## Johnny Petraglia Joins Dick Weber as Second Player with PBA Titles in Six Decades

HOWELL, N.J. — Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia of Jackson, N.J., defeated David Kneas of Annapolis, Md., 245-189, to win the PBA East Region Howell Lanes Senior Open at Howell Lanes Sunday, and join the legendary Dick Weber as only the second player to win PBA titles in six decades.

Petraglia won the first of his 14 PBA Tour titles in Fort Smith, Ark., in 1966 at age 19. A week later, he joined the U.S. Army and didn't bowl on Tour again until 1969. With Sunday's title, he also has 12 PBA Regional titles along with seven PBA Senior Tour titles. Now included are titles won in the 1960s, '70s, '80s, '90s, '00s and '10s.

Weber's six-decade span began when he won his first PBA title in the PBA's second event ever — the 1959 Paramus Eastern Open in Paramus, N.J. — and ended with his final title in a PBA Midwest Regional event in Taylorville, Ill., on Jan. 20, 2002.

"I'd still like to win a national title, but winning a regional...it's still a title. Just to be linked with Dick Weber, you did something," the 63-year-old left-hander said.

"The way it turned out was really terrific because it happened at my home lanes," Petraglia added. "I qualified eighth and struggled through match play, but I got just barely through it. There were only four of us left, but I found something. I used a different

## DAVE WODKA, 2010 CA STATE MASTERS CHAMPION

BAKERSFIELD—After clenching both the Singles Scratch and the All-Events Scratch first place honors in the 2010 California USBC Open Championships that was held in Bakersfield this past summer, it was no surprise that when **Dave Wodka** of Chatsworth, returned to bowl the State Masters at AMF Southwest Lanes, the weekend of September 11-12, that he was going to be the man to beat!

64 finalists, 32 qualified through the Open Championships at Regency Lanes using their Singles/Doubles scores, 29 coming from the Last Chance qualifier and three seeded positions for the past two years champions and the 2010 All-Events Scratch champion, started the double elimination (best 3 game series) finals Saturday morning at 9am. After eight grueling rounds of competition, the final top eight bowlers emerged with competition resuming Sunday morning at 9am. **Marvin Hale**, Roswell; **Chris Murray**, San Jose; **Ron Case**, Oakley; **Wayne Garber**, Modesto; **Josh Blanchard**, Rancho Cucamonga; **Dave Wodka**, Chatsworth; **Rick Meneley**, Santa Maria; and **Jeff Frankos**, Daly City were now looking forward to the \$3,000 guaranteed first place prize. In the second round on Sun-

day, Dave Wodka bowled the highest series of the weekend (266-258-280 = 804), earning a bonus \$100 award plus an additional \$100 honor score award. Hale and Frankos finished 7-8<sup>th</sup> earning \$750 each and Murray and Meneley finished out 5-6<sup>th</sup> earning \$850 each.

And then there were four... Ron Case, Wayne Garber, Josh Blanchard and Dave Wodka. Case finished in fourth place earning \$1,000 and Garber finished third earning \$1,500. Dave Wodka remained undefeated and met Josh Blanchard in the championship match. Wodka and Blanchard both looked strong going into this final match and Wodka had the security of keeping one loss in his pocket to force another match. The first game Wodka was down -32 as Blanchard won 267-235.

The second game started out with the two of them dead even until the fourth frame where Wodka started a string of eight strikes defeating Blanchard 269-239. This had Wodka starting the third game down just two pins. Blanchard stuck a 7-10 split in the fourth frame, while Wodka stayed steady and won 236-203. Wodka earned a check for \$3,000 plus a free entry into the 2011 USBC Masters event (\$450) and berths into the next two State Masters

(\$3,950 value). Josh Blanchard received a check for \$2,000 for his second place finish.

The State Masters event had 96 total entries. Friday night's Last Chance qualifier drew 35 of those entries. **Will Wilson** of Anaheim was the high qualifier from the Last Chance squad and **Rodolfo Corona** of Tijuana had the high game of 290, each earning a \$100 bonus award. **Rick Meneley** of Santa Maria shot the only 300 of the tournament earning a \$100 bonus award plus an additional \$100 honor score award and **Sam Carter** of Ben Lomond shot a 299 — both shot during Saturday's competition.

