O'Keefe Caps Banner Year - Wins PWBA Tour Championship

RICHMOND, Va. — Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, put the finishing touches on a dream season by winning her second career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour Championship on Wednesday.

O'Keefe rolled eight consecutive strikes on her way to a 268-179 win over Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova in the title match to claim the \$20,000 top prize and her third major championship.

The 2019 PWBA Tour Championship was held inside the Old Dominion Building at Richmond Raceway, and Wednesday's knockout-style championship round was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

The 40-year-old righthander won her fifth title of 2019, after securing her second consecutive PWBA Player of the Year award

earlier in September. She made seven championshipround appearances in 13 events and finished the season with an 11-2 record in those appearances.

my wildest dreams," said O'Keefe, who won the 2017 Tour Championship. "To have a season like this - to win five titles, come back to Richmond Race-"This is beyond any of way, where I won my first major, and be able to win again, to be player of the year - it's mind boggling to me, and I'm so humbled and grateful."

After delivering in a must-strike situation to defeat Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas, in her semifinal match, 234-223, O'Keefe elected to make a ball change heading into the title tilt against Kovaloagainst Kovalova crept high on the head pin, leaving a 4-7 combination, which resulted in a spare. Her adjustment from the first frame helped her quickly distance herself from Kovalova, who opened twice in her first seven frames.

"Going off the first match, Dasha's ball motion was really good and her ball was hitting like a ton of bricks," said O'Keefe, who now owns 13 career PWBA Tour titles. "We felt like I could shoot 220 with the ball I used in the semifinals, but it was starting to get lazy downlane. We thought the other ball, with a little surface, would still retain through the front part of the lane and still come off it. The first shot was really good, so I made a one-and-one move on both lanes, and it was such a good choice."

Bill O'Neill Sweeps Jason Sterner to Win First FloBowling PBA ATX Invite

O'Neill wins 257-176 and 237-215 in best-of-three title match to win \$25,000 first prize

AUSTIN, Texas - No. 6 seed Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania swept No. 4 seed Jason Sterner of Rochester, New York, 2-0, in a best-of-three-game championship match to win the first FloBowling PBA ATX Invite and a \$25,000 first prize Saturday at Dart

Streamed live by PBA's online streaming partner FloBowling, O'Neill, an 11-time Go Bowling! PBA Tour titlist, was among eight PBA Tour stars in the non-title elimination event who earned berths by finishing in the top eight in USBC Cup points during the nine-tournament FloBowling PBA Summer

O'Neill took the first game of the title match with a dominating 257-176 win and was able to continue the momentum heading into the second game beating Sterner 237-215 for the victory.

"I was able to stay with

my game plan and didn't have to deviate much from it," said the 37-year-old O'Neill, "I was able to keep adjustments simple with footwork and keeping my angles tight to the pocket. When you can keep the adjustments simple and manageable, you're better able to keep your focus and stay in a rhythm."

O'Neill's Summer Tour was highlighted by a win in the PBA Harry O'Neale Chesapeake Open for his second title of the season.

"I think overall from top to bottom this is probably one of the best seasons of my career," O'Neill said. "I haven't won a major yet but I'm probably as confident as I've ever been with my game and the way I'm throwing the ball. I've had a lot of success learning from my mistakes and putting myself in the best position to succeed. After that,

it's all about executing to the best of my ability."

Sterner's Summer Tour was highlighted by winning the PBA Illinois Open, which concluded the Flo-Bowling PBA Summer Swing presented by the Brands of Ebonite International, for his third career tour title.

Competition on the 45foot PBA Dick Weber lane condition started with four continued on page 7

Nancy doesn't seem to accept anything less than perfection, often visibly showing her displeasure


when her right-handed shot fails to connect.

Five Months and Five Million Steps Later, Bowling Proprietor David "Kilroy" Kellerman Completes 2,190 Mile Hike to Raise More Than \$71,000 for BVL and Veterans

FAIRFAX, Va. – Welcome home, Kilroy! It took more than five months and five million steps, but the journey is over for Texas bowling proprietor David "Kilroy" Kellerman who has completed the 2,192-mile hike through the Appalachian Trail to raise funds and awareness for BVL (Bowlers To Veterans Link).

