Moving into match play in the WWPB, Missy Bellinder took charge. Winning all six of her matches as well as averaging nearly 225 for the day, she strolled to her first place prize check of \$500! Laura Hardeman took second, followed by Andrea Snyder, Lori Yamasaki, Laura Lee Daniel, and Paula Vidad respectively.

The WWPB Forest Lanes event is technically Missy's second WWPB title (her first being a Mixed Doubles event title with Jon Brandon). She thanks for family for their never ending support of her bowling; her boyfriend, Daren Ogomori; and her father, Frank Bellinder of Frank Bellinder's Precision Pro Shop for drilling her equipment and coaching her.

Missy is a member of Columbia 300 Regional Pro Staff. Throughout Saturday's compe-

tition she used her Columbia Shock and Columbia Ricochet Rebound, drilled of course by her father. "I'm happy that I'm throwing the ball well again after my accident (last October) and a two year slump", Missy said in recalling her victory. She continued, "I've been working on my physical game a lot lately".

Following a successful academic and bowling career at Cal State Fullerton, Missy is now helping her father at Precision Pro Shop. She is also coaching and doing freelance public relations work all while bowling as much as she can in both men's and women's events.

Our next WWPB events will be two separate one-day events both at Palos Verdes Bowl, October 15 and October 16. Competition on October 15 will be on the high side of the house on their house shot. Another one-day event will follow on October 16 on the low side of the house on a sport condition.

Record Scores Bowled in the WCST Ebonite All Stars Doubles at Buena Lanes in Ventura

Don Blatchford & Mike Rick, The Champions Over a Full Field of 63 Teams

VENTURA—All scoring records for a WCST Doubles Tournament were broken as a full field of 63 teams or 126 bowlers had an over-all average of 220 per bowler per game for 1260 games, in the qualifying on Saturday. There were 55 team games of 500 plus, and four 300 games, and 110 games of 250 plus, which included 42 games of 260 plus.

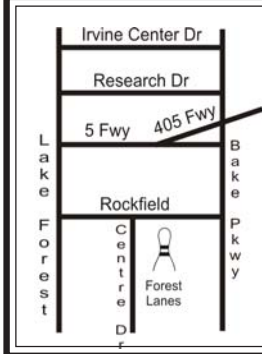
Don Blatchford (Santa Monica), and Mike Rick (Redlands) came out on top as the champions. After a slow start in the 1st 5 game block of the qualifying on Saturday, they were way down the list with plus 137, but in the afternoon block, they went plus 507, to end up in 6th place to start the finals on Sunday. To open the finals, they trailed the team of Ray Cobb-Vince Wood, the qualifying leaders with plus 869, a total of 225 pins the difference, and made up ground quickly to end up the first block pf the finals in 2nd place behind Ray and Vince. They made a bigger move in Game #10 of the finals, as Don rolled a 300 game, and their team score, put them in first place, and they were able to hold on to that lead and pulled way ahead in game #11 and 134 pin lead over Ray and Vince. Don and Mike rolled a 483 team game in the position match and beat Ray and Vince who rolled 417, and won the tournament by 238 pins.

The loss and the low team game by Ray and Vince enabled the team of Chuck Hansen and Frank Barefoot Jr who won their team match in the position round, and passed Ray and Vince by 2 pins to finish in 2nd place. The biggest move and finish of the finals was the team of Randy Taylor, and John Wellnitz, who moved from 12th place to 1st place in the first 4 games of the morning block, but later on to drop back and finish 4th. Two 300 games bowled in the finals, Don Blatchford and Vaughn Doody.

The 12 teams bowling a total of 288 games averaged 230 plus per man. Five other 300 games were bowled in the qualifying on Saturday. Steve Gurrieri, Rick Meneley, Jason Milligan, Tim Tripp, and John Wellnitz. The two team high games were Ray Cobb-Vince Wood, and Joe Wilhite-Jason Milligan, team games of 568 each. Top 3 teams: 1st, Blatchford-Rick, \$2200.00 2nd, Chuck Hansen-Frank Barefoot Jr, \$1600.00, and 3rd to Cobb-Wood, \$1400.00. 42 checks were paid out, for a total prize fund of \$17,730.00.

For 10 tournaments this year, \$81,385.00 paid out, and for 225 tournaments, \$2,456,328.00 paid out. Counting the prize fund of the tournament and the side-pot and bracket action, over \$35,000.00 in winnings paid out. This was the biggest entry field tournament for the WCST in over 5 years, and it was a great success.

Our thanks to our host, Mr Dan Mueller, the GM of the center, along with his bowling coordinator Dina Fink and the help of the workers behind the desk and the lane mechanics, a great job done by all. Dan gave the WCST a reduced price on the lineage which resulted in adding over \$1500.00 to the prize fund. Our thanks also to Sherry Davis, who did all a fantastic job of handling the brackets, and of course our coverage sponsor, Ebonite International. We sold 3 more Ebonite Bowling Balls, and now have a total of \$2280.00 for the last singles tournament for the year 2005.

