Seventh Time's A Charm For Sargent

PBA Mourns Loss of Chris Schenkel

SEATTLE-Chris Schenkel, long time PBA play-by-play announcer, died early Sunday at Lutheran Hospital in Fort Wayne, Ind. He was 82.

Schenkel's wife, Fran, and the couple's two sons were at her husband's side when he passed away at Lutheran Hospital, where he had been hospitalized for two weeks after undergoing surgery for a bleeding ulcer.

Schenkel was the PBA's play-by-play announcer for 36 vears on the popular "Pro Bowlers Tour" on ABC. He was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1976 under the Meritorious Service category, going in as a member of the PBA's second class of Hall of Famers. The PBA renamed its Player of the Year award the Chris Schenkel Player of the Year award beginning in 1999.

Schenkel's radio and television broadcasting career spanned more than 60 years and included virtually every major sports competition.

Known for his honey-smooth baritone voice, he was the first to cover the Masters Tournament on television, in 1956; the first to call a college football game coast to coast on ABC; and the first to serve as live sports anchor from the Olympics, in Mexico City in 1968.

Other highlights include calling gymnast Nadia Comaneci's perfect 10 at the 1976 Olympics in Montreal, and calling the 1958 NFL Championship game between the Baltimore Colts and New York Giants, considered by many the greatest football game ever played.

Schenkel also had a long association with the Indianapolis 500, including a scary moment. Schenkel, astronaut John Glenn and Tony Hulman, the late owner of Indianapolis Motor Speedway, were passengers in the Dodge Challenger pace car at the 1971 race when it skidded into a bleacher section full of photographers. Twenty-two people were injured, including Schenkel. Schenkel was born Aug. 21, 1923, on a farm in Wabash County, one of six children. His parents, second generation German immigrants, managed a grain and feed business.



and later Purdue University.

He fought in World War II in the Philippines, then Korea, as an infantry platoon leader. He came home to find a radio job in Richmond, Ind., then moved into television in Providence, R.I.

In 1947, he assumed television play-by-play duties for Harvard University football. Five years later, he began a 13year run as the TV voice of the New York Giants.

His many honors include honorary doctorate degrees from Purdue, Ball State and Rose-Hulman Institute. He has been inducted into 16 halls of fame, including the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters and College and Pro Football halls, and he won an Emmy Award for Lifetime Achievement in 1993.

Recently 50 letters were sent to President Bush nominating Schenkel for the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Among those sending letters were Indiana senator Richard Lugar, former Indiana senator Birch Bavh. New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner, Kansas City Chiefs owner Lamar Hunt, former Indiana University basketball coach Bob Knight and golfing legend Byron Nelson. Last summer longtime broadcasting partner Jim McKay said, "Chris is one of the friendliest, nicest people you would meet anywhere. He likes people. He loves people. He's very forgiving about people even if anything happens in a bad way.' Schenkel is survived by his wife, Fran, sons Ted and John, daughter Tina, and several grandchildren.



PBA Reacts to Passing of Chris Schenkel

PBA President and CEO Fred Schreyer

"The entire PBA family is deeply saddened by the passing of Chris Schenkel. He was an accomplished professional and was the face of the PBA Tour on ABC for so many years. He was a wonderful ambassador for the sport of bowling, but more importantly, he was a genuinely good person who treated everyone with kindness and decency. He will be missed."

Carmen Salvino

"Chris came to the PBA as one of the premier announcers and he gave the PBA a lot of credibility at that time. He had a golden voice. Not only was he a great announcer, but I have had dinner with him several times and he was a good human being. He never flaunted his position.

"He's right at the top as far as PBA legends go because he gave us credibility. We were a new sport on TV and when he came in he brought in a big following. Once people saw the show they loved it, but he brought a lot of people in to begin with. He has to be right at the top as a contributor to our sport.

