

COLUMBUS, Ohio Reigning three-time Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year Liz Johnson showed she's ready for the final events of the PWBA

Tour season by making a title-winning run at the Nationwide PWBA Columbus Open on Saturday.

Johnson rolled 23 strikes over three matches at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl to snag her 24th professional title. In the title match against top seed Shannon Pluhowsky of Davton, Ohio, Johnson flirted with a perfect game, connecting on her first nine shots before a 10 pin ended the run in a 278-202 victory.

Johnson started Saturday's final round of qualifying with a 289 game, leaving a 10 pin on her second shot in the final frame.

"You couldn't ask for a better day." Johnson said. "I've had some troubles on Friday nights and Saturday mornings, (the lanes) seem to get a little tighter as the week goes on. I just made a couple of little changes, tweaked a little bit with my release."

"I tried to keep it simple, stay with that game plan. For the most part, I stayed out of trouble, had a couple of big games, got to the show and then made some good shots."

Pluhowsky remains without a PWBA title, having lost as the No. 1 seed for the third time. Her other two losses as the top seed came in 2016. Early in Saturday's match, she left a 9 pin on a solid shot followed by an open frame despite a good shot on the spare attempt.

Rich Lapiezo, 69, Pops 5 Perfectos Within a Month – and That's Not the Half of It

LA MESA, Calif. - "Amazing."

That's how Rich Lapiezo's friends describe him, but that's clearly an understatement.

The 69-year-old Lapiezo recently went on an honor-score rampage that even left Lapiezo stunned. "I'm still in shock," he said last week. "I can't believe it."

Lapiezo, a La Mesa resident who turns 70 on September 4, reeled off five perfect games in league play within a month at Parkway Bowl in the San Diego County city of El Cajon. It all started July 9 when he rolled his second 300 of the year and sixth of his career.

Lapiezo, who carries a 225 average, then racked up additional perfectos July 12, July 19, July 26 and Aug. 9. On July 19, Lapiezo also busted a personal-best 834 series (257-277-300), his third 800 series.

"Two twenty-five is the best I've ever averaged," Lapiezo said. "I'm almost embarrassed about it. I can't believe I'm bowling as well as I am.

"I'd say I'm an easy 210 house-shot bowler. But by no stretch of the imagination am I a 225 bowler. I'm just in a zone right now.

"I'm just enjoying it. I know how quickly it can go away."

Said Parkway Bowl manager John Balla: "The reason I admire him so much is that he's so humble."

Oh, there's another special quality about Lapiezo. He has a prosthetic right leg, which forced him to devise a threestep approach where he could maintain his balance while flinging the ball. ("I like to call it 'grip and rip,' he says.)

Lapiezo suffered an injury to his right leg while working as a pipefitter foreman at the naval base in San Diego. "I slipped on a pipe and fell 10 feet and messed up the right knee," Lapiezo recalls about the 1981 accident.

In the next 17 years, Lapiezo developed nine blood clots in his right leg and suffered nerve damage. The upshot was that doctors finally needed to remove his leg above the knee.

When Lapiezo returned to the game in 2008, he hadn't bowled in nearly two decades, but he was eager to try to recapture the success he had before he was injured – such as when he won the California state 1966 high school scratch match-game championship. He went on to finish third in the national tournament. "My claim to fame," he says with a laugh.

Lapiezo said it took him three years before he could feel comfortably balanced bowling with his prosthetic leg. In 2013, he marked his return with a perfect game and he's continued to pick up steam. He's even nailed three 7-10 splits.

"Last year I picked it [7-10] up twice within three weeks," Lapiezo said. "That was really surprising because I throw the ball [a mere] 13 miles per hour. It was total luck."

Marc Scherlis, one of Lapiezo's longtime friends, says simply that Lapiezo is "a frickin' marvel."

As for his 300s, each one represents a hugely joyful event for Lapiezo.


Whether it's his first, second, third or 10th perfecto, "I can't ever imagine being complacent," he says. "It's still a shock – an adrenaline-rush feeling. It's the greatest feeling in the world.

"I am truly blessed."



FLOBOWLING DEBUTS MULTI-STREAM OPTIONS FOR PBAGO FINALS, XF TOUR EVENTS

As the PBA "senior" players wrapped up their regular season this week with the third annual PBA60 Dick Weber Championship, PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling unveiled a new multi-stream system to provide subscribers with a "sneak peek" at enhanced viewing options to watch a variety of players.

