### Nation Will Lead Team USA Into Tournament Of The Americas

GREENDALE, Wis.- This has been a whirlwind summer for Stefanie Nation, whose incredible journey will come to a fitting end just minutes from her hometown of Miami, as she leads Team USA in the Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas in Sunrise, Fla., next week. Nation, 21, is wrapping up a

world tour of sorts that began in June with a trip to the International Youth Friendship Tournament in Punta Cana, Dominican Republic, where she picked up gold medals in doubles, trios, team and Masters competition.

On the way to Kegel/Bowling Writers Association of America Bowler of the Month honors in July, Nation outlasted more than 400 competitors in a grueling 46-game format as she claimed her third consecutive U.S. Junior Amateur title at the USA Junior Gold Bowling National Championships in Indianapolis. Nation became the second individual to win the event three consecutive times - joining Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix, who won three straight titles from 1999-2001.

Finally, Nation, a senior on the University of Central Florida women's team, started the final month of her summer vacation with a two-week trip to Aalborg, Denmark, where she helped the U.S. to a silver medal in the fiveperson team event at the World Tenpin Bowling Association Women's World Championships.






# **OCBA/USBC** Honors Lewis, Huntington, Childs & Champs




