



Albin's Bowling Supply Owner Tim Albin Passes

Merritt Timothy Albin ("Tim") passed away on Monday, August 31, 2020 at age 78. Tim was born in Pasadena, California, on Monday, September 1, 1941.

In his early life, Tim began a line job at Lockheed Martin manufacturing helicopters and airplanes. He then excelled to the executive level as the "right-hand-man" to the department head at the time before leaving the company.

Tim was a passionate and dedicated bowler. For 43 years, Tim and his wife Diana operated their company "Albin's Bowling Supply", first at Gable House Bowl, then in their own pro shop in Torrance, CA and around several other bowling centers across Southern California thereafter. Until his passing, Tim still worked on his customer's equipment at his home pro shop. He truly loved working with his customers, not only fixing their equipment but also sharing his extensive knowledge of the sport and of the world with them.

Tim bowled in his final bowling tournament on Sunday, September 8, 2019 at Fountain Bowl after nearly six years out of competitive bowling. During this nearly 8-hour-long tournament, Tim was awarded fourth place behind Marv Sargent, Kevin Gannon and Jim Murtishaw; some of the best bowlers in Southern California. He was cheered on by his best friends Larry Gray and Barry Asher amongst other friends, family and customers.

In addition to his interest in bowling, Tim was a

NEW YORK – Over 500 of the best youth bowlers, ages seven to 17, from around the country took to the lanes to begin their journey to become the first ever PBA Jr. National Champion.

The fierce competition kicked off on Sept. 4 with the regional portion of the inaugural event split into four qualifying tournaments at Bowlero locations across the country. Each regional had the same format – two squads of six-game qualifying rounds followed by two semifinal qualifying games for the top 50 percent of players. After eight qualifying games, the top 20 players advanced to match play for six final games.

The long-running Parker Bohn III Scholarship Tournament (PB3) served as an additional qualifier for the East Region. The top two boys and girls in the PB3 event automatically secured a spot in the PBA Jr. National Championship.

The youth bowlers brought their A-game, including three perfect 300-games, but only the top two boys and girls secured spots to advance to the National Championship.

Each regional tournament guaranteed a first place \$2,000 SMART Scholarship. SMART scholarships were also awarded to one out of every six (1:6) entries in each division. The top two boys and girls finishers from each regional move on to the National Championship to compete for a \$7,500 SMART Scholarship. The National Championship date will be held in conjunction with a PBA National Tour stop, to be named at a later date.

be on the verge of vanishing from many local communities due to COVID-19. The operator of several bowling alleys says he's losing millions -- and he's concerned his industry may become extinct.

Like many businesses, Empire Bowl in Redlands has been shut down for months due to the coronavirus pandemic. It's left regular bowlers without a place to play their favorite sport.

"This is their home. People have bowled here for 60-plus years," said bowling center manager Jennifer Lujan.

For owner Will Mossontte and his partner, who run seven bowling centers



in Southern California, it's heartbreaking. His father's 40-year legacy had been passed on to him.

"That was always my intention to do the same to my kids. I never once ever thought that was going to happen," said Mossonette.

"It's an overwhelming feeling." Nearly 200 employees have been without work, some having to find other jobs. "I'm at my

breaking point emotionally. I can't do it anymore," said Lujan. "My savings account is at 19 cents, we're not getting any relief."

Bowling centers were allowed to reopen in June for 14 days before being shut down again. So safety measures are in place.

"We have 20-30,000 square foot buildings - we can easily socially distance," said Mossonette. "We use our sprayer... it's an electro-magnetic sprayer. There's a chemical that kills COVID-19 in it," said Wayne Phelps, manager of Empire Bowl.

The bowling center owners and managers remain hopeful that they'll be able to open again for their regulars.

But once that happens, it will only be at 25% capacity.



PAUL WIEBER Dominates at The LAUGHLIN B

LAUGHLIN, NV. - From our perspective, after observing all of the participants at this summer's Laughlin Blast and evaluating all of the results, we have concluded that the outstanding bowler at the August event was PAUL WIEBER. He was the most consistent and the most dominant bowler throughout the course of the week.

Paul is a scratch bowler from Kingman, Arizona. He is a power player who rolls one of the strongest balls we have seen for a senior bowler. His ball speed appeared to register close to 20 MPH with a Rev-Rate of probably close to 500! As we know, two-handed bowlers average about 580 revolutions while most senior bowlers average 300 revolutions. So, you see, Paul's 500 Rev-Rate is not only impressive but also far greater than most senior bowlers and most younger bowlers. With such bowling capabilities Paul is a bowling force to be reckoned with.

