Vince Duarte-Castro Shoots Two 800's in 1 Night



Beginning Year League Information – What's New

This Workshop is put on each year to not only hand out league packets to secretaries and the new Average booklets but also to bring everyone up to speed on any NEW changes that will affect their leagues this coming season.

The first topic of discussion was **Bonding**. President Neubig shared that USBC doesn't cover league envelopes that mysteriously get lost while in a league secretary's possession. By this he was referring to when bowlers turn in their envelopes to a league secretary, he or she needs to make sure they are not left out in plain view while the secretary is up to bowl! Be sure to put them away in a safe place. Also, President Neubig read a question he found on bowl.com concerning whether a bowler who had a felony twenty years ago could hold the position of league secretary and the answer is no, they still cannot hold that position if they have been convicted of a prior felony. It was stressed that a good way for secretaries to keep track of money they have been given each week is to have a sheet that you have each team representative sign with the amount they are giving you in their envelope that week to verify what they are paying so there is no misunderstanding and you can refer back to that sheet if there are any questions.

Assoc. Manager Nancy Weber then explained what she needs from secretaries when they submit their **league's sanction and the league bowlers' sanction cards.** One of the hardest things is getting all your league bowlers to fill out a sanction card the first night they are bowling as well as any bowlers that bowl multiple leagues need to also fill out a sanction card form for all their additional leagues when they bowl in these other leagues their first time even though they have already paid for their card in their first league of the season. If you do not fill out a card for an additional league you are bowling in, your name will not be on the league roster. It should be the responsibility of the team captain to be sure all their team fills these cards out throughout the season when a bowler bowls on your team as a sub or alternate.

USBC sanction cards have gone up this season which reflects the dues increase passed a year ago at the USBC National Convention. Cards are \$21 (\$13 – National; \$2 – State; and \$6 – local). If you are a bowler transferring from another CA association and have a valid 2017-18 USBC card, the transfer fee is \$6. If you are a bowler transferring from another state and have a valid USBC card, the fee is \$8. Please fill out your USBC sanction card application clearly and if you have a pre-printed form (bowled in the same league last season), be sure to check that your name, address and phone are correct if you have moved or married. If any of this incorrect, this is where your USBC card will be mailed and you might not get your card in the mail when they are mailed out. If you get married or have a change of address during this new season, you need to submit a new sanction card to get the information updated. It usually takes two months from the start of fall leagues to get your new USBC sanction cards. You can always go online to bowl.com to see if you are listed to check your status.

There is also a league roster sheet in all the secretaries' league packets for the secretaries to list all their league bowlers that you send in with your sanction cards. You only need to send this sheet in once at the beginning of the season and the purpose of you providing all the names of your league bowlers is to help Nancy have a place where she can double check a name of a bowler if she can't read their sanction card application.

USBC will bond a league up to \$10k. If a league's prize fund exceeds \$10k, you need to put that information on your league sanction form in order to be covered.

Hope this helps give you some further advice on what takes place and is discussed at this annual Workshop. It is open to any league officer and always takes place mid-August. This should also let you know how important it is to have both a league president and league secretary who are efficient and will take the time to do their job for the betterment of your league. This is why it is so important to have at least one team member attend the league meeting at the start of your season to be sure the correct people are elected to these positions.


Ron Range Mesmerizes Torrance Gable House Bowlers With His Beautiful 11 In-A-Row

LAUGHLIN, NV - Big Shots, Big Scores, Big Wins. That is what CALIFORNIA bowlers are about. That is what "Californian" Jerry Wood is all about. That is what Jerry Wood is all about when he goes to Laughlin and hits the lanes.

Big Shots, Big Scores, Big Wins. BIG, BIG, BIG in RIVER CITY. That is why Jerry Wood is a Laughlin Superstar. He makes big shots, big scores and has big wins.

