Dave Beres Wins PBA Midwest Regional Players Invitational

PERU, Ill. - Dave Beres of Waukesha, Wis., defeated Tom Hess of Urbandale, Iowa, 225-205, to win the Professional **Bowlers Association Midwest** Region's Regional Players Invitational title Monday, concluding two days of live Xtra Frame coverage from Illinois Valley Super Bowl.

Beres, 35, earned \$6,000, a paid entry into the PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in late October and a berth in a new PBA RPI Finals which will be televised on ESPN. The regional title was Beres' sixth and his second in two weeks.

"Besides the added money and beating a strong field which is always special - my mother got to watch me win on Xtra Frame," Beres said. "She had never seen me win a title

"I've been losing early in match play recently," he added, "so winning early here kind of helps you build momentum. I was lucky to get past Nathan (Michalowski, a fellow Wisconsin player), but it was a relief to be able to move on. You just never like to win like that.'

Beres defeated Michalowski in the semifinal round, 201-195, by throwing two strikes and a nine-count in the 10th frame, followed by Michalowski failing to convert the 3-10 "baby split."

Beres admitted he hasn't bowled well in two previous World Series of Bowling appearances "but I'll practice a lot and hope I can do better this time.'

The Midwest Region RPI was the second in a series of six PBA Regional championship events. The PBA East, Central, Southwest and combined West/Northwest Regions also will host RPI events in the coming weeks, with each RPI winner advancing to the PBA RPI Finals that will be taped for delayed airing on ESPN as part of the World Series of Bowling V at South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center, Oct. 26-Nov. 3. Tom Daugherty of Wesley Chapel, Fla., was the first RPI winner, claiming the South Region title in Tavares, Fla., in early August.

Each RPI is open to 48 players who have qualified through a season-long points competition in their respective regions, and each RPI is being covered live from start to finish on PBA's exclusive bowling channel, Xtra Frame. Visit pba.com for Xtra Frame



Dean of Bowling Writers, PBA & USBC Hall of Fame

There have been many bowling institutions in bowling. Some are as short lived as a small candle in a large wind. Others are as long lasting as a mountain reaching high into the sky.

One of the rocks of bowling was John Jowdy, who left us all too soon, though he had a long and successful earthly stay of 93 years.

In my early days in bowling I made it a point to attend every meeting, tournament or gathering of the sport-and there was one common plus—John Jowdy was there.

We hit it off from the start, whether we agreed or agreed not to agree, friends, buddies, close to brothers. Some people called him a bowling ball salesman, and a few claimed he couldn't make the judgement calls.

That irked me because as a pioneer of the sport, able and willing to study and try to understand every area of bowling, John was a valued public relations master and executive for his beloved Columbia, and his love for the sport, warts and all.

We went to places where maybe we were not fully welcome, and we listened to almost everyone. The most important thing I learned about Jowdy is that first and foremost he was a people person with an inquiring mind that never quit learning and loving in his own way.

His life experiences included operating a nightclub and his sports connection was as a top softball pitcher and a fine bowler who made the finer points of the game available to the world. He had a way with words, speaking and writing them and never afraid to do research and gain help from others.

Over the years I discovered he was an excellent dancer with feathery movements, a classic dresser with a flair for colors, ties, cowboy hats and boots.

Jowdy's hats were the best and he owned boots of practically every exotic leather used for the purpose. I still have a huge collection of various era ties he would give to me from his bulging clothing closet.

Over the years I had the pleasure of rolling with such great doubles partners as Lou Campi, Lindy Faragalli, Graz Castellano and even the one and only Andy Varipapa, all multiple Hall of Famers.

When my four sons became good enough we decided to go to the American Bowling Congress tourney as a team but we needed a bowler for doubles and singles and John became my honorary son and doubles partner. We couldn't roll more than a few frames without someone dropping by to chat with Jowdy.

He wasn't a magnet but he had a special attraction to all who knew and respected him, as wide and inspiring as you can imagine.

Our original writer group at breakfast were Jowdy, Dick Evans and Joe Lyou, all now passed, and they let me in too. There was kidding, needling, and idle and serious chatter. Soon bowlers in the top tournaments joined the group, all time greats such as Dick Weber and Johnny Petraglia and at the Firestone Tournament of Champions, the group often ballooned to 40 or more, bowlers, writers and officials.

Jowdy always had a way with the ladies because he treated them like ladies, never failing to send a hand written Thank You note to tournament writers, scorers, and others involved with the tourney in some way.

John's birthday always came during the Firestone, and whether it did or not, we had a cake. But one time the competing bowlers came up with a surprise for John to thank him for the uncountable hours he spent teaching almost everyone who asked.

I had to keep him busy while the hotel site was being prepared for the fete and it brought the usually talkative John to near tears when he was presented with a gold

"I considered that birthday party one of the highlights of my life because so many went out of their way to say thank you in such a unique way in such a once in a lifetime setting," Jowdy fondly recalled. Jowdy will be remembered as one of the greatest teach-

ers of all time, from youngsters in his hometown of San Antonio, Texas to more than a hundred top stars, including the world's outstanding pro champions.

The John Jowdy Scholarship, and many of his innovations, are standard in bowling centers, and the bowling world is all the better for his being.

We could write his name in smoke in the sky, but the wind would blow it away.

We could dig his name in beach sand, but the water would wash it away.

So let's just keep him in a loving corner of our hearts where it will stay—for all the forevers and a day.

The pressure to perform - for teammates, for country - under difficult conditions was palpable. It's what makes bowling an incredible sport. The USA, featuring for the first time a 'Dream Team' group of PBA pros, won that day, but bowling was the true

"The PBA prides itself on featuring the greatest players in the world, and witnessing the talent on display that entire week in Thailand made it clear to me all of the best players in the world were not regular participants in the PBA," he continued. "I needed to make a greater effort to bring these players from around the globe to compete on our stage. 


