

Johnny Petraglia Joins Dick Weber as Second Player with PBA Titles in Six Decades

HOWELL, N.J. - Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia of Jackson, N.J., defeated David Kneas of Annapolis, Md., 245-189, to win the PBA East Region Howell Lanes Senior Open at Howell Lanes Sunday, and join the legendary Dick Weber as only the second player to win PBA titles in six decades.

Petraglia won the first of his 14 PBA Tour titles in Fort Smith, Ark., in 1966 at age 19. A week later, he joined the U.S. Army and didn't bowl on Tour again until 1969. With Sunday's title, he also has 12 PBA Regional titles along with seven PBA Senior Tour titles. Now included are titles won in the 1960s, '70s, '80s, '90s, '00s and '10s.

Weber's six-decade span began when he won his first PBA title in the PBA's second event ever - the 1959 Paramus Eastern Open in Paramus, N.J. - and ended with his final title in a PBA Midwest Regional event in Taylorville, Ill., on Jan. 20, 2002.

"I'd still like to win a national title, but winning a regional...it's still a title. Just to be linked with Dick Weber, you did something," the 63year-old left-hander said.

"The way it turned out was really terrific because it happened at my home lanes," Petraglia added. "I qualified eighth and struggled through match play, but I got just barely through it. There were only four of us left, but I found something. I used a different continued on page 11







by Frank Weiler MURRIETA — Jim Murtishaw bowled 300 the previous week at CAL OAKS BOWL on a Thursday, followed that with a weekend 300 at a PBA Regional Tourney and came back last Thursday in his scratch league at Cal Oaks for another perfect game.

Jim's last perfecto was in the league championship game. Of course, Murtishaw's last 300 led his team to the league title. No matter that ten year national PBA tour star DON MOSER shot 257 against Jim. Two fifty-seven wasn't enough to wrest the title from "Team Murtishaw."

Murtishaw's teammates were PAUL NIELSON and ANITA MURTISHAW. Anita is Jim's wife of about twentyfive years. Hail the champions!

It shouldn't be surprising that Jim does so many phenomenal things on the lanes. Simply put, Jim Murtishaw is a machine out there. He repeats shot after shot. Nothing fancy, nothing overpowering, just a simple pendulum swing as smooth and consistent as his grandfather's clock.

Jim is active on the lanes again after nearly five years off. He gave up bowling to serve as a church missionary for several years. Before these missionary years, Jim bowled on the PBA National Tour for ten years. He won a PBA national title, came in second at the PBA Tournament of Champions, won ten PBA regional titles, won fifteen Pacific Coast Bowlers titles, won seven West Coast Senior Tour titles and one Super Senior Tour title. Jim has been elected to several Halls of Fame and is considered by many to be the best bowler to ever roll a bowling ball in the Citrus Belt. Jim wants to thank DAVE TENNY and VICKY ING-ERTSON, managers of CAL OAKS BOWL, for their support through the years. LAKEWOOD — In our return to Cal Bowl. We had a very nice turnout of 624 bowlers over the 4 days.

Many of our members from as far away as Las Vegas, San Diego and more, participated in this one! On Thursday we had 69 bowlers came out for the 1 squad, with cut scores of +50 for the men and +21 for women. On Friday we had 82 bowlers for the 3 squads with cut scores of +67 for the men and a super +90 for the women. On Saturday we had 186 bowlers with cut scores of +55 for the men and +41 for the women. And on Sunday we had 184 bowlers for the regular squads and 103 bowlers in our Re-Entry squad. The cut scores on Sunday were +52 for the men and +30 for women in the regular squads and +39 for the men and +26 for the women in the Re-Entry. The five Super Seniors added to the board this week were John Grieco (+57), Rey Josafat Sr (+56), Romy Cajucom (+50) for the men and Dianna Miller (+19) and Bobbie McCollum (+14) for the women. That would give us a total of 128 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

During our Qualifying squads, the top qualifier for the Men was Kenny Kwan with a +192, and for the women it was Annaliza Argoncillo with a + 105. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ÂBTA event. Kenny, being the top seed would draw the Match Series worth \$1018 this week and he drew a 461 that was matched by Andy Yu and Victor Fabian, they would each get \$509 dollars. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, the last person standing was Richard Samson and he would go for the \$1,100 this week. He missed on the first shot, so he will get a \$100 consolation. We will go for \$1200 at Chaparral Lanes in our tournament this week.

