

PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins PBA50 Gene Stus Dies at 74 Treasure Island Resort & Casino Open

MICHIGAN — The PBA learned that PBA Hall of Famer and Senior Tour standout Gene Stus of Allen Park, Mich., died Monday August 18th at age 74.

As a competitive bowler for most of his adult life, Stus had always wondered how he might have done on the PBA Tour. But the opportunity to compete in Tour competition didn't present itself until he was able to retire from General Motors after 32 years at the age of 50 and became a regular on the Senior Tour, now called the PBA50 Tour.

Even as a late-bloomer in the professional ranks, Stus' career on the Senior Tour would ultimately lead to his induction into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2012.

Norm Duke Earns PBA50 Player of the Year

WELCH — Walter Ray Williams Jr. won his ninth career PBA50 Tour title and Norm Duke withstood a challenge from Tom Baker for PBA50 Tour Player of the Year in the PBA50 Treasure Island Resort & Casino Open presented by Hammer Wednesday at Island Xtreme Bowl in Welch, Minn.

In another all-Hall of Fame championship match, Williams, who won the USBC Senior Masters for his first title of the season, defeated Baker 268-224 in the championship match. With a win Baker could have earned the 16 points necessary to move ahead of Duke of Clermont, Florida, for the Player of the Year title.

"It's a great way to end a season," said Williams, who is the PBA Tour's all-time titles leader with 47 wins. "I had a good season and when you can win against the talent that's out here now it makes it that much more satisfying.


"I think Norm owes me dinner but you can't take anything away from him – he bowled awesome all year," Williams added.

Duke left the door open for Baker to make a run at Player of the Year when the two Hall of Famers slugged it out in the Round of 8 with Baker winning the best-of-three match 2 games to 1.

Duke's closest competitor in the Player of the Year race going into the tournament was Hall of Famer Pete Weber who was just eight points behind but had to withdraw from the tournament prior to match play because of illness which required a hospital visit. He was treated and released.

In the semifinal matches, Baker defeated Hall of Famer Randy Pedersen of Orlando, 246-162 and Williams defeated Don Breeden of Urbandale, Iowa, 279-190, to advance to

Williams' 268 game in the title match and the 279 in the

semifinal match were his highest games of the tournament.

"I saved the best for last and that was the time to have them," Williams said. "Earlier in the day I wasn't really executing as well as I wanted but I was able to fine tune my adjustments at the right time."

Duke, who won two titles this season including the Senior U.S. Open, joined Baker

as the only players to win PBA50 Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year in the same season. Baker, of King, North Carolina, earned both honors in 2005 which was the start of a record four consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crowns for the 12-time PBA50 Tour winner.

...A bowler can usually tell how good his or her reputation is by how difficult it is to live up to it.

...We have some great trick shot bowlers but the master was the late, great Andy Varipapa who was still in demand when he was 90. He went through all the various bowling ablls from wood on up and he dazzled in person, on TV, in the movies. He had control, confidence, and his main aim was to communicate with his audiences, letting them know that he wanted to please them.

...It is no knock not to win, but it is tragedy if you don't give your best effort.

...Top pro golfers, and even some that aren't top rated, can win a million dollars and more in a single tournament. Top pro bowlers still get special praise when they reach the million mark in their careers. That's hardly fair. But remember we didn't even have true professional bowlers in any numbers in their own niche until 1958. Pro bowlers travel the world seeking the many tournaments that are making roll for pay more and more universal.

...If more bowlers would read all the rules before they enter tournaments, and more tournament directors, individuals or groups, would check bowlers before they bowl, there would be a lot less post tourney problems.

...If tourney entry fees, travel, by any means, car, train, plane, hotels and food costs continue to escalate, nearby tournaments will have their own special appeal, in the head and in the purse. Start out by rolling in your county and state events.

...The happy ending to "too many nights of bowling" is the simple fact that the night has ended.

