

Monacelli Wins PBA50 National Championship to Benefit Riley Hospital for Children for Fourth Career PBA50 Major Title

Venezuelan defeats Sam Maccarone 224-212 in title match to win seventh career PBA50 title

ELKHART, Ind. – Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli concluded the 2016 PBA50 Tour season by winning the PBA50 National Championship to Benefit Riley Hospital for Children Wednesday for his fourth PBA50 major title on the tour for players 50 years and older.

The Venezuelan defeated two-time PBA Tour and one-time PBA50 Tour titlist Sam Maccarone of Blackwood, N.J., 224-212, in the title match at Signature Lanes to also win his second title of the season and the seventh of his career.

As the No. 3 qualifier Parker Bohn II for the stepladder finals, N.J., 235-233.

the 54-year-old Monacelli had to win two come-frombehind matches to get to the title match.

In the second match, he left splits in the first two frames that he failed to convert before roaring back with six consecutive strikes to beat fellow hall of famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., 235-233.

In the semifinal match against two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, Monacelli was down by 30 pins in the fourth frame before stringing seven strikes together to win the match 256-244 to advance to the title match against Maccarone.

Haugen Wins Delaware's PBA Xtra Frame Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic

Near-perfect effort topples O'Neill, locks up fifth career title

MIDDLETOWN, Del. – Michael Haugen Jr. of Phoenix, Ariz., a noted "old school" bowler who defies contemporary powergame standards, was nearly perfect in defeating Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., 289-255, Sunday to win the PBA Tour Xtra Frame Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic at Mid-County Bowling and Entertainment.

Haugen, in winning his fifth career PBA Tour title, started with 10 strikes before leaving a 4 pin to end his bid for a perfect game. Playing straight up the lanes with minimal hook

by today's standards, Haugen picked up his first title since winning the 2014 PBA Scorpion Championship

"Like they say in movies, I'm old but not obsolete," Haugen said. "Today straight was great. I got to play my 'A' game and it was good."

Haugen tripped a couple of high-pocket shots, but, "You need to catch a few breaks out here to win and today I was lucky enough to get them," he said. "I really wanted to win again."

Grand Casino Renews PBA FireLake TOC Partnership, Adds Second Event

PBA's signature event returns to Shawnee, Oklahoma, in February; summer event to be announced

SHAWNEE, Okla. The Professional Bowlers Association's successful relationship with the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, Grand Casino Hotel & Resort, and FireLake Bowling Center and Arena will expand in 2017 when the Shawnee-based organizations will again host the PBA's signature event, the FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions, and add a second to-be-announced summer event.

The premier event for PBA champions will conclude on Sunday, Feb. 19, with live ESPN coverage of the five-player stepladder finals staged in a special installation inside FireLake Arena. All preliminary rounds will be conducted next door at 24-lane FireLake Bowling Center.

In addition to the Tournament of Champions, Grand Casino will host the annual PBA Hall of Fame dinner and the sponsoring organizations will partner with the PBA in creating a new tentatively-titled FireLake Oklahoma Open tournament during the summer months. Dates have not yet been determined.

"Since 2014, Citizen Potawatomi Nation, Grand Casino Hotel & Resort, and FireLake Bowling Center have been outstanding partners," said PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark, "and our relationship continues to grow. The



2016 championship finals in FireLake Arena were spectacular, one of the best venues we've ever had the pleasure to work with. It's great for the PBA and its players to not only have an opportunity to return to Shawnee for the Tournament of Champions, but also for a second event we're working on right now."

Last year's pre-Super Bowl timeslot for the Tournament of Champions drew nearly one million viewers to the ESPN live broadcast. At the time, the FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions finale was the highest-rated PBA

telecast of the 2016 season, a 17 percent viewer increase over the previous year's TOC telecast.

"Our tribal leadership is a firm supporter of the PBA, and the growing numbers of spectators at events inside our facilities and on television show that support is well founded," said FireLake Bowling Center Director Chris Skillings.

"This community loves hosting the PBA, and we're proud to bring a professional sporting event to FireLake and the Grand Casino Hotel & Resort."

ELKHART — Due to circumstances beyond his control, eight-year-old Eric Perkins of Elkhart, Ind., arrived late for his scheduled pro-am at the PBA50 National Championship at Signature Lanes. But it turned out to become the experience of a lifetime because his bowling hero, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, took the time to give Perkins a full game of personal instruction.

"The (PBA League) Dallas Strikers team is my favorite team and Norm is my favorite bowler," Eric said. "He's funny and I just like the way he bowls."

