

Pete Weber Wins 2nd Consecutive **PBA50 Player of the Year**

Ohio's Eddie Graham wins Rookie of the Year. Ron Mohr earns PBA60 Player of the Year honors

CHICAGO - Despite missing four of 13 tournaments. Pete Weber put together the most dominant season since the Professional Bowlers Association started its division for players 50 years of age and older in 1981.

Weber, who turned 54 on Aug. 21, earned his second consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crown thanks to winning a record six tournaments in 2016, including a record string of four in a row. Among his six wins were two majors - his second consecutive Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by 900 Global and his second USBC Senior Masters title, his first coming in his rookie season of



Bowling in nine tournaments, his string of four consecutive wins included the PBA50 UnitedHealth-

lages presented by Radical, PBA50 Mooresville Ford Open presented by Columbia 300 and Miller High care Sun Bowl In The Vil- Life, and the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Brunswick leading up to his Senior U.S. Open win. His sixth win came in the PBA50 South Shore Open presented by DV8.

Weber also had secondplace finishes in the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV and the PBA50 Treasure Island Resort & Casino World Championship presented by Storm, and a fourthplace in the season-opening Pasco County Florida Open, which was his lowest finish of the season.

"Don't get me wrong, I threw the ball well this year but I have to admit I got a lot of breaks this year and it seemed like my opponents continued on page 9

ADDISON, Ill. - To calm herself as she looked to capture her first Professional Women's Bowling Association title, Josie Earnest thought about the patches she received as a youth bowler, the ones that reminded her that bowling is fun.

"It means everything," Earnest said of winning her first PWBA title. "It's pretty cliché to say, but I think growing up you compete, you go to college, and you look forward to bowling professionally. The icing on the cake is winning a title. You want to live out your dream, and I'm just really excited I was able to do it in Season 2."

Earnest's road to the title meant going through a United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer and a 2016 major title winner before taking on O'Keefe, one of the top



competitors on the PWBA Tour this season.

Earnest started with victory a 187-159 over



- ●HOLLYWOOD STAR BOWL started off the year with a star studded grand opening. A few of the stars that glissened were Jack Dempsey, Rafer Johnson, Jimmie Rodgers and Rick Jason. (?)
- ●BOWLING SQUARE was particularly owned by Michael Ansara and wife Barbara Eden when it opened. 3rd partner was Willie Shumaker.
- ●W.I.B.C. was held in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Dang - I bowled 38 W.I.B.C.Tournaments and missed that one! Entry fee was only \$6.00 per event.
- Here comes another one! WOODLAKE BOWL in Woodland Hills. More in February 1961 on this beauty.
- ●Homer Chestnut was named G.M. of CAL BOWL. He was lured from BOULE-VARD BOWL. He didn't want to move. But money talks. He hosted the opening in March.
- Heard of POM LANES? All 32 lanes were filled for fun February 3rd. Their lounge was the "Kilt Room".
- •From February 13 thru February 25, the Bowling Proprietors Assn. sponsored 24 bowling clinics in 24 different centers!! Hard to tell how many league bowlers were signed up.
- •Question of the week to Lee Jouglard (the Bowling Doctor) was "How does the Petersen Point scoring system work?" First time the P.P. was mentioned.
- The Jackpot on "Jackpot Bowling" NBC-TV, reached \$65,000 on March 3. MII-ton Berle, M.C. was the host and Bob Strampe was the current "King of the Hill".
- ●INDIO BOWL's "cut the ribbon ceremony" was enjoyed by hundreds. The Mayor was dressed like a sheik and gave out figs.
- Dave Boran offered 16 new 1961 Dodge Lancers for the "Bowler of the Month" in each of his centers. Boran had 4 centers, each center gave away 4 cars. What a promoter!
- Hank Catalano treated the L.A. Angels baseball team to a steak dinner and bowling at his PALM SPRINGS LANES. The Angels were in spring training. That night STRIKES were a good thing!
- •Fresh from Detroit, Art Goddard joined the staff at BOWLIUM as the "Day Bowling Instructor". More to come about him. Bowler, Manager, Owner, etc.
- •Winners of the first Candlepin Tourney on the West Coast won a round trip to Massachusetts to the finals.
- ●BOWLING NEWS OWNER Jesse Dudley had a 10 minute radio spot on KIEV featuring scores, news, human interests, and interviews.
- College bowling brings a new sport for team competition. U.C.L.A. installed 10 lanes and the college craze took off. Oregon and Minnesota led the way.
- ●TROPICANA LANES ran something called "3 Pin Circus". Big Mystery. No description ever given. Maybe colored pins??
- •New on the market were leather aids for the hand and ankle. These were invented to avoid calluses, blisters and lumps on the hands and bloody ankles. These items are still used today by avid bowlers.
- ●PICKWICK RECREATION featured bowling, swimming, volleyball, ping pong, shuffleboard, dancing, fashion shows, horseback riding, ice skating, hockey, speed skating and shows. You could vacation there!
- •Granada diggers were pictured breaking ground for GRANADA LANES in Granada Hills. Gone now but not forgotten.
- ●When CAL BOWL opened, they ran "Learn To Bowl" classes 8 hours a day, 5 days a week for a month. Every hour was filled with eager students. Leagues were formed quickly, April 1961.

