Jason Heggemeier is 2008 Masters Champion

LAKE FOREST—First time Masters participant, Jason Heggemeier from Castaic went undefeated into the championship match and lost his first match of the weekend to John Sowell from Vista, winner of the Loser's bracket. Forcing one last final match, Jason came out on top winning the 2008 Masters title, a check for \$900 and will receive a free entry into the 2009 USBC National Masters event as well as berths into the next two California State Masters events.

Over \$12,000 was awarded in prize money to the 63 finalists and we had a turnout of 123 total entrants from the Open Championship qualifying and the Last Chance qualifier. Kevin Gannon from Lakewood earned the \$100 high game bonus and the \$100 two-game high series bonus in the finals with a 300 game and 556 series. Other high game honor scores in the finals: Lyle Rollins 299, Michelle Silver 297 & 296 and Skip Pavone 289. Larry Dickens from Redding averaged 240.39 for 18

games taking over the lead for the all-time Masters high average in the finals making his mark in the record books.

The Friday night Last Chance qualifier had 56 total entries. 35 berths were filled from that squad as there were 3 additional openings from the Open Championship qualifying to fill. Dewaine West from Temecula lead the qualifier shooting 300 and a 1,512 six game series and Sergio Lopez rounded out the cut with a 1,181 series.

WESTMINSTER—Thank you to everyone who came out to our 31st Anniversary tournament at Westminster Lanes over the Labor Day weekend.

Our tournament started on Thursday evening with one squad saw eight bowlers advancing to the semi-finals. The cut after the squad was +42. There was one squad on Friday evening with six bowlers advancing with a cut score of +44. Saturday squads were every two hours beginning at 1PM. The cut score on Saturday was +22 with 9 advancing to the semi-finals. Sunday squads also began at 1PM. Eight bowlers advanced with a cut score of +2. There were two squads on Monday with a cut at the end of each squad. The first squad saw 7 advancing with a cut score of +37. The second squad has a cut score of +61 with six advancing to the semi-finals. After the semi-finals, the top eight included Orpah Toliver, Theresa Maloles, Elijah Viewens, Jun Cadenas, Roy Jones, Victor Jordan, Fred Go and Noel Sicut. Bowlers drew for their lane assignments for the first round. The first round saw Elijah Viewens take on Fred Go, Jun Cadenas take on Theresa Maloles, Victor Jordan take on Noel Sicut and Orpah Toliver

take on Roy Jones. After the first round, Elijah Viewens, Jun Cadenas, Roy Jones and Victor Jordan lost their matches and each received a check for \$200.

The semi-final round saw Theresa Maloles take on Fred Go while Orpah Toliver took on Noel Sicut. Noel Sicut and Fred Go lost their matches and each received a check for \$650.

A large crowd of bowlers had gathered to watch and cheer as our championship match between past ABT Champion Theresa Maloles and our 2007 defending ABT Labor Day Champion Orpah Toliver unfolded. Both players started the match with marks, and continued their seesaw battle. Many of the crowd thought that the ninth frame was the turning point of the match as Theresa missed a five-count spare. In the tenth frame, Orpah ran into a 4-7-10 split and converted only two of the three pins. This left the tournament championship in the hands of Theresa Maloles. Theresa needed a strike on her first ball in the tenth. As she released the ball, the excitement grew as many of the supporters were standing and now cheering with anticipation of a

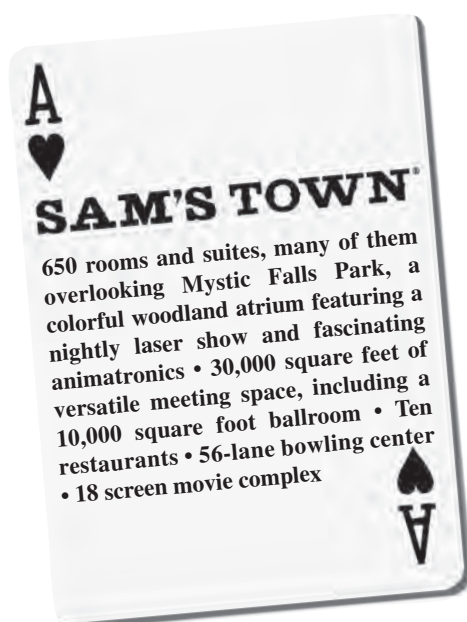

WCST Announces New Format For All Future Singles Tournaments

The WCST, as of August 19, 2008, and for all future WCST Ebonite Singles Tournaments will have a format more fitting for our organization. Tournament entries will be broken down into two divisions,