For the Dick Weber Championship, an event that included a field of 97 players 60 and older, FloBowling began using six streams covering five different pairs of lanes along with a sixth "FloZone" stream that is similar to DirectTV's "Red Zone" channel. A banner at the bottom of the screen includes links to the available pairs of lanes being streamed. The "FloZone" channel provides live commentary by the Xtra Frame announcing team, but the remaining channels provide scoring and allow viewers the opportunity to watch the players in action.

PBA Tour events on PBA Xtra Frame in Middletown, Delaware, multi-stream options will be expanded to 10 simultaneous streams. That means, if there are four players on any given pair of lanes, viewers will have the ability to watch 40 different players on 10 different pairs of lanes during any given game. In Coldwater, Ohio the following week, all eight pairs in 16-lane Pla-Mor Lanes will be live-streamed throughout the event.

The PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic takes place in Coldwater Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 25-26. PBA Tour titles will be at stake in both exclusive PBA Xtra Frame Tour events.

All PBA Xtra Frame events on FloBowling are covered live, from first ball to last. Existing Xtra Frame subscribers need to transition their current subscriptions to FloBowl-



from me a little bit, and I caught a break, fortunately."

Johnson started her run against Colombian native Clara Guerrero, striking on seven of her first eight shots. Guerrero, meanwhile, could not put together consecutive strikes as Johnson won, 234-205.

Guerrero did string together strikes in the opening match. She struck on four of her first five shots to build a 19-pin lead against rookie Jordan Richard of Tecumseh, Michigan, who was making her third consecutive televi-

While Guerrero left the 3-6-7-10 in the ninth frame, she had built a big enough lead and took a 210-198 victory.


The PWBA Tour heads to the Dallas area next week for the QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship at Plano Super Bowl, and Johnson is ready.

"I feel good," Johnson said. "This is a great confidence booster going into Dallas."

The Nationwide PWBA Columbus Open was the third and final elite-field event on the 2018 PWBA Tour. The top 24 bowlers on the PWBA points list after the U.S. Women's Open qualified for the elite events with the remainder of the 32-player field at each event completed through a pre-tournament qualifier.

Competitors bowled 16 qualifying games on Friday before the field was cut to the top 12. Six additional games on Saturday morning determined the five players for the

"I felt really confident on the right lane so I wasn't worried about that," said Mohr, who bowled his 10th frame on the right lane. "The left lane was the challenge and I found myself having to make a number of adjustments. I just had to read and react, stay in the moment and keep telling myself to stay slow."

It was Mohr's second senior win of the season after winning the PBA50 Northern California Classic in May for his 10th PBA50 Tour title. Sullins, a three-time PBA50 Tour winner, was trying for his first national senior win since winning the 2011 Senior Lake County Open.

Mohr found himself dangerously close to elimination more than once in the tournament. He started the tournament 44th after the first qualifying round and scrambled to make the cut to match play finishing second round qualifying in 25th after dropping as low as 31st. He then had to win his position round match in the final game of match play Thursday morning to take the fifth qualifying spot for the finals.

"I've made a lot of comebacks in a tournament for a good finish, or to win, but this one ranks right at the top," said Mohr, who now makes his home in Las Vegas. "I don't recall ever being on the brink of being eliminated as much as I was in this tournament.

"It's a spectacular way to wrap up the season where I accomplished way more than I thought I would," he added. "This is extra special because I grew up here."

Mohr, who earned his third consecutive PBA60 Player of the Year award, started the finals with a 288-215 win over No. 4 qualifier Christopher Keane of Cape Coral, Fla., who was trying for his first national senior title.

Mohr then went on to beat No. 3 qualifier, PBA Hall of Famer Brian Voss of Centennial, Colo., who turned 60 earlier this month to become eligible for the Dick Weber Championship, 249-212, in the second match.

In the semifinal, Mohr beat PBA50 Tour veteran Sammy Ventura of Syracuse, N.Y., also trying for his first senior title, 224-184, to advance to the title match against Sullins.



PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: BUTTURFF WINS REYES DOUBLES FOR 18TH REGIONAL TITLE

Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., and his non-member partner, Ryan Nikolas of Milwaukie, Ore., posted a 9-3 match play record and a combined 20-game total of 10,033 pins Sunday to run away with the PBA Tony Reyes Memorial Member/Non-Member Doubles title at 4th Street Bowl in San Jose, Calif.