Vance Sisk Is The Citrus Belt Bowling Association Hi-Average Bowler For 2004-05

For the second consecutive year Vance Sisk has led the Citrus Belt USBC Bowling Association in average. After tying for high average in 2003-04 at 232 he upped the ante this past season posting a 242 average, the second highest in CBBA history.

I interviewed Vance recently and he wants to thank CBBA Hall of Famer Corky De Maio for helping him with his game and equipment.

With six weeks left in the season Sisk knew he had an opportunity to challenge the CBBA record 243 average. With a 240 average at the time, he had to average 259 plus for his final 18 games or a 778 series each week to end the season at a record 244.

Vance nearly did it. In five

of the final six weeks of the season he bowled 780 or better. However, he "only" rolled a 660 series one of those last six weeks. The 660 came with three weeks to go. It still did not eliminate his chance for a 244 average, if he bowled a couple of hefty 800s the final two weeks of the season. He shot 787 and 771.

Can Vance break the record in the future? I think so. He really knows the game of bowling, especially equipment and the fine points about form, lane conditions and adjustments. Along with this knowledge of the game, he is even-tempered, focused, and confident. He possesses every quality necessary to be a great bowler and a future record breaker.

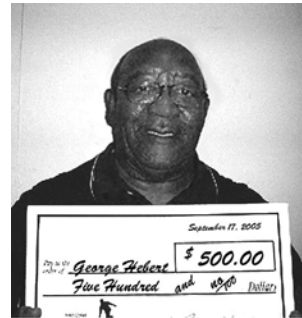
The other qualifiers competing in the finals were Scott Smith, Johnny Graham, Steve Slezak & Mike Lopez.

Vejar Wins First ABTA Title at Cal

Match Game, Match Series and 3-6-9 Carryover to Cerritos

Special Squad Times Last Squad is 6:00PM Saturday

LAKEWOOD—Carlos Vejar is quite a gentleman, and it is nice to see him win the latest ABTA Early Event at Cal Bowl. He did so from the top seeded position downing upstart Anthony Drapeau in the title game to take home a nice top prize of \$2,100 to Phoenix Arizona.

Carlos' fine performance in the three squad early event at Cal saw him top a nice turnout of 178 bowlers (3 squads only). They had a nice shot for the event taking cut scores of men +68 and +27 for the women. We returned 47 bowlers to the Semifinals. Also added to the Semis were the Super Seniors Eddie Shipley, Bobbie Mc Collum, and Simon Rojas.

Leading the Semis was the resident of Arizona who still bowls most ABTA events, Carlos Vejar. His fine +142 made him the top seed to be in the top 16 Singe Elims. He would sit out and bowl for the title. He was closely followed by Speedy Bryant at +135, who would receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a 55 (men) and +26 for the 3 guaranteed ladies to make the Sweet 16 finals.

The bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, losing were Susan Ebilane, Marife Catalasan, Lorenzo Justice, Danny Guevarra, Chaune Merritt, Tommy Newman, and Jim Smith. They got checks of \$100 in 10-16th places. In round two, being eliminated were Speedy Bryant who had just entered the field, Steve Domon, Anthony Borci, and Tomeika Johnson. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$107.50 each.

Round three had Anthony Drapeau finish strongly to edge Super Senior Larry Feldman. Another Super Sr. Ed Shipley disposed Jeff Garrison. Larry and Jeff were 4th and 5th and \$115 with Ed and Anthony to meet for the right to bowl for the title against Vejar. 



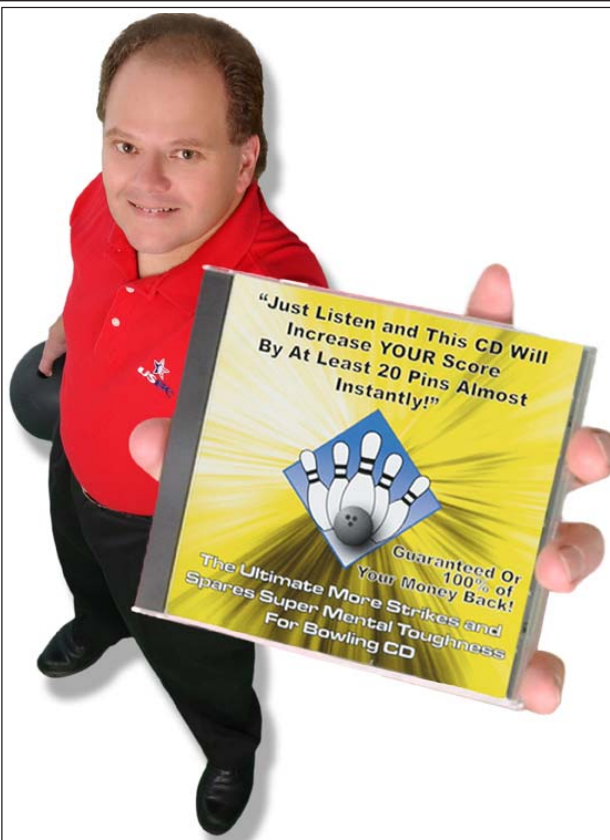

Ten Pin Slants

Two landmark bowling events, one of which occurred recently and the other to be held within a matter of days.

