### **Walter Ray Williams Jr. Sweeps 2012 PBA Senior Tour Stats**

NORWALK - After dominating the season statistical categories for more than two decades on the PBA Tour, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., is doing more of the same as a member of the PBA Senior Tour.

Williams, who won his first PBA Senior Player of the Year title in a points contest designed specifically for that purpose, also led all 50-andolder players in competition points, average and earnings as the nine-event 2012 season came to an end Tuesday, Aug. 14, in Decatur, Ill.

The 52-year-old righthander earned 163,367 competition points in nine events, easily running away from runner-up Bob Learn Jr. of Macomb, Mich., who had 114,611 points. Williams won the average title, scoring at a record 233.41 pace for 267 games to top runner-up Wayne Webb's 229.85 average and break his own record of 229.56 set during the 2011 season. And the season's only

two-time title winner led the Senior Tour in earnings with \$35,900, comfortably ahead of runner-up Hugh Miller's \$26,850. Williams completed his sweep with 48 Player of the Year points, topping Venezuela's Amleto Monacelli's 32 points.

During his 47-title PBA Tour career, Williams was PBA Player of the Year seven times, earnings leader seven times, average leader eight times and competition points champion eight times - all PBA Tour records.

The final Senior Tour stats also showcased how close the 2012 Senior Rookie of the Year race will be. The winner of that contest will soon be determined in voting by bowling media and PBA members. The leading candidates are four players who each won one title and finished in the top 10 in all three key statistical categories:



Plans for the next one have now been made yet.

ARLINGTON, TX. August 18 and 19, 2012, the tryouts for the 2013 USA Deaflympic team was held at the International Training and Research Center at the USBC headquarters. The Deaflympics is scheduled to be held in Sofia, Bulgaria in the late summer of 2013. There were 33 interested bowlers from all over the USA and 13 came to the tryouts. All did their best and accepted the challenge although they were not getting the scores they wanted each game. The coaches Ed Abakumoff and Walter Niesluchowski put a lot of emphasis on making your spares consistantly. The team selection has not been made yet, the format for the competition in the Deaflympics might change from 5 events to 3 events. The number of bowlers per team (men and women) might change from 6 to as little as 3. We have to wait for the announcement from International Committee on Sports for the Deaf (ICSD). Hope that announcement comes soon so that the chosen bowlers can begin their fundraising efforts.

Anyway, congrats to Mike on his first 300 and congrats to the two of you for putting on the show you did this evening. It was fun watching it!

Steve: So.... if anyone is going to invent a "time machine", it's Mr. Kaku.

Carol: How will a time machine make him unbeatable?

Steve: Picture this Carol, a match between you and Michio Kaku is arranged to raise funds for charity. Just for fun, let's say it's for the Championship of the Known Bowling Universe. Carol: I get the picture.

Steve: Okay, you're at Del Rio Lanes, all warmed up and ready to go....but Michio is nowhere to be seen. to begin. The tournament offered \$250,000 in total scholarship awards, positions on Junior Team USA and the newly formed Developmental Junior Team USA, and of course the titles of Junior Gold National Champion in both U15 and U20 Boys & Girls Divisions. In addition there was also the opportunity to earn a free entry into the Team USA Trials held in January of each year where positions on both Junior and Team USA awarded.

Day one and the battle begins for Title of North Pointe Junior Gold U15 Girls National Champion. The champion would be determined through a 16 bracket best of two games total pin fall double elimination format. The top 16 positioning within the brackets would be determined by total pin fall from 25 games comprised of five game blocks. The first three blocks would each be bowled on a different WTBA sport pattern. The fourth and fifth block would both be bowled on the same pattern, but a different pattern from the previous 3 blocks. A cut from 99 to 24 would be made after the first 15 games (three qualifying blocks), so it would be important to get off to a good start. The next and final cut would come after the fifth block, as the remaining 24 girls would use the fourth and fifth blocks to position themselves within the top 16 for the double elimination

After the first five game qualifying block Ashley found herself in 1st place with a 199.8 average, a far better start than her previous two appearances at Junior Gold Nationals. She was off to a great start, but the competition was much more fierce than anticipated, with the top 16 scores bunched tightly together. Day two, and five games later Ashley found herself now in 2nd place with an overall average of 194.10 and 57 pins out of first. After the first 10 games the top five girls had began to separate themselves from the rest of the filed, so at least at this point making the top 16 still looked very promising.

