Duke Earns PBA50 Player & Rookie of the Year *Johnny Petraglia Takes Super Senior Player of the Year honors*

SEATTLE — It didn't take long for PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke to make an impact on the PBA50 Tour. In his rookie season on the tour for players ages 50 and older, the 37-time PBA Tour champion from Clermont, Florida, became only the second player to earn PBA50 Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year in the same season.

Despite the great season Duke had, it was two other PBA greats – Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Pete Weber – who led the PBA50 Tour statistical races, claiming the top spots in average, earnings and competition points over the course of the 11-tournament campaign.

Duke, who won two titles in 2014 including the Sun-

coast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Dexter for his first major, joined fellow hall of famer Tom Baker (2005) as the second player to earn the PBA50 Tour's top awards in the same year. Pete Couture, Mark Roth, Wayne Webb and Williams have also won both honors, but not in the same year. Duke also joined Webb, Williams and Roth as players who have earned both the PBA Tour and PBA50 Tour Player of the Year crowns. In addition to his two victories, Duke had three other top-five finishes in the seven tournaments he entered, including second-place finishes in the Dayton Classic presented by Roto Grip and Pasco County Open to win Player of the Year and Rookie

of the Year which are based on points awarded for championship round appearances. He finished second in average (233.63), fourth in competition points (141,226) and fourth in earnings (\$33,940).

Williams, another two-time winner in 2014 including the USBC Senior Masters for his first PBA50 major title, fell short of his third straight PBA50 Player of the Year title, but he did manage to repeat as earnings (\$45,313) and competition points leader (196,062) for the third consecutive year. He also had eight other top-10 finishes including third-place finishes in the Grants Pass Open presented by Track and Pasco County Open.

Weber, who won one title and had seven other top-10 finishes including runner-up finishes in the Senior U.S. Open and Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300, led the average list for the second year in a row, scoring at a PBA50 Tour-record 234.79 pace for 268 games for a one-plus-pin lead over Duke (233.63). Weber finished second in competition points (178,220) and third in earnings (\$35,145).

Baker, who made a run at a record fifth PBA50 Player of the Year crown, also won two titles, but a second-place finish to Williams in the season-ending PBA50 Treasure Island Resort & Casino Open presented by Hammer ended his bid to overtake Duke. Baker, who turns 60 Sept. 12, finished second in earnings (\$37,980), third in competition points (166,737) and ninth in average (226.01).

By virtue of finishing in the top eight in competition points, Williams, Weber, Baker, Duke and four others in the top eight earned paid entries into PBA World Series of Bowling VI and a berth in the PBA50 Tour Finals which will result in a berth for two players in a PBA Challenge telecast on ESPN. Hall of Famers Parker Bohn III and Amleto Monacelli, two-time PBA50 Player of the Year Ron Mohr and three-time PBA50 Tour winner Harry Sullins also qualified for the finals. Those eight will bowl an eight-game round-robin match play event on Friday, Oct. 24, to determine the PBA Challenge finalists.

