Troup Upsets Belmonte to Win PBA-WBT Storm Lucky Larsen Masters Title

Two-handed players finish one-two-three in Sweden; U.S. star Bill O'Neill rounds out top four

MALMO, Sweden -Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., threw strikes on seven of his first eight shots on his way to upsetting top qualifier and defending champion Jason Belmonte of Australia, 248-232, in the title match of the PBA International-World Bowling Tour Storm Lucky Larsen Masters at Baltiska Bowlinghallen Sunday.

Troup, a 27-year-old 10th-year PBA member, earned his third PBA Tour title along with a \$16,500 first prize, completing a sweep of the top three positions by two-handed players. Belmonte, who led qualifying as well as the "Step Three" round leading into the stepladder finals, saw his hopes for a title repeat when he failed to convert the 2-10 split in the fourth frame and left the 2-8 in the ninth frame after rallying behind a string of four strikes.

The colorful Troup, dressed in matching jersey and slacks in Sweden's blue-and-yellow national colors, also bowled without his trademark "afro" hairdo in denying Belmonte his third title of the 2018 sea-

"This is my first trip to Sweden," Troup said. "I couldn't ask for a better result."

In the first stepladder match. Ireland's Christopher Sloan opened in the seventh frame of a close match, but recovered by throwing six strikes to close out the contest and eliminate nine-time PBA Tour champion Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., 236-234.

Troup advanced to the title match with a 235-187 win over Sloan, a 24-yearold third-year PBA member from Dublin, who was unable to sustain his firstgame momentum. Sloan threw one strike and had an

open in his first six frames while Troup started with four strikes. A pocket 7-10 in the sixth frame slowed Troup, but he came right back with another three strikes to roll to an easy

The Malmo tournament - named in honor of Swedish PBA star Martin Larsen - was a World Bowling Tour points event. The tournament format involved multiple six-game qualifying squads to arrive at 60

finalists. Qualifiers 34-60 bowled the four-game Step One, with the top 11 advancing to Step Two along with qualifiers 9-33. The 36 players in Step Two bowled another four-game block, with the top 16 joining qualifiers 1-8 in Step Three for an eight-game round to determine the four stepladder finalists. In each "Step" round, pinfall from all previous rounds was dropped. Under tournament rules,

women bowling in the event were entitled to eight handicap pins per game.

The final PBA International-WBT event on the 2018 schedule is the WBT Thailand which will take place in Bangkok Sept. 22-28. Thailand's Jojoe Yannaphon is defending champion. Fans can follow the event on the Asian Bowling Federation website (http:// www.abf-online.org/results/ttbawbt18.htm).



The 62nd Best Bowler of the 20th Century Revolutionized The Game

A recent article by J.R. Schmidt in the National Bowlers Journal focused on Connie Schwoegler (that's pronounced "Schwagler," not "Schwogler"), voted the 62nd of the best all-time 20th century bowlers.

Never heard of Connie? For those of you that have not heard of Schwoegler, he is most famously known to have popularized the three-hole fingertip grip in the 1940's as a result of his osteoarthritis from the traditional two-hole conventional grip of that era (thumb and one finger).

My relationship with the legend of Schwoegler first began in 1968, when a man by the name of Primo Liberatore purchased the local bowling center in my hometown of Sebastopol, California. After years of managing John Swanson's Westlake Bowl in Daly City, California, Primo and his nephew Mel Del Gallo decided to take a chance and purchase the thriving L & L Lanes.

Primo, a single parent with two young girls named Sandi and Rene, took our group of rag tag bowling groupies under his wing and treated us all like his own boys. Because I lived just a few hundred yards from the bowling center on a hill above the lanes and overlooking the Santa Rosa Valley, I became the favorite fair haired boy by reason of geography.

Liberatore's ability to relate stories of his life experiences were monumental. I could literally spend hours listening to his amazing tales while cleaning tables, answering trouble calls and looking after the control desk while he ran to the bar to serve customers.

One of his favorite topics centered around Connie Schwoegler, when the two were together for a brief time in Chicago. Primo, a native of Chicago, was a fair bowler at the time, but Schwoegler was kegler royalty, with a couple of All-Star titles.

Before the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) was formed, the All-Star was *the tournament* in the game of bowling, and Primo said that Connie attributed the fingertip, or Schwoegler grip, to his success.

Needless to say, within a few weeks I had changed from a conventional to a relaxed fingertip grip. My average shot up from the mid-170's to over 200, using an Ebonite rubber bowling ball. While this was not the only prophetic event that led me to a career in bowling, it was certainly among one of the first.

J.R. Schmidt goes on to catalogue Connie's success in bowling, including many of his endorsements with major products like Hamm's Beer, Camel Cigarettes and Gillette Super Speed Razors. He's also the only professional bowler to ever appear on the cover of Time Magazine, according to Schmidt.