With the Senior Division, ages 45 to 59, for the Men, and ages, 40 to 49 for the Ladies. The Super Senior Division, ages 60 and up for the Men, and 50 and up for the Ladies. Amount of finalists, and games to be bowled for each division, determined by a chart posted at the tournament site. All cash places will be paid on a one for three basis in each division. When there is added money from sponsors in any singles tournament, percentage of that money goes to each division, depending on amount of entries in each division. Qualifying on Saturday's of scheduled dates, still will be 10 games, that would be two 5 games blocks, with an hour break for lunch, after the 1st block, or 10 games straight, depending on the WCST Tournament Director's decision. 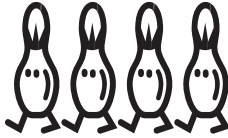

Forest Lanes First "Over 50" Scotch Doubles Tournament

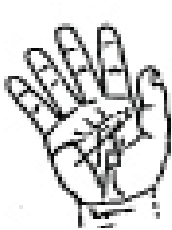

Premiere of 2008 U.S. Women's Open to Re-Air on ESPN2

ARLINGTON, TX— Bowling fans who missed the premiere of the 2008 U.S. Women's Open, a United States Bowling Congress event, last Sunday will have a second opportunity to catch the debut of the five-part series when it re-airs on ESPN2 on Monday, Sept. 15 at 3 p.m. EDT.

The four remaining U.S. Women's Open shows will air as planned at 2 p.m. EDT on each Sunday until Oct. 5 with one additional change to the schedule. The Sept. 21 show will air on ESPN2, while the Sept. 14, 28 and Oct. 5 shows will be shown on ESPN.

In addition to the announcement to re-air last Sunday's show, ESPN also has agreed to re-air all five U.S. Women's Open shows throughout October. A re-air schedule will be posted on bowl.com when it becomes available.

"It's great to see women's bowling back on TV, and each week brings another opportunity bring attention to the sport and the best women bowlers in the world," USBC Vice President of Media Pete Tredwell said. "We have worked closely with ESPN to develop a TV schedule that will bring maximum exposure to the event, and we're excited about being back in the limelight."

The U.S. Women's Open started with more than 180 competitors, who battled through 32 grueling games of qualifying Aug. 1-4 at Brunswick Zone XL in Romeoville, Ill., before the top 16 advanced to the single-elimination bracket that will be featured on ESPN.

The field of 16 of the most talented women bowlers in the world was divided into four sub-brackets, and on each of the first four telecasts, four players will face off for a spot in the finals.

The field includes Team USA members, former professional stars, international standouts, collegiate champions and top amateurs, and the event concludes with a climatic title match that makes bowling history.

LAKEWOOD—Tim Tran, one of our Most Faithful Members, was the best over the ABTA's 3 day Memorial Special at Super CAL Bowl as he finally won his First ABTA Title in fine style, downing top seeded Greg Velarde, in a tense, exciting title game that went to the final ball and a 188-186 score inc handicap for the win. Tim certainly did it the hard way, as he won 6 straight matches in the top 32 Single Elim Finals. He bested a great turnout of 649 entrants. He won by advancing through the eliminations to the to the big title game.

This event was held over four days, including Thurs (One Squad) Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, with a nice total of 649 entries coming to CAL to enjoy the fun and competition.

The scoring was contentious but fair (semi tough) and produced cut scores for each day listed in the Standings. Special thanks to Sal, Charlie and CAL for the fine tournament shot which was Most Fair to all (Each day) Great Job!!

136 bowlers took to the semis. Also added were our faithful Super Seniors / Semis being Mike Bousquet, Don

Jackson, Ely Cruz , and ladies Linda Larson and Dodie Sajonas. The fine field of 135 would enter the semis in hopes of making the top 32 Single Elims.

The Semis took to the lanes. We cut to the top 32, with nearly one in four earning a shot at the big bucks. After three games the cut to the top 32 went Men +52 and the ladies at +24.

Our finals field was set at 32 players, 25 men and 7 women. Benny Hurtado stepped up to take control as the top seed with his huge +157 which guaranteed him a free ride to the title match. Ping Romero was runner up at +135 which gave him a first round bye and be seeded into the second round of the Single elims.