EL MONTE - We returned to Action Lanes where 188 bowlers came out for a great day of bowling. The cut scores were + 85 for the men and +63 for the women. The Super seniors added to the board (two men and one woman) Manny Loria at +84, Glenn Matsumoto at +81, and for the women it was Carla Sanchez +42. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 42 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

High qualifiers for the tournament were Brad Le Count for the men with a +188, and for the women it was Faye Josafat with a +155. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA Event. Each week one of our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$2,665. Brad drew a 502 Series, no one matched that score. The pot carries over and is estimated at \$4,000 at West Covina. Teddy Villaroman was the last standing for the 3-6-9 pot and missed on shot#1 receiving \$50 consolation. Since it is not broken, 3-6-9 stays at \$3,000. We have a Nice Back Up Pot also in store.

In our optional doubles tops were Faye Josafat and Henry Sanchez with a 1531 for \$160. Finishing in second place was Emilio Flores and Carlos Umana with a 1446 for \$140. There was a total of \$1,930 paid out in doubles. 30 paid spots with low to cash of 1376. In our Mystery Doubles, we paid out eight places and finishing in first with a 524 was John Armenia and Freddy Zamora with a 524 for \$100. Total paid out was \$480 with a low score of 464.

After the first game of the semi-finals, the low for the top 13 men was +33. The low for the top 3 women was +39. Robert Contreras lead the way with a +79. After the second game, it was Manny Loria taking the lead with a 94. Low for the men was +51, and the women's low was +45. After the third game of semi-finals, finishing in first was Manny Loria with a +178. Coming in a tie for second was Chris Kelly and Mamerto Jablan at a +145. They would have a 9th and 10th frame roll-off to determine the second seed to sit out the first round. Chris Kelly would win the roll-off. This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In Round -1, the seven losers were Emily Yeung, Brad Le Count, Henry Sanchez, Tri Vo, Robert Contreras, Mike J Moore, and Ray Saucedo III. Each will get \$100. In Round-2, the four losers were Benjamin Chung, Ada Wong-Hum, Christina Cheung, and Chris Solomon with each of them getting

checks of \$105. In the third round, it was Sunny Fong and Emilio Flores finishing fourth and fifth for \$110.

This would get us down to the semi-final match that would have Chris Kelly and Mamerto Jablan having the rematch of the 9th and 10th frame roll-off. In our horses, it would be Chris paying \$43 and Marmeto paying \$50 if they won their match. Mamerto would take revenge on Chris during this match as he continued his hot bowling with a 263 to 185 to advance to the title match. Chris finished in third place for \$200. For each \$5 that you bet on Marmeto you took home \$50.

The title game was set with the top qualifier Manny Loria vs Mamerto Jablan. Manny elected to have Mamerto start first. Mamerto started out with a strike; Manny came up and got a couple of spares for his start. In the second Mamerto would left a split but came back with a strike and trailed by 37 after the first couple of frames.

Manny was able to get another spare but opened in the fourth. Up came Mamerto and he would get another split on the right lane and could not take advantage of the open. However, he would strike in the fifth frame. Manny came up in the fifth and got another spare but once again he opened in the sixth to open the door, as his lead was 35 pins at this point. Mamerto would get his first strike on the right lane in the sixth but he left the bucket in the seventh and could only cut the deficit down to 13 at this point. Manny managed

to get a mark in the seventh but opened in the eighth to leave the door open. However, Mamerto could not convert the single pin spare in the eighth frame. So going into the final frames Manny needed a couple of marks to lock out the match. He struck in the ninth and left the four pin in the tenth but he missed his fourth consecutive spare on the left lane to give Marmeto a chance in the tenth. Mamerto came up needing to throw two strikes, got a seven count on the first ball and that would give Manny the victory with a 142/202 to 165/198. Manny took home his third ABTA championship taking home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$100 for wearing his ABTA shirt and \$100 for using a 900 Global to give him a total of \$1,200. Mamerto would take home \$500 for his second place fin-

Confederation Youth Championships, where they also won the team event, and they drew on that experience in Hong Kong.

"After PABCON, we didn't know if we'd get to travel together again for the World Championships, so to come here together, win again and defend the title for the 2012 team is surreal," Low said. "We had an early advantage today and just didn't want to let up or give them a chance to come back. As the week went on, we kept getting stronger as a team, and that really showed today."

The United States edged Japan 776-760 to earn its spot in the final, while Malaysia dominated England, 909-738.

In the girls gold-medal match, Japan and Sweden both struggled at different points of the game, but a late rally from Japan gave anchor Kana Shimoide a chance to win with two strikes and nine pins in the final frame.