- The B.P.A.A. sued the A.B.C. for violation of the Federal Anti-trust laws. Basically, that infers the A.B.C. has a monopoly on "Bowling" and "Equipment manufactures". A.B.C. also had complete and final jurisdiction over the 3,839,642 male bowlers, rules of the game, playing fields and money. The dispute would not be solved until December of 1961.
- •A fellow named Maxie Kodof ran a 20 game singles plus a 10 game team event in the summer. 60th place in each event was \$500. The Ogden, Utah event drew bowlers from 43 states and Canada. \$20.00 entry fee per person per event. PLUS PLUS 5 Game singles, doubles, mixed doubles and all events.
- •Sand was kicked around by the owners of BEACH BOWL to signify the start of construction on their 40 lane center in Hermosa Beach. Suggested to be 2 stories and with a view of the bay.
- Marvelous MAR VISTA LANES, all 28 opened for business May 20, on Venice Blvd. in L.A. And, it's still there! The Brunswick Gold Crowns were a thing of beauty.
- ●Here is a beginning and an end. BEACON BOWL in Barstow opened on June 3, 1961. The same bowl, recently named "REVOLUTIONS" closed May 31, 2016, and still had wood lanes! Good try!
- Actor Pat O'Brien was Guest Émcee at the Bowling Writers Banquet, backed up by Phyllis Diller. Norm Meyers and Hope Riccilli were "Bowlers of the Year". That takes us on our time travel to May 31, 1961. Part II will be printed soon with another trip down Memory Lane.





THE NEXT EVOLUTION IN BOWLING

Every sporting edeavor from basketball to indycar racing has evolved over time, and bowling is no exception. The "Cheater Ball" or so it was called led to what we know today as the Resin Reactive Bowling Ball which changed the face of bowling. Soon a new ball will change the face of bowling forever. What began as a project to help people with disabilities live up to their potential may soon change the face of bowling as we know it for everyone. That is, if the USBC can set its prejudice aside and actually certifies a redesigned bowling ball from its failed remotely operated "Cheater" ball. The inventor of this new ball is in the process of working with the USBC so that there are no problems when and if the enormous capital investment required becomes available. The plans for the ball of the future are now being submitted on behalf of a bowler who can only use one half of his body to bowl.

No one knows the struggle of Micheal Moisant, 21 of Rancho Cucamonga, California. In his own right, he is a true champion because despite the fact one half of his body is lifeless, the other half of his body is so full of life, nothing drags him down. Everyone who bowls with him is not only inspired, but even more grateful for their own God given abilities. His dream is to be able to bowl on a level playing field, and my dream is seeing his dream to fruition. Bowling is a constant struggle for people who can swing the ball behind them, but for Micheal it's a forward facing one-way or no way proposition. His style is as unique as Jason Belmonte, and likely to become more famous as I have committed myself to helping make this happen. Every Monday night when we bowl in the Challenge 200 Sport Shot League at Bowlium in Montclair, California, the highlight of my week is being able to share new information and progress in the development of his ball that provides no tactical advantage but will allow him to reach his full potential. In fact, it will enable everyone unable to swing their arm and those who can, an even playing field opening the most popular sport to even more people.