In the round #1 of the single elim finals, each of the first-round losers pocketed checks for \$205 finishing in 18-32nd places.

Round #2 losers received checks of \$225 each finishing in 10-17th places and were Jerry Blackshire, Donovan Chung, Marvyn Galsim, John Wei, Greg Neuer, Romy Bautista, Beth Borci, and Kmel Cunanan.

Round #3 losers were Ely Cruz, Bart Sanchez, Marife

Catalasan, and Elvin Godoy. They ended in 6-9th places and \$300 each.

Round 5 had Tim Tran best Angel Chau in a good one 224-217. Anthony Cabading downed Glen Dantes 205-148. Angel and Glen were 4th and 5th and \$600 each with fine bowling, with Anthony and Tim to meet to bowl Velarde for the title. The excitement was building. Tim and Anthony (ABTA regulars) went at it but Tim won out easily as Anthony seemed to lose his shot which was superb. Tim advanced to the title game 211-154. Anthonly was 3rd with a great performance and \$1,250. Tim was now off to the title game!!

The stage was set for the title match and Tran would lead off with a resounding double. Greg then was clean but couldn't strike at all and after 7 frames Tran had one open as did Greg. But due to his double led by 19 pins.

Three frames to go Greg struck and then spared in the 9th. Tim marked the 9th so Greg up in the 10th needing a double and a miracle. He came up short and Mr. Tran won his first ABTA title, and a Sweet \$8,900.

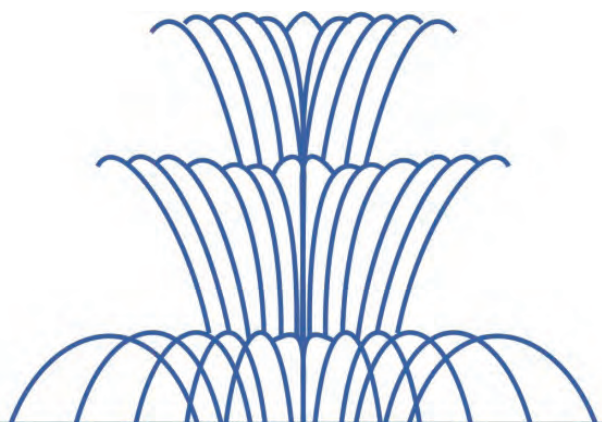

ONLY 8 MEN BOWLED IN THE DEAF TEAM USA TRYOUTS AT COLORADO SPRINGS

COLORADO SPRINGS—Despite many letters and emails, the USADSF Bowling Ad Hoc Chairman Ed Abakumoff sent out to high average deaf men and women, only 6 men and no women showed up at Harmony Bowl in Colorado Springs last June 13. This is sad that such a small number had the interest to tryout for the Deaf Team USA to represent USA at the 5009 summer Deaflympics in Taiwan.

Abakumoff said many factors had prevented most of the women and many men from attending but the 3 days tryout went on anyway. Because of the small number, only the top five will represent the men’s team USA. The 6th man and an alternate will be chosen from the resumes sent by the other bowlers. Similarly, 6 women and an alternate will be selected from the resumes sent in. Of the 8 present there, only two, 19 years old Rai Doblmeier, Conn. and Robert Ellison, San Diego were from the previous Deaf Team USA that participated in the 2005 Deaflympics in Australia. The others were Randy Perry, WA, Gene Takinen, AZ, Ronnie Zuchegno, MI, Ryan Kelly, John Qualls, KS and Johnny McLean, all of them are good and hardy bowlers except McLean who shown no experience for the many games the Deaflympics format required.

The scratch 40 games tryout format called for 6 games each in singles, doubles, trios and team, 16 games of match plays with 10 bonus points going to the winners and the top five with total pins

and bonus points will be the 5 men Team USA. Sorry that no games were given in the scores mentioned below.

In Day 1, Perry led singles with 1350 (225 ave) and Doblmeier beat Takinen by 1 pin and Perry by 6 with 1262 in doubles. In Day 2, Doblmeier again led Trios with tournament high 1442 (240 ave) and Perry led team event with 1263. Then in Day 3 morning first 8 games match plays, Perry led with 1834 (229 ave) and in the afternoon 8 games match plays Doblmeier and Perry were still fresh while all others were tiring as Doblmeier led with 1850 (231 ave).