Nikolas and Butturff, who picked up his fifth PBA Regional title of the year and the 18th in his three-year PBA career, defeated Darren Tang of San Francisco and non-member Zack Hattori of Las Vegas by 824 pins to split the \$4,000 first prize. Tang and Hattori posted an 8-4 match play record and a 9,209 pinfall total to earn \$2,200.

The Tony Reyes Memorial is named in honor of the late PBA Tour champion who died in 2012.

• Jason Sterner, a newly-relocated resident of Atlanta, Ga., won his 12th PBA Regional title and the \$5,000 top prize Sunday, defeating Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., 278-216, in the title match of the third annual PBA AMF Chesapeake South Open presented by Hammer at AMF Western Branch Lanes in Chesapeake, Va.

Sterner, the top qualifier for the stepladder finals, waited while Troup disposed of Stephen Hahn of Sterling, Va., in opening match, 215-186, and Randy Weiss of Columbia, S.C., 224-173, in the semifinal contest. In the title match Sterner started with six strikes while Troup started with four. The final difference was that Sterner converted a single-pin spare in the seven frame and then struck out until leaving another single pin on his final ball while Troup was unable to match Sterner's strike barrage.

• Chris Colella of Indianapolis defeated Jean Perez of Puerto Rico, 211-166, to win the PBA Greater Richmond Central Open at Richmond 40 Bowl in Richmond, Ind., Sunday, earning \$1,600 and his second PBA Regional title.

Colella downed Kyle Cook of Centerville, Ohio, 279-173, in the semifinal round while Perez eliminated Joe Bailey of Wooster, Ohio, 209-186, to also advance to the championship match.

WILMINGTON, Del. – Anthony Simonsen, a 21-year-old two-handed bowler from Austin, Texas, got creative to win his fourth career PBA Tour title in the 10th anniversary PBA Xtra Frame Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic at Mid-County Bowling and Entertainment Center Sunday.

Simonsen – who normally plays the lanes from the right side – resorted to a reverse hook, bowling like a left-hander and targeting the 1-2 pocket, to defeat left-hander Matt Sanders of Indianapolis, 216-194, for the title.

Simonsen made a dramatic change after scoring conditions proved more than a little difficult, forcing many of the right-handed players to move to a deep inside angle that was unmanageable for most.

"To be honest with you, I'm a bit speechless," he said. "These guys are the best bowlers in the world, and to beat them, sometimes you've got to be creative. I didn't have any (kind of consistent shot) on the right, so I had to try something different."

Simonsen said he had tried the so-called "backup ball" technique in a couple of recent PBA Regional tournaments, with limited success, "but I did it enough to think it might work if I practiced a little. I actually practiced three times last week, which is three times more than I usually practice, and I decided to try it in game 10 of match play, and it worked."

Simonsen became the second-youngest player ever to win a PBA Tour title when he won the 2016 Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship with partner Connor Pickford as an 18-year-old, and shortly thereafter won the 2016 USBC Masters at age 19. He won his third PBA Tour title in the 2017 Xtra Frame Wilmington Open, but several other opportunities have escaped him.

"It's been frustrating, but if you keep knocking, they're eventually going to let you in," he said. "You never know if (the reverse hook) will have to come out again, but I'm going to practice and see if I can get better at it."

In the opening match, Sanders, PBA's 2017 Rookie of the Year, had a string of six strikes in an otherwise error-free game, eliminating Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., who failed to convert a 2-4-8-10 split in the third frame and a 2-10 split in the eighth, 256-210.

In the semifinal match of the four-man stepladder finals, Sanders converted a 2 pin in the first frame and threw four strikes in a row, threatening to blow open his match against 20-year-old PBA Rookie of the Year contender Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn. But Sanders missed a 7 pin in the sixth frame, giving Doyle an opening and Doyle took advantage, throwing his own string of four strikes to take the lead. After converting a 6 pin in the eighth frame, Sanders finished with four strikes to put the pressure on Doyle, who needed to throw a fifth straight strike to remain in contention for his first PBA Tour title. Doyle left a 10 pin on his first shot, and Sanders moved on to the title match with a 237-223 decision.



The 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour continues with the PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic from Pla-Mor Lanes in Coldwater, Ohio, next Saturday and Sunday, where EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., and Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich., will again try for a third 2018 title. Tackett led the Delaware event until the final two games when his inability to overcome the deteriorating lane conditions led to a 4-8 match play record and ultimately a fifth-place finish. Anderson came into Sunday's competition in a tie for 30th place, made a big move to sneak into match play as the 16th qualifier and eventually he finished 14th.







