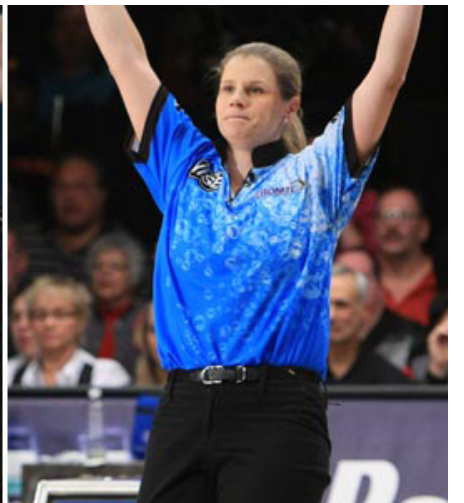
Osku Palermmaa, Kelly Kulick to Enter World Bowling Writers International Hall of Fame

LAS VEGAS — PBA Tour champions Osku Palermmaa of Finland and Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., will be inducted into the World Bowling Writers International Hall of Fame during the PBA World Series of Bowling at South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center in early November.

Palermmaa, who grew up in the Helsinki suburb of Espoo, won his first international medal – a bronze – in the 2005 World Championships team event, but over the next eight years garnered nine first-place finishes in international competition (eight in singles and a gold medal with Team Finland in the 2013 WTBA World Championships team event in Henderson, Nev.) He led the European Bowling Tour points rankings three consecutive years, and amassed a record total of 66 WBW Hall of Fame points to become the first two-handed bowler to earn induction.



Kulick's international medal career spans 14 years, beginning with gold in singles and bronze in both team and trios in the 1999 WTBA World Championships in the UAE. As a professional, she was then denied a place on Team USA until WTBA changed its rules. When she resumed her



Team USA competition, she won gold in the 2011 WTBA Women's World Championships team event, topped the inaugural WTBA 2012 World Singles Championship in Cyprus, earned gold (mixed doubles) and silver (singles) in the 2013 World Games in Colombia and added two silver

medals in team and trios in the 2013 WTBA World Championships for 44 WBW points.

The World Bowling Writers Hall of Fame, which is based upon points earned in international competition, is now supervised by the International Bowling Media Association.

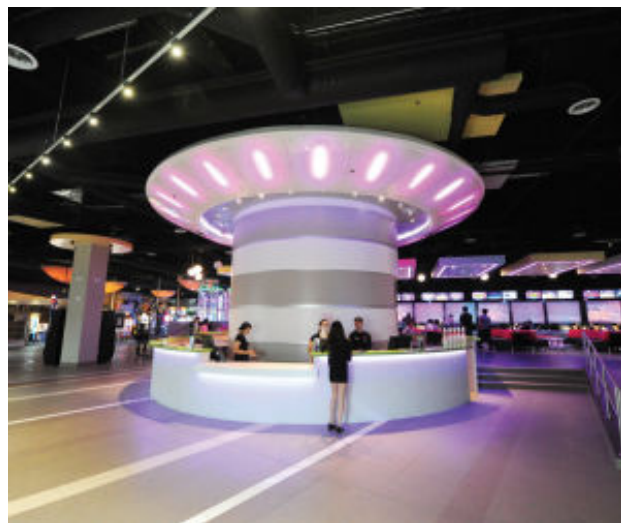
X Lanes' \$6 Million Strike

LOS ANGELES — For years, the Little Tokyo Galleria has been something of a gray elephant in Downtown. The massive complex at Third and Alameda streets is regularly derided for its insular, fortress-like design. Inside, it has long been plagued by empty space, with only a few shops, sushi spots and the cream puffs of Beard Papa's drawing attention.

Now, things are changing. X Lanes, a 50,000-square-foot bowling alley and entertainment center, opened May 17 as the centerpiece of an ongoing renovation. The \$6 million attraction is the first major step in bringing younger customers to the 28-year-old mall.

"Little by little, we're turning into a location where more people will want to come," said Jay Chun, CEO and director of operations of X Lanes.

Like Lucky Strike at L.A. Live, which opened in 2009, X Lanes is more than just a place for bowling diehards to throw balls at pins. In addition to a 24-lane bowling alley, it has a 150-seat Italian/American restaurant, a sports bar, a



nine-table billiard room, three private rooms for parties and a 100-game video arcade.

Work on the bowling alley began about two years ago, following the 2008 purchase of the building by a group of Korean American investors. Although the structure had held a bowling alley when it originally opened, the buyers knew a repeat of the past was no guarantee of success.