In 2009, 900 Global introduced a remotely operated ball as a novelty for children's birthday parties. It was heralded as another modern marvel and testimate to the ingenuity of man in Popular Mechanics. Contrary to the USBC, The Bowling Minute, the \$950 ball has never been retired by 900 Global, and with less than a handful in inventory, their value in the collector's market will soon fetch hundreds of thousand of dollars if a working prototype based upon a redesign bringing the ball into compliance with USBC rules is certified.

These monumental tasks are by far easier said than done; however, so is Micheal's struggle. Thankfully, the bowling ball industry remains a tight knit segment of manufacturing. When I could not reach anyone by phone at 900 Global (as they do not sell to the public) Storm Rotogrip in Utah put me in direct contact with Dan Garner of 900 Global and after two-months of waiting for the trade show circuit to end, he was more than happy to offer up one of the balls remaining in inventory within a two-week time period. Although no deed with good intentions goes unpunished, the entire project has been sidelined because of a USBC stipulation that certified bowling balls cannot contain metal or have lights. This fix may be as simple as disassembling the unit, disabling its lights, and replacing its moving components with ceramic or carbon fiber. The cost \$95,000. With a reward which is priceless in my book, it is no competative advantage so long as the ball can be purchased by anyone at any pro shop. The cost of re-tooling for the unprecidented demand \$950,000 to \$9,500,000. The revenue generated to the bowling ball industry- \$95,000,000. Ten fold is a pretty good rate of return and considering one half of the revenue generated by bowling centers is from shoe rental, this bonanza is a gold rush waiting to happen.

Micheal Jordan who tried introducing the Micheal Jordan Ball failed to obtain USBC certification, but that is no reason for me or Micheal to give up. If you build it, they will come. While no one in their right mind would shell out \$95,000 unless the ball can be certified, if and when someone is willing to make that kind of investment it is a certainty that we will see a ball that will be smart enough to allow the bowler to pre-program the ball for speed, revolution rate, and the ball itself will not know when to hook, but will leave it to the bowler to determine the optimal entry angle.

Competatively, there is no advantage because it will still require the one thing no computer can ever replace- Thought. Inevitably the Indy 500 will either adapt to driverless cars or become obsolete. Last year the race was won by a rookie in only the fifth start of his career. An unprecidented achievment and proof that the impossible is not always what it seems. A Shack-proof backboard changed basketball just as putting a hole in the bottom of the basket leveled the playing field for those who weren't tall enough to retrieve it. Bowling will either adapt to new technology or die, but it would be the highlight of my life and a boom to the bowling industry to see Micheal enter a Pro-Am tournament and emerge the Champion he already is.

No matter how large each hurdle comes our way, the future of bowling belongs to the bowlers in as much as it is owned by the industry who have pledged to make this happen.

stepladder final. The stepladder will follow qualifying and a round-robin elimination round. All prior WCST tournaments this year have staged a double-elimination roll-off in the finals.

The WCST will close out the 13-tournament season with events at South Point Lanes in Las Vegas on Nov. 5 and Riverside Casino Lanes in Laughlin on Dec. 10-11. The WCST's agreement with the TVS Television Network will continue through the 2017 season.

The deal with TVS will provide many benefits for Sanders' senior tour, which is open to eligible players 60 and older.

Perhaps first and foremost, TVS will inject prize money to each of the tournaments it tapes. TVS will add \$250 for the Linbrook tournament, for instance. It will provide \$500 for the November Las Vegas tournament.

Twenty-five bowlers competed in La Habra on Aug. 13 in the WCST's last tournament. Russ Davies of Las Vegas claimed \$725 for first place. Second and third place paid \$600 and \$500. Those payoffs are expected to jump in future tournaments with the TVS deal.

"I told you in the past that more money in tournaments will result in more people wanting to play," said Sanders, citing another benefit of the TVS deal.

The WCST has been fighting to boost entries since its heyday in the mid-1990s when the tour averaged more than 100 bowlers a tournament. The tour attracted a staggering 233 players to Ventura for one tournament in 1995, Sanders said.

Those grandiose events were two- and three-day affairs in those years, unlike the primarily one-day events now. The tournaments attracted bowlers from Northern and Southern California and Nevada those years. Now, the tour basically gets its players from the Southland and Nevada.

The tour was forced to cancel its scheduled tournament at Winnetka Bowl in the San Fernando Valley on June 11 because of a lack of entries. But now the WCST, in its 24th season, is expected to attract big numbers in coming events.