**Johnnie Englehart** also received a \$100 bonus award for being the high qualifier

through the Open Championships qualifier.

**The California USBC Association guaranteed a prize fund of \$30,000 for this event paying 64 places.** The board approved the payout last September in the last ditch efforts of preserving this long time historical event. NORWALK—A returnee Gorman Low who last bowled in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League more than a decade ago, came back and made a big bang in the league 51st opener at Keystone Lanes. Low is no stranger at Keystone as he rolled some high scores in the now defunct Tuesday Downey Deaf League there. So it was not a surprise when Gorman blasted the pins with 236-243-day's high 257 for 736 before slumping to 180 for a good 916 total for four.

Low's 916 led the day's honor roll of 6 bowlers with Ed Abakumoff making the only other 800 with 219-236-201-179 for 835. Bob Jones followed with 181-195-194-207 for 777 and his teammate Bob

Bergan behind with 190-228-195-156 for 769. Others making the list were Pablo Yoma with 202-169-178-161/710 and Gardy Rodgers, 157-1156-190-202 for 705.

Early leaders are Rodgers' Mid City with 15 points, Jones & Bergan's S. F. Valley with season high team series 2230, Low's 257 with teammates Glenn Cissna's 178 and Bob Taylor's 176 gave their Los Angeles 611 for the season high team game.

The league is down to 6 teams of trios from last season's 50th anniversary 8 teams of foursomes. Next travel date is Sept. 26 when the league returns to Jewel City Bowl in Glendale after an absence of several years.

## James Borillo Wins ABTA Labor Day Event at Cal Bowl 9 Shared Match Game of \$3,500 • Big Pots at Chaparral Lanes Chaparral Lanes is our Host for this Weekend (Sept. 18 and 19) Match Game estimated \$2,500 / Match Series estimated \$300 and 3-6-9 is \$1,200

LAKEWOOD — In our return to Cal Bowl. We had a very nice turnout of 624 bowlers over the 4 days.

Many of our members from as far away as Las Vegas, San Diego and more, participated in this one! On Thursday we had 69 bowlers came out for the 1 squad, with cut scores of +50 for the men and +21 for women. On Friday we had 82 bowlers for the 3 squads with cut scores of +67 for the men and a super +90 for the women. On Saturday we had 186 bowlers with cut scores of +55 for the men and +41 for the women. And on Sunday we had 184 bowlers for the regular squads and 103 bowlers in our Re-Entry squad. The cut scores on Sunday were +52 for the men and +30 for women in the regular squads and +39 for the men and +26 for the women in the Re-Entry. The five Super Seniors added to the board this week were John Grieco (+57), Rey Josafat Sr (+56), Romy Cajucom (+50) for the men and Dianna Miller (+19) and Bobbie McCollum (+14) for the women. That would give us a total of 128 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

During our Qualifying squads, the top qualifier for the Men was Kenny Kwan with a +192, and for the women it was Annaliza Argoncillo with a + 105. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Kenny, being the top seed would draw the Match Series worth \$1018 this week and he drew a 461 that was matched by Andy Yu and Victor Fabian, they would each get \$509 dollars. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, the last person standing was Richard Samson and he would go for the \$1,100 this week. He missed on the first shot, so he will get a \$100 consolation. We will go for \$1200 at Chaparral Lanes in our tournament this week.

In the doubles this week, we had a 279 groups get into the

doubles, with 32 spots paid out. The top prize this week went to Michael Leung and Kenny Kwan with a 1502 for \$220. In 2nd place were Victor Lee and Kenny Kwan at 1413 for \$200. The low to cash was 1331.

In the semis we saw Godfrey Galsim lead the field with a + 110 to sit out and bowl for the title. They would each get \$388 dollars for that 192 game 3. Next week we will estimate our pot at \$2500.

This week we had 19 new bowlers join us, and 2 returning members. This would bring us to our Match Play finals now with 30 bowlers taking the floor in our top 32 finals this week. In the first round, the 7 losers were Emma