During the game, Duke demonstrated a couple of his patented trick shots including his ball-in-towel strike shot and two-ball 7-10 split spare, both crowd pleasers.

The PBA50 National Championship pro-ams included a youth/Riley Hospital for Children squad, corporate squad and open squad for the general public.

Duke is competing for his second major of the season in Elkhart after winning the Treasure Island Resort & Casino World Championship presented by Storm in July. PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame is providing wire-to-wire coverage of the final tournament of the 2016 PBA50 Tour season.

I know it's no-tap, where a nine-pin shot counts as a strike.

So I know it's not really legitimate.

Still. 609.

Bowling a 600 series has always been a dream of mine. Most people who have seen me bowl would say that goal was more of a folly.

My average has plummeted 20 pins in three years, I've fallen four times

so I approach the foul line tentatively and I've bowled several games in double digits. Double digits!

So I'll take the 609. No-tap or no no-tap!

As one of my friends said, that \$60 I pocketed for winning a side pot with a 229 scratch (plus handicap) was legitimate enough.

But this story isn't about me.

Rather, it's about all the bowlers who have been thoroughly frustrated with the game (as I've been).

It's about all the bowlers who are thinking about quitting – or have already quit. Don't give up.

Bowling is a game of adjustments. Keep adjusting. Keep trying.

And remember, your scores aren't everything when it comes to bowling. There's the bonding that goes on between you and your teammates and opponents – all that socialization that makes for happy and healthy people. It's not all about the competition – even though that's fun too. Your bowling league team can still win if you're not the top gun. You can let others be the sheriff. It's OK to serve as the deputy.

There will be times when you become the star – or as Geoff Gast says, he turns into the Kobe Bryant or Shaquille O'Neill of his team. When you're in that "zone," you have such a blissful feeling of confidence. Some might say cockiness.

That's how I felt at the no-tap doubles tournament this month at Winnetka Bowl.

And this comes from someone who posted powerful scores of 85 and 96 in the past couple of months.

"Let's finish with six strikes," I told partner Amy Lew when we started the 10th frame in Game 2. That's how delirious I felt.

I then popped three strikes (most of them on nine counts) and Amy chipped in with two so we got five of the six.

It reminded me of what the wonderfully enthusiastic Kelly Gold once said when she described her back-to-back perfect games in league play.

"I was on another planet," she said, laughing. "It was surreal. It was like you were on your own little lane by yourself and you can't miss. And even if you do miss, it still carried. It was crazy, unbelievable."

Hitting that "zone" could happen anytime – to anyone. It may not result in two perfectos in a row – but it's still something you don't want to miss.

The exhibitantion is awaiting at the end of the rainbow.

Glenn Allison 900

I can personally relate to the BS that came out of the OCBA in the 1980s!

1. Of course, the Glenn Allison 900 series. Did Bob Ramirez actually approve the 900 or was he forced to change his initial report?

2. In 1983, I worked at Kona Lanes and was doing the lanes on one particular day in October 1983, when Kona Lanes got its first 300 game in five years! Bob Ramirez rejected that 300 game. When I asked what the problem was, I never got a clear answer on that. This rejection coming from someone who, in the 1980s, bowled at a center with a well-known reputation for applying illegal lane conditions, the Great Wall of China is what many bowlers suggested to me. Champion Lanes in Garden Grove routinely turned out 300s, 800s, and other honor scores that routinely were never rejected, since members of the OCBA were bowling there and enjoying all those illegal conditions! While rejecting a legitimate 300 at Kona Lanes, while rejecting Glenn Allison's 900 series!

3. In 1986, while keeping score for a league in which my then-finacee was bowling, a bowler blindsided me and knocked me off the scorer's seat. I immediately declared to all ten bowlers that since he used unprovoked violence against me, the scorer, that I would no longer keep score for those two teams and that they forfeited my scorer's fee, and that the person who knocked me off the scorer's chair was then responsible for keeping all the scores. The local police dept refused to arrest that bowler who battered me (even though I wanted to press charges) AND the OCBA also refused to take any action to pull that bowler's sanction card for battering a scorekeeper, the OCBA deferring this matter to the league itself, who would not support me in filing charges against that bowler to hopefully get his card pulled. (Interestingly, some of the bowlers on the team opposing my thenfinacee's team actually went to the front counter to complain that my scorekeeping was quite errant even though my scorekeeping has always been the most accurate among all scorekeepers in any house in Orange County; that opposing team had no clue that those working the front counter knew that their claim was BS since I often kept score for many of those who work the front counter while bowling in leagues; everyone in that house knew and proclaimed that I never made any mistakes, so that claim of inaccuracy was definitely bogus!)

