the first foreign player in more than two decades to win the United States Bowling Congress Queens presented by Storm as she defeated USBC Hall of Famer Leanne Hulsenberg of North Ogden, Utah, 190-160, at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center on Thursday night.

The 22-year-old righthander was the first No. 1 seed since 2009 to secure the title, and she did so in her first USBC Queens appearance. Hall of famer Carol Gianotti of Australia was the last foreign player to claim the coveted crown, doing so in 1989, two years before Zavjalova was

"There are just so many feelings right now, but excitement is at the top of the list," said Zavjalova, who earned \$20,000 and the traditional Queens tiara. "This is the first time I have bowled in this event, I was the leader and I was able to beat a hall of famer. I'm living my dream. I just can't believe it.

Zavjalova has been successful under the television lights before, helping Webber



International to the women's title at the 2012 USBC Intercollegiate Team Championships, but the experience is much different when you're out there alone

Despite being nervous, Zavjalova felt confident with her first few shots, though the 10 pin didn't agree. After missing one in the second frame, she was able to refocus, and the pins started to cooperate.

"I was mad on the inside, but I knew I had to let it go," said Zavjalova, who struck in the sixth, seventh and eighth frames to put the game out of reach. "I started fresh after the open, and even though I left another 10 pin, I made it and kept trying to throw good shots.

Hulsenberg, who has made more than 100 television appearances in her career, threw 15 strikes in her first two matches but was plagued with poor carry in the finale. The 1999 Queens champion missed two single-pin spares late in the game to ultimately cost her a chance at becoming the ninth bowler in history with two Queens victories. She took home \$10,000 for the runner-up finish Thursday.

In the semifinal, Hulsenberg struck eight times as she defeated Shayna Ng of Singapore, 249-172. Ng, who was never lower than second in the standings all week, left splits in the fourth and fifth frames and wasn't able to recover.

Hulsenberg started her first game on TV since winning the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas, with a missed 7 pin before getting comfortable. She then rattled off a string of five strikes to build a 30-pin lead over Jennifer Higgins of Westerville, Ohio, and advanced to the semifinal with a 235-184 win.

In the evening's opening match, Higgins trailed after six frames but made a late charge with three consecutive strikes and cruised past USBC Hall of Famer and two-time Oueens champion Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 205-173.

The Queens is open to any female USBC member, and with this year's event coming just after the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Championships, the field included 202 players representing 15 countries.

Other international Queens winners include Kazue Inahashi of Tokyo in 1984 and Katsuko Sugimoto, also from Tokyo, in 1981 and 1982.

Chris Barnes Wins PBA Southwest Regional Players Invitational Title

Veteran PBA Tour champion tops Mike Edwards to win World Series entry, RPI Finals berth SHAWNEE, OK. - Chris In the title match, Barnes

Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, rallied from a 45-pin deficit after three games, throwing the final nine strikes to defeat Mike Edwards of Tulsa, Okla., 245-203, Sunday to win the Professional Bowlers Association Southwest Region's Regional Players Invitational title at FireLake Bowling Center.

Barnes, a 43-year-old 16time PBA Tour title winner, earned \$6,000, a paid entry into the PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in late October and a berth in a new PBA RPI Finals which will be televised on ESPN. The regional title was Barnes' 25th including two previous titles during the 2012-13 season. After qualifying 10th for the single-elimination match play finals, Barnes eliminated George Brooks, Loveland, Colo., 3-0, in the Round of 16; fellow PBA Tour champion Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 3-2, in the Round of 12; Chris Hibbitts of Fort Worth. Texas, 3-1, in the Round of 8, and Blake Starr of Oklahoma City, 223-186, in the semifinal round.

failed to convert splits in the first and third frames while Edwards jumped into the early lead behind a string of three strikes. Barnes then switched to a ball he had used successfully a little earlier while Edwards was unable to put backto-back strikes together during the rest of the match. One chopped spare attempt gave Barnes the margin he needed for the win.

The PBA Southwest RPI was covered live. from start to finish, on PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame. The title match can be watched on YouTube.com. "I survived," Barnes said. "With a couple of games left against (Malott), I figured out how to play outside. I missed practice session because I was in Las Vegas watching my wife (Lynda) bowl in the USBC Queens finals. I started the tournament playing inside and I struggled. "In my match against Wes, I got to the point where I didn't think I could strike any more playing where I was, so I moved to the right to try to find something and I was able

to throw some strikes. "Never was eligible to bowl for the Southwest Region title that will be taped for delayed airing on ESPN as part of the World Series of Bowling V at South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center, Oct. 26-Nov. 3. Tom Daugherty of Wesley Chapel, Fla., won the South Region title in early August, and Dave Beres of Waukesha, Wis., won the Midwest RPI title over Labor Day weekend.

