead that would prove to be enough. Billy would finish with a 189/231 to Ruben 133/168 and take home his 2nd ABTA title. He would take home \$1,000 for 1st place and \$1,700 for max Cash and Carry, \$100 for wearing his ABTA shirt but he did not use a Global Bal. He would take home \$2,800 for his win. Ruben received \$500 for 2nd place, and lose only 3 pins this week, with our champion losing 4 pins.

Champion, Billy Chao is from Monterey Park, and used an Awesome Finish drilled by himself. He has a son Charlie, a future ABTA Member and would like to thank Patricia and the Mou Liu bowlers, along with Bob and the rest of the ABTA Staff for a fine event to bowl in. Billy is definitely One of the Good Guys and nice to all. He usually has a positive upbeat disposition and is fun loving and nice to be around. Congrats Mr. Chao.

Ruben Gonzales (2nd Place) is from Palmdale, and used a Cool Noise drilled by

He is also one of the Good Guys!!

Dale Eagle Wins PBA Senior Decatur Open
For 12th Career Senior Tour Title
Win ties him for second on Senior Tour career titles list

DECATUR, Ill. (Aug. 16, 2011) – Dale Eagle of Tavares, Fla., won the Professional Bowlers Association Senior Decatur Open Tuesday to notch his 12th career Senior Tour title putting him in a tie for second on the all-time Senior Tour wins list.

The 65 year-old Eagle, who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in January, defeated Kent Wagner of Palmetto, Fla., 223-186, in the title match at Spare Time Lanes.

“I was trying to be perfect on every shot and maybe too perfect,” said Eagle. “It was a tough shot where I had to play a straighter line. It was one of those tournaments where you needed some breaks to win and I got a lot of breaks in match play.”

Eagle, a three-time winner on the PBA Tour, is tied for second with Gary Dickinson on the Senior Tour all-time wins list and both bowlers trail career titles leader John Handegard with 14.

Eagle’s win was his first in two years with his last title coming in the 2009 Senior Miller High Life Classic. His previous best finish this season was sixth in the Senior Don Carter Open.

“I’ve had some health issues especially with my knees and back and I’m working hard on getting in better shape,” said Eagle, the 1999 PBA Senior Player of the Year and 1996 Senior Rookie of the Year. “I’m working hard on my game and learning a lot from the younger guys. Norm Duke has helped me work out a problem with my release.”

In the semifinals, Eagle defeated Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Township, Mich., 192-171, to advance to the championship match. Sullins was trying for his second consecutive and third win overall this season. In the other semifinal, Wagner, a two-time PBA Tour winner, defeated Dave Axon of Bellevue, Neb., 237-194. Both players were trying for their first Senior Tour win.

CHUK IT!
(Pronounced “Chuck”)

MURRIETA — “Stop chuking the ball, stop chuking the ball” yelled KEN CLAY. Our ten minute practice session was nearly over and Clay could see the “KING OF CHUKERS” chuking his ball down lane at 25 MPH. He couldn’t resist letting the King know he was watching.

The King of Chukers (JERRY DeYAGER) just smiled and kept chuking. He loves launching a bowling ball down lane at a high rate of speed. He loves throwing a hardball. Harder than anyone on the planet. He just rears back and throws his sixteen pound Taboo, over the ten board, with gusto. Nothing fancy, just POTENTIAL ENERGY converted to KINETIC ENERGY, with a BANG at the end. Pure power generated by six feet four inches and 250 pounds of muscle. Add a little side turn and BOOM!

So what is chuking and why does Jerry do it? Chuking a bowling ball is propelling it down lane at a high rate of speed, with four to six feet of loft, in a straight line from the corner, with a little wrinkle at the end.

“WRINKLE,” I mean hook. Side rotation is preferred.

Chuking is especially effective on dry lanes. However, it can be used anytime if you maintain your ball speed at recommended levels. Jerry is comfortable at 20 - 25 MPH on dry lanes, and 15 - 18 MPH on wet. Are you up to the challenge?

I would love to chuk. Deep down I know that Ken Clay would like to chuk. We are both jealous, and Jerry knows it. He just keeps chuking with a smile on his face. I think ball chuking must be fun. Chuking is a macho thing, and every red blooded American male wants to chuk it. However, only the few can.



Another topic of interest was our tournament dress code. Everyone present agreed that times are changing, and our society is going casual. As a result, like dress code enforcement at the national USBC tournaments, we will have to be diligent but lenient. We still expect our bowlers to be "PRESENTABLE".

In the future, our tournament committees may adjust the base average which is used in each tournament, to determine how much handicap a bowler receives, in a tournament. For example, the directors recommended that the Men's Tournament Committee consider raising that tournaments base average to 240.
