

### West Covina Trio Is Upset Winner of ABT Mega Event **Brunswick \$10,000 Challenge** by Frank Weiler

COVINA — The second annual BRUNSWICK \$10,000 CHALLENGE was hosted by Brunswick Covina Lanes, on Saturday. Ninety-six trio teams from Brunswick centers throughout SoCal participated. LEANNA BARNES, General Manager of Fontana Foothill Lanes, was Tournament Director

Any trio team which bowled in a Brunswick \$10,000 Challenge Summer League, in So-Cal, was eligible to participate in the tournament. The teams were vying for \$10,000, with first place being worth \$3,000.

The tournament featured a Baker Format. There were two qualifying rounds which paired the field down to six-The "Sweet teen teams. Sixteen" then bowled single elimination, two game, total pin matches. Winners kept advancing, until only one team stood undefeated.

The championship team from West Covina Lanes included DON QUINTANGON, FRED GO, and FRED MAN-ANSALA. The winning trio bowled like professionals. In the three matches and six games I saw them bowl, I only remember them have three open frames. Only one of the three miscues was an ordinary spare. Two were splits. That is error free bowling.

All three champions hit the pocket consistently. All three were righties and played the same strike line, looping the ball out over the seventeen board to the thirteen board, and back into the 1-3.

While our champions carried book averages between 158 and 175, into the tourney, they were able to bowl baker games of 220 or better, one after another. The champs easily outscored everyone, on a scratch basis. They didn't need the approximately fifty pin handicap edge, they had in every match.

The big surprise was them defeating a trio from CAL OAKS, which included three scratch bowlers (DAVE GUL-LEY, SCOTT FILIPI, and RICHARD SZCZAWINSKI) with

212 or better book averages. The champs beat these high rollers scratch, and they made it look easy!


# **3 Time Hall of Famer Billy Myers Sr. Passes**

WEST COVINA - Welcome to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to West Covina for our frozen handicap event where we saw a nice 283 entries. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +52 for the men and +27 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were James Sweet(+48), Lonzell Burnett(+38), and Wendy Soo Hoo(+5). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 67 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

For all qualifying squads, our top qualifier for the Men was Dennis Kelsey with a +147, and for the women it was Beth Borci with a +75, each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. The top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$494. Kelsey drew a 403. We had three bowlers that bowled this score. They were Giang Huynh, Rey Josafat and Johnny Tran, each will get \$164. This week we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,100 at the big Labor Day event. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, 3 people missed on the final qualifying shot, they were Lord Ferguson, Vict Hilvano, and Mike Benavides. They will split the \$50 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$2,600 at Cal Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Chris Kelly and Danny Guevarra with a 1448 for \$200. Second were Chris Kelly and Jerry Chang with 1445 for \$180. There was a total of \$2,340 paid out in doubles and 26 paid spots with low to cash of 1363. Doubles are only \$5.00 entry fee. In the semis we saw Joevin Bolanos lead the field with a +180 to sit out and bowl for the title at West Covina. In second was Ryan Nam with a +169 to sit out the first round. It took a +70 for the men and +52 for the women. There was an error at the start of Match Play where one of the women's recaps was missed, so in error we announced that +39 was the cut score.. This was an honest mistake and we the ABTA try our best to make sure all scores are correct, but at times this will happe, with so many entrants.

Bolanos had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. The pot is maxed out and we have a backup pot that is growing which is now at \$2,235. Our top seed drew a 254. We had no bowlers who shot that score so it will be carried over. We will have \$3,500 next week at Cal Bowl, and continue to build on the second back-up pot. This week we had six new bowlers join us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Gary Mak, Jesse Pena, Ron Hernandez, Christopher Sabado, Ryan Reyes, and Ed Geneston.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Ada Wong-Hum, Cecilia Lung, Roy Li, Andy Yu, Lonzell Burnett, Je Je Gabriel, and Greg Velarde. They received checks of \$110 each. In the second round, the losers were Donovan Chung, Ngheim Tran, Jerry Chang, and Kenny Kwan. They received checks of \$120 each. This would get us down to the final five bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$31 (Ryan

After forty games, and one week to go (last week), Milburn was averaging 219.96. She was two total pins shy of 220. She had knocked down 8,798 sticks in forty games, but needed 8,800. The last week of play would see Amanda bowl four games, two sets of two games. She would need 882 pins.

The final week of the summer started slow with games of 203 and 204.

Everyone could see the disappointment on Amanda's face. She just didn't match up well on her first pare of lanes. Things looked grim, and 220 seemed to be a distant dream. However, as they say: "When things get tough, the tough get going." Amanda is as tough as any guy on the lanes.

While her first two games left her thirty-five pins off the 220 pace, any sane prognosticator would bet on Amanda to come back. She would need a

475 total her last two games, a 237.5 average.

After moving to a new pare of lanes everything just clicked. New lanes, better carry and WHAMO - Amanda produced higher scores! How about 228 and

254 for 482. That gave her seven pins to spare, and a 220.11 average.

What did Amanda do to upgrade her scores? She told me she changed bowling balls, but the more important factor was the new pare of lanes. Her carry was much better after the move. For the record, she changed from her Brunswick Max Zone to her C-System 3.5.


