Buena Lanes High School Bowling Championships Now Offer 3 Divisions: Jr Varsity-Varsity-Graduate/Collegiate

VENTURA—The High School Bowling Championship at Buena Lanes in Ventura is a 4 per team event. All teams may be comprised of any combination of bowlers. All students must have a current High School student body card to bowl in the High School Junior varsity and Varsity divisions. All Graduate / Collegiate division bowlers must have a High School Diploma or GED. All students must have a current USBC sanction card. If a student does not have a current USBC card, they may purchase one the day of the tourna-

All games in this event shall be on a scratch basis. The Varsity and Graduate / Collegiate division are open, therefore no average verification is required. The Junior varsity division has a maximum team average of 760. All Junior Varsity entries must be accompanied with April 15, 2006 league sheet or book average. If no average verification is available a bowler may enter at 200 scratch.

All teams will bowl 2 qualifying blocks. The first block shall be 6 games of regular style bowling. The second block shall be 12 games of bowling using the Baker Style format. After the

completion of qualfying, the field will be cut to the top 8 teams in each division. The top 8 teams in each division will be placed in an 8 man brackett with the seeding as follows: (1 vs 8) (3 vs 6) (4 vs 5) (2 vs 7). All matches in the finals will use the Baker Style format with the best 3 out of 5 games advancing to the next round. This will continue until a winner is declared.

Based on 14 teams per division, over \$11,000.00 in scholarships will be awarded. Entry fee for this event is \$75.00 per bowler of which \$12.00 goes to lineage, \$1.00 to expenses and \$62.00 to the prize fund. With over 82% of the entry fee going back to the bowlers, I doubt if there is any other tournament of this kind with as high of return.

This event is scheduled for October 7th and 8th. Both Saturday and Sunday starting times begin at 9:00 AM. Time is running out to enter your team. Defending Doubles Champions, Don Blatchford & Mike Rick Win Again, The WCST Ebonite All Star Doubles at Buena Lanes

VENTURA—For the 2nd year in a row, the doubles team of Don Blatchford (Santa Monica), and Mike Rick (Redlands), win the WCST Ebonite All Star Doubles Tournament held at Buena Lanes in Ventura last week-end.

This being a very high scoring tournament, it took plus 528 to make the 12th place cut. Don and Mike qualified 9th on Saturday for the 10 game qualifying format. They were 207 pins behind the qualifying leaders, Kevin Gannon and Ross Packard, the two bowlers who have 45 WCST Titles between them. For the 12 games, Don rolled 2901, and Mike, 2923, that's over 240 per game per man. They had the high team game of 558. There were 20 team games rolled of 500 or better. Top 3 places: 1st Place, Don Blatchford-Mike Rick, \$2200.00, 2nd Place, Don

Jackson (Bonita)-Steve Smith (San Diego), \$1800.00, and 3rd Place, Sonny Dew (Los Angeles)-Vernon Adams (Chino Hills), \$1400.00.

Other 300 games, also in the finals, Vernon Adams, and Kevin McBride. Michelle Silver, bowling in her 1st finals in the WCST rolled a 299 game in the qualifying, and with her partner Kevin McBride finished in 7th place in the finals, beating the team of Kevin Gannon and Ross Packard, two matches, with one of them in the position round. \$17,400.00 was paid out, as we had 62 teams entered. 20 team places cashed.

"Columbia Corner"

by Gary Kelley For the last fifty years, Co-lumbia 300 has been the industry

leader in coverstock technology. In the late 1950's and through the 1960's, the Columbia Caramel White Dot was the polyester

ball of choice among the top amateurs and professional bowlers

alike.
The 1970's arrived and with

it came the Columbia Yellow Dot, the very first soft shell polyester ball, and without a doubt the most popular selling ball of all time. No other company was able to duplicate the strong performance characteristics of the Yellow Dot and so it had the longest run of any performance ball in history.

The urethane coverstock arrived in the 1980's and Columbia once again became the industry leader with the Black Columbia U-Dot. The U-Dot was thrown successfully by just about every major tournament winner on the PBA Tour as well as amateur bowlers around the world.

When the reactive resin era began in the 1990's, Columbia once again produced some of the most popular balls of the decade. The Cuda/c and the Piranha series were the balls of choice for millions of bowlers around the world. Columbia then introduced the Messenger Ti, which would become the largest selling midprice ball of all time.