In league play back home in Kingman Paul is averaging 207 and regularly rolls honor scores. He has been averaging above 200 for years and has a local reputation as a "GAMER". A gamer is a bowler who competes against anyone and wins regularly. That's what we saw in Paul a couple of weeks ago at the Laundry Blast.

With a handicap series of 844 on Sunday, with a high game of 276, Paul finished in third place in the Men's Division I (Men averaging 176 or higher) Singles Tournament. That's third place in a field of about thirty bowlers. Damn good.

On Monday through Wednesday Paul rolled scores of 804, 794 and 858 for an All-Events total of a whopping 2,456. His total was good for a Top-Five finish and about \$200 in prize money.



Is there such a thing as a bad day on the lanes? Right now, even bad sounds good. So does pins banging together, a ball returning though the ball return or the foul light buzzing.

My worse day on the lanes was back in the 80's when I was averaging in the 180's. The local association was hosting a No-Tap Tournament at Beverly Bowl.

On my score sheet was a big 393. Problem? That was for THREE GAMES OF NO-TAP.

What to blame? Sore finger, slippery approaches, wrong ball, lane oil or dumb luck?

I don't remember saying goodbye that day or the long ride home, but the pain of that 393 has lasted over 25 years.

Mark Baker

Silver Lake Atom Splitters

A well-known bowling instructor, Mark Baker has led the Silver Lake Atom Splitters to the PBA League title three times. Before he began his coaching career, Baker was a successful bowler on the PBA Tour, winning four titles and made more than two dozen television appearances.



Del Ballard Jr.

Motown Muscle

Del Ballard Jr. had a highly successful career on the PBA Tour, winning 13 titles. Among his wins were four majors, including the 1987 and 1993 U.S. Open, 1988 USBC Masters and 1989 Tournament of Champions. Ballard was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2009.



Andrew Cain

Andrew Cain has bowled on the PBA Tour mostly on a part-time basis since 2006 but may be better known for his efforts off the lanes. Cain served on the USBC Board of Directors for nine years and was president of the governing body from 2012 through the 2014-16 season.



Jason Couch

Philadelphia Hitmen

A 16-time PBA Tour champion, Jason Couch is probably best known on the lanes for his incredible run of winning the PBA Tournament of Champions three times in a row from 1999-2002. He was the PBA Rookie of the Year in 1992 and his successful pro career got him inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2012.





Known for his fiery competitive nature, Marshall Holman won 22 titles in his 23 years a PBA Tour player. His biggest wins came at the 1976 and 1986 Tournament of Champions as well as the 1981 and 1985 U.S. Open. Inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2010, Holman will make his debut as a team manager in the PBA League this season.



Bob Learn Jr.

Miami Waves

With his ability to throw perfect games in his career, Bob Learn Jr. became known as Mr. 300 and won five PBA Tour titles in his career, including the 1999 U.S. Open. In one of the most incredible performances in PBA history, Learn won the 1996 Flagship Open by shooting games of 279, 280, 270 and 300, earning a \$100,000 bonus for the perfect game.

Tim Mack is known around the world, having won more than 70 titles internationally as he became one of the first Americans to compete extensively overseas. These days, Mack is known for his expertise as a ball rep on the PBA Tour and has been the man behind nearly all of Jason Belmonte's major victories.



The first international player inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame, Venezuela's Amleto Monacelli has won 20 PBA titles and amassed nearly \$2.7 million in career earnings. His lone major win on the PBA Tour came at the 1989 Touring Players Championship, but in his PBA50 career, Monacelli has won four majors, including the Senior U.S. Open twice.

Dallas Strikers

One of the most successful players in the history of the PWBA Tour, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard has amassed 20 titles in her career, including a win at the 2001 USBC Queens. More than half of her titles came from 2000-2003 just before the PWBA folded. She was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2008.



Still active and winning on the PBA Tour, Norm Duke is the only player/manager in the PBA League. The 40-time champion won two titles in 2019 and continues to compete at the highest level on the PBA Tour at age 56. Among his 40 titles are seven career majors, the most recent coming at the 2011 U.S. Open.

Brooklyn Styles

One of the best left-handers in the history of the PBA Tour and a Vietnam veteran, Johnny Petraglia won 14 times on the PBA Tour, including several majors. He became the first player in PBA history to win a PBA Tour or PBA50 Tour title in six decades when he won his eighth PBA50 title in 2012.