My association with the name Schwoegler would come full circle years later, while working for AMF in New York. Along with my marketing duties, I was also often called upon to investigate possible bowling centers for acquisition into the AMF Bowling Centers chain.

Because of my unique background in the bowling center business, a quality lacking among most of the married AMF executives; I was the only one that could hop on a plane and go to a particular city and just camp out for a week, primarily investigating and confirming the league schedule provided by the owners of the potential acquisition.

One of those trips brought me to Madison, Wisconsin, where I was to investigate the possible acquisition of Badger Bowl and Village Lanes. Before I was about to leave on my trip, Bruce Gobbi, my boss at AMF, added another location to my list of possible acquisitions... Schwoegler's Park Towne Lanes!

Bruce said not to spend a lot of time at Schwoegler's, because they were probably just using this as an opportunity to see what their business was worth. But the opportunity to meet Connie Schwoegler was certainly a priority for me!

When I called Schwoegler's to set up an appointment, I learned that Connie had passed away in 1982, but that I would be meeting with Bill and Dan Schwoegler. I remember being so impressed with their league schedule flyer, a

trifold information piece on a heavy paper stock, that I used variations of this model for years among many of the AMF Bowling Centers.

When I was tossing around ideas for this article, I gave Bill Schwoegler a call to get some information and perhaps a unique picture that I could include with the story. Bill, an alert 84 years young, told me that the family had sold the business in 2012. But in spite of the fact that he was no longer involved, he was quite concerned the day that I called because the bowling center had flooded and there was major damage.

I could understand his concern and related my experiences with other owners that just could not let their business go after spending the major part of their life among the hallowed halls of their "bowling center baby." A handful of the bowling centers that AMF purchased over the years even had clauses where the former owner could keep their office, with a private outside entrance constructed

We reminisced for a time and swapped our favorite Dick Weber stories. Before closing I apologized for saying "Schwogler," instead of "Schwagler." He was amused by my admission and gave me a quick German language lesson involving umlauts.

You never know what might become of a chance meeting in your life. If it wasn't for Connie Schwoegler befriending Primo Liberatore during their time together in Chicago, and then Primo relating the success of the Schwoegler grip to me, I might never have embarked on a career in bowling that has now spanned close to 60 years.







1985 - PART 4

by Carol Mancini Were you around Southern California in 1985? Bowling? How's your memory? Let's get going - - - -?

- What was in your arsenal? The Golden Angle? The Gray Angle? Hammer? Cobra? Scorpion? Eagle?
- The Sunbelt Bowlers Tour paid out over \$3,000.00 in prize money week after week.
 They had a 189 average maximum and scheduled as many squads as possible every week-end. Ronnie Soliman and Dave March were directors.
- TOWN SQUARE LANES celebrated 30 years in business. Every 30th bowler got to bowl free.
- MITZI ANDERSON "invented" STRIKE BINGO, and PICK SIX. Fun Games.
- Repeat Repeat Still trying to get bowling into the OLYMPICS! At least an exhibition sport
- Hey LARRY GRAY! Remember when the writers had dubbed you "Lawrence from Torrance"? You won the P.C.B. in Pomona beating out ROY KARNOWSKI and WALT BLOCK. Those Seniors at CAL BOWL don't know who they are messing with!
- Master Industries of Irvine (producer of the DICK WEBER WRIST MASTER) produced a high performance ball with a thick urethane shell.
- RICK FITE won an AMF (all centers) tourney. From Hemet, he could pack his luggage (a prize) and head for Sydney, Australia. He beat out 18,000 entrants. And his book average was only 144!!
- Amusing story about ROSS NELSON, bowling at SANTA MONICA BOWL in the early 60's. ROSS had 11 beautiful strikes in the first 11 frames. The bowl got deadly quiet, a crowd gathered, ROSS picked up his ball and staggered toward the foul line. His ball rode the one board all the way to the 10 pin. 291!!! A record score. (I thought this was worth repeating.)
- Lake Elsinore got lanes! BROOKSTONE LANES in fact. Only 10 lanes, but they were welcome.
- KYLE SHEDD opened his pro shop. "The Bowling Shedd" in Downey. His first shop was in Denver.
- The first six issues starting Sept. 1 had pictures of BAR TULANIAN accepting checks.
 What a true gentleman on the lanes (but he knew how to score!) After retiring he moved to Las Vegas. He was soooo smooooth.
- In 1967 there were 70 centers in the L.A.B.A. area. In 1985, only 35 were left. Bowlers complained - "I would rather bowl in the parking lot than on the lanes." They were spoiled by the new balls and didn't work at their game. NEVER HAPPY!
- Believe this or not according to the "experts" bowling was played as early as 5,200 B.C.
- GRANADA LANES Midnight to 3 A.M. special. SUPER ROCK N' BOWL. For \$5.00 you got games, music and door prizes like balls, bags and shoes. No booze and no food. The ad did not give an age limit. Could we do this in 2018 ???
- PBA recommended outlawing urethane balls! Urethane was considered "exotic" and should not be allowed on THE TOUR. If allowed, the ball makers could generate millions of dollars.
- LITTLE TOKYO BOWL was hiring like crazy; Mechanics, waitresses, porters, cooks, managers, etc. They had big plans! Opening planned for October 26.
- BILL TAYLOR'S theory of "short oil" saving the sport of bowling was coming true. Nonbelievers were even agreeing with him. He hoped that non-believers would drown in public humiliation!! The biggest "war of words" that filled the pages of bowling publications was between Bill Taylor and well known writers (not necessarily bowlers.)
- ALBERTA CROWE, President of W.I.B.C. for 21 years died of leukemia. Her words still
 ring in my thoughts "No Demonstrations Please." She was small but she was mighty!!!
- NAT ROSENFELD suffered a heart attack and his pacemaker was working!! So he
 got a new one. It didn't save him. He was the heart of Junior bowling and CANOGA
 PARK BOWL!