After getting the double, Shimoide's final offering drifted high, nearly leaving the 4-7-10 split, but the 7 and 10 pins fell late to secure the 784-783 win.

Japan's road to the final included a less-dramatic, 750-685, win over Finland. All of the fireworks came in Sweden's semifinal win against the United States, the defending girls champion. Sweden anchor Jenny Wegner struck on the first shot of the 10th frame to lift her team to an 838-821 win.

Japan and England each earned bronze medals in the boys team event, and Finland and Junior Team USA shared the bronze in the girls division.

All teams bowled three qualifying games on the 45-foot Mexico City lane condition and three on the 35-foot Beijing oil pattern before the field was cut to the top four for the semifinals.

The conclusion of the team event Wednesday also determined the all-events medalists based on their 18-game pinfall totals.

Junior Team USA's Low claimed the all-events gold medal on the boys side with help from a 300 in his opening game Wednesday. It was the fourth perfect game by a boy, and fifth overall, in World Youth Championships competition. The first was rolled by Team USA's Tommy Jones at the 1996 event, also in Hong Kong. Low set the pace with a record 18-game total of 4,224, a 234.67 average. Junior Team USA's Kamron Doyle earned the silver with 4,095 and Sweden's Jesper Svensson claimed the bronze medal with 4,078. The previous all-events record of 4,153 was set by Dominic Barrett of England in 2008.

"I wasn't paying attention to the all-events standings at all this week," said Low, who won the silver medal in singles this week. "I wanted to take it one event at a time and hopefully make the Masters cut, and then take it from there. Today, I was just focused on the team and helping us have a chance to win." On the girls side, Shion Izumune of Japan reached the medal

On the girls side, Shion Izumune of Japan reached the medal round in every event and took home the all-events gold medal with an 18-game total of 3,836, a 213.11 average. Junior Team USA's Mary Wells and Liz Kuhlkin won the silver and bronze medals with 3,777 and 3,724, respectively.

The field included 262 bowlers from 46 countries, competing in singles, doubles, team, all-events. Singles was contested on the Beijing oil pattern, doubles was bowled on Mexico City and the team event featured three games on each.

Competition continues Thursday with the start of Masters play, which will feature the top 24 boys and top 24 girls in the all-events standings. It took an average of 205.44 to qualify on the boys side and 194.17 for the girls.

All competitors will bowl six games Thursday morning, followed by a cut to the top eight in each division for round-robin match play. Each pair of lanes will have the Mexico City pattern on the left lane and Beijing on the right.

The top four in each category after Friday's match-play round will advance to the semifinals, scheduled for 1 a.m. EDT.



Several years ago, I returned to bowling to find changes, one being many more oiling patterns. I can see the need for expert bowlers to test their talents. Most bowlers have a limited budget and cannot drill an endless supply of bowling balls to remain competitive.

The Sport is getting smaller and evolving into a fun center atmosphere. I understand the need for bowling centers to make money but don't forget about the bowlers that started this sport.

I bowled in many ABT and NABI tournaments in the past. I rejoined ABT in San Diego looking for good competition and fun. I found a very low turnout. At first, I thought it was the economy. After bowling in a few tournaments it was evident the lane patterns were very difficult. So difficult, that I found many bowlers were frustrated with the low scores.

I just returned from an annual national company tournament were teams compete for Olympic style medals. This year was very different, the new coordinator wanted to keep the scores down. He asked the house for a different shot. They used a shot called "Fox". Everyone had that dear in the head lights look. Everyone scrambled to their smart phones. It was later discovered to be a locale house shot made up to drive scores down. It worked so well that almost all of the 200 average bowlers were caught off guard. They tried everything and I mean everything to play this surface. Players that average 210 back home were now shooting 160 games. Bowler were not competing against one another but fighting the lanes. Some bowlers quit the event out of frustration.

I watched a PBA event on TV were the top five bowlers did not even break 200. It was boring to say the least. Tournament with high scores are fun and exciting. Who will be the first to miss, not who will be the first to get a strike?

My point in all of this, happy bowlers are now upset and frustrated bowling on condition made to drive scores too low. Players question any future participation in the events. Most bowlers do not have the resources to compete at a PBA level. Bowling is dropping off and centers are closing. Lane conditions are not the only reason but why add to the problem.


