## Nation Will Lead Team USA Into Tournament Of The Americas

GREENDALE, Wis.- This has been a whirlwind summer for Stefanie Nation, whose incredible journey will come to a fitting end just minutes from her hometown of Miami, as she leads Team USA in the Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas in Sunrise, Fla., next week.

Nation, 21, is wrapping up a world tour of sorts that began in June with a trip to the International Youth Friendship Tournament in Punta Cana, Dominican Republic, where she picked up gold medals in doubles, trios, team and Masters competition.

On the way to Kegel/Bowling Writers Association of America Bowler of the Month honors in July, Nation outlasted more than 400 competitors in a grueling 46-game format as she claimed her third consecutive U.S. Junior Amateur title at the USA Junior Gold Bowling National Championships in Indianapolis. Nation became the second individual to win the event three consecutive times - joining Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix, who won three straight titles from 1999-2001.

Finally, Nation, a senior on the University of Central Florida women's team, started the final month of her summer vacation with a two-week trip to Aalborg, Denmark, where she helped the U.S. to a silver medal in the five-person team event at the World Tenpin Bowling Association Women's World Championships.

"It has been like a summer of a lifetime being able to travel to all of these places with so

many great people just to do something I love," said Nation, a collegiate first team All-American. "I've learned a lot about teamwork and a lot about myself and I can't wait to share those things with my college teammates. I feel like I've really matured this summer, and it has been an amazing experience."

The upcoming week-long Tournament of the Americas runs from Aug. 25 to Sept. 1, and features bowlers from 12 countries from across North, Central and South America. Although the event had been held at Cloverleaf Lanes in Miami since its inception in 1963, it has found a new home at Sawgrass Lanes in Sunrise since Cloverleaf shut its doors earlier this year.


Competition is divided into adult, senior and junior divisions, and the bowlers will compete in singles, doubles, mixed doubles and four-person mixed team competition. Medals also will be awarded for individual all-events and national all-events based on the 36-game performance of all four team members.

Nation will be joined by fellow Team USA members Amanda Burgoyne of Newport, Minn., Dan Patterson of Phoenix and Cory Simmons of Wichita, Kan., along with Junior Team USA members Kayla Bandy of Danville, Va., Josie Earnest of Vandalia, Ill., **Mark French of Ventura, Calif.**, and Ronnie Sparks Jr. of Wayne, Mich.

"I'm just so excited because I've wanted to bowl in this tournament forever," Nation said of the Tournament of the Americas. "I've been there to watch a few times and now I finally have the chance to compete and hopefully earn a few medals. I'm looking forward to seeing my friends and especially my family there. This is a great way to end the summer."

Because some well known officers and directors were not selected does not mean they will not have a job. We will need house directors and committee people.


