Richmond — The largest owner and operator of U.S. bowling centers is asking teens to think twice before attempting to purchase alcohol beverages in its venues. The We I.D. program, which builds on current efforts by AMF to restrict underage alcohol sales, provides retailers with drivers license guides to help employees verify iden-tifications, introductory train-ing DVDs and digital clocks that display the date of the legal age required to purchase alcohol beverages. We I.D. posters and signage will be displayed at check-out areas in IF Bowling Center lo tions to reinforce each store's commitment to requiring valid identification for the purchase of alcohol. "The We I.D. program provides useful tools and sends a clear and consistent message to underage customers about our firm commitment to checking identification for all alcohol purchases," said Joe Scarnaty, vice president of Food and Beverage for AMF Bowling Centers. "Ensuring our associates are properly trained and are supported with easy-to-use

materials to prevent the sale of alcohol to minors helps protect our teens and the community."

In fact, 95 percent of American adults age 21 or older agree that sellers of alcohol beverages should be trained to spot fake identification, according to a survey conducted by Opinion Research Corporation CARAVAN® 2010.

"We're proud to support AMF with its ongoing commitment to abide by the law and help keep our communities safe," added Kathy Casso, vice president of Corporate Social Responsibility at Anheuser-Busch. "This We I.D. effort complements and reinforces the progress that's been made in preventing underage drinking among our nation's youth."

The number of adolescents ages 12 to 17 who drink has declined 18 percent in the past according U.S. Department of Health & Human Services' National Survey on Drug Use and Health, issued last fall. "I applaud Anheuser-Busch and AMF's efforts to prevent alcohol sales to minors," said Police Chief John Venuti of Virginia Commonwealth University, which is located in Richmond, Va., also home to AMF Bowling Centers. 






DEAF HALL OF FAMER ROGER SELLERS PASSES AWAY AT 72

McGEHEE, AR—This writer received a fax from Bill Cozad that the long time major dynamo in Southwest Deaf Bowling, Roger Sellers passed away at age of 72 in his home at McGehee, AR on September 16. He had been ill for the past couple years. Sellers began bowling in 1958 but was best known in 1977for his work in Fort Worth, TX when he formed Fort Worth Deaf Mixed League. He served as the league secretary-treasurer from 1978 to 1983 and league president from 1984 to 2002. Sellers also was the long time chairman of Fort Worth Deaf Singles Classic.

His interest in Southwest Deaf Bowling Association began when he got involved as a bowler in 1977 and his work in Fort Worth Deaf Bowling got him elected Vice-President of SWDBA in 1983. While in office as Vice-President in 1990, Sellers took over as SWDBA Secretary-Treasurer due to the former's misuse of SWDBA funds. Then he was elected as Secretary Treasurer and served till 2002. Sellers' work in SWDBA got him elected as only the 3rd Secretary-Treasurer in National Deaf Bowling Association in its 43 years. As a bowler Roger hit his best 300 game in 1977, his best series 791 in 1982 also had a 299 in 1979 and a 790 in 1980. Roger Sellers' list of honors includes induction in SWDBA Hall of Fame in 1992, his alma mater Mississippi School for Deaf Hall of Fame in 2002. Our condolences go to his wife, Virginia, their two daughters and sister.

SAN DIMAS-In our return to Chaparral Lanes we had a turnout of 155 bowlers over the 2 days, this time back we had a tougher shot, so the scores were lower than in the past. On Saturday we had 91 bowlers with cut scores of +33 for the men and +23 for the women. And on Sunday we had 64 bowlers with the cut scores of +20 for the men and +14 for women. The three Super Seniors added to the board this week were Jack Trongale (+29), Pablo Castro (+27) for the men and Roberta Nakunz (-1) for the women. That would give us a total of 43 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

During our Qualifying squads, the top qualifier for the Men was Anthony Martinez with a +148, and for the women it was Kerry Lucka with a + 46. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Anthony, being the top seed would draw the Match Series worth \$272 this week and he drew a 588 that was bowled by Jaime Sulit worth \$272 for that series. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, everyone missed in the 2nd round of the 3/6/9 rolloff, so we will carry over the pot again this week. As there were quite a few left, there was no consolation this week. We will go for \$1,300 at Oak Tree Lanes this coming weekend.

In the doubles this week, we had a small turnout compared to past weeks, only 51 groups got into the doubles, with 10 spots paid out. The top prize this week went to Bedell Vasquez and Marvin Crowder with a 1331 for \$110. In 2nd place were Danny Guevarra and Anthony Martinez at 1327 for \$90. The low to cash was 1288.

In the semis we saw Mike Nakunz lead the field with a + 113 to sit out and bowl for the title. Behind Mike was Ferdie Lipana at +103 who would sit out the first round, it was a wild finish in the 3rd game to determine, who would be 2nd as Danny Guevarra bowled a 285 with hdcp to finish 3rd seed just 7 pins behind Ferdie. It took a + 20 for the men and a - 1 for the women to make the semi-finals this week.

This week, our top seed Mike Nakunz had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$2,430. He would draw a score of 169 and 4 lucky bowlers matched the score. They were Faye Josafat, Bryan Moore, Marvyn Galsim Sr and Greg Kokanour. They would each get \$607 dollars for that 169. Next week we will estimate our pot at \$1,500. This week we had 2 new bowlers join us, and 1 returning member. Let's welcome these new bowlers to the club, Ben Chan and Bill Plummer, with Pedro Benitez returning to the club.