"Having just a bowling alley in this current econom-

tle Tokyo Bowl opened with the mall in 1985. It closed on a Saturday in October of 1992 without much fanfare or explanation.

When the original bowling alley closed at the complex then called Yaohan Plaza, it was home to dozens of leagues. Brian Kito, a longtime Little Tokyo business owner and a member of one of those leagues, recalled a simple, no-nonsense facility with a store that sold some bowling accessories.

"It served a really good purpose back then and a lot of people really missed coming there when it closed," he said.

Kito hasn't been to X Lanes yet, but he plans on taking his 12-year-old son soon. When he does, his son will see a very different place than where his father bowled.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

FLORES 828, FISSER 248 LED DEAF TRAVEL AT MISSION HILLS BOWL

MISSION HILLS — On the day the founder of Southern California Deaf Traveling League was honored on his 90th birthday in the league’s stop at Mission Hills Bowl, Dan Flores led the 5 bowlers honor roll with 828 and Mark Fisser had the day’s high game 248.

Flores missed the 10 minutes warm-ups when he arrived on time for the games to start, struggled at the start with 147 and 192. Then he finished strong with 246 and 243 for the day’s only 828 series. Fisser who bombed a 972 in the league’s season opener, tried to maintain his 240 average when he started with a 248. But he found it hard hold and struggled with 171 and 147 and recovered to finish with 205 for 771.

After hitting 188-213-209, Bob Jones missed hitting the day’s other 800 by one pin when he closed his 4th game with 5 strikes in row for 195 and 799 series. League’s long time President Ed Abakumoff placed third with 778 from steady games of 196-206-185-191. With Fisser’s 771 in fourth and the 5th and last man on the roll was Leroy MacMonagle who closed with a 223 for a 744. The high lady with the series was Anita Lorenzo’s 621 and League’s Vice-President Sharon Caldwell had the day’s ladies high game 183.

The bowlers and fans enjoyed the occasion which the league feted its founder, Connie Marchione on his 90th birthday with a beautiful 6 inches high cake. League Secretary-Treasurer Bob Taylor had his friend’s bakery made this unique cake in shape of a fallen bowling pin hit by a dark chocolate ball.

Fifty-four years ago Marchione who before that time was an ardent fan of All Stars Traveling Leagues, vision an all-deaf and hearing-impaired scratch traveling league with match point system. So he gathered like bowlers with 150 and over averages and held a meeting. They liked it and Southern California Deaf Traveling league started as scratch match point traveling league with six teams of trios. ABC at that time said that there was no record of an all-deaf traveling league and So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league may be the first one.

Through all the years the league had growing pains as at its best time it grew to 16 teams and in one bad year it fell to only 5 faithful bowlers staying with Connie as a scratch singles traveling league. Over 300 deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers had bowled one year or more in this traveling league. With about a third of old timers passed away, Connie remained as the only one who bowled all the 54 years in this league he founded.

The league thanks Dave and Mission Hills management for letting the league have this memorable party. The next stop will be at another long time favorite, Del Rio Lanes on October 6 with bowling at Noon.

Mike's book average is 195 but after three weeks this season he is averaging a whopping 217! MAYBE 60 IS THE NEW 40 WHEN IT COMES TO BOWLING.

DALE CONWAY Passes

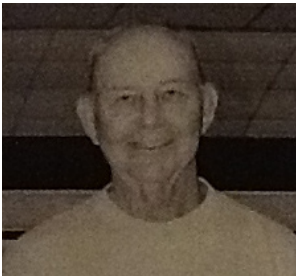

Robert Harvey Earns Second PBA50

Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award

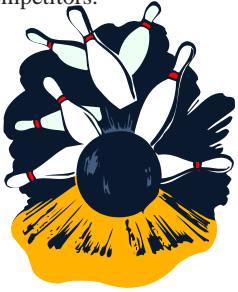
SEATTLE — PBA50 Tour veteran Robert Harvey of Boise, Idaho, has been selected as the 2013 PBA50 Tour's Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award winner by his fellow players marking the second time he has won the honor named after the legendary PBA Hall of Famer.

"It's an honor to win it once and a surprise to get it twice," said the 57-year-old pro shop owner who first won the award in 2010. "It's especially an honor to receive an award that's voted on by your peers and named after one of the greats of the game."

Harvey, who has competed on the Senior Tour since 2008, owns one PBA50 Tour title which came in the Illinois State BPA Ladies and Legends doubles event which he won with partner Kelly Kulick in 2008.

In 2013 he made a run at winning his second title by finishing second in the season-ending PBA50 Treasure Island Resort & Casino Open presented by MOTIV, losing to Hall of Famer Pete Weber, 243-227, in the championship match. He also had a fifth-place finish in the PBA50 Greater Birmingham Open presented by Ebonite earlier in the season.