"Our 25th year will be one of our better years in a long continued on page 9

LAUGHLIN — Andy Toro is a very good bowler. He books 221 and has many certified/sanctioned perfect 300s and 800s. He is even a better tournament bowler. He regularly wins on the SoCAL ABT (Amateur Bowlers Tour) circuit. So it's no surprise that Andy scored big at this summers Laughlin Blast Tournament.

So what did Andy do at this summers Laughlin Blast senior No-Tap Tournament that caught my attention and everyone else's attention? First, he started the week by winning Sunday's Sweeper. He did so impressively by rolling a huge 857 (257-300-300) with no handicap.

Second, he rolled four perfect 300 games during the week. That number of 300s by one bowler is probably a tournament record. The rest of the field of bowlers only recorded three perfect games during the week.

Third, his 2,421 nine game No-Tap pin total was highest scratch total for the tournament. That pin fall is the result of a 269 average! His series scores were 776, 775 and 870.

Fourth, his 870 (300-280-290) No-Tap scratch series was the highest scratch series of the tournament. That is an average of 290!

Fifth, his 2,421 pin total was good for second place in All-Events. All -Events was a handicap event but Andy received no handicap. The All-Events winner knocked down less pins than Andy (2,324) but received 151 handicap pins for a 2,477 winning total. There are my five reasons for concluding that Andy Toro was the top bowler at this summers Laughlin Blast Tournament.

got the bad breaks," said Weber. "It was just one of those years. I hated to miss those last three tournaments because there was probably another title there somewhere."

Weber's season ended prematurely because of a nagging hip injury that he hopes won't be a factor as he gets ready for the upcoming PBA Fall Swing that starts over the Labor Day weekend in suburban Detroit.

"It's in good shape now after going to the doctor and not bowling for a while," Weber said. "I'll probably take another week off and have my brother Rich do a little analysis of how I'm throwing the ball and just go from there."

With his six wins, Weber ran his career PBA50 Tour win total to 10 which puts him in a tie with Walter Ray Williams Jr. for fourth place on the all-time PBA50 Tour titles list. John Handegard is the leader with 14 titles.

Winning POY with 457,200 points, nearly twice Amleto Monacelli's 241,680 second-place total, Weber also led two other statistical categories by whopping margins. He averaged a record 237.03 for 265 games and took home \$73,200 in earnings.

"I had some pretty good years on the PBA Tour where I won multiple titles and made a lot of shows but winning (PBA50) Player of the Year two years in a row ranks right up there with what I was able to accomplish on the 'kids' tour," said Weber, who never won player of the year on the regular tour. "The atmosphere is a little different on the PBA50 Tour than it is on the regular tour but I can tell you, nobody's intimidated."

Weber's closest competitor in earnings was Monacelli with \$38,775. Monacelli was the only other multiple winner in 2016, capturing two titles, the PBA50 Fountain Valley Open presented by Track and the PBA50 National Championship to Benefit Riley Hospital for Children for his seventh PBA50 title and fourth major.

Norm Duke, the winner of the PBA50 Treasure Island Resort & Casino World Championship for his third PBA50 Tour title and second major, finished second in average, nine pins behind Weber with 228.31.

Other players winning titles in 2016 were hall of famers Williams (Pasco County Florida Open), Brian Voss (Dave Small's Championship Lanes Classic presented by Roto Grip) and newcomers Noel Vazquez (Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV) and Eddie Graham Jr. (De-Hayes Insurance Group Championship presented by Pro Bowl West and Ebonite). Voss, Vazquez and Graham were all first-time PBA50 Tour winners.

With their wins on the PBA50 Tour, Weber and Williams also edged closer to the 100 overall PBA titles mark with both players currently sitting at 99, including PBA Tour, PBA Regional, PBA50 Tour and PBA50 Regional titles. As the top rookie in points, Graham, a five-time PBA Regional titlist including the 2007 Regional Players Invitational, earned Rookie of the Year honors.

Graham cashed in the last nine consecutive tournaments of the season and won his first PBA50 Tour title in the DeHayes Insurance Group Championship.

With his big finish, Graham also moved into eighth place on the season-long competition points list to qualify for the PBA50 Challenge which will be contested on Nov. 27 and aired live on Xtra Frame as part of the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VIII in Reno. Graham will join Weber, Monacelli, Duke, Williams, Voss, Parker Bohn III and Mohr in the eight-game round robin match play event. All eight also earned paid entries to compete in WSOB VIII.

