
Duke To Donate Dallas Strikers "Manager" Compensation to Tony Reyes Family

SEATTLE — PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, the No. 1 player on the Dallas Strikers in the PBA League, also serves as his team's manager. But rather than taking personal advantage of the added financial compensation associated with his dual role, he is using his extra in-

come in a unique manner. In a memo to PBA Comfortunately I did.

"This is the third time we've had a (PBA) finals on my birthday," Weber added, "and I've won titles all three times, so I kind of like bowling on my birthday."

DEAF FRANK GALLO 4TH IN POINTS IN PBA50 SOUTH REGION STATISTICS

NORWALK - In the January 1, 2013 to July 31, 2013 PBA50 South Region Points Statistics, deaf Frank Gallo is listed in 4th place with 76,349 points in 10 events out of 192 senior bowlers. That is the highest placing the super senior (over 60) Jacksonville, FL right-hander ever did. PBA stalwart Tom Baker, King, NC leads the list with 125,560 points for 7 events.

Also while it is fair to say that the last event Gallo bowled was an event for super seniors (over 60) only, Gallo was the only senior to bowl in all 10 events. Also he topped the 86 super seniors bowlers scattered all over 192 seniors list. The closest super senior to Gallo on the list is Guppy Troup, Taylorville, NC in 5th place with 69,030 Points in 9 events. Troup was known to wear colorful pants early in his PBA career.

On the PBA50 South region earnings statistics led by Baker with \$6,550.00 for 7 events, Gallo is in 4th with \$3,725.00 for 10 events. Gallo is also at top for super seniors and Troup again in 5th with \$3.450.00 for 9 events. On the averages list with minimum of 32 games, Gallo had 210.9 average for 112 games in 10 events placing him 15th. Three super seniors were ahead of him including Steve Jones, Berlin, MD in first with 226.50 for 40 games. Baker is in 2nd with 224.05 for 116 games. Super senior Troup is in 19th place with 207.82 for 102 games.

On the most events cashes list, four including Baker, Troup and Gallo were tied with 7 each but Baker led with perfect 7 out of 7 events. Troup was tied with another senior for 2nd with 7 cashes out of 9 events and Gallo placed 4th with his 7 out of 10 events. On the last statistic, the number of times in making the finals, Baker was perfect in 7 out of 7 for first and Troup is 4th for 5 out of 9 events. Gallo had 5 out of 10 for 5th place.

Except for 15th place in averages list, Gallo has this best showing for 4th and 5th places in other statistics. With more to go for this statistics to end on December 31, 2013, we will be watching and cheering our deaf bowler Frank Gallo on the PBA50 tour.

The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) John Camisa +84, Victor Paolucci +68. For the women it was Bobbie McCollum +22. That would give us 45 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

High qualifiers for the tournament were Rithy Ath for the men with a +196. For the women it was Tess Dizon with a +126. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week one of our top seeds draws the Match Series. This time it was worth \$820. Rithy drew 667. No one matched that score. The pot will carry over and the estimate for Cal Bowl is \$3,750. Joel Arcienga was the last person left to hit the 3-6-9 pot and he missed, so he got a \$50 Consolation. This week we will go for an estimated \$3,700 at Cal Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Freddie Catamisan and Vuong Do with a 1540 for \$130. Fnishing in second place was Vuong Do and Steve Brode with a 1530 for \$120. There was a total of \$1,510 paid out in doubles. 27 paid spots with low to cash of 1426

In the Beat the Board Finals Mode, after bowling three games, where You finish is where your cashing position will be. After game 1, low for the top five was +67. Jerry Chang at +67, fourth was Mark Andrews +73, third, Kent Maruyama +75, second was Henry Hoang +105, and first was Andy Huynh +119.He took the first game side pot for \$55. The low for the women after the first game was +28. After the second game, low for the top 5 was \pm 116. \pm 63 was the low for the women. The top five bowlers after the second game were Dennis Kelsey, Jeff Taino, and Tim Tran all tied at +116 for 3rd thru 5th. In second was Henry Hoang at +150 and in first was Andy Huynh with +171. Julie Nguyen made the gals proud, and took the second game side pot with at 269 for \$55. After the final game, we had a change in the top spots. This week due to ties, we would have 17 spots being paid \$100 or more. Finishing in 10th thru 17th for \$100 were Tess Dizon, Kent Maruvama. Mark Andrews. Tim Tran, Jarrett Handa, Marina Suos, Anita Smith, and Vuong Do. Finishing in sixth thru ninth for \$105 were Thomas Licauco, Jeff Taino, Henry Hoang, and Cleve Johnson. In the top five finishing spots were, in fourth and fifth were Steve Brode +158 for \$110, Michael Zhang +172 for \$110. Finishing in third place for \$200 with a +174 was Freddie Catamisan. Second place went to Andy Huynh with a +184 for \$500, and finishing in first place with his third ABTA championship with a +193 was Dennis Kelsey.