Day three, five more games and Ashley had dominated the field in this last block prior to the cut to 24. Ashley was firmly back in 1st place by averaging 218.8 for the block, and bringing her 15 game overall average to 202.33. Ashley was the only girl in the U15 Division averaging 200 or more at this point, and had the 4th highest 15 game total pin fall of all girls in either the U15 or U20 Division. This was a significant accomplishment in that by leading after 15 games of qualifying in the U15 Division she had not only survived the first cut, but earned an automatic spot on the Junior Gold Developmental Team. Additionally, it was the first 15 games of qualifying that determined the winners of the free entries into the 2013 Team USA Trials at Sunset Station during January in Las Vegas, and Ashley easily won the entry valued at \$350. Two major accomplishments now regardless of the final outcome of the tournament. Things were looking good.

Day four, and another change of pattern and two five game blocks today, one in the morning and another in the evening. After the morning block Ashley had held on to 1st place even though she had bowled her worst five game block of the tournament dropping her overall 20 game average to 195.95. Fortunately for her this new pattern had proved to be troublesome for the majority of the field as well, but the top 5 no longer enjoyed their large distance from the remainder of the field. It was apparent that the 5th and final block for positioning within the 16 brackets would be intense. Five games later and the brackets were set, as suggested it had been intense, with several positions changing. Although Ashley had handled the pattern much better than the previous five games, a few of the other girls had got locked in and she found herself entering the brackets as the #3 seed with an overall 25 game average of 193.04

Day five, the final showdown about to unfold on yet another sport pattern. Ashley begins a steady march through her first three matches, four straight places you in the Championship match, but she had ran into another talented and determined young lady in match four, Breanna Clemmer from Clover, SC was on a mission of her own and handed Ashley her first defeat sending Ashley to the Contenders brackets where she was still just one win away from the Championship match. Ashley was determined to not let it end there and won a hard fought battle by just 10 pins in a two game total pin fall match, yes a real nail biter, but she had done it, she was now in the Championship match having to face the only challenger that had defeated her once again. Both girls nerves seemed to be showing as they began the battle on the Bowl TV broadcast pair, it was evident from their scores. In the first game they had traded the lead back an forth with neither girl capable of getting into a rhythm, but Ashley came out on the losing end by just a few pins. The second and final game of the match would prove to not be much different, perhaps their nerves even more of a factor knowing that the title was getting closer and closer for one of them with each frame.

In a hard fought battle that ended in a match score of 339-369 in favor of Breanna Clemmer, Ashley would have to settle for being known as the second best U15 Girl in the Nation for 2012. Second best in the Nation...... .....that's not too bad now is it! Ashley finished the tournament having bowled 37 games, in 3 different bowling centers, on five different sport patterns with an average of 193.11. Ashley also earned a \$3,000 scholarship from the USBC for her efforts. Ashley would like to congratulate her new friend Breanna Clemmer on her victory! I would like to congratulate Ashley on keeping her poise and never giving up. Remember that one tournament does not make your career, and that your successes and failures in the sport do not define you as a person. Words cannot express how proud I am to be your father! We are all very proud of you!

We would also like to thank the California Bowling News again for publishing Ashley's accomplishments, and a very special thank you to Coach Ken Clay for the extra work he did with Ashley when Mark wasn't available during preparation for this tournament.



He couldn't let it go to waste so the shepherd gluttoned on mutton, and then only the bones remained. Too stuffed and too lazy to move, he tossed the sheep bones into the air. Like the shepherd who couldn't hit the birds, new bowlers don't want to miss the pins all the time, nor do they want to knock them all down too easily.

New and old bowlers need continuous encouragement. They need mental and physical help and instruction from everyone connected with the game, other bowlers, proprietors officials

Many won't stick to it the way the shepherd did. Many

will give up without much of a struggle. Too many people have given up bowling for the wrong reasons.

If all the people who bowled in the past 20 years who are still able to bowl were still bowling, all the lanes in the country would be going the better part of 24 hours a day.

That's a worthy goal if there ever was one, but if we take a cue from that first shepherd, it can be done, because there are plenty of shepherds out there we have never reached

And just as once upon a time is a long time ago so is forever a long time in the future.

Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., who won the Senior Sun Bowl in The Villages, finished 10th in points, fourth in average and seventh in earnings.

Monacelli, who won the PBA Senior U.S. Open, finished sixth in points, seventh in average and third in earnings.

Mike Edwards of Tulsa, Okla., who won the USBC Senior Masters, finished ninth in points, third in average and fourth in earnings.

In his final event as a PBA competitor, PBA Hall of Famer Dave Soutar of Bradenton, Fla., capped his career as the all-time leader in earnings as a PBA Senior player. In addition to his seven Senior Tour titles, Soutar finished his career with a total of \$586,120 in earnings in Senior Tour and Senior Regional competition.