Twice a year (January and August) Jerry is among a hundred or so bowlers from Arizona, CALIFORNIA and Nevada who converge on "River City" to compete in the Laughlin

Blast Tournament. A Senior Handicap No-Tap Tournament for bowlers fifty and older. Each Blast is actually three tournaments, with champions crowned Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Though Jerry is 80 years young he enjoys beating the pants off the 50 year old kids. He won the Laughlin Blast "Triple Crown" in the summer of 2015 (winning the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday tournaments), won a title again in 2016 and last week won again. He has won titles in three consecutive years.

In addition to all those titles Jerry is rolling some of the biggest scores in Laughlin Blast history. Last Monday he bowled an incredible 920 (298-318-304) handicap series. The score may be the highest series in "BLAST" history. Jerry also combined with partner Frank Weiler for a phenomenal 1,757 (920-837) doubles set.

Jerry Wood is a CALIFORNIA bowler and a Laughlin Superstar. He has been bowling for three score years and is in such good shape the odds are he will be competing in Laughlin when he is 100 years old. Jerry Wood is another example of why CALIFORNIA bowlers are the best in the world.



Jason Belmonte Wins PBA-WBT "Storm Lucky Larsen Masters" in Sweden for 15th Career Title

MALMO, Sweden – Australia's Jason Belmonte defeated Cameron Weier of Tacoma, Wash., 245-180, to win the PBA International-World Bowling Tour's Storm Lucky Larsen Masters at Baltiska Bowlinghallen Sunday for his 15th career PBA Tour title.

Belmonte, 34, joined EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., as the only three-time PBA Tour title winners in 2017. Earlier in the year, Belmonte won the Barbasol PBA Players Championship and a record fourth USBC Masters title. His win in Sweden, a new event on the PBA International-WBT schedule, was his second international tour title. He also won the 2012 Australian Masters.

After qualifying first for the Malmo stepladder finals by 45 pins over Weier, Belmonte started the title match with two spares followed by a string of six strikes to build a lead Weier couldn't overcome. Belmonte won the equivalent of \$19,832 along with his title.

Weier, a 26-year-old former Robert Morris-Illinois collegiate star, won his only PBA Tour title in the 2015 Qatar Open. He defeated Finland's Jari Ratia, 226-194, to advance to the title match.

The Malmo tournament - named for Swedish PBA star Martin Larsen - was a World Bowling Tour points event. The top three men and top three women in 2017 WBT points will bowl in the WBT Men's and Women's Finals, presented by the PBA, during the GE-ICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Properties, on Nov. 19 in Reno, Nev. Two additional qualifying events – the WBT Thailand in September, and the PBA World Championship in Reno – remain on the schedule prior to the finals. 

An Untimely End to Fred's Watch (2016-2017)

AGOURA HILLS - I know. I know.

It had to happen.

Buy a cheap watch and this is what you get: A watch that expires before its time. It's sad. So, sad.

It did its job so beautifully and made this bowling writer a happy person who showed up for interviews and bowling sessions on time.

I thought my watch would survive years of use, perhaps decades.

I thought my watch could stand the test of time - indefinitely.

But I was wrong.

On Wednesday, Aug. 16, my beloved watch passed away in its sleep without notice after flawlessly ticking away on my wrist for 1 year, 4 months and 6 days. Cause of death: a broken-down battery.

I've written extensively about the troubles I've had finding a watch that wouldn't fall apart. My previous watches came from trustworthy places such as Costco and T.J. Maxx and ranged from \$70 to \$140. No cheapies there.

I had gone through four watches in quick succession when I settled on a \$10.99 Target watch. No one was happier than I was wearing this no-brand-name timepiece with actual numbers 1 through 12 - and no Roman numerals.

Friends and family applauded how much I became attached to this watch. A comment from Facebook friend Rob McNaughton was typical:

"I gave up on expensive watches long ago," Rob wrote. "I've had a watch that I bought at Walmart over 10 years ago and never have had to replace the battery! And it's got BIG numbers that I can read in my old age!"

