## BJMoore Wins firstiph Tour Title

Late string of four strikes locks up victory to end seven-year quest for a titte
WILMINGTON, N.C. - BJ Moore of Greensburg,
Pennsylvania defeated 13time Professional Bowlers Association titlist Sean Rash of Montgomery, Illinois, $243=215$, to win his first PBA Tour title in the Go Bowling! Professional Bowlers Association Tour's Wilmington Open Wednesday at Ten Pin Alley Family Fun Center.
Moore, a 30 -year-old right-hander, ended a sev-en-year quest for his first title in his 50th PBA Tour tournament. Moore's previous best finish was second place in both the 2016 and 2019 PBA Scorpion Championships.

"I don't know what to Rash praised Moore for said. "I'm a process guy it great when he needed and that's definitely what I to," Rash, the top qualifier, was focused on this week. said. "It was a great effort." Sometimes you have to Moore gained the uptake your lumps before you per hand in the final match, can win, but it's all been worth it."

## Walier Ray Williams st: Returns to Winning Form on Way to Third PBA5O Player of the Year Award

Eugene McEune wins 2019 PBA50 Rookie of the Year • Ron Mohr wins fourth consecutive PBAGO Player of the Year honor
CHICAGO - After winning his third PBA50 Player of the Year Award in his 10th season competing on the tour for players 50 and over, 59 -year-old PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. sent a message that he will be a major force for some time to come competing in the "senior" ranks.
Williams, who also earned the PBA50 Player of the Year crown in 2012 and 2013, opened the 2019 season with three consecutive wins including the PBA50 National Championship for his third career PBA50 Tour major, and never had a finish worse than ninth until a 17th-place finish in the PBA50 David Small's JAX 60 Classic, the final PBA50 event of the season.

The all-time Go Bowling! PBA Tour titles leader with 47 wins brought his career PBA50 Tour titles


Tour titles lead with retired Hall of Famer John Handegard.
"Obviously, it was a re-
ally good, encouraging season," said Williams, who owns seven Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year honors on the PBA Tour. "I wasn't always the best bowler in the field (this season) but you can't argue

Williams is among a handful of players who continue to compete on both the PBA Tour and PBA50 Tour including fellow Hall of Famers and rivals for more than three decades, Norm Duke, Pete Weber, Parker Bohn III and Amleto Monacelli. Williams' PBA50 Player of the Year award came at what
"I wasn't pleased with how I bowled on the regular tour this season so the PBA50 Tour gave me a lift," he said. "Bowling on the regular tour has always been enjoyable for me but last season wasn't enjoyable. I'm not ready to retire from bowling on the PBA Tour but that's a tough tour continued on page 5

# Fjam Ciminelliwinis PeBA Gene Carter's Pros Sono Classicicot tighthitile Two strikes in 10ith frame ends three-vear title drought 

MIDDLETOWN, Del. - Ryan Ciminelli of Lancaster, South Carolina, defeated top qualifier Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Florida, 217-209, to win his eighth Go Bowling! Professional Bowlers Association Tour title Sunday in the Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic at Mid-County Bowling and Entertainment Center.
Ciminelli, ending a three-year title slump, took an early lead against Daugherty, starting with three strikes and getting help when Daugherty left the 3-6-7-10 split and opened in the fourth frame. But Ciminelli returned the favor, leaving the 4-6-7-9-10 "Greek church" in his ninth frame to give Daugherty a chance to shut him out. When Daugherty failed to strike out, Ciminelli locked up the title with strikes on his first two shots in the 10th frame.
"I really don't know what to say," the 33-year-old lefthander said. "There's a few different reasons why this one means so much to me. What really matters is all the people here watching me win. There were a lot of people who helped me out. I can't thank them enough."

Daugherty, a 44-year-old two-time PBA Tour title winner, took the lead in Sunday's five-game cashers round and systematically won every match he needed to win in the 12-game match play round to secure the top berth for the stepladder finals. But he fell one match shy of picking up his third PBA Tour title.
"Maybe I'll get (Ciminelli) next week in Coldwater (Ohio)," Daugherty said.

In the first stepladder match, Ciminelli threw strikes on his first two shots in the 10th frame to lock out Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Michigan, 224-214. Ciminelli, pursuing his first title since winning the 2016 Parkside Lanes Open in Aurora, Illinois, was nearly perfect in eliminating Canadian two-hander Zacharay Wilkins of Barrie, Ontario, 266-223, in the semifinal match. After a spare in the first

frame, Ciminelli threw eight consecutive strikes to deny Wilkins' bid for his first PBA Tour title
The Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic was the fifth of 10 events that are part of the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour.
The FloBowling PBA Summer Tour now moves west to Coldwater, Ohio, for the PBA Bowlerstore.com Classic presented by Moxy's Xtra Pair at 16-lane Pla-Mor Lanes where qualifying will take place on Thursday followed by the cashers round, Rounds of 16 and 8, and stepladder finals on Friday.
All rounds of the sixth FloBowling Summer Tour event will be livestreamed on FloBowling.com. For additional information, visit FloBowling.com.