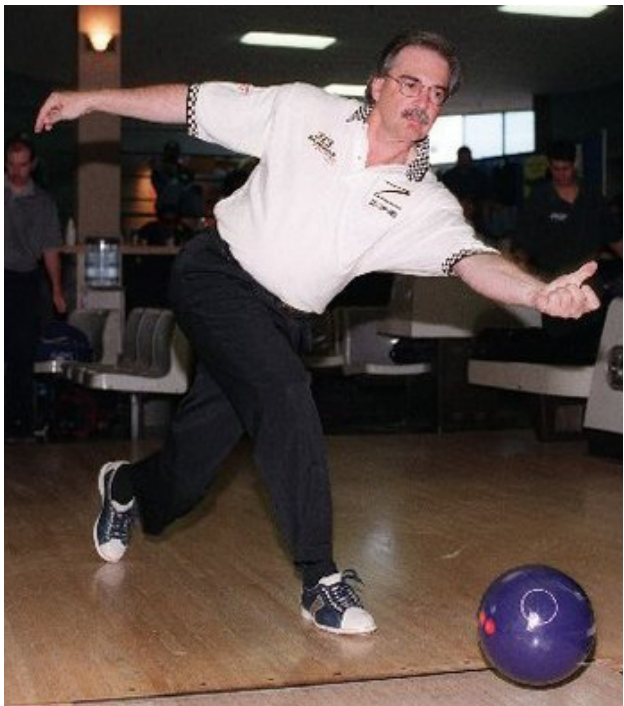

PINS AND PUNS

...Bowling has been fortunately immune from many natural disasters but recently the Eastern United States had to alter league and tournament activities because earthquakes and a hurricane—all in the same week.

There's an oft told tale about a bowlers in Japan who had a string of strikes and when the final ball was rolled an earthquake hit. All the pins went down but the question remained whether the bowler or the quake caused the final pinfall. Every possible witness had left the building.

...Slow bowling is still a problem in bowling and the pro and high average bowlers take the most time. In most cases they just wait for too many lanes to clear before they bowl. There have been six game blocks of bowling that took longer than it takes to fly across the country. But don't just blame the higher averagers. Many of the lower averagers are busy chatting or watching TV and must be reminded when it is their turn.

Remember, most of the greatest bowlers took little time once they set themselves for trips to the foul line.

...There once was a bowler who was annoyed because every time he was ready to roll his opponent would suddenly cough loudly.

"You cough one more time when I'm about to bowl and I'll punch you out", said the bothered one. There were no more coughs.

At the end of the match the would be puncher presented his foe with a bill for \$50.

"What's that for?" said the startled loser.

The winner smiled as he noted, "I cured your cough, didn't I."

...Bowling Halls of Fame, on all levels, are usually criticized of not electing enough persons to their Halls—or too many. What are the extremes in other sports? In women's pro golf in some cases you need 30 titles, while on the flip side the boxing Hall often honors 20 new inductees in a single year. That's what makes Hall of Fame committees so important, figuring out what is best for our particular Hall. The main attribute should be domination in any sport in the years in which you competed. A talent in one era likely would have been a talent in any era.

...A bad tournament bowler is a person who now carries copies of scoresheets where his money used to be.

...Somewhere along the line every great was an unknown. A win or steady stellar performances make an unknown a known. Future success and recognition depends on future wins. Seldom is there more than a few lucky wins. It is too hard to practice luck.

...Did you ever notice that the bowlers who keep telling other bowlers that it is only a game is always the bowler who is winning.

...A 1914 edition of Spalding's "How To Bowl" advised women bowlers, "A woman should dress properly. A short walking skirt, shirt waist and low heeled shoes make an excellent combination. Every garment should fit loosely, and allow freedom of action to the muscles."

That was good advice nearly 100 years ago—and still is.

...I repeat, how many bowlers who kick the rack, would kick the rack if the rack could kick back? And I wonder what the bowler who kicks the ball return would do if the bowling center owner kicked the bowler's car?

WEST COVINA —We returned to West Covina Lanes where 246 bowlers came out for a great day of bowling. 151 bowlers showed up for the final squad at 6 pm. Optiona Side Pots paid 3 places Handicap \$325 (\$125, \$105, and \$95). The cut scores were +88 for the men and +64 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one woman) Ben Bagaioisan at +85, Manny Loria at +83. For the women it was Wendy Soo Hoo +41. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need be a young 55. That would give us 53 bowlers making it to the semi-finals, to cash and/or go on and win the event. As customary, our high qualifier drew the Match Series number which was 470. We had one lucky bowler who matched that score, Wendy Soo Hoo!! , She takes home the \$3,745 dollars, nice going Wendy!! We will estimate the pot at \$3,000 at Cal Bowl.

Memo Rosales was the last person left to go for the 3-6-9 pot, missed on his second shot, and received a \$50 consolation. Since it is not broken, 3-6-9 stays at \$3,000, with the backup pot at \$1,900.