"I know he loved the PBA. Of all the sports he covered, he always found time to go out with us guys. It always amazed me because he was a big name in sports, but he always wanted to hang out with the bowlers. If he came to Chicago he'd call me. We'd have dinner or go downtown and see a show. He loved hanging around the PBA guys. He was one of us and was like a brother to us. He wasn't just an announcer."

"It's been a tough year. First Dick (Weber) dies, my good friend and then I lost a younger brother to cancer two months after that. It hits home and makes you start thinking differently. Before Dick passed, I never even thought of death. I thought we'd go on forever. Then my brother dies and I realize that nobody's infallible. When you're an athlete for some reason you think you're indestructible. At some point you realize you're just like every other human being."

Walter Ray Williams Jr.

"He was definitely a big name in sports and broadcasting. He had such a great voice and was a very personable guy. He was so easy to like and just a very nice gentleman. I really enjoyed meeting him and getting to know him. I wish his wife and family the best.

"It was kind of tough at the end of the last ABC broadcast. Chris and Bo (Burton) were in tears when they were saying goodbye. It was a pretty emotional moment.

"(Chris) was the broadcaster when bowling was at its biggest, in the '60s '70s and '80s, especially in the '70s. It was Burton and Schenkel. He was definitely a big part of bowling on TV. I think he added a lot of credibility to it and seemed to enjoy doing the telecast. We had one or two broadcasters over the years who didn't seem to care but Chris really seemed to enjoy the competition and the players."

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ABOUT CHRIS SCHENKEL From the St. Louis Dispatch:

"His finale for ABC came from suburban St. Louis on June 21, 1987, when he had an emotional send-off while broadcasting the St. Clair Classic bowling tourney in Fairview Heights. Fans gave Schenkel two raucous standing ovations at St. Clair Bowl and he broke down several times.

'This maybe is the all-time thrill of my career,' Schenkel said after the telecast. 'The crowd was just tremendous. It meant every-thing to me. I'll always treasure the memory.'

He'll probably be best remembered as the voice of the PBA Tour for its entire 36-year run on ABC.

'Bowling has been the constant friend,' he said in summarizing his career."

"'He was a very, very sincere, loving man who loved what he did,' said wife Fran Schenkel, noting that they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in January.

George Bodenheimer, the president of ESPN, Inc. and ABC Sports, called Schenkel a pioneering sportscaster and a 'true gentleman.'

'Everyone at ABC and ESPN mourns the loss of a great friend and colleague. Chris was a pioneer in sports television and was the pre-eminent play-by-play announcer to a generation of sports fans,' Bodenheimer said in a statement. 'More importantly, he was a true gentleman, beloved by all. He treated everyone with respect and friendship.''

Weber Looks Ahead

SEATTLE-The 2004-05 PBA Tour season was a tough one for Pete Weber, one of the Tour's most colorful champions who always garners national media attention.

He was hurting in so many ways and no amount of rest or therapy was going to make things right.

On Feb. 14, he lost his father — the legendary Dick Weber — and four days later Pete injured his shoulder while "playing around with my step-son."

The net result was one of his worst seasons — mentally, physically and spiritually since earning only \$25 in his lone tour start in 1979.

Pete Weber, who includes seven majors among his 31 Tour titles, failed to make a television appearance last season for the first time since 1995.

"My physical condition was not good because of my shoulder injury and I probably shouldn't have bowled in Indianapolis or Grand Rapids," Pete recalled. "That delayed my healing time, worsened my condition...I learned healing takes a little longer these days.

Emotionally I was devastated because Dad's death was totally unexpected."

Little wonder Pete managed to earn just \$43,350 while bowling in only 15 of 20 Tour events last season. That's a far cry from the \$2.8 million he has earned, second only to Walter Ray Williams Jr. in career earnings.

Now at age 43, Pete Weber sounds like a hungry bowler once again, one willing to pay the price to regain greatness.

He has started practicing and even entered an event on the European Tour.