"This season was probably the most consistent I've had to date," Harvey said. "I had a couple of top-five finishes, finished in the top 20 in overall points and cashed in all but three tournaments. When you're having fun positive things happen. I think that attitude rubs off on your fellow competitors."

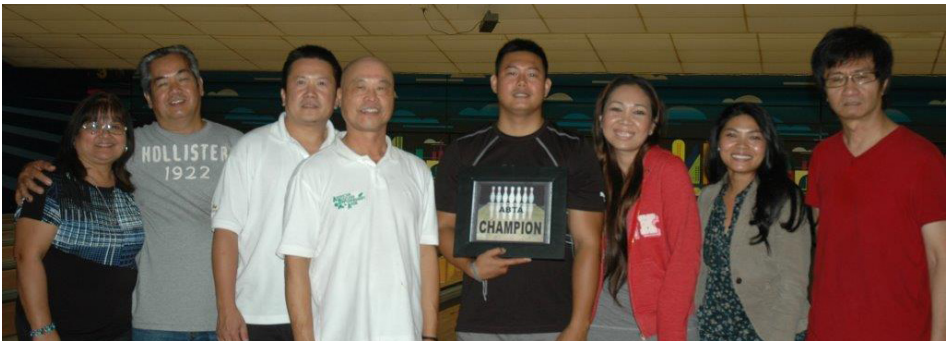
High qualifiers for the weekend were Ricardo Baca +158 for the men and Ada Wong-Hum with a +129 for the women. They each get a

There are many easy attack possibilities in bowling. It's always simple to pick on local and national bowling organizations, whether they be administrative, tournament or promotional groups. Then, of course, there's always Halls of Fame.

Let us start with the obvious. There isn't, hasn't been, and won't be a perfect Hall of Fame, or Hall of Fame committee, in any sport. Bowling has so many Halls, and so many intangibles, that the quest for so called perfection is even more difficult.

Most Halls, bowling and other sports, make only one of two mistakes. They honor too many, or too few, That can't be corrected too easily because there always remains disagreement as to what numbers constitute too many, or too few.

To be elected to the women's golf Hall, you must win a certain number of tournaments. I think the number these days is 30, and you can get bonus credits for events designated as majors. Now that's tough, and it's cut and dried, reach the magic win number and you're in automatically, no discussions, personalities, no great need for more than a small committee. On the other side is the boxing Hall. Each year, any amount from a dozen to more than 20 are inducted. I can't remember when the number of new boxing honorees wasn't in double figures.

There's really no right or wrong there, and much is determined by the age of the Hall, the number of potential candidates over the years, and the geographical area covered. Some sports are strictly regionalized; others are universal.

The same as anyone deeply involved in bowling I become frustrated when certain people are elected, and others are neglected. But once a person has been elected to a Hall, it is a little late to be critical, unless you have guts plus.

The late, colorful, outspoken Don McClaren once said, "You put people in Halls of Fame, why can't you take them out?"

Though he said it in half jest, it should spur the critics. If so many injustices have taken place, why don't they propose amendments to the constitutions of the major bowling Halls to allow removal of some of those enshrined.

Jim Thorpe's Olympic medals were taken away from him, weren't they?

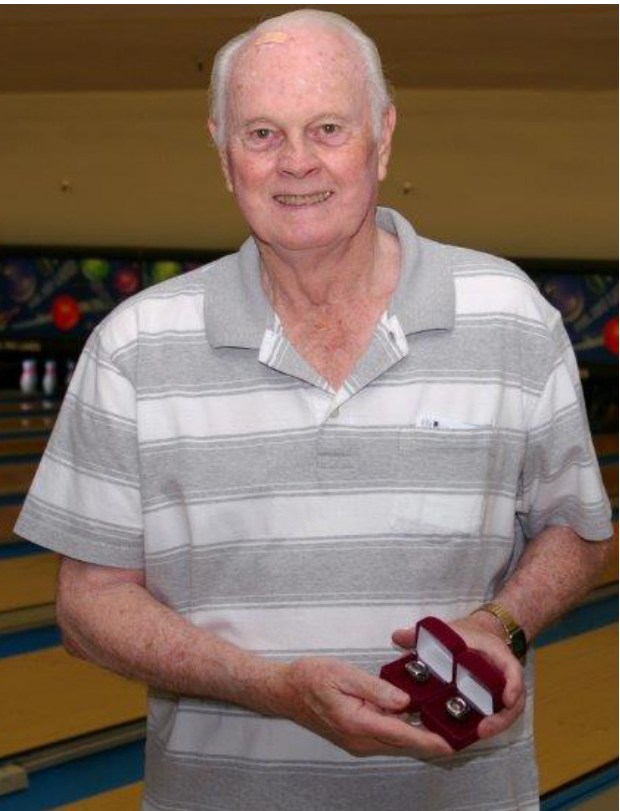
And isn't it strange that the elitists become that way almost always after they have been elected? Like, keep that door wide open, but once I get in, shut it tight.