Each RPI is open to 48 players who have qualified through a season-long points competition in their respective regions, and each RPI is being covered live from start to finish on PBA's exclusive bowling channel. Xtra Frame. Visit pba.com for Xtra Frame subscription information. The next RPI will be the PBA Central RPI at Thunderbowl Lanes, Allen Park, Mich., Sept. 13-15. 



LAURA LEE DANIEL Leads Citrus Belt Women at USBC Queens

HENDERSON — Laura Lee Daniel traveled from Corona to Henderson last week to compete against the best women in the world. Her goal - win this years USBC Queens tiara.

Laura Lee finished the first day of qualifying in seventyfirst place with a 201 average for five games. Day two saw Daniel average a whopping 228 with games of 268 and 266. After two days her overall average was 211, good for nineteenth place.

Remember, this scoring was registered on the difficult Queens oil pattern with balls (Roto Grip Defiant and DV8 Diva) drilled for her home oil patterns.

Also, Daniel did not have the aid of a manufacturers rep coaching her or the luxury of specially drilled balls gratis a la Brunswick, Columbia, Storm etc.

On Day three Laura Lee fired a 267 game on her way to a 203 average for the block and a three day composite of 211. After three days of qualifying

(15 games) Daniel stood tall in thirty-second place. The field was cut to the top 64 for match play. Two hundred and one women left the starting gate on Sunday and as the sun set on Tuesday there were three score and four ladies left.

Match play saw Laura Lee face four experienced professionals: Aumi Guerra (Dominican Republic), Jordeen Koizumi (Arizona), Bernice Lim (Singapore), and Sandra Anderson (Sweden), winning two matches. The tournament was a double elimination affair with Daniel's 2 - 2 record resulting in her tying for 24th



John La Spina's heart always will remain in Brooklyn, though the physical structure that molded his life, his beloved Maple Lanes, will be gone.

It was a wonderful day back in 1960 when an enthusiastic 11-year-old La Spina was honored at the grand opening of the center as the person to roll the first ball, a ball he helped keep rolling for more than 50 years.

La Spina grew in body and knowledge from those preteen days because he loved and still loves the game, his perfect game, from every angle. He wasn't just a young man who loved to bowl, he was a youngster who was involved in the every day chores that must be done, checking house balls to insure they were properly distributed, help clean up, pitching in if the snack bar was busy, noting the desk operation, and listening and watching and learnng from his dad, Peter, and the devoted employees.

Peter, his father, was a builder of buildings and the father and builder of Maple when some of the greatest names in the sport and other interested parties, convinced him that bowling might be a way to go. Among his mentors were Carter Burgess, who led AMF to major success and later became a praised U.S. Ambassador.

"My father always was a businessman first, evaluating the plus and minus factors of his building and other projects," said the younger La Spina. "After his death our family all tried to follow his standards. Maple Lanes is one of the few open spaces in mid Brooklyn. When it changes hands, a needed, huge condo complex will tower over the area."

The decision has been one of the most difficult in the life of La Spina, who has made many. Maple Lanes is still in business and La Spina also controls Farmingdale Lanes, Coram Country Lanes, JIB Lanes and RVC Lanes, all in New York.

Through the years he has owned, operated and bought and sold numerous bowling centers.

La Spina has been a national bowling figure for some four decades, always bringing a fresh look and a forever optimism to all his positions. He has been close in every part of bowling from the kids to the pros and a willing and able member and top officer of many bowling organizations, including the presidency of local, state and national bowling proprietor organizations, a stalwart in representing bowling in civic and charitable endeavors, and working with other sports.

"My deep interest, in addition to the bowling business, has been in the real estate aspect of bowling ventures," said La Spina.

But he has never been far from the whole world of life, always bringing employees or bowling associates to major events such as Bowl Expo or finance a trip for a high school bowler to attend a top pro competition.

He has helped obtain and been the personal guide of guest speakers at Bowl Expo and that list included past presidents, high ranking politicians, business personalities, show buisiness grreats and even astronauts.

"I have never failed to realize that so many decisions I have made in regard to bowling centers involves individuals who have spent their entire working lives with our centers, and that means their families also have an attachment. And in places such as Maple, many customers consider their bowling center their home away from home. I offer them my solace, thanks and appreciation for life's fond memories," said La Spina.

Bowling has deeply involved John, his father, brother, son and all their families. Maple Lanes will go as a traditional landmark in Brooklyn, much as baseball's revered Ebbets Field.

In the final analysis, La Spina felt that the business part of the decision, and the future of his family and many emplyees, would benefit in the long run.

La Spina has been one of the most astute figures in bowling for a long time and if there ever was a posiiton such as commissioner of all bowling, he would fill the bill.

