GREENDALE—When Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., goes into battle with Team USA at the upcoming World Tenpin Bowling Association Men's World Championships, scheduled for Aug. 22-30 in Bangkok, Thailand, he knows one thing for sure.

"None of us like to lose," said Jones, who is one of five professional bowlers representing Team USA. "Anytime we bowl anything, we want to win ... especially when you put those colors on. There will be a lot of people gunning for us. We just have to go over there, do our part and feed off each other. It will happen."

This event marks the much anticipated first appearance of professionals at the World Championships. Joining Jones in Thailand on the six-player Team USA squad are fellow Denny's Professional Bowlers Association Tour stars Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, Patrick Allen of Wesley Chapel, Fla., and Rhino Page of Topeka, Kan., along with amateur Bill Hoffman of Columbus, Ohio.

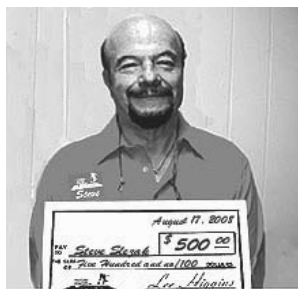

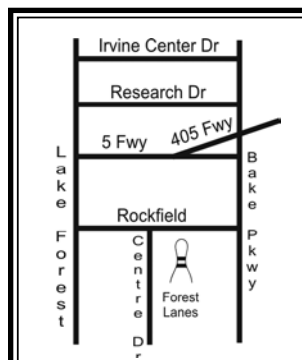

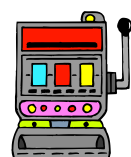

legislation last August.

Even though this is his first year on Team USA, Jones is no stranger to representing his country on the world stage. At age 17, he earned all-events and Masters silver medals plus a team bronze at the 1996 WTBA World Youth Championships in Hong Kong, where he also rolled a 300 game in the singles event.

Like Barnes and Hoffman, Jones has represented the United States in recent years at the Weber Cup, an event similar to golf's Ryder Cup pitting the U.S. against a European team in a series of different match-ups.

"I love the team atmosphere. Your teammates can pick you up and you can pick them up," said Jones, a 12-time winner on the PBA Tour - including two majors. "When you put that shirt on and bowl for your country, it's a completely different mentality."

All of Jones' PBA Tour titles have come in the last four seasons, including four titles in 2004-05 followed by four in the 2005-06 season in which he earned the PBA Player of the Year Award.

Even though they have a combined 77 PBA titles between them, Jones see him and his teammates learning plenty in Thailand.

"That's one of the beautiful things about bowling. You can never master it," said Jones, who won two titles in the 2007-08 season. "I'm going to learn something from Chris. He'll probably learn something from me. Patrick is going to learn something from Rhino. Walter might even teach us something. It's going to be a learning experience for all of us and it will better us for the future."

### Gallo Lost in Close Vote for July Bowler of the Month to Morgan

The Bowling Writers Association of America has a monthly selection of Pro or amateur bowlers who excelled in such month be named the BWAA Kegle Bowler of Month. Usually PBA and top ranked women bowlers were named each past months.

For the month of July this writer who is on the BOM Committee, nominated deaf Frank Gallo, Jr of Newport News, VA who won his first PBA tournament in 36 years.

It is the first time a deaf bowler was on the ballot and it turned out to be a close contest between Gallo and another PBA senior Nick Morgan of Sacramento, CA. Morgan had won the PBA Senior North California Open title on his first try with a clean 7-0 record and 245+ average. Morgan nosed out Gallo in a close vote for the Kegle BoM of July. There were also some competitors who got some votes.

### RESULTS OF PACIFIC COAST DEAF MASTERS AND SENIOR MASTERS VASQUEZ BEATS STOGRYN FOR LAST DEAF SCRATCH MASTERS TITLE

RANCHO CUCAMONGA—The 49th annual Pacific Coast Deaf Masters, the deaf bowlers' history longest going scratch Masters in the nation ended as its last scratch event with 55 entrants at Brunswick Deer Creek Bowl last Memorial Day weekend. The once grand prestige event of Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association had dwindling entries and was voted to go along with nation's other deaf Masters that had been using handicap.

On Saturday afternoon, the honors of leading the last scratch qualifying round went to Mark Fisser, Laguna Hills, CA with 884 from games of 206-247-226-205.

Hawaiian Ralph Collier, the defending champion who made yearly trips to mainland for this prestigious event, placed 2nd with 212-207-223-223 for 865. There were fifteen 800 series and the 32nd cut off score was 728. The high qualifying game 279 was made by PCDBA President Ed Abakumoff, Riverside who finished with 823 for 12th place.

On Sunday 's all day doubles elimination two games match plays, Collier had his hopes of being the third bowler to win back to back titles eliminated with two quick losses and former champion Abakumoff failed in third round. Fisser was going well, winning first two but losing next two but him out. His last loss was to Tim Estes, Tacoma, WS who rolled tournament high two games 546 from 278-268 one pin shy of the record 547.

After close record series, Estes who qualified in 5th place with 858, won two more rounds, then lost in 7th round quarterfinals to 17th place qualifier (794) Darrell Stogryn, El Camino Village, CA 453 to 395. Estes received \$200 for 4th place Stogryn who lost in 1st round and won his next 6 matches averaging 220+ for his 14 games moved into semi-finals against Hawaiian Nicholas Rivera who qualified in 6th place with 855.

In the winners bracket, Rivera had won all his 4 matches averaging 222+ for 8 games moved into 5th round match against the eventual winner, Daniel Vasquez, La Puente, CA who had qualified in 4th place with a closing 268 for 860. Vasquez also won his 4 matches averaging 209+ for his 8 games. In this undefeated match Vasquez became the top seed when he beat Rivera 415 - 359 to put Rivera in the loser bracket's semi finals against Stogryn.

In the semi-finals Stogryn, a silver medallist in the 2005 Deaflympics Masters ousted Rivera in close battle 442 to 426. Rivera got \$250 for 3rd place and Stogryn moved into the Championship finals against the resting and waiting Vasquez. In that match Stogryn after steadily bowling 16 games without a rest, lost 372 to Vasquez's 421.

Vasquez got the trophy and \$530.00 while Stogryn as the runner-up got \$310.00. All 32 qualifiers received prize money.

The story of Pacific Coast Deaf Senior Masters won by Lonnie Jones, Jr. was held up because of this writer's confusion on the qualifying set-up.