Kim Terrell-Kearney

Phoenix Fury

Kim Terrell-Kearney won 10 times on the PWBA Tour in her career, including victories at the 2001 Women's U.S. Open, 2002 Queens and 2008 Women's U.S. Open. She also competed and coached for Team USA and is currently the head coach at North Carolina A&T.

Bowling Centers Permanently Closing Hits Close To Home

For most citizens of the United States, bowling is a part of life. It starts at an early age with an introduction through a bowling birthday party or an after school bowling league. It continues with a first date for teenagers, then as a weekly activity for young married couples, and finally as a hobby for retired seniors.

Nothing could completely get in the way of the success of bowling, not even changing lifestyles or skyrocketing land prices. Nothing that is, until the introduction of the COVID-19 pandemic upon our shores. Now after more than 60 years of successful operation, bowling centers throughout the country are permanently closing.

A word search confirms that the closings are nationwide... Brooklyn Lanes in Brooklyn, MI, Glacier Lanes in Everett, WA, Kingpin's Alley in South Glens Falls, NY, Second Strike Lanes in Brookville, PA, and Tsunami Lanes in Crescent City, CA, are now permanently closed. It is interesting to note, without trying to sound political, that all of the closings mentioned are in states that are run by democrat governors.

When reading an article in the California Bowling News about Fountain Bowl a few short weeks ago, the impact of operating a business, even as successful as Fountain Bowl, without any revenue coming in, was made crystal clear. As proprietors Dave Osborn and Gary Forman so appropriately stated in the article, they finally got tired of dealing with the uncertainty of an opening date and decided to put the center up for sale.

Here in New Jersey, another democrat stronghold, the permanent closings of Eagle Rock Lanes and Stelton Lanes were especially sorrowful. During my time at Nationwide Bowling Centers, I became especially close to Eagle Rock Lanes and general manager Tony Cerrato. As a former schoolteacher, Tony was a mentor for me, especially in the area of youth bowling. His opening day learn by Dave Williams

to bowl session for after school leagues is a template that I am still using today.

Eagle Rock Lanes was also a special stop on the PBA Regional Tour for many years, with the affectionate nickname of "Easy Rock." Every year the pros returned to an almost exact same scoring condition and total adoration by the staff and community of West Orange, NJ. No doubt this same experience took place every year at Fountain Bowl, among the most popular destinations for the national touring pros. Stelton Lanes in Piscataway, NJ, was particularly special to me, and to the community as a whole. It brought me together with general manager Nadine DiLeo, who I first met during my days at American Recreation Centers. Nadine, a native of Brooklyn, was attending the University of California at Berkeley, and managing the bar at ARC's famous Mel's Southshore Bowl (Mel Weiss, owner of the Mel's Drive-in chain that was featured in the movie *American Graffiti*, also dabbled in bowling centers).

After school bowling programs were a hit at Stelton Lanes and reached a peak of 485 children from 11 different towns in the surrounding area. We weren't the only hit, as many popular bands became regulars of the club atmosphere during Stelton Lanes evening hours. Bon Jovi, Twisted Sister and even "The Boss," Bruce Springsteen, played at Stelton Lanes in their early years, according to local aficionados. Dee Snider of Twisted Sister once said during a television interview that Stelton Lanes was their first live performance.

Stelton Lanes originally opened as Brookside Lanes, with 38 bowling lanes, a nightclub, lounge and even a drive up window for packaged beer, but as the club appearances and bowling popularity waned, the owners decided to take out 12 of the lanes and the nightclub that made all of those bands famous, in lieu of yet another strip mall along the highly trafficked Stelton Road.

But nothing could ever completely shut down Stelton Lanes, that is until COVID-19.

Joe Kashatus, Nadine's nephew and current manager, said in a recent interview conducted by <u>mycentraljersey</u>. <u>com</u>, "It has been heartwarming to read the comments posted on our website about the closing. People have had amazing things to say about their experiences and memories."

In the weeks to come, we will update everyone with the progress and status of the January event. It's important to note that everything we can tell you now could change.

As of today, it's business as usual and we are accepting and confirming team entries. It would greatly help if your team has decided not to come this year to please let us know.

As you know, we must follow the guidelines and mandated restrictions put in place by the Governor of the State of Nevada, the Gaming Control Board, state and local health organizations and of course South Point Hotel.