So what does this tale have to do with bowling?

Plenty!

Here is the most important lesson for bowlers from my watch experience:

Embrace change and don't give up. I found happiness with a mundane, no-nonsense watch after repeatedly being let down by more-expensive watches.

Likewise, bowlers should adapt when times are tough and they should find a new method for their madness.

Here are some cases in point:

John Kiledjian was a lights-out right-handed bowler who routinely scored in the 200s with a sharp-breaking hook. When he hurt his right elbow and couldn't bowl the way he'd like, he adapted.

He shifted to bowling with his left hand.

That's not to say he's bowling as well now as he did before. But he's still in the game, still improving and he's enjoying a new side of the game – so to speak. He's still looking for his groove. But time is on his side.

Then there's Michael Antin. Another lights-out bowler in his heyday, Michael realized he needed to make changes after a series of injuries robbed him of his ability to blast away at the pins. So he now bowls craftily, throwing precise shots that hook sweetly into the pocket.

He doesn't score 265 like he did in his teen-age days. But reincarnated as a 150ish bowler, Michael finessed his way this year to a 233 game – which ranked as the highest handicap score in his league: 304.


Michael didn't give up and he found his timing.

Oh, one more thing: I've since replaced my fallen no-name Target watch with a similar no-name Target watch.

Same price: \$10.99.

I had lasted one week without a watch before hastily returning to my Target in Agoura Hills and finding a replacement.

I didn't want to waste any more time.



The qualifying and match-play rounds of the PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open took place July 6-8 at Seminole Lanes in Seminole, Florida. It was the second consecutive year Seminole Lanes hosted the tournament. The stepladder finals were one of three shows taped at Plano Super Bowl, in conjunction with the U.S. Women's Open, for later broad-cast on CBS Sports Network.

The finals of the PWBA Orlando Open aired Aug. 15, and the Nationwide PWBA Rochester Open finals will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network on Aug. 29 at 8 p.m. EDT.

Rhino Page Ends Title Slump with PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Classic Win - EJ Tackett Claims Storm Cup -

COLDWATER, Ohio – Rhino Page of Orlando, Fla., defeated rookie Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio, 190-173, to win his first Professional Bowlers Association singles title in seven years Sunday in the PBA Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Group Classic at Pla-Mor Lanes. Earlier in the event, EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., clinched the PBA Xtra Frame Storm Cup title in a finale without much drama.

The Kenn-Feld Classic championship match reflected the challenging scoring environment, where strings of strikes were rare and spares were at a premium. Via, the tournament leader coming into the title match, left a 2-10 split and opened in the first frame. Page returned the favor, leaving a 3-7-9 split and opening in the sixth frame.

After a ball change that resulted in a cross-over strike, Page tacked on another for the only double of match, taking a six-pin lead. Via then left a 4-9 split in the ninth and opened again. Needing a double in the 10th to force Page to mark in his final frame, the former Notre Dame College two-handed player got the first strike but not the second.

All Page needed was seven pins to end his title slump, and he threw a strike to lock up his fifth career title.

"I can't even catch my breath," Page said. "It feels so wonderful, I can't even describe it. I can't thank the guys who helped me keep my head up the past seven years.

"I think (Pla-Mor Lanes) is one place that shows it's not always about the (lane conditioning) pattern, but the playing surface as well. It's not like there were a lot of strikes to be had, so I relied on my spare game, and that was the key."

In the opening match, Jason Sterner of Rockledge, Fla., struck on five of his first six shots and held a 36-pin lead, but lost his momentum when he left a 4-7-10 split and opened in the seventh frame. Given an opening, Joe Bailey, a 35-year-old veteran of PBA Central Region competition with one title, responded with a double, but needing a double in the 10th frame, he left the 3-4-6-7 split and opened. Sterner won, 209-179, but Bailey recorded his highest finish (fourth place) in 39 national tour events.