This would bring us to our Match Play finals now with 14 bowlers taking the floor in our top 16 finals this week. In the first round, the 7 losers were Danny Guevarra, Don Quitangon, Kerry Lucka, Jack Tron-

gale, Marvyn Galsim, Pablo Castro, Dianna Miller and they would receive checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Anna Bautista, Jhun Tan, Robert Ricketts, Ferdie Lipana and each would get checks of \$110. This would get us to down to the final 4 bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$33 (Marvin Crowder) to a high of \$134 (Jaime Sulit) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Rico Cayton (10th seed) bowling Jaime Sulit (11th seed) on lanes 31 and 32. In this match, Jaime would get the better of Rico in a close match that went down to the 10th frame with a 201 to 193 finish. In the other match we saw Anthony Martinez (7th seed) bowling Marvin Crowder (6th seed) on lanes 25 and 26. In this match. Anthony would get the better of Marvin with a 221 to 202 final score. Marvin and Jaime were 4th and 5th getting checks for \$120 each. Our semi-final match was set to be bowled on 27 and 28. We had our 7th and 10th seeds into the top 16 bowling each other. In our horses this week we would see Anthony paying \$41 and Jaime paying \$134 if they win their match. In this match it started out close but Anthony would pull away and win the match 202 to 176. Jamie would finish in 3rd place for \$200. This week the horse paid out \$41 for all of you that bet on Anthony making all the way to the title match.



Helen Duval Bowling and Personal Outstanding Life

Helen Duval has been a close friend of mine for over fifty years. Up until seven years ago when I moved to Sonoma we lived only a few miles apart. We bowled in some of the same leagues and were involved in many bowling events plus personal events.

She entered the working world as a Milliner. That's designing and making hats and along that same line, Helen was an excellent Seamstress. Helen was a natural bowler and started in 1938 at the local Cal-Rec Center. The coaching and training was not available then that has developed worldwide since then.

I don't know when she met another enthusiastic bowler Rossaire (better knows as Rost) Duval nor when the wedding bells rang for them, but they purchased their lovely home in Berkeley, CA. It soon became filled with trophies and her favorite plant-African Violets.

The Violets need some additional coverage as Helen traveled this country and other parts of the world and learned about them. AMF annually presents the "Helen Duval Award" to the person that does the most nationally for junior bowling. Helen presented this at the NWBW annual luncheon. She also presented an African Violet (not always easy to carry on a plane.) Many of her friends over the years have received plants or a leaf with instructions on how to grow them. I am afraid some of us were not as successful with the flowers.

Bowling became very important in her life because she quickly became not only a high bowler, but in teaching others. Not just juniors, but other programs. The California Women's Bowling Association had many programs to promote bowling and coaching. Helen was very involved and wrote articles for various publications over the years. Learn to bowl, Bowl Better, Solve Bowling Problems, How to Select a Ball, and many more subjects.

It was necessary to drive to the bowling centers in California and other areas. Cadillac was her choice and one had over 200,000 miles on it when she turned it in for a new one. When a cell phone was furnished to her, she carried it in her trunk. But she did use a portable microphone for her teaching presentations.

As a good cook everyone enjoyed the holiday or special parties held frequently for family and bowling friends in that Berkeley home. Yes, there were smaller meals served now and then. During World War II there were special day leagues to attract women to bowling. A popular one was WIG league. Everyone would receive your choice of a wig during or at the end of the league. Joan Feinblum won a very attractive one and was wearing it at a luncheon at Helen's, I was there too when all of a sudden Joan's wig landed in her plate of food. What a good laugh we had.

She became a bowling proprietor when, with Rosy, they acquired 8 lane College Bowl in Oakland. They owned this center for many years.

One Friday night we were bowling in an eight team scratch five person league in Berkeley Bowl. I was not bowling on Helen's team but her five year old son Richard was there. He spent most of the evening sitting on my lap. I was entertaining him, making faces, etc. In the morning the horrible word POLIO described his illness. Everyone who had contact with Richard that evening had to have a special huge shot immediately. Poor Richard had to spend almost a year in the hospital with very few visitors. Then when he returned home it was a long time to be able to walk. Helen introduced bowling to his fitness program. After they started him in a wheelchair then held him by the back of his belt at the foul line and taught him how to bowl. What a back swing he had. Over the years he had to wait until he aged before the operations necessary to implant metal equipment in his back were possible.

When he was spending so muh time at home in bed, the computers were starting with games. It was so great and very few of his visitors could begin to match his skill. I think he even became a good cook during this time. Eventually, Richard averaged 208 and became a pro.

Helen and Richard were together with Nobu Asami and her son Dean when they did a tour in Japan teaching disabled children how to bowl. Prior to the tour, parents in Japan hid their children away if they were disabled in any way. This was a big step in changing how the "Special people" were treated and was a great thing for Richard to contribute to everyone.

Golfing-she was pretty good at it. On one of my trips to my favorite island, Maui, it was a two week stay at a two story condo on the water. Helen joined us for the last week and brought her golf clubs with her. We played the Kaanapali 18 hole upper course. What a beautiful course to enjoy no matter what the score. We played golf in this area on other occasions.

She deserves the title Nurse because she left the Pro Tour for a year when Rosy had a brain tumor. He was able to recognize visitors at his home but was bedridden for that time. Living so close, I was able to visit quite often.

I need to mention some of her bowling in our California tournaments. She was Captain of the Fitzpatrick Chevrolet team that won WIBC National Tournament. These are the California Team Championships won. This record can never be equaled.