Dennis Kelsey held off Andy Huynh and several more to win the ABTA Title at Westminster Lanes for a \$2,700 First Prize. ALL WINNERS AREN'T CHAMPIONS

To be a champion takes more than the besting of a field in any type of given competition. Most of all, it means giving as well as taking.

Top athletes in most sports, many of them big winners, aren't nearly as respected as they were in the past, and with good reason. It's more than the enormous sums of money they earn. I'm for every athlete earning as much as he can while he can, since any sports career is chancy and short at best, and in the majority of cases, frustrating and futile, physically and financially.

But enough is enough is enough.

Many winners, though they're public figures, look down on the public. They want cheers and extra rewards when they succeed, but no jeers and or penalties when they fall. Some want the public to love them, no matter what, and moan and cry and pout if they don't receive what they consider proper respect and treatment, the very things they often withhold from their adoring fans.

It may appear to be ridiculous, but many athletes feel it is too much of a burden to cooperate with the media, or to sign an autograph, unless there is some sort of pay. With all the big salaries, never enough, and the groups of management, the bottom line always is the same, the public pays and pays and pays.

The public really doesn't ask much in return. All fans ask is that their heroes do their best, respect their sport and its fans, and display just a little pleasure and thankfulness at their good fortune in being able to play little boy's games for huge fortunes.

Champions do that. The champion isn't discouraged by problems, he's challenged by them. He may be scared, but is less scared and more inspired by the great challenges.

Less we fall into a generalization trap, all winners and all athletes don't fall into the they don't care category. They must look into a mirror now and then and see how fortunate that image staring back at them really is.

Bowlers, for the most part, are just great. Much of the headway in the sport can be attributed to the champions right down the line for the better part of a century. Their color, charm and cooperation has been unmatched according to the greatest critics, the people who must deal with athletes all the time. They rate bowlers, men, women and children bowlers, at or neat the top.

And despite that fact that bowling officials have been known to disagree, it is to their everlasting credit that when it's for the good of the sport, they almost always forget their internal differences.

Cynics may say, with some truth, that star bowlers are more cooperative and more giving because they haven't been spoiled by too much of the big dough. Don't kid yourself, some of the bowlers, with their prize money and various other involvements, do very well, and better than many athletes in other sports. Don't think either, that all are models of cooperation. Some are big pains.

There's a necessary learning process in every sport or activity. Some learn quickly. Others never learn. Much of the sports world is riding high because of inflated TV rights money, and peak spectator interest. It wasn't always that way. It won't always be that way.

Bowling, though a big boy and big girl now, still is on the outside peeking in on too many of the other sports.

One way to keep trying to get more of a look from those who make the other sports is to keep doing our best to continue to create champions, not just winners.



Williams, Monacelli, Weber Top 2013 PBA50 Tour Stats PBA Hall of Famers earn berths in PBA50 Tour Finals during World Series of Bowling

SEATTLE - Three of the Professional Bowlers Association's greatest players topped the season-ending PBA50 Tour stats for average, earnings and competition points.

After earning his second consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crown, Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., topped the earnings and standard competition points lists while finishing third in the average category behind fellow Hall of Famers Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., and Amleto Monacelli of Venezuela.

During the 11-tournament 2013 season PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame provided nearly 130 hours of live coverage of PBA50 Tour events.

Bowling in all 11 tournaments and leading all competitors with three titles, Williams led earnings with \$41,175, competition points with 204,157 and he placed third on the average list – based upon a minimum of 150 games bowled – with a 229.46 average for 304 games. Along with his three titles, Williams had two thirds, two fourths, including the Suncoast Senior U.S. Open, and had three other 10th-place finishes including the USBC Senior Masters. Player of the Year points earned for top four finishes determined the PBA50 Player of the Year title.

Competing in his fourth PBA50 Tour season, the PBA Tour's all-time titles leader now has seven PBA50 Tour titles.

Weber, who bowled in only six events in his first year as a PBA50 Tour competitor, led the average category, scoring at a 233.77 pace for 154 games, and ending the season second in earnings (\$32,000) and sixth in competition points (127,667).

Weber won two titles, including his first PBA50 Tour major in the USBC Senior Masters, in his third tournament. He also won the season-ending Treasure Island Resort & Casino presented by MOTIV Open in Welch, Minn., a victory that gave him the PBA50 Rookie of the Year title (also based on points awarded for top four finishes). Weber also had two third-place finishes, a fourth and a ninth.

Competing in eight tournaments in his second PBA50 Tour season, Monacelli finished second in average (230.48), third in earnings (\$29,850) and second in competition points (159,339).