Mohr, in earning PBA60 Player of the Year honors, had six PBA50 top-five finishes and eight top five's, including the ITRC Super Senior Classic and PBA60 Dick Weber Championship presented by Hammer, which were limited to players 60 years and older.

Among Mohr's top finishes were second-place finishes in the UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages and the Dick Weber Championship.

Winning the "super senior" events were Don Sylvia, capturing the Dick Weber Championship title, and Junichi Yajima winning the ITRC Super Senior Classic.

In addition to Weber, Monacelli, Duke, Williams and Bohn will return to action against the younger generation in the PBA Fall Swing at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich. Sept. 4-11.

struck in six of the first eight frames of the semifinal match in a 238-214 victory over Colombia native Clara Guerrero, who won the Go Bowling PWBA Players Championship earlier this season.

"In some ways, it's difficult because you have three really fantastic competitors you have to beat to get there," Earnest said about her road to the title. "At the same time, it allowed me to get comfortable. I was nervous that first match; it was one of my first matches on TV in a long time and I was bowling against a hall of famer. You try to eliminate those distractions. But it allowed me to get comfortable."

Earnest's last TV appearance came in 2012 at the USBC Queens, held at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas. She bowled well in the opening match but lost to Liz Johnson, 268-223. She would make the stepladder finals of the PWBA Detroit Open last season, beating Kelly Kulick in the opening match before falling to Johnson in the semifinal.

Against top-seed O'Keefe in the title match, Earnest was facing a competitor who was making her fifth championship-round appearance and who was seeking her fourth title of the 2016 PWBA season.

"You just have eliminate that thought," Earnest said. "I kept thinking of those patches you would get as a youth bowler that said BIF, Bowling Is Fun. I said before the match that the sun would come up tomorrow whether I shoot 100 or 250, so I'm just going to go out and enjoy the moment because you never know how many of those you will have."

Starting in the fourth frame, Earnest strung together four strikes, while O'Keefe opened in the sixth after leaving the 4-6-7, helping Earnest coast to the win and qualify for the season-ending Smithfield PWBA Tour Championship, set for Sept. 1-4 at Uptown Alley in Midlothian, Virginia.

All 2016 tournament champions, who are PWBA members at the time of their victory, receive an automatic invitation to the 16-player Smithfield PWBA Tour Championship. The remainder of the field is filled through the points list

Earnest, who is the assistant women's bowling coach at Vanderbilt University, said her family, who owns a bowling center, always have been a motivating factor, but her players also push her to be better as a competitor.

"My girls really inspire me to be better and give them something to look up to," said Earnest, who bowled at Vanderbilt and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2013, the first member of the bowling program to earn the honor. "It's exciting to know they are excited for you. I had a couple of them in the stands, and it's exciting for them to see it and want to be here someday."

The qualifying and match-play rounds of the PWBA Rochester Open took place July 8-9 at AMF Gates Lanes in Rochester, New York.

The stepladder finals were held Aug. 7 at Stardust Bowl in conjunction with the 2016 U.S. Women's Open, along with the PWBA St. Petersburg-Clearwater Open finals which will air on CBS Sports Network on Aug. 30.

time," predicted Sanders about the 2017 season.

TVS has a long history of sports involvement – and bowling in particular. Wikipedia reports that in 2008 TVS produced many bowling shows at the Silver Nugget Casino in Las Vegas, including a 13-episode revival of "Celebrity Bowling" and a revival of "Make That Spare." In the 1970s, TVS was involved in telecasts of the Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour.


Sanders said the reaction of bowlers to the TVS agreement has been extremely positive. "They love it," he said.


"Another thing is that this will be the only bowling show with just 60-year-olds bowling. The PBA has 50- and 60-year-olds bowling together.

"We will have no gimmicks. People today want to see an actual match and that's what we emphasize. This is a good way to bring bowling back to Southern California and for people to see it."

The WCST will hold its next tournament Sept. 10 at Bowlium Lanes in Montclair. The event will mark the last double-elimination roll-off for the finals before the stepladder rules take effect.


Steve is very generous and loves sharing his knowledge to help beginners or jog the memory of what we've learned in the past.