ORLANDO, Fla. - Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, became the first player in nearly 20 years to claim four titles in a Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour season by winning the 2019 BowlerX.com PWBA Orlando Open at Boardwalk Bowl.
O'Keefe, the reigning PWBA Player of the Year, edged Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, in the championship match Saturday, 207-202, to record her 12th ca reer PWBA Tour title and take home the $\$ 10,000$ top prize
The stepladder finals of the BowlerX.com PWBA Or ando Open aired live on CBS Sport Network
"I don't know if there are words to describe it," O'Keefe said. "I'm very proud of my season, proud of how I'm competing and proud of how I've been mentally approaching it. This season, more than any other, has just been so vivid to me."
O'Keefe and McEwan have been at the top of the PWBA points list the last two seasons, and the title tilt lived up to expectations, as both players entered their respective final frame with the chance to secure the win
O'Keefe, who finished the match first, had made a ball change on the left lane in the eighth frame but elected to switch back to the ball she used throughout the stepladder finals after making a bad shot and leaving a 3 pin, which
she converted.
"We decided to be a little gutsy in the eighth frame," O'Keefe said. "I threw that ball in the fill the previous game, and it read the lane so well. We were trying to strike on that lane, and I just threw a bad shot."

With a strike in the ninth frame, she needed to roll two strikes in the 10th for the chance to shut out McEwan. After recording the first strike, she left a 4 pin on her second shot to give McEwan an opportunity to lock up her second win of 2019
"The left lane was just a little tricky," O'Keefe said. "It had a little wiggle spot, but if you got it going up the lane, it wanted to hook. I was really making sure my hand was soft through the bottom and to stay down on my shots. I told myself to just execute and be proud of my execution. I threw the first one in the 10th so good, but I twirled the second one just a bit."

McEwan's first delivery in the 10th frame was left of target, resulting in a 6-10 combination.

O'Keefe's run of success since the relaunch of the PWBA Tour in 2015 is apparent, but her ability to keep putting herself in position to win now has her name being mentioned with great bowlers from different eras

The last time a player won at least four titles in a season on the PWBA Tour was 2001, when future United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famers Carolyn Dorin-Ballard (seven wins) and Liz Johnson (four wins) and Australia's Cara Honeychurch (four wins) each accomplished the feat.

The 2001 season featured 23 events, while O'Keefe claimed her fourth title in the 12th event of the season.

The PWBA ceased operations during the 2003 season before the relaunch in 2015.
"As I get older and my career progresses, it's very cool o hear your name mentioned in the same sentence as the people you've looked up to," O'Keefe said. "To be able to achieve something like that is very humbling for me."
O'Keefe was the No. 2 seed for Saturday's championship round after a miscue in her final frame during the Round of 12 earlier in the day cost her the chance to tie for the top seed and force a one-game roll-off with McEwan.

Needing a double in the 10th frame to secure the top spot outright or a strike and spare to tie McEwan, O'Keefe delivered the first strike but left and missed a 10 pin to finish the frame and fall one pin short of McEwan's overall qualifying total of 4,788 for 22 games.
McEwan admitted to not making the shots she needed in the title match, but she's still seeing improvement in her game as the 2019 season nears completion.
"It wasn't a good shot (in the 10th frame), and I had too many bad shots against the greatest player on the planet in Shannon O'Keefe," said McEwan, a five-time PWBA Tour champion and the 2019 U.S. Women's Open winner "That's just something you can't do.
"I ended up holding onto a spot on the show, though, which is an improvement from last week. I'm happy to still be seeing small improvements in my game from week to week, especially at this point of the season."

In Saturday's semifinal, O'Keefe rolled four consecutive strikes, starting in the fourth frame, to jump ahead of Colombia's Rocio Restrepo and never looked back, earning her spot in the title match with a 226-201 win. Restrepo, a four-time PWBA Tour champion who has been fighting injuries all season, was making her first championship-round appearance of the year.
Restrepo advanced to the semifinals by staying clean in a 197-179 win over Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York. Kuhlkin won the 2018 U.S. Women's Open at Boardwalk Bowl, winning four consecutive matches on her way to the title
In Saturday's opening match, Kuhlkin rolled eight strikes on the way to a 228-194 victory over Katelyn Simpson of Emmett, Idaho. Simpson was making her first career championship-round appearance

A total of 32 players earned spots in this week's main field. The top 24 players on the 2019 PWBA points list (through the Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open) secured automatic spots in the field, while a pre-tournament qualifier (PTQ) held Thursday at Boardwalk Bowl determined the bowlers filling the rest of the field.