In our optional doubles, in first were Sol Cericos and Stan Por with a 1588 for \$190. Finishing in second place was Du Quach and Jo Jo Barcelona with a 1486 for \$180. There was a total of \$2,600 paid out in doubles. 36 paid spots with low to cash of 1399. In our Mystery

doubles, we paid out eleven places. Finishing in first was Sol Cericos and John Armenia with a 505 for \$120. Total paid out was \$650 with a low score of 478.

During the semi-finals, Vuong Do started with a 289 first game. He did not stop there and continued to bowl good. After three games it was him leading the field with a +180. In second was Marife Catalasan with a +156. The low for the men was +103 and for the women it was +42. Top Seed Vuong had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,735. Vuong drew a 208. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had NO ONE match that score and will carry the pot over to Cal Bowl where it is estimated at \$5,000.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Giang Huynh, Du Quach, Stanley Tam, Anthony Borci, Memo Rosales, Samson Kong, and Stan Por. Each will get \$105. In the second round, the four losers were Leslie Gabriel, Annaliza Agoncillo, Dennis Kelsey, and Sean Nguon with each of them getting checks of \$112.50.

In the third round, it was Jo Jo Barcelona and Will Samson finishing fourth and fifth for \$120. In the semifinal match, it was Jamescart Alarcio vs Marife Catalasan for a chance to advance to the title match and face top qualifier Vuong Do. It was close all the way down to the end. It was Jamescart that would advance with a 260 to 242 win and be the horse winner for \$142, with Marife Catalasan finishing in 3rd place for \$205.

The title game was set with the top qualifier Vuong Do vs the eleventh seed Jam-

escart Alarcio. It was a close match, but in the end, it was Vuong who could not hit this pair at all, and Jamescart would go on to win his 1st ABTA championship with a 164/212 to 175/200. Jamescart took home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$1,600 for Cash and Carry for a total of \$2,600. Vuong would take home \$500 for his second place finish.

Champion Jamescart Alarcio, who is one of our avid weekly supporters lives in Pomona and used a Lane-1 drilled by ABTA Member Memo Rosales. He is single, and would like to thank God for all His blessings, his parents, brother for their support and West Covina Lanes. He would like to encourage other bowlers to bowl ABTA the BEST tournament club.

Mr. Palmer started bowling at the age of nineteen and has been plying the lanes ever since. YES by golly, Chuck has been bowling since mid 20th century. YES by gee, Chuck started bowling when General Eisenhower was President. YES by gum, Chuck has been a kegler since gasoline was 27 cents a gallon! His long journey has INSPIRED family and friends, especially his comeback after leg and ankle surgery.

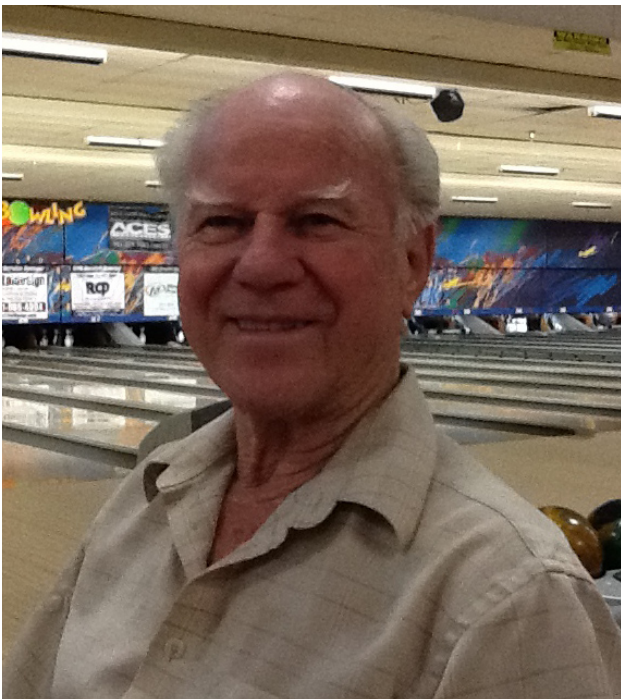
Chuck was introduced to “THE GREATEST SPORT IN THE WORLD” as a high school pin boy in Flint, Michigan over six decades ago. He set pins for free, working for tips. FREE, TIPS only, wow! I am surprised because he deserved at least the TEN CENTS a game I was paid for setting them up in 1960. Chuck never bowled when he was setting pins, waiting until he settled in the Golden State.