1985 – PART 3

We are half thru 1985. Lots of stories, pictures, prizes and stats to sift thru. Wish I knew what YOU remember as important events and people.

- The JAT was (and is) the tournament for Juniors of all averages. Many of the JAT greats became adult greats and are Senior greats! Topping the list in a June event were PAUL VARELA, DINA BRAASCH, JESSE PEREZ, STEVE GIROUX, ED HARNSTROM, MI-CHELLE SILVER, CHARLES WILLISON, EDDIE WILLIAMS, LAUREN TAKAHASHI, STACY RIDER and KIM WALL.
- COREY GROTH won the first San Gabriel Valley's Masters. COREY is still sending "10 to the pit" at UPLAND BOWL. Plenty of competition for him there! The league sheet is a list of "Who's Who" in the area.
- HARRY GRANT guaranteed \$10,000.00 first place in the Grant Classic, plus another \$30,000.00 in lesser prizes. HARRY was a legend in his own time! Everyone had a HARRY story. You weren't a bowler if you didn't give the Classic a shot.
- "ROBBY'S" latest contribution to fit a bowlers need was his "Spaceport" and "Spacecase." Both were designed to hold 2 balls, shoes and accessories, complete with shoulder strap for carrying. Wheels? ? ? They came along with the Rollin DonKee.
- Another "bowler helper" was the MONGOOSE, for proper hand positioning and wrist support. As advertised, it was lightweight, attractive, cool, comfortable and washable.
- For months we ignored "BIG ANK" at WONDERBOWL/DOWNEY, a NO-TAP with lots of ways to cash. Major competition was the DEL RIO LANES "POT SHOT" and the "Baby Pot Shot". Big Ank director was SAM GIRON.
- The 24 ACTIVE WEST centers had a giant NO-TAP DOUBLES tourney that no one understood! Center prizes weekly prizes qualifying, finals - way too complicated.
- More than 400 took part in the 17th American Indian Tourney. Indians came from Montana, Kansas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada and Utah for the "PIN POW WOW".
- The UBA (United Bowlers Ass'n.) was for 195 averages and under. 8 squads and rolloffs. They were basically in the San Gabriel/Pomona area on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Gold Stamps could be spent at Sears, Vons or Redemption Stores. 40 centers had Gold Stamp programs and merchandise.
- Murrey installed their Pathfinder Lanes at San Gabriel Lanes. Clunk- Clunk Clunk.
- The Hall of Fame and Museum in St. Louis displayed some unusual bowling balls. Imagine - - - - a 1845 smooth wooden-sphere, a 38 pounder made of granite, one made of clear plastic, one with a retractable handle, and ones used by DON CARTER, DICK WEBER, RAY BLUTH, MARSHALL HOLMAN, MARK ROTH and 4 year old JUDY SOUTAR!
- Why did Champion Horseshoe pitcher WALTER RAY WILLIAMS turn bowling pro? ? No body ever made a living pitching horse shoes! Did you know W.R.W. was from Chino, Calif.? His mothers name was ESTHER WILLIAMS. No, not the swimmer!
- The 1985 "High Roller" ventured to the SHOWBOAT and their 106 lanes for four days of non-stop action.
- Color coded house balls. Yea! Orange 6 pounders and grey 16-pounders is all I remember. But house balls are still color coded by weight. Do house balls ever get cleaned ?
- The unusual hot weather caused mechanical problems at the Bowling News! Air conditioner blew, two typesetters overheated. Stories and results didn't make it into type. That was 1985 — this is 2018!!
- KEN KNAPP was elected President of California State Bowling Assn. George Zeidell 2nd V.P., Butch Wittman was A.B.C. Field Rep.
- Channel 56 and Brian-Brian Productions presented "T.V. Championship Bowl-Off" on Sunday nights. (Paper never reported who won).

- The latest national bowling spokesperson was Mary Lou Retton. Bowlers everywhere "gave her a tumble"!
- For Sale L.T. 48 (Drilling Included) \$45.00. Brunswick Plastic Balls \$7.95. Hammer \$75.00 at GIBSON'S Bowling Supplies.
- BOO on the guys at SPORTS CENTER BOWL who put this ad in. "Congratulations GREG HIGHSMITH" State Team Event 127-120-152/399.
- July 19 BRUNSWICK VALLEY BOWL in Simi Valley opened. VIRGINIA NORTON and JOE NORRIS led the way. They even had a "children's playroom". (Remember that?)
- ALVIN LOU won the PBA Regional at KEYSTONE LANES another event sponsored by P.J. Carroll.