All the national Halls have their legends, the Don Carters, Dick Webers, Earl Anthonys and Marion Ladewigs, and they have their fringe members, those who might have made a Hall in one of those years when the talent isn't loaded. If you wait for just legends you might have one or two each generation. If you are careful with screening, then any candidate should be accepted if elected.

I know of no Hall of Famer in any major Hall who didn't have some reason for election even though many of them don't come close to the legends. But times change, and we now have junior bowlers who have better career records than some of our most respected Hall of Famers. There never is enough research and material on any of the older and pioneer Hall members, and more facts are uncovered constantly.

Yes, the rules and constitutions of bowling's Halls should be looked at constantly, and care should be given as to how easy or difficult it is to gain such great honors in any or all divisions. But, it is always so much easier to take shots than it is to work on the possible problems.

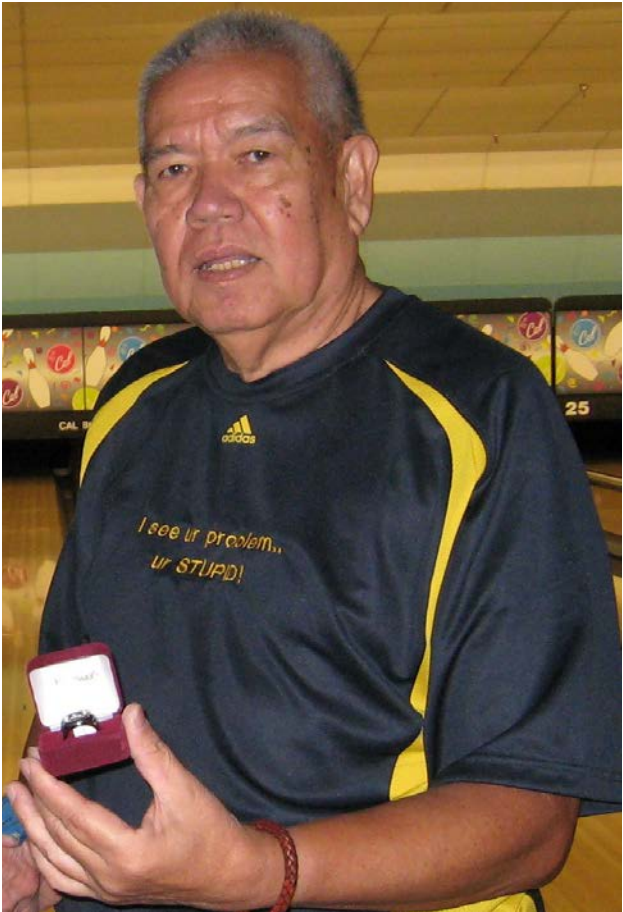

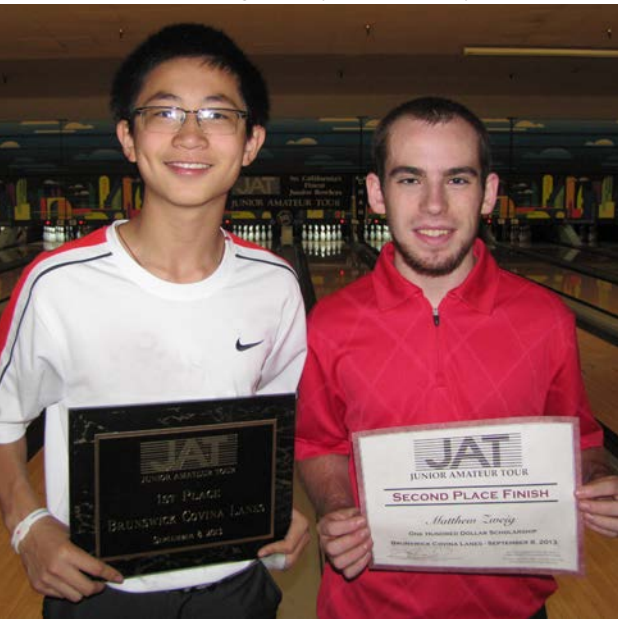