- The Lottery came. Tickets, scratchers, etc. Millions of bowling dollars gambled on "Hitting the Big One". California hasn't been the same since Indian casinos and the lottery.
- FRANK BABORE was officially the No-Tap KING of So. Calif. Sometimes he even "talked" his way to the cashing window. He was not the most likeable and his back-up ball from the left side was disgusting!
- ALEX CHEESMAN JR. A HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR ROLLED A 300 At PIONEER BOWL. He received \$1,300.00 and his first ring.
- Fire destroyed 14 lane BURBANK BOWL. It was built in the early 1940's.
- Fun Fact. From 1895 to 1984, 65,984 300 games were sanctioned. 10,000 800+ series.
- The first greeting card with a bowling theme was just donated to the Museum in St. Louis. The card was donated 1903. Bowling has had a humorous touch for many a year!
- JUDY LEE was elected to CWBA Hall of Fame. Very deserving!
- NELSON BURTON JR. (Pro Bowler and color commentator for ABC Sports) was suspended for 6 months by the PBA for a locker-room incident with Greg Shields.
- Murrey Pathfinder Lanes (lanes made of metal) were being installed from Montana to Lake Elsinore and points east. Production could hardly keep up. GORDON MURREY was burning up the airways and running out of ink just signing contracts. Pathfinders WERE a really big deal!
- GLENN ALLISON, DON CARTER and CARMEN SALVINO bowled in a benefit "Strikes for Tykes" in Brookfield, Conn. (makes you wonder how many benefits Glenn made an appearance) his answer was "hundreds" when I asked him recently.
- The 1985 33rd Grant Classic (after 20 weeks) ended in a tie! KEN MCCLOUGH and Pat Danforth shared the \$15,000 top prize. Other familiar faces at the cashing window BRUCE HARNER, JOE STATON, EUGENE CHEESMAN, SANTANA BROWN, ROB-IN ROMEO, MARY SMITH, BILL BATESOLE, ERIC FORKEL, BILL NEELEY, DOUG JOHNSON, AL CHADOR, RON WINGER, LARRY STEPHENS, PETE DUMPIT AND 97 MORE! TOTAL PAYOUT? \$50,000.00.
- 66 southland centers ran qualifyng squads of the "Lite Beer" National Doubles. That was bigger than the WIBC in 1985!
- Lloyd Stone and Marlene Fondred were cracking the whip at FRIENDLY HILLS. Great people! The beauty shop inside the lanes was a busy place.
- Another name I like PIWAT SUPHICHAI. He rolled a 290 game at BRUNSWICK BOWLERLAND.
- Shooting stars with their names on them—VIDAD, SARZEC, HOOLMQUIST, ROMEO, BRADFORD, ADAMEK, MYERS, MONSON, MIVELAZ AND MIVELAZ. They showed weekly on the pages of the Bowling News.
- The DonKee Tour was a hit. Who could resist a picture with EDNA HOLLAND OR BERT STRAIN? Their smiles would melt a snowman! p.s. BERT STRAIN is doing well in her new Senior Living abode in San Dimas.
- RON WINGER won 100,000 Blue Chip Stamps at SPORTS CENTER for his 799 series.
 That's how many books?
- P.J. "Pat" Carroll, a Whittier contractor had 8 pros in his 1986 'stable that he sponsored on the PBA Tour; JIM TILTON, WARREN NELSTON, BOBBY KNIPPLE, BUTCH SOPER, JOE SALVEMINI, SAM FLANAGAN, GIP LEPTINE AND TROY KENDRICK. He was also sponsoring leagues, tournament teams and "almost anyone who had their hand out"!
- The 24 ACTIVE WEST centers stayed open on Christmas. The Pro Shops were open for drilling those new balls. Dad and the kids went bowling while mom cooked dinner.
- Who was the "self-proclaimed #1 girl watcher."? BILL BEST.

Out with 1985, on to 1986 finding new faces, bigger scores and radical changes. Come On Along-----