So, yes, I have had some history with the OCBA and Bob Ramirez, and they are the reasons I stopped bowling after summer 1983.

Just so you know!

Alejandra finished with a 681 series (213-300-168). Nate crushed a 788 series (232-256-300).

It was Alejandra's fifth perfect game and her first of the year; Nate said it was his "13th or 14th" perfecto and his second of the year.

Alejandra, 26, said she fully expected Nate to finish with a perfect game in the finale after watching him knock down strikes in the first few frames.

"I knew he was going to do it," said Alejandra, a member of Team Mexico's bowling team in the Pan American Games in 2009. "I'm just happy and proud he did it. I never doubted it."

Nate, 28, was similarly optimistic about his chances for a perfect game.

"In the fourth or fifth frame, I started laughing. I just thought I could do it," said Nate, who credited ball driller Jay Gaines for improving his and his wife's scores.

"Now our goal is to bowl 300s in the same game – and also to shoot an 800 on the same day."


Nate has bowled a handful of 800 series; Alejandra is knocking on the door with a high of 793.

The Urrutias, who live in the Riverside County city of Moreno Valley, were married Feb. 11 of this year, nearly six months to the day before their memorable two-perfect-games night.

Perhaps not surprisingly, the two right-handed bowlers first met at a bowling center – Forest Lanes in Orange County. The Urrutias' rare feat is reminiscent of another take-your-breath-away moment in the Southland. Two years ago, Johnnie Englehart, a superstar bowler, and his up-and-coming son, Scott, both scored 300 games and 800 series on

DSBA tournament is open to all deaf and hearing-impaired USBC men and women member Senior bowlers aged 50 and over on October 4th with USBC registered 2015-16 book averages.

The event starts on Tuesday October 4 with Singles at 8 AM followed with Doubles at 12 Noon. There will be two squads of singles and doubles.

Then on Wednesday October 5 at 9 AM these who paid the optional \$50 for the Men's Match Play Classic and Women's Queens Match Play will start their 4 games qualifying round.

Depending on number of entries, for the men large entries cut off will be 32 or small entries 16 for the match Play eliminations. Likewise, for the women the cut off may be 16 or 8 for the Match plays.

On Thursday October 6 at 9 AM the top men qualifiers start their Match Plays and at 9:30 AM the top women qualifiers start their Match Plays. The date and time for DSBA general meeting will be announced.

December, noted his fifth win means he's halfway to PBA Hall of Fame eligibity, but he hasn't given up hope.

"Number five is halfway. It's a long way to go when you're almost 50, but you never know," he said. "Maybe someday I'll make it to the 'hall.' That's what drives me."

In the semifinal match, O'Neill broke up a 7-10 split in the ninth frame to keep a string of five strikes intact in a 244-235 win over John Szczerbinski of North Tonawanda, N.Y., ending Szczerbinski's bid for his first PBA title.

In the first stepladder match, O'Neill struck on eight of his first nine shots to send two-hander Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., to the sidelines, 255-220.

The PBA Tour now heads to Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., Sept. 5-11, for the PBA Fall Swing. The a multi-event competition that will award four PBA Tour titles (Wolf, Bear, Badger and Detroit Open titles) along with a Fall King of the Swing special event. "I hope I can perform mentally and physically the way I did the last two days in every tournament I bowl," said Monacelli, who is also a 20-time PBA Tour winner. "Those two matches were the best example of how I was able to stay calm and focus after making mistakes.

"It would have been easy for me to lose my composure and let that get the best of me," he continued. "I wasn't thinking, oh, I'm going to lose the match. I was thinking about what I needed to do to throw a better shot. It helped that in both cases it was early in the match because that gave me time to make the corrections."

Monacelli's other PBA50 major titles were the USBC Senior Masters in 2015 and back-to-back PBA Senior U.S. Open titles in 2012 and 2013.

In winning his second title of the season, Monacelli became only the second player to win multiple titles this season. PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber, who won a record six PBA50 Tour titles, was the other.

"I'm just trying to concentrate on learning as I go and don't over analyze," said Monacelli, who won the PBA50 Fountain Valley Open in June. "The way my game is now it takes me back to my best years on the tour in the '90s. I just need to do my thing."

In the opening stepladder match Bohn, a three-time PBA50 Tour winner, beat Hall of Famer Brian Voss of Centennial, Colo., who was trying for his second win of the season, 216-180.

The other 2016 PBA50 major winners were Weber, who won the Senior U.S. Open and Senior Masters titles and Hall of Famer Norm Duke who won the Treasure Island Resort & Casino World Championship.