Singapore's Cherie Tan was the lone player in the top 24 not to compete this week, which allowed nine bowlers to advance from the PTQ
The elite field bowled 16 games Friday to determine the top 12 competitors, who advanced to bowl an additional six games Saturday. Total pinfall for 22 games determined the five finalists.

with all those young guys."
So tough, in fact, that Williams has added the twohanded delivery - made famous by tour stars Jason Belmonte, Anthony Simonsen and Jesper Svensson among a growing number of others - to his arsenal. He employs the technique to be more effective primarily when he has to play an "inside" shot."
"Basically, if I have to move way inside and throw it right, that's when I'll use it," Williams said. "It's still a work in progress but it has become a useful tool for me when the (lane) conditions warrant it. I like the results I've had with it, so I'll continue to develop it.'

One example of the effectiveness of his two-handed technique was his performance in the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open where he eventually finished sixth after starting the tournament in 53rd after the first round of qualifying. He used the two-handed delivery often in qualifying and match play to negotiate the challenging Senior U.S. Open lane condition eventually finishing sixth. The fruits of his labor with the two-handed delivery paid off again when he bowled a 300 game in qualifying for the PBA50 River Extreme Open to become the first player to bowl a 300 game using a traditional and two-handed delivery in national PBA competition.

Williams led the PBA50 season with 32,480 points, more than 10,000 ahead of 2017 PBA50 Player of the Year Brian LeClair, who finished second with 22,320 . Williams also led in earnings with $\$ 42,525$ and was third in average with 227.48 .

Three-time PBA Tour titlist Eugene McCune won the PBA50 Spectrum Lanes Open which served as a springboard to winning
 PBA50 Rookie of the Year honors. Bowling in just six tournaments, the 51-year-old hard-throwing right-hander, also had ninth-place finishes in the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open and the JAX 60 Classic and 13th in the USBC Senior Masters that contributed to his 11,070 point total leading rookie contenders.

PBA Hall of Famer Ron Mohr once again dominated competition among players 60 years of age and older to win his fourth consecutive PBA60 Player of the Year Award.
The 63 -year-old right-hander won the PBA50 David Small's Championship Lanes Classic for his 11th career PBA50 Tour title and had a string of six top-five finishes in PBA50/60 tournaments plus a sixth-place finish in the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship to end the season.
"It's been an unbelievable year, "said Mohr, a two-time PBA60 titlist who is the only player to win more than one PBA60 tournament since the category began in 2014. "I don't recall ever being on a stretch where I've bowled that consistently well.
"I believe I have some good years left but what does concern me - like every athlete - is the time when you're no longer competitive and you have a decision to make. But for now, I'm still seeing the lane (condition) well and throwing the ball with confidence. Hopefully if I continue to focus on good execution the outcome will take care of itself."

Mohr finished the PBA50 season third in points overall behind Williams and LeClair with 20,575, ranked fifth in average with 222.53 and second in earnings with $\$ 33,440$.

PBA50 Tour players will have the opportunity to vote on the PBA50 Dick Weber Sportsmanship award that will be announced later

Kyle Sherman Retains Lead in FloBowling PBA Summer Tour Points Race

## Gene Garter's Pro Shon Classic runner-un Tom Daulgherty advances from 22nd to place to seventh

CHICAGO - Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Missouri retained his status as the FloBowl ing PBA Summer Tour's most consistent player, finishing 12th in Sunday's Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic in Middletown, Delaware, to remain No. 1 on the Summer Tour points list after five of nine events while Delaware runner-up Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Florida made the biggest move on the points list, advancing from 22nd place to seventh.

Closing the gap on Sherman was AJ Johnson of Oswego, Illinois, who moved up one place to second after his eighth-place finish in Delaware. Johnson now has 4,180 points, only 200 behind Sherman. Bill O'Neill, Langhorne, Pa. $(3,965)$; EJ Tackett, Bluffton, Ind., $(3,540)$, and BJ Moore, Greensburg, Pa., $(3,355)$ round out the top five, all after solid performances in Middletown.
The FloBowling PBA Summer Tour points are important because they involve bonus cash to the top five in the USBC Cup points standings, eight berths in the end-of-summer FloBowling ATX Invite and eight expenses-paid trips to China for the inaugural PBA China Tiger Cup in November. Fans can follow the summer points races (USBC Cup, FloBowling ATX Invite and PBA China Tiger Cup) by clicking on this link.