In the doubles this week, we had a 279 groups get into the

doubles, with 32 spots paid out. The top prize this week went to Michael Leung and Kenny Kwan with a 1502 for \$220. In 2nd place were Victor Lee and Kenny Kwan at 1413 for \$200. The low to cash was 1331.

In the semis we saw Godfrey Galsim lead the field with a + 110 to sit out and bowl for the title. Behind Godfrey was a tie with Gina Velarde and Som Seng at +101, they would bowl a 9th and 10th frame roll-off to determine who would sit out the first round. Som would win the rolloff and get the 2nd seed position while Gina would be the 3rd seed and have to bowl starting in the first round. It took a + 28 for the women and a + 54 for the men to make the semi-finals this week.

This week, our top seed Godfrey Galsim had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$3500. Godfrey drew a 192, and it was matched by 9 fine individuals. They were Anthony Dancel, Danny Eguilos, Michael Scimone, Ric Bisnar, Victor Hilvano, Vic Paolucci, Leo Silva, Freddie Catamisan and Matt Garcia. They would each get \$388 dollars for that 192 game 3. Next week we will estimate our pot at \$2500.

This week we had 19 new bowlers join us, and 2 returning members. Let's welcome these new bowlers to the club, Michael Scimone, Chris Mallory, Antione Sye, Rosalina Gabriel, Victor Hilvano Jr, Virgil Hilvano, Dianna Miller, Stanley Potts Jr, George Alford Jr, Kathyn Gray, Thomas Gray, Christopher Taylor, Wendell Richardson, Michael Davis, Oliver Gruber, Violeta Arcelona, Michael Scimone, with Bill Ledoux and Edwin Barrett returning to the club.

This would bring us to our Match Play finals now with 30 bowlers taking the floor in our top 32 finals this week. In the first round, the 7 losers were Emma Soliman, Miriam Galluzzo, Sonia Coronado, Ada Wong Hum, Giang Hyunh, Roger Romero, Roland Bisnar, Ted Villaroman, Bryan Moore, Glen Dantes, Tony Tang, Vien Tran, Chris Abing, Freddie Catamisan and Tony Leogrande and they would receive checks of \$200 each. In the second round, the losers were Cezar Marcella, Bernie Navarro, Matt Garcia, Mary Robles, Leo Silva, David Emrich. Ruthie Jones, Som Seng and each would get checks of \$250. In the third round, the losers were Kmel Cunanan, Kenny Kwan, Vic Paolucci and Ginalynn Velarde and each would get checks for \$325. In the 4th round we would get down to our final 4 bowlers (excluding the top seed). At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$78 (James Borillo) to a high of \$182 (Carlo Mansilungan) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Carlo Mansilungan (24th seed) bowling Ping Romero (17th seed) on lanes 43 and 44. In this match, Carlo would get the better of Ping in this match with a 231 to 194 finish. In the other match we saw Jun Contreras (4th seed) bowling James Borillo (14th seed) on lanes 39 and 40. In this match, James would get the better of Jun with a 253 to 201 final score.

Juan and Ping were 4th and 5th getting checks for \$650 each. Our semi-final match was set to be bowled on 31 and 32, we had our 14th and 24th seeds into the top 32 bowling each other. In our horses this week we would see James paying \$78 and Carlo paying \$182 if they win their match. In this match James and Carlo kept it close through the early parts of the match, but in the end t would be James that would hold on to win with a 209 to 183 score.