Sterner quickly became a victim of the challenging scoring environment in the semifinal match, dropping a 214-168 decision to Page, who started with a spare and three strikes, and stayed out of trouble the rest of the game to earn his shot at the title. The Xtra Frame Kenn-Feld Classic was the final tournament in the seven-event PBA Xtra Frame Storm Cup series that awarded \$50,000 in bonus prizes to the five points leaders, including \$20,000 to Tackett as the points champion. Tackett came into Coldwater with a nine-point lead in the Storm Cup race, and picked up two more points with his 19th place finish.

As a testament to the difficulty of the event, Tackett had the highest finish among the four players who had a mathematical chance to win the Cup, but the other three failed to gain any ground. Because only the top 20 finishers in each tournament earn Storm Cup points, England's Dom Barrett, who finished 65th; Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., who finished 58th, and Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., who finished 76th in Coldwater, failed to win a point. Regardless, Barrett held on to second place for a \$10,000 bonus, Kent wound up in a tie with Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., who finished sixth in Coldwater, for third place (\$7,500 each) and Allen earned \$5,000 for fifth place in the points race.

Senior Bowling Tour Rolls On JAT Kicks Off Another Season **25 Years and Counting**

WESTMINSTER - The West Coast Senior Tour has four more bowling tournaments to go this season before it concludes 25 years in operation.

So is the WCST ready for another quarter-century of events? "Absolutely," says Dick Sanders, who has presided over the WCST's two-and-a-half decades as the tour's feisty director and owner.

Sanders hasn't wasted any time getting the 2018 season planned out. In late July, he announced the tour's schedule for next year with eight events planned for Southern California and four for Nevada.

Still to go this season are tournaments Sept. 2 at Westminster Lanes; Oct. 15 at Linbrook Bowl in Anaheim; Nov. 4 at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas; and

Dec. 9-10 at Riverside Casino Lanes in Laughlin. Westminster Lanes will be serving as a WCST tournament site for the first time since 2001.

The tournaments in Las Vegas and Laughlin are expected to climax the WCST season. Sanders estimates he'll get 35-40 entries in Las Vegas and 40-45 in Laughlin.

Overall, Sanders says the WCST entries have held steady this year. "We've had about the same as last year," he said. The tour is open to eligible players 60 and older.

Sanders has maintained the same number of entries despite a disappointing break-up with the TVS Television Network Company. TVS, a syndicator of American sports programming, was expected to tape the finals of WCST tournaments and distribute the content to various TV channels and other media formats. That deal, however, never really got off the ground.

Still, Sanders has kept WCST interest up with several novelties, such as creating a round-robin format for the tournament finals. He's also changed rules to benefit the 70-and-older segment, whose membership in the tour has been growing.

Additionally, Sanders has been encouraging women bowlers to take part in the tour, allowing women to compete starting at 55 years. One woman who has taken advantage has been United States Bowling Congress Hall-of-Famer Robin Romeo.

Sanders said Romeo has bowled in two WCST tournaments this year. "Robin Romeo is the most wonderful lady I've ever known," said Sanders, whose tour has paid more than \$4 million in prize money over more than 400 events. "She's the classiest person I've ever met." Romeo won the first WCST tour in which she competed – in 2001 at AMF Bowling Square Lanes in Arcadia.


Behind Sanders, the WCST has fought to boost entries since its heyday in the mid-1990s when the tour averaged more than 100 bowlers a tournament. The tour attracted a staggering 233 players to Ventura for one tournament in 1995, Sanders said.

Those grandiose events were two- and three-day affairs in those years, unlike the primarily one-day events now. The tournaments attracted bowlers from Northern and Southern California and Nevada those years. Now, the tour basically gets its players from the Southland and Nevada.

In any event, Sanders is focused on providing bowling tournaments for senior bowlers - and sees plenty of decades of WCST competition ahead.

"If I'm not there, cover it anyway," he joked.