Kellerman, who finished his 160-day solo trek last week, has inspired more than \$71,000 in BVL donations to date. "Five million steps to completely hike the Appalachian Trail is nothing compared to the sacrifices our veterans made to



protect our freedoms," said Kellerman, who plans to return to work this week at Mel's Lone Star Lanes in Georgetown, Texas, the bowling center he co-owns with his sister Dot Ammons.

"My Appalachian Trail adventure would never have happened if not for the freedoms given to me as a United States citizen. My freedoms are not free thanks to the great men and women who are serving or have served in our military. I dedicated my hike to them by raising funds for the bowling industry's oldest and own charity – the Bowlers to Veterans Link."

Kellerman credits "all the support and prayers from the bowling industry family" with helping him to power through and complete the Appalachian Trail thru-hike. "I hope my adventure increased the awareness of BVL and that more centers will become involved in raising funds for our charity."

Since 1942, BVL has provided more than \$52 million in grants to VA hospitals and clinics to fund recreation therapy and programs for America's veterans and active duty service members. BVL is bowling's oldest and own charity, a national nonprofit 501 (c) (3) charity that is consistently acknowledged for efficient and effective programming delivered with extremely low overhead. BVL has been recognized as one of "America's Best Charities" by Independent Charities of America, earned a "Top-Rated" Nonprofit distinction from GreatNonprofits, and is also a member of the Combined Federal Campaign (#93325).

"The personal sacrifice that David has made to be away from his family and business for more than five months to raise funds for BVL is one of the selfless things anyone has ever done for our organization," said BVL Board Chair John LaSpina. "David believes in BVL's mission to brighten veterans' lives through recreation therapy programs and services, and his contribution will make a significant impact for many of our veterans.

"We are so grateful to everyone who has donated so far in support of David's hike and BVL, and we hope others who are inspired by his incredible journey will continue to give what they can to help BVL continue to be there for our veterans."

After surpassing his original goal of \$50,000 during Bowl Expo, Kellerman upped the target to \$75,000. Kellerman, who self-funded the trip to ensure the maximum benefit of his fundraising efforts for veterans programs, is hoping to clear the updated fundraising target at the two upcoming meet-and-greet special events over the next month. He is scheduled to talk about his adventure and support of BVL at "Koffee with Kilroy" at Mel's Lone Star Lanes on September 24, and "Kocktails with Kilroy" at the Southwest Bowling Proprietors Trade Show on October 7 in Irving, Texas.

Wednesday's victory also was amplified for O'Keefe as she celebrated the win with her husband, Bryan, on their 15th wedding anniversary.

"He's been in the fire with me, and it's so awesome to be able to share moments like this with him," O'Keefe said. "I wouldn't be the player I am today without him, and to win this on our anniversary is very special."

Kovalova was dominant in her semifinal win against Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, delivering 11 strikes to record a 279-230 victory.

Kovalova started the game with four consecutive strikes, but she found herself trailing as McEwan began with six consecutive strikes. Kovalova took the lead after back-to-back spares from McEwan in the seventh and eighth frames and found herself in the driver's seat after McEwan was unable to convert the 1-2-4-6-10 in the ninth frame.

Kovalova had a breakout year on the PWBA Tour in 2019, winning her first career title at the United States Bowling Congress Queens to earn her first trip to the Tour Championship. She followed the major victory with a perfect game in the championship match of the Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open to claim her second title of the season.

"No, I didn't expect this," Kovalova said. "I wanted to make one show this season. I made four and won two of

"In the title match, I knew I needed to make a ball change, but I was just stubborn. It's OK. I'm going to take a little break and heal some of the aches and pains and come back stronger next year."

O'Keefe and McEwan were automatically seeded into the semifinals based on their ranking on the season-long points list, which determined seeding for this week's bracket.

Kovalova and Johnson each had to make their way through best-of-five matches to advance to Wednesday's championship round. The Tour Championship is a singleelimination event.

The 16-player field at the Tour Championship included all of this year's eligible PWBA Tour champions, and the final spots in the bracket were filled in using the 2019 PWBA points list.

Four lanes once again were specially installed inside the Old Dominion Building by QubicaAMF, the official supplier of bowling equipment for the 2019 PWBA Tour Championship.