Monacelli, a 19-time winner on the PBA Tour, successfully defended his Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open title for his second career PBA50 Tour title. Other top finishes included two seconds, two fifth and two eighth-place finishes. He was the top qualifier in five of the eight tournaments he competed in.

As the top three in Player of the Year points, Williams, Monacelli and Weber earned the three berths for the PBA50 Tour Finals which will be conducted as part of World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in early November.

Tim Kauble of Marion, Ohio, finished in the top eight of the Treasure Island Resort and Casino Open to become the PBA50 Tour's first Super Senior Player of the Year, nipping PBA Hall of Famer Dale Eagle of Tavares, Fla. The honor for players ages 60 and older was based upon the tour's competition points standings. Kauble had top finishes of fourth, sixth and seventh during the season.

REE-INVENT FILMS SNAGS TOP HONORS AT MONROVIA, CALIFORNIA'S ACTION ON FILM INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL

"We've Got Balls" wins "Best Comedy - Feature" and "Outstanding Cast Performance" awards, as well as two additional nominations

SANTA ANA, CA-We've Got Balls, a quirky comedy that centers on the potential demise of a cherished bowling alley in a small town (52 people), to make way for a casino, won two top honors on Saturday evening, August 24, 2013, when it was named "Best Comedy - Feature" and also "Outstanding Cast Performance." The film was also nominated for Without a Box's coveted "Best in Show Award," and Cherie Kerr, producer/writer/director of Balls was also singled out as a nominee for "Filmmaker of the Year."

We are overwhelmed at having won such great honors," Kerr says of her first indie feature film. "Del Weston, head of AOF, and his staff, really put on an incredible festival and are so supportive of emerging filmmakers. I am honored to have been among them."

Although Kerr has run both a public relations firm, KerrPR, and a communication skills training company, ExecuProv, for nearly 40 years, she also has spent the better part of her adult life performing, directing and writing sketch and improv comedy. In 1990, Kerr founded the Orange County Crazies, similar to the L.A. Groundlings, of which she was a founding member. She has received rave reviews for her comedic works. She also is the author of 11 books and 45 movie shorts.

Balls debuted last spring when it was chosen as an Official Selection in the Newport Beach Film Festival. Kerr's film sold out the first day tickets went on sale. Its April 29, 2013 screening necessitated an additional screening on May 2 since all 265 seats were sold out. With the AOF screening August 17, 2013, Balls sold out as well. In total, the film has sold roughly 750 seats in only three screenings

In sum, the tagline for the film captures its essence: A quirky town, a crooked mayor, and one whacked-out bowling showdown.

A year ago, Kerr began shooting her first indie comedy in Orange County. The film co-stars Gary Austin, founder of the L.A. Groundlings and Andrew Dickler (Douchebag, 2010), in addition to a formidable cast, many of whom are Kerr's Groundlings and OC Crazies chum alums. "We had little money, but a lot of heart and determination," Kerr quips. "Looking back, I see it as an absolute miracle that we were able to bring it to fruition!"

Set against the backdrop of Fountain Bowl, in the fictitious town of Fountain Springs, the story is about a filthy rich female land developer and her Indian Chief cohort who team up with Fountain Springs' crooked mayor in an attempt to demolish Fountain Bowl in order to build a gambling casino. The small town's population shows up for a tense and life-altering bowling tournament, the outcome of which determines the fate of both the bowling alley, and the quality of life of its townspeople.

Kerr is the mother of Drake Doremus, who won the Grand Jury prize at Sundance in 2011 for his film Like Crazy, with supporting actress Jennifer Lawrence. Doremus studied improv comedy under his mother's tutelage from the age of six until she sent him off to AFI at age 19 when he was chosen for its directors program. Doremus debuts a new film in theaters next month, Breathe In, which stars Amy Ryan, Felicity Jones, and award-winning actor Guy Pearce.


Kerr intends to showcase We've Got Balls at other prominent film festivals before year's end and prior to inking a film distribution deal.

Kerr has already garnered impressive reviews for her first indie film including one from OC Weekly's Matt Coker, who says, "Cherie Kerr takes her screwball comedy out of the gutter, rolling audiences a big screen strike." Michael Gellman, legendary director at The Second City in Chicago (who performed with John Belushi, Dan Ackroyd, Gilda Radner and Bill Murray, and who taught and mentored John Candy and Chris Farley) says "We've Got Balls is comedy at its best, a film with heart and an insane bowling tournament that racks up a perfect score." Yahoo! also gave the film a perfect score as writer Leslie Gornstein stated, "I was hooked on this movie from scene one.'

Kerr announced last week that she and Ree-invent Films are in the pre-production stages of Small Claims, a new indie feature scheduled to be completed by late summer, 2014.