The technicians at BASF,

which is Columbia's chemical company and produces all of the resins for our coverstocks, had developed "Super Flex", a resin material that created some skid in the front part of the lane and a very strong finish at the backend. This combination, on the lane oils and surfaces of the late 1990's was a winning formula both in ball reaction and hitting power.

Particle balls came into popularity in the late 1990's and early 2000's and with it came the Columbia Chaos. Again the experts at BASF had developed a coverstock that would react well in heavy oil yet could be polished for use on medium conditions. Along with the Chaos, the Rock series proved to be extremely versatile on a wide variety of condi-

As lane oils and synthetic surfaces have changed in the last few years, so has ball reaction. With the oil transition that takes place on a lane during competition, Columbia found it necessary to once again make a change to the coverstock. We went to BASF with the challenge of developing a resin material that would read the midlane sooner and have a smoother transition at the breakpoint, yet still retain a high level of energy at the pins.

BASF was once again up to the challenge, producing a new series of coverstocks for our Jinx and HyJinx entry level performance balls as well as the Wrath and Wrath XP performance series balls. Through new chemistry BASF was able to develop a new additive, that when added to our existing resins, made the coverstock more flexible through a process called Heat Distortion. The heat is created by the friction of the ball rolling down the lane, which in turn causes the shell to create a bigger footprint, reading the mid-lane sooner with a smoother breakpoint.

The Jinx has the Big Flip Re-The Jinx has the Big Flip Reactive cover and the HyJinx has the Big Flip Strong cover. These are two decidedly different coverstock materials. The Jinx has more length down the lane with a smooth transition at the breakpoint and a strong finish at the backend. The Jinx is a light to light-medium oil ball. The HyJinx, which hooks about 3 to 5 boards more than the Jinx, reads the mid-lane sooner and is stronthe mid-lane sooner and is stronger at the backend. The HyJInx is designed for light-medium to medium oil conditions. Both balls are very controllable as the oil transitions over the course of a night

We have already had tremendous feedback on the Jinx and HyJinx, both in performance and color. One of my staff players made the comment that if he didn't know the price of these balls he would have thought they were high performance, just by their performance and hitting power. The Wrath has the STS cover

and the Wrath XP has the STS XP cover. Again, we have two different coverstock reactions. The Wrath cover is a more aggressive formula than either the Jinx or HyJinx, with its primary use to be on medium oil conditions. The Wrath XP has a very aggressive cover that is best suited for lightheavy to heavy oiled lanes. The core in the Wrath series is the popular core we used in the Ti Boss II ball. This core is a great match up for the new coverstocks.

Like the Jinx and HyJinx, the Wrath and Wrath XP read the midlane smoothly and transition to the pins in a strong motion. Both balls have fantastic hitting power as well as beautiful colors, but the best thing about the Wrath series is the price. High perforperformance core for a mid price

The newest addition to the Action line is the Action Max. Again we have a new coverstock called M80 Friction Plus. This new cover is extremely tacky, which is very unusual for a heavy oil ball. This cover has more "worm holes" for added oil absorption. The combination of a higher RG core and this new coverstock create one of the most aggressive balls on the market today. The strength of the Action Max is its ability to roll through heavy oil and retain a very strong angular finish at the back end. If you're looking for a heavy oil ball with a strong motion on the back end and great hitting power, you can't beat the Action Max.

Keeping up with the ever changing environment in bowling is a constant challenge, but as you can see, Columbia 300 is again ready to meet the challenge head





match ends 780-679. It was Case's first loss, so another match had to be bowled. A bowler must lose twice to be eliminated.

In their second face-off, they take to the lanes as Ron Case explodes twelve strikes in a row for a 300 game against Vince Wood's 249 game. Case follows with a second game of 278 and the deciding match ends with Case's 812 series to Wood's 701 series.

Ron Case, who was bowling in his fifth master's finals appearance, was presented a beautiful plaque by Ray Stewart of Bishop, President of California State Bowling Association. The champion received a prize check for \$1360.00.





The team split the \$2,000 first place prize and also collected \$160 for their 2229 high scratch team series and \$2003 for its high handicap team game 919.. The Unknowns from Illinois, Louisiana and West Virginia claimed the high actual series \$300 prize with 2236 and placed in 5th with handicap 2470 for another \$300.