All rounds leading up to the championship round were broadcast live on **BowlTV.com**.





PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: MALDONADO HOLDS OFF LAVOIE TO WIN 11TH REGIONAL TITLE

• Shawn Maldonado from Houston, Texas, built a 248-pin lead and then held off Canada's François Lavoie in the final frames to claim his 11th PBA Regional title in the third annual PBA Liberal Kansas Southwest Open Sunday at Ayr Lanes in Liberal, Kan.

Maldonado started the eight-game match play finals in the lead before losing matches six and seven while Lavoie closed in with wins behind 257 and 229 games to set up the deciding position round match. Maldonado still held a 64-pin lead, meaning Lavoie had to win the match by 35 pins and collect the 30 bonus pins to win the title. While Maldonado was filling frame through the middle of the match, Lavoie countered with two doubles to briefly take the lead. When Lavoie failed to convert two splits late in the game, Maldonado escaped with a 192-174 loss, but still maintained the overall pinfall lead, 4,610-4,594.

In addition to his title, the win was worth \$4,000 to Maldonado.

• Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C. defeated Trevor Roberts of Crystal River, Fla., 257-234, to win the \$2,500 first prize and his 12th PBA Regional title in the 16th annual PBA Fayetteville South Open at Lafayette Lanes in Fayetteville, N.C., Sunday.

Roberts qualified in the third position for the four-man stepladder finals, one pin ahead of defending champion Brandon Curtis of Manson, N.C., and then eliminated Curtis in the opening match, 208-192. Roberts then defeated Ryan Ciminelli of Lancaster, S.C., 257-234, to advance to the championship match.

In the title match, Troup threw eight strikes in his first eight frames to grab a healthy lead. Roberts didn't strike until the seventh frame and by then it was too late.

• Darren Tang of Las Vegas posted an 8-4 match play record and a 20-game total of 4,366 pins to win the Fourth Annual PBA West/Northwest Capital City Open at Bowlero North Sacramento Sunday while Tony Rodriguez Jr. of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., won the PBA50 portion of the doubleheader weekend.

Tang won his sixth PBA Regional title and the \$2,000 first prize by 56 pins over non-member Sam Cantrell of Citrus Heights, Calif., who had an 9-3 record and 4,310 pins, including match play bonus pins.

Rodriguez went 8-4 in the 12-game PBA50 match play finals and knocked down 4,250 total pins for his 20 games to top Noel Vazquez of Sacramento by 78 pins.

• Rick Graham of Lancaster, Pa., the reigning East Region PBA50 Player of the Year, compiled a 3-5 match play record and a 15-game total of 3,524 pins to win the PBA50 King Pin Lanes Open at King Pin Lanes in Rome, N.Y., Saturday.

While Graham only managed to win three of his eight matches, his 228 average helped propel him to a 101-pin victory over Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y. For Graham, the trip to King Pin Lanes brought back fond memories because King Pin Lanes was the site of his first PBA regional win, in 2010. Saturday's win was Graham's fifth in PBA Regional competition and earned him \$1,500.

- Justin Knowles of Okemos, Mich. defeated Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio by 30 pins to win the PBA Sturgis/ Storm Central/Midwest Open at Sturgis Bowl Sunday. Knowles finished with a 5-3 match play record and a total of 4,738 pins for 21 games, including match play bonus pins, to win his first PBA title and the \$2,600 first prize.

Nancy finished with a 241 – the first time she had cracked 200. With handicap, Nancy's score ballooned to a stratospheric 329. "My goal two years ago was to bowl 200 and I hit 241," said Nancy, who had previously distinguished herself with a strong performance in a doubles no-tap tournament.

"When you go big, sometimes you go *really* big." That's Nancy's way. She shoots for the heavens. And she doesn't like to misfire.

"I'm very competitive," Nancy explained. "But I'm very competitive with myself."

Said teammate Fountain: "Nancy showed what she could do when she closes both eyes. No, seriously, she bowled really well and was hitting her spots."

Nancy rolled a 107 in her first game and 122 in the finale but is optimistic about attaining her newest goal.

"A three hundred, of course," she said with a big smile.


