



DEAF TRAVEL BOWLS AT BRUNSWICK COVINA LANES SUNDAY 11 AM

COVINA — So. California Deaf Traveling League will make its scheduled stop at Brunswick Covina Lanes this Sunday 23rd with bowling at 11 AM. In the league's 2012-13 season opener On Sept. 9 at Keystone Lanes, in case you missed the news, Francisco Navarro rolled the nation's deaf bowlers first perfect game of the new season. Dan Flores hit his 300 in a summer league at Jewel City Bowl early last August.

Navarro's career 4th perfecto, which came in the 4th game of his 879 series, is only the 2nd in this traveling League's 53 years history. Carl Malucci hit the first one 15 years ago and Mike Moore had 299 at Del Rio Lanes, followed by Bob Jones' 298 at Action Bowl.

Lets see how Navarro follows his season opening 219 average at Brunswick Covina Lanes. In this Traveling League's match points format, he will be challenged by Leroy MacMonagle who is now 2nd at 209 average. Also their teams are tied for first place in this early season.

Pete Dumpit Wins His Second ABTA Championship Match Game Again \$3,500 • Dom La Guardia Hits 3-6-9 for \$1,700 3-6-9 Will Be \$700 and Match Series estimated at \$700 Next Week: ABTA at Chaparral Lanes One Day

CERRITOS — In our long awaited return to Cerritos Lanes we saw 183 entries come out on Saturday in the extreme heat for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were +97 for the men and +53 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) were Ed Palma (96), Ken Seiple Sr (78), and Sierrie Herradura (35). Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 44 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The top qualifier for the Men was Arvhin Garcia with a +64. For the women it was Emily Yeung with a +119. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event for their fine bowling. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series score and this time it was worth \$312 Arvhin would draw the score and he drew a 667. We had no bowlers that matched this score so we will estimate the Match Series at \$700 at Chaparral Lanes

Dominador LaGuardia was standing for the 3-6-9 roll-off. He got the chance to go for \$1,700. He was able to get all five strikes or nine counts to take home \$1,700. The pot will be \$700 at Chaparral Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing first were Chris Romero and Matt Garcia with a 1517 for \$150. In second were Arvhin Garcia and Manny Natividad with a 1492 for \$130. There was a total of \$1,510 paid out in doubles and 31 paid spots with low to cash of 1418. The semi-finals, finishing in first was Matt Garcia with a +214 and in second was Freddy Zamora at a +174 He sat out the first round of the elims. Top Seed Garcia

had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. He drew a 284. We had no bowlers who shot that score, and so it will carry over. There are five full pots, with a sixth pot that is currently at \$635.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were John Armenia, Steve Bryant, Chris Kelly, George Parker, Sandy Rosenblum, Faye Josafat, and Annaliza Agoncillo. Each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Greg Velarde, Kmel Cunanan, Je Je Gabriel, and Chris Romero with each getting checks of \$107.50.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$25 (Freddie Zamora) to a high of \$66, Pete Dumpit. In one match, it was Edgardo Talayera the third seed versus Dominador LaGuardia the 11th seed. This was another of our fine high scoring matches that saw Dom take home the victory with a 251 to 224. In the other match it was Pete Dumpit the 14th seed versus Freddie Zamora, the second seed. This was another good match that went down to the 10th frame and would need a strike from Freddie to advance. He was not able to get one, so Pete advances with a 223 to 215. Freddie and Edgardo finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$125 each.

Our semi-final match set. and would pit the 10th and 13th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly horses, we would see Pete paying \$66 and Dom paying \$61 if they win their match. This was a close match between two left-handers. Pete would go on to win with a 194/222 to 166/205 to advance to the title

match. Finishing in third place was Dom LaGuardia this week for \$215. For those lucky investors that had Pete as a horse, he paid \$66. Pete was the Horse winner and Imelda had one on him:_)) She is a great handicapper!!

The title game was set and would be top qualifier Matt Garcia going for his third title and Pete Dumpit going for his second championship. Again this was a match between two left-handers this week. This would be a close match do to the handicap difference of 28 pins. However. Matt would give up that lead quickly with opens in the first and fourth frames. Pete was able to get three strikes in the first four frames to give him a lead of 16 pins after four frames. Matt would open again in the eighth and ninth frames to seal his fate. Pete would go on to finish with a 194/222 to 148/204 and take home his second ABTA Championship. He would take home \$1,100 for first place, \$1,000 for the Cash and Carry to give him \$2,100 total in winnings. Finishing in second place for \$550 was Matt Gar-







Dean of Bowling Writers, PBA & USBC Hall of Fame

Too often bowling has been depicted as an activity that has overcome a sordid past.

As a youngster I sort of reluctantly accepted the oft repeated tales of drinking and gambling and assorted other ills as the main lure of the game, and not the thrill of rolling a ball and knocking down more pins than the other bowl-

Early in my writing career I met some people who were involved with the early days of the sport and others who were related to or knew some of the pioneers of the game. One day a fellow sportswriter handed me a package, told me that an older woman had dropped it off for me and if I didn't want it to just throw it away.

It was a scrapbook of bowling articles that appeared from 1900 to 1905. I was surprised, fascinated, and proud, and eagerly devoured every word. It was all positive, maybe by design, maybe because that's the way it was. It had many a piece about wormen's bowling, informative, educational, and illustrative of a larger role women played than ever imagined.

Serving on various Hall of Fame and other committees I had the opportunity to peruse long ago publications and articles about the sport plus much of the research done by bowling scholars such as Al Matzelle, Bruce Pluckhahn and Herm Weiskopf.

Sure there was some gambling, drinking, plenty of needling, lip action, equipment tampering and all the rest that goes with the building of a sport, but there also was the touch of class given by builders, engineers, women, churches, athletic and social clubs and people from every walk of life.

That's why the restoration of a three alley bowling center, brand new back in 1899, has to be one of the brightest bowling stories of the past decade.

The Brunswick Foundation and Georgian Court University have teamed to bring back a bowling jewel of the past located on the campus of the school in Lakewood, N.J.

The alleys were constructed originally by the Brunswick Balke-Collender Company, now Brunswick Corp., a pioneering bowling firm that was founded in 1845, and became a world leader in a wide variety of products. The Foundation was established in 1957, and is deeply involved in projects and causes that enhance the interests of the company, employees and committees.

Georgian Court University was founded in 1908, and its main campus, though just minutes from busy, major Garden State super highways, has been designated a National Historic Landmark of architectural, social and cultural importance. It originally was the winter estate of George Jay Gould.

"Bowling has a long and rich history at Georgian Court. We are grateful to the Brunswick Foundation and delighted to bring this piece of history back to life", said Rosemary Jeffries, president of the school.

A part of the University's Casino building, the three lanes are almost as exactly as they were in 1899. The wooden, overhead ball returns, the lanes, and all other equipment. All meet today's specifications, though modern pins will be used and wooden bowling balls only as a way to try out

The Casino building is a historic monument in itself. At the time it was built, Casino was a word more applied to a sports complex than it was to today's primary definition as a home for gambling.

And what a complex it was. It housed and hosted indoor polo, indoor court tennis, swimming, and other sports, along with the well cared for bowling alleys,

The cream of the nation's best of society, industry and the arts and thousands of college students, mostly women, have enjoyed the alleys at Georgian Court as far back as 114 years ago, proof that bowling was not only acceptable, but an esteemed part of the sporting scene.