The FloBowling PBA Summer Tour's next stop is Thursday and Friday in Coldwater, Ohio, for the PBA Bowlerstore.com Classic presented by Moxy's Xtra Pair at Pla-Mor Lanes. After Coldwater, the Summer Tour's final points events are part of the FloBowling PBA Summer Swing presented by the Brands of Ebonite International next week at Parkside Lanes in Aurora, Illinois, where the PBA Wolf, PBA Bear and Illinois Open titles will be at stake. The Summer Tour will conclude with the FloBowling ATX Invite at Dart Bowl in Austin, Texas, on Sept. 21

All PBA Summer Tour events except the Illinois Open are Tier 3 events ( 2,500 points for first place). The Illinois Open is a Tier 2 event (double the Tier 3 points including 5,000 points for first).

Also underway along with the summer points competition is the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour earnings race which will reward the top eight money-winners with berths in the second PBA Clash that will take place at the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Florida, in late October for airing on FOX on Nov. 3. Australia's Jason Belmonte is the runaway leader in earnings as of Aug. 18 with $\$ 264,050$. Sean Rash currently holds the eighth spot with $\$ 77,430$, less than $\$ 5,000$ ahead of Sherman. ## Bowlers Truly Say the Dammest Things, Part2

Karen Beeler, on husband Jamie, who survived three games in league play despite suffering from excruciating kidney stones that forced Jamie into an emergency visit to the hospital that night: "Nothing keeps him from his bowling. Nothing.'

"Rockin' Ray" Miller, who composted the iconic polka song, "Grab Your Balls, We're Going Bowling,' summarizing the game in his final verse:

We'll add up all our scores in just a blink. Then we'll buy ourselves another drink. We'll spend an hour trying to explain, Why we didn't bowl a better game.

Jerry Zerg, on his team's league name, "The Irritable Bowl Syndrome": "It was the most apt name we could get." Siena Cawelti, on her love for the sport: "I live and breathe bowling and if I could eat a bowling ball, I would.'
West Coast Senior Tour owner/director Dick Sanders, on how technology had cheapened bowling scores: "The perfect example is a 300 game in tournaments. No one knows he did it but the guy who shot it. Three-hundred games are so phony baloney, although it's still exciting for the guy who shot it for the first time. Everyone's a pro now. If you collect money in league at the end of the season, you're a pro."
Justin Adams, on bowling his first 300 game: "It was one of the coolest feelings. The last shots were gut-wrenching. I literally took a lap around the bowling alley."
Gail Marlis, on switching to her left hand after incurring an injury to her right (throwing) arm: "Not bowling is not an option."
Gail Marlis, again, on what bowling means to her: "Bowling is like my play date with my friends."
Randy Silverman, on watching the late Andy Varipapa perform a one-man, trick-shot exhibition at now-defunct Mission Hills Bowl about 60 years earlier: "One thing that stands out in my mind is that he set up the 7-10 split with one pin (the 7) on one lane and another pin (the 10) on the lane to his right. He used two bowling balls, one in each hand, and he released the balls and they would cross each other. One ball would pick up the 7 pin on the lane he was on and the other would cross the lane and pick up the 10 pin. He was spectacular."
Theo Sojourn, on bowlers' resilience: "Heart attacks, strokes, it doesn't matter. People go back to bowl. It's just amazing that some people can get hurt and they have a chance in bowling to come back."
Sami Rice, calling her husband Mike's mental outlook a factor in his 288 game in which he opened with 10 strikes: "He keeps bowling better each year. He's never bowled this well. He just doesn't take the game as seriously as he did in his 100 -some years of bowling.'
Temmy Walker, who sports a distinctive first name, on how she knows she's not the only Temmy around: "I know there
is another one in L.A. because she got the [personalized] license plate that I wanted."
Bev Zietz, brushing off an incident in which she was sidelined for three months after colleague Barb Dasaro inadvertently dropped a bowling ball on her toe: "[Barb] really knows how to take out the competition."
Hall-of-Fame bowler Robin Romeo, on her mother Joan being named in 2015 to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame for meritorious service: "When I was on [Professional Women's Bowling Assn.] tour, she used to be called 'Robin Romeo's mother.' Now, I'm 'Joan Romeo's daughter.' She's not 'Robin Romeo's mother' anymore.' Kamie Katzarska, looking on the bright side after barely failing to break into triple figures during a league game: "Ninety-nine. That's almost 100."
Veteran bowler Ken Borshell, on his desire to bring more women bowlers into his league: "Damn tootin'. I'm not dead yet. When I get older, my eyes get younger."
Carol Tucker, counting her blessings amid her retirement from teaching: "I feel like the luckiest person on Earth because I enjoyed my career so much and I was able to retire with enough money to buy bowling shoes, running shoes and frozen yogurt."

Hollywood icon Susan Sarandon, promoting her worldwide ping-pong social clubs while at the same time taking a paddle to bowling: "[In ping-pong], you don't have to wear someone else's shoes."