Palmer moved to California after graduating from high school. He came alone and lived with his sister while working for Houston Fearless Sheet Metal Company for 90 cents an hour. He worked hard and soon was able to purchase a black 1949 Mercury convertible. That Mercury was “hot.” It was streamlined and boasted broad band white wall tires and was fast to boot. It played a big part in his becoming a bowler and winning the heart of future wife Nita. Why? Because in California back then a young man needed a gas driven chariot to bowl and to date.

It all started with bowling. Chuck wanted to date Nita and Nita’s family bowled. So Chuck joined her family bowling, just for fun. Bowling was his avenue to Nita. Bowling was the avenue to winning her heart. His bowling story is a LOVE STORY.

Chuck, Nita and the in-laws bowled at Boardway Bowl in Santa Monica. It was a ten lane center at a time when many centers only had four lanes. A time when lanes were alleys and alleys were made of real wood.

Since those dating days Chuck and Nita have been bowlers. Over the years Chuck developed into a scratch bowler with a smooth accurate stroke. He still averages in the 190s, though he is entering his eighth decade. He prefers using older bowling balls, especially his Brunswick Nexxus. He told me the newer balls are too aggressive. Palmer prefers balls he is familiar with and can be controlled at the back end.

Chuck was one of the first to have an ankle replaced and may be the first to bowl on a replaced ankle. He has been working on his game since surgery and is now back to scratch scoring.

Chuck’s hard work has paid off. Bowling on a new ankle and with a rejuvenated game he recently bowled his first perfect game. Tremendous story, unbelievable and inspiring to me and all who know Chuck. The perfecto was rolled in the Guy Johnson 565 Senior Scratch League and witnessed by President PHIL GALVEZ.

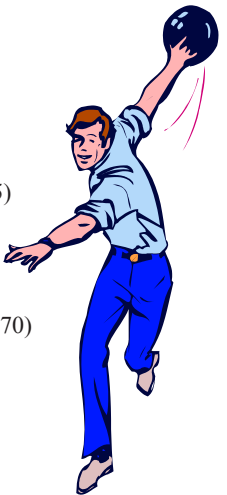

BURBANK — This month I have bowled a few tournaments and the one thing common to them all is the number of balls on the return. As the game(s) go on, they seem to be reproducing right in front of the bowlers. When counted, the ratio of balls to each bowler begins to number three to one. I am astonished as I add them up and realize there are two more than there were two frames before! I ask myself what is happening and why is it happening. I look around and see that to go along with those balls are bags. Big bags! The two ball bag is dwarfed by the appearance of larger, multi ball bags holding 6 to 8 balls each. Ah ha! It becomes clear how all this started with the advent of the spare ball concept. Not an extra ball as a spare, but a ball used only to pick up spares. Tricky, huh?

My mind trails backward to a kinder place for me, the past. When I started as a youth bowler, there were few balls to choose from. Certainly not much in the way of color

and nothing less than 12 pounds. The balls were rubber based and I was in my teens when the exciting news of the plastic Columbia Pearl was broken. And they came in colors! The first release was minimal, gold and silver and maybe a blue. The plastic surface added new challenges to the old laquered wood lanes. In those days they were your one and only ball. (Yes, we really did have to learn to do it all with just one ball!) Now they are used as "spare" balls and rarely as a strike shot ball. You might hear a bowler say "This shot is forcing me to use my plastic ball!" Oh the horror!

The bags we used for our one and only ball were simple in design, sturdy, held one pair of shoes and if you were lucky, an extra pair of socks! It definitely did not have pouches, velcro add ons or any kit bag. Today they are collectors items, rarely in good shape and nearly extinct. In contrast, I now use a two ball bag. It holds my usual strike ball and a spare. Not a spare ball, a spare strike ball. I simply cannot warm up to the other kind of spare ball. I tried, but to no advantage to me so I gave up and went back to the stuff I learned when I had my one and only ball. The reality is, I am a loyal one ball gal!