The overall leader was Doblmeier with 8886 total pins (222 ave) plus 115 points for 9001. The other four who made the team were Perry who was close behind with 8843 (221 ave) plus 115 points/8958, followed by Ellison with 8329 (211 ave) plus 120 pts/8449, Takinen 8099 (204 ave) plus 80 pts/ 8179 and Zuchegno 8040 (201 ave) plus 60 pts/8100.

The other two, Kelly (7435) and Qualls (7418) will have to get more experience for the next try out for the 2013 Deaflympics. The sad thing was McLean who was battling with Zuchegno for the 5th spot until in the morning first 6 games of match plays his thumb worn out and could not continue. The chairman Abakumoff had to take his place with a house ball to pace the rest of the matches to give competition.

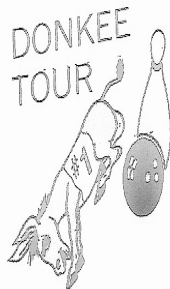

Julian would continue to bowl well from the qualifying round, as he became the first place finisher with his 230 to 210 win.

Kiana continued to bowl well with a 222 to 200 win as she advanced to the semi-final match against second seed Javier Zavala. In the end, Javier picked up enough pins to win 206 to 204 to go against top seed Kevin Robeniol in the championship match. Javier used the momentum from his nail-biting win to help him finish in first place with a 225-213 win.

In the first match, fifth seed Chris Eguilos faced fourth seed Jennifer Hefner. This match started off back and forth, yet Jennifer pulled away to win the match 247 to 211 and face third seed Mike Foley in the second match. Jennifer managed to get enough marks to advance to the semi-final match with a 219 to 198 win. Jennifer faced second seed Shaun Morad in the next match with Shaun finding his line en route to a 230 to 212 win and telling top seed Andrew Arellano to bring it on in the championship match. Andrew started off red hot in the match, and, despite a late game comeback from Shaun, held on to win 245 to 240 to finish in first place.

The 2007-2008 year was a very successful year for the Cerritos Youth Bowling Program thanks to all the bowlers and parents that participated throughout the year and made the youth program what it is today. Tom Ferry continues to do an exceptional job as coach and as the director of the youth program. As a youth bowler myself, the group of people, youth bowlers and parents alike, that I have met and gotten to know are, in the words of some of my friends, "just simply awesome" and as a group "own all ftw gg lol." For those of you that did not get that last sentence, do not worry about it. All that should be known is that the bowlers, with their talent and dedication, as well as the parents, with their commitment and their appreciated help with our yearly events, continue to make the Cerritos Youth Bowling Program what it is now and what it will grow into in the future.

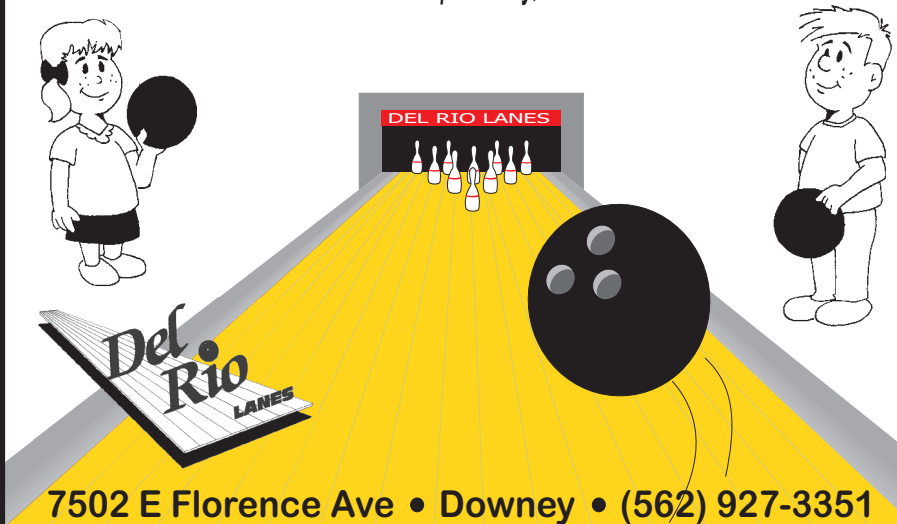