One thing for sure, whenever Maple Lanes is mentioned, his heart will beat a bit faster.



Where Have All The **Delegates Gone...**

ONTARIO — I was sitting in the hotel bar chatting with old friends and making new ones at the Double Tree Hotel in Ontario at the California USBC Convention weekend. There was much discussion about the low delegate count this year and why it continues to diminish. By the way, this year there were 117 delegates registered to vote, including the Youth! As we surmised why their are fewer delegates than ever, a couple of folks stated that their Association does not send their full compliment of delegates. They told me that although they are entitled to send the maximum number of delegates, 6, their respective Boards vote to send only 3. Looking perplexed, I asked why they would do this? Is it because of a lack of interest by their Board members, or was there some other reason? I suggested that if there is a lack of interest by their Board Members then perhaps they should look to any certified league member as a potential delegate. This would broaden their field of potential participants. However, if there are other Board Members who have an interest in serving as delegates, they should be given the opportunity. Apparently, this is not the case at all. They do have Board Members who want to go but deny them the privilege of attending. They said because they give their delegates a stipend to defray the costs of attending convention, their Board does not want to spend a lot of money to send 6 delegates. After my mouth dropped open with disbelief, I asked why their Board would deliberately take away votes from their membership? Perhaps their Board should vote for a designated amount of money to give their full compliment of delegates and then spread the money amongst those who wish to attend convention. How about conducting a bake sale or some other type of fundraiser to earn money for their delegates? This was the first time I ever heard that a local Board of Directors voluntarily reduced their number of delegates to fit a budget. I did not realize a Board of Directors has this power.

As a local Association President, I feel a responsibility to our members and that our Board owes them the best representation possible. Come on folks, please take a step back and reconsider what you are doing. Don't be so quick to reduce your right to vote at our State Convention.

Our Association stopped paying our delegates years ago due to budget cuts, just like everyone else, yet we are able to find committed individuals who want to serve our members and we send our full compliment of delegates.

There are plenty of changes coming from USBC that will affect our bowlers and what is left of our local Associations. I beg of you, please do not forfeit your right to have a say. I encourage you to actively participate in your State Convention.

Six-time Professional Bowlers Association Tour Champion Les Schissler Dies at 83

SEATTLE — Six-time Professional Bowlers Association Tour champion Les Schissler of Brighton, Colo., died Saturday at the age of 83.

Schissler won the 1967 All-Star Tournament (now the U.S. Open) for his only major title. He experienced a resurgence in his pro career in 1983 when he finished fourth in the United States Bowling Congress (then American Bowling Congress) Masters at the age of 53. Badger, Wolf, Bear "Animal Patterns"

MILWAUKEE – The Professional Bowlers Association has unveiled three distinct new lane conditioning patterns.

The new lane conditioning patterns, named the Badger, Wolf and Bear, are a continuation of the animal pattern theme the PBA introduced in 2005 to not only test the versatility of the players and demonstrate the variety of scoring challenges PBA players face, but to give PBA members, grass-roots league bowlers and fans an easier way to identify specific types of conditions.

The Badger will be the longest animal pattern ever (52 feet). Conversely, the Wolf will be the shortest animal pattern ever (32 feet). The Bear will be a flat pattern of medium length (40 feet), similar to what has been used at the U.S. Open in recent years and characterized as the most difficult test in professional bowling.

The way lane oil is applied (in shape and volume) to the 60-foot playing surface of a lane is a strong factor in the scoring pace of a professional bowling tournament, testing the skills necessary for success and the strategic approach the players must take.

"We listened to players and fans looking for more diversity in our lane maintenance program and have developed patterns that will give everyone fresh looks," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "These new animal patterns have dramatically different, uniquely challenging characteristics."

The original animal pattern system, featuring the Chameleon, Cheetah, Scorpion, Shark and Viper patterns, eventually became the foundation for the PBA Experience League program which allows grassroots United States Bowling Congress league bowlers across America a chance to bowl on the same lane conditions PBA players compete on in national and regional tournaments. The original animal patterns will be used again at this fall's PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas.

All eight animal patterns, in addition to PBA major tournament patterns, will be used and available for future PBA national, PBA50 and PBA regional tournaments plus PBA Experience league play. All of the new patterns are USBC Sport Bowling-compliant, which generally means flatter ratios of oil across the lane and demanding more precision by players than on more typical "house" conditions found in bowling.

"The best players in the world will develop fresh strategies to attack the lanes and fans will be entertained by the results," Clark said.

A complete description of the new animal patterns, along with graphs illustrating how oil is applied for each pattern for PBA members, will be available on pba.com under the "resources" tab. Along with the new patterns, the PBA has created a new series of animal pattern logos which will be used in conjunction with each pattern.