That's all for now so until next time, keep the ball rollin'!

The Perfect Game

Editor's note: Bowlers have something in common with bears, an annual hibernation period. For bears it's the harsh winter months; for bowlers it's the summer. This proves the wisdom of bears, but makes one wonder, "If they're so smart, why did they chose to play in Chicago?" But I digress. Last week, we were treated to an article written by Lance Pound concerning the addiction to high scoring conditions and its effect on the status of our sport. I couldn't wait another month for Steve to wake up, so tonight I called his wonderful wife Beth and asked her to pour a bucket of ice-water over his carcass. Apparently it's a very "in" thing to do these days. Surprisingly, she was happy to oblige!

Steve: AAAGH!!! WHAT THE.....!!!!

Beth: Sorry, honey! Carol's on the phone and I knew you'd want to talk to her.

Steve: Ice-water! Really?!

Beth: It was her idea. She said it was important. Here, just talk to her. I'm going back to sleep.....by the way, you were snoring again.

Steve: Hello.....

Carol: Hey Stevie! Sorry to disturb your hibernation but I have something I need to talk to you about.

Steve: What hibernation? It's 1:00 AM here!

Carol: Oh, yeah. I keep forgetting that. I guess the ice-water was a little over-kill, huh.

Steve: Never mind that. What's so important that.....

Carol: By any chance did you read last week's edition of the Bowling News?

Steve: No! In fact, later today I'm going out to buy a big bird so I can line his cage with it! Ice-water at 1 AM! Are you kidding me!

Carol: Settle down, Bucko. Log on to The California Bowling News and click on "Archives." Select the August 21st edition and read the article on page 11 by Lance Pound titled, "Low Scores Drive Bowlers Away."

Steve: Right now?

Carol: Sure! I'll wait.....

10 minutes later

Steve: Hello..... Carol?

Carol: ZZZZZZZZZZZZ

Steve: Hello? HELLOOOO!!! IS ANYBODY THERE?

Lillian: Hello! This is Lillian. How can I help you?

Steve: Lillian, this is Steve.....

Lillian: Oh, HI! How are you? We haven't heard from you in a while. Carol says you're hibernating.

Steve: Speaking of Carol, by any chance do you have any ice-water handy?

Carol: I heard that! So what did you think of the article?

Steve: I applaud Mr. Pound for putting pen to paper and having the chutzpa to make his opinion known. I wish more bowlers had that kind of courage.

Carol: But do you agree with what he says.

Steve: Absolutely! But.....

Carol: But.....what?

Steve: He made a couple of points that bothered me.

Carol: Such as.....?

Steve: Frustration with low-scoring lane conditions. That's the most common complaint in bowling today.

Carol: I certainly hear it a lot!

Steve: Scores are a reflection of a bowlers ability to adapt to conditions. That's always been the case. All bowlers need to understand that high scores are created; they don't just happen. When they do, it's because their delivery matched the lane condition.

Carol: Well said! That's why I call you.

Steve: I think it's more accurate to say he was frustrated because he couldn't adjust his delivery to match the condition presented to him..... and apparently he had a lot of company!

Carol: So, why does that bother you?

Steve: He missed out on an opportunity to enjoy the spirit of true bowling competition: bowlers on the same lanes, on identical conditions, at the same time. His article mentioned that others walked off rather than be embarrassed by their scores. That's a shame because any condition can be solved. Even if you can't, you can win with a score of 160 if your opponent rolls 159. On any condition, it's the cream that rises to the surface and he seems to have forgotten that. As Chuck Pezzano has written many times, "Winners never quit, and quitters never win!"

Carol: Point taken. What else bothered you?

Steve: Based on his article, he's an experienced veteran league bowler with more tournament experience than the average "Joe". Despite that, I believe he may be the victim of, what I refer to as, "standard-shot-itis".