The latter event is the inaugural Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge—guaranteeing \$1 million to the winner—to be staged from Oct. 22-30 at Reno’s newly renovated National Bowling Stadium.

Much has been written already about the historic Kingpin Challenge, so for further details, interested entrants (at \$695 each) are advised to log on to www.kingpinchallenge.com for an entry blank, official tournament rules and the format. A \$195 deposit will hold your spot. Bowlers also may enter by calling 1-866-300-2292, toll free.

There are six separate divisions, so bowlers will be competing against others with similar skills. Each divisional winner is guaranteed \$50,000 and the opportunity to shoot for the \$1 million grand prize in the televised finals (taped by NBC-TV and shown on Sunday, Nov. 13 at 2 p.m., EST).

Kingpin Challenge promoters are optimistic they will hit their goal of 2,500 entries. It’s a possibility as re-entries are permitted at \$295.

Tenpin Slants asked Joan Romeo, a consultant for the Kingpin Challenge tournament, how the entries were doing. “All the divisions are doing well,” she replied, “except for the women’s and seniors’ divisions. Those two divisions, however, could pick up because so many bowlers wait until the last minute to enter.”

Southern California will be well represented in the Kingpin Challenge, including former junior standouts Scott Norton of Cypress and Missy Bellinder of Fullerton. Both are now 23.

Another SoCal bowler to keep an eye one is Bob Edwards of Palmdale, who owns and operated a pro shop at Brunswick Vista Lanes.

Edwards is already a winner, having won a free Kingpin Challenge entry, a comp room at the Circus Circus Hotel & Casino in Reno, and \$600 in cash by capturing a Scratch 8-Game Sweeper on Aug. 21 at Bill Mossontte’s Mission Hills (Calif.) Bowl. The likable right-hander also pocketed \$350 in the high-game sidepots and 4-game blocks.

Edwards shot 1973, a 246 average. In all, there were 10 places paid, totaling \$6,445. Not bad for a one-day sweeper.

Finishing a surprising fourth was Missy Bellinder, who rolled 1914, a 239 average, good for \$400.

Mossontte was so pleased with the turnout of 57 bowlers—who paid a \$100 entry fee—that he planned to hold another “Win-A-Spot” Scratch 8-Gamer before the Kingpin Challenge starts in Reno.

The second landmark bowling event was a luncheon—but what a luncheon it was!

It was called the “Joe Norris Remembrance Luncheon” and it was held on Sept. 7 at Fillippi’s Restaurant in San Diego’s Little Italy. This is the same restaurant where Norris, a Border City resident for more than 25 years, used to hold court before a rapt gathering of bowling personalities two or three times a year, until his death almost five years ago.

This time, there were 10 Norris admirers on hand—and FIVE of them were national hall of famers. They were Dick Evans (all the way from Daytona Beach, Fla.), Mort Luby Jr. (from Chicago), John Jowdy (from El Cajon, just a few miles from downtown San Diego) and Andy Marzich (from Torrance)—all members of the ABC and PBA Halls of Fame. The fifth hall of famer was Virginia Norton of Cypress, who is in the WIBC Hall.

A vacant chair was reserved for Joe Norris at the head of the table. He may not have been there in body, but his spirit certainly was. Near the end of the two-hour luncheon, everyone raised their glasses in a sentimental toast to the legendary Norris. I think he would have been very pleased.

I called Chuck Pezzano, another ABC and PBA Hall of Famer, who lives in New Jersey, to congratulate him because his granddaughter, Amanda (Mandy) Pezzano, had been selected for the annual PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Award. Mandy, who just began her senior year at the University of Pennsylvania, will receive \$1,000.

“I was surprised when I found out about Mandy winning the scholarship,” Pezzano said. “I didn’t even know about it because she had filled out the application herself and mailed it in.

“Mandy (who is majoring in law) is doing great at Pennsylvania,” the proud grandfather added. “In her first three years there, she has gotten all A’s except for two B’s. She’s still unhappy that she got those two B’s,” he said.

FINAL ITEM: Dick Evans and John Jowdy (accompanied by his devoted wife, Brenda) will fly to Switzerland on Oct. 12, tour a couple of countries by train, and then wind up in Austria for the Vienna Open. And it’s an “Open” alright because even PBA members are allowed to enter...Evans will return on Oct. 24, spend a day or two at his Florida home, then fly across the country to catch the final four days of the Kingpin Challenge...Jowdy will remain in Vienna for a couple of extra days, to conduct one of his renowned bowling clinics. That will cause Jowdy to miss the Kingpin Challenge, he says. But don’t bet on it...

Did you know that Brenda Jowdy is a gourmet cook and is noted for her “world-famous” Southern fried chicken? Dick Evans says it’s his favorite dish, which is why he—and Mort Luby—flew so far, not only to attend the “Joe Norris Remembrance Luncheon,” but to sample Brenda’s tasty chicken...The day after the Norris luncheon, the Jowdys, accompanied by Luby and Evans, took a wine-tasting tour at the famed Temecula Valley wine country. D’ya think that’s the real reason why Evans and Luby made the long flight to San Diego? Naw-w-w!