"I have bowled four regionals, getting two nochecks, one cash and one top eight finish," Pete said. "I haven't completely healed. I'm only about 90 percent but Chris Schlemer, my Storm ball rep on Tour, said everything looks the same after a few work-out sessions this summer."

Pete was happy to report that he had recently renewed his contract to use Storm bowling balls on Tour once again. "I feel very confident using Storm equipment because I feel it's the best out there. I enjoy my association with (owner) Bill Chrisman and the entire Storm family."

Pete does not sound worried about how he starts the 2005-06 Tour in Tulsa Oct. 26, just how he finishes it in March.

"I am still doing some



therapy on my shoulder and will practice more before the start of the season. I seem to start every season slowly because I'm trying to get the feel for Tour life, traveling again."

Life on Tour is made easier because wife Tracy, another outstanding bowler, is there to watch his game.

Pete, who never seems to lack confidence, says he feels no pressure trying to bounce back after an off season.

"I don't feel pressure to prove to anyone that I'm back. The only pressure I feel is what I put on myself every week to perform well. Besides, I'm already exempt for next year and that will loosen up the arm swing one more season."

He has not changed his goals. "They're the same. I want to win the Masters and be voted Player of the Year...two things I have not yet accomplished."

Asked if he would join the PBA Senior Tour when he turns 50 in 2012, Pete said: "Of course I will because I have to win seven senior titles to stay ahead of my Dad's six."

Pete is already five wins ahead of Dick's 26 PBA Tour titles.

"My heart is into the Tour this season because I know Dad will be there with me."

The 2005-06 PBA Tour season begins Oct. 26-30 with the 2005 PBA Tulsa Championship. The arena finals take place Sunday, Oct. 30 at the Donald W. Reynolds Center on the campus of the University of Tulsa.

STRIKE

A STRIKE is made when the full stepup of 10 pins is knocked down with the first delivery in a frame. It is marked by an "X" in the small square in the upper right hand corner of the frame where it was made. The count for one strike is 10 plus the number of pin knocked down on the player's next two deliveries.

Bowling Proprietors Of America Announces New Coaching Program

TEXAS — A new program called Coach It Up has been introduced by BPAA. The program shows bowling center employees how to "coach" open play bowlers on basic techniques to help them enjoy the experience more.

While the program takes customer service to a new level, it also addresses one of the key reasons customers don't come back a second time: inability to keep the ball on the lane.



LAKE FOREST — It's our game, American Tenpins. It belongs to the United States Bowling Congress and its complying organizations, like your local certified association and if they ask politely tenpin bowlers in Canada, Central and South American territories — how about the world — can join us.

It says so in the USBC 138-page playing Rule Book, Chapter 2, Rule 1 and 2a.

Rule 1. Leagues and tournaments must be organized and bowled in accordance with USBC bylaws, rules and regulations. These events must be scheduled on lanes that are currently USBC certified and only USBC approved equipment may be used.

Rule 2a. A game of American Tenpins consists of ten frames. A player delivers two balls in each of the first nine frames unless a strike is scored. In the 10th frame, a player delivers three balls, if a strike or spare is scored. Every frame must be completed by each player bowling in regular order.

That's it. Except, filled with words to keep the prize fund safe, lanes, gutters, balls, pins, uniforms, collect dues, handle disputes and other stuff to help keep the game rolling smoothly.

In the past, before the merger (BTM), ABC, WIBC, YABA and BPAA, probably wasted time and money, so the sharp pencil people said, "Merge". Now we don't have the money to waste or the people (volunteers) to do the work.

To attract members and games, these types of leagues will be certified: Adult Mixed, Adult Women, Adult Men, Youth, Adult/ Youth, Mixed, Senior, Travel, Managed and others.

And, games with different formats: Standard American Tenpin, Sport, Baker, Scotch Doubles, No-Tap, 3-6-9 and Best Ball. This writer doesn't know if all their averages must be designated. If they pay their dues, yes? About \$16 per player.