Carol: Your gonna have to explain that one.

Steve: Most league bowlers compete one night a week. They bowl in the same house, on the same conditions, week after week, year after year. As they mature and become more consistent, they experiment less.

Carol: That's a bad thing. Right?

Steve: Not at all! On their own, all bowlers develop a "standard shot." In other words, they become comfortable delivering their ball the same way every time because they know what to expect.

Carol: Of course.

Steve: But problems occur when they face changes. They throw their standard shot and don't get the expected result. If they have become creatures of habit, they are so committed to one delivery that they can't or won't adjust. These bowlers blame everything but themselves because making excuses is easier. That is "standard-shot-itis."

Carol: And the cure is.....?

Steve: Practice.

Carol: But Lance made the point that few people have the luxury of being able to devote endless hours to practice.

Steve: If you think of every shot as practice, then by his own admission he's already spent the better part of a lifetime practicing, and so have many of his bowling associates.

Carol: I guess you could think of it that way.

Steve: The takeaway is this: when the majority of bowlers practice, they practice what they already do well. The key to improving, is to practice what you DON'T do well, even if it's just during the pre-league warm ups.

Carol: So what do you advise.

Steve: Lance, there are two parts to your game; one is physical, the other is mental. Like most league bowlers, you already have a great physical game, so focus on the mental one.

Carol: "BORRRING!"

Steve: Carol, the only bowlers that never get frustrated are the ones who just don't care. The fact that Lance still gets angry proves he still has a passion for this game. It's bowlers like him that prove this sport has a future. For him to stick with it, he needs some direction and I'm trying to provide that.

Carol: Keep going.

Steve: First, he needs to read the first couple paragraphs of Chapter 2 in, "The Essentials of Bowling: Second Edition."

Carol: Do I detect a little self-promotion?

Steve: Not at all. I wrote that little manual specifically for frustrated bowlers like Lance. You printed it from cover to cover a couple times. I'm sure Lance can find it in your archives, free of charge. I think it'll be worth his effort.

Carol: I'll see if Dean can reference it for him.

Steve: Why not just let him find.....

Carol: HEY DEAN!!!!!!!! WHEN DID WE PRINT CHAPTER 2 OF STEVE'S BOOK?

Dean: October 6, 2011!

Carol: There! That wasn't so hard. Was it?

Steve: Wow! What a memory!

Carol: Yeah.....that's why I keep him around. Now, where were we?

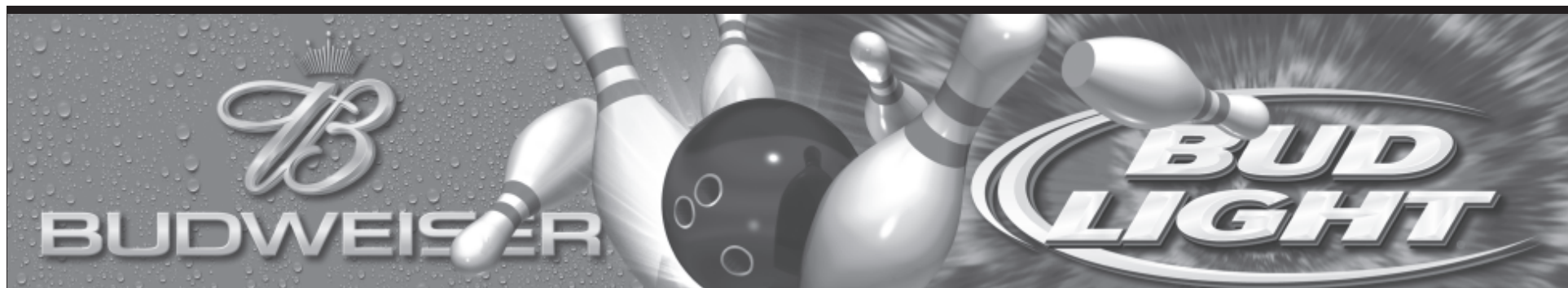
