# LAS VEGAS BREAKS THROUGH TO WIN FIRST PBA ELIAS CUP TITLE

The High Rollers, featuring MVP Andrew Anderson, AJ Johnson, Matt Ogle, Matt Russo, Sean Rash, Thomas Larsen and manager Amleto Monacelli, prevailed over the Portland Lumberjacks to win 2024 PBA Elias Cup

Since the franchise's inception in 2020, the Las Vegas High Rollers have been knocking on the door of the PBA Elias Cup. This year, they broke the door down.

The top-seeded Las Vegas defeated the Portland Lumberjacks in the PBA Elite League presented by Snickers Elias Cup Finals to win the franchise's first title. The High Rollers fell behind 0-1 before rattling off three consecutive wins to win the Race-to-Three match at Portland, Maine's Bayside Bowl.

stepladder finals. Each match of the stepladder finals was a single scratch game, BAKER FORMAT.





lar season's Most Valuable Player, was also named the Mark Roth PBA Elite League Playoffs MVP.

"We're here. We've been here, and now the experience paid off. We were due." Anderson said.

"This one just feels a little sweeter, because me, Andrew and Amletto have been a part of this team since Las Vegas got started, since we were an expansion team," Johnson said. "Me and Andrew have talked so many times about how we were going to to figure out how to win this thing. Going through the draft and these guys — Ogle, Rash, Russo and Larsen — just became available to us. Andrew and I couldn't believe it. We literally said after the draft, 'This is the year we win. This is how it's supposed to happen. This is it — and we proved that all year."

The Lumberjacks sprinted out to an early lead fueled by the insertion of Wes Malott into the lineup. The 47-year-old veteran has battled numerous injuries and sat during Monday's semifinals, but the man Portland calls their "Franchise" found a way to compete. Meanwhile the High Rollers looked nothing like their dominant selves in a 236-183 Game 1 loss. The team did not strike until the fifth frame and Sean Rash, who struck on all eight of his attempts in the semifinals, missed a 10-pin in the sixth frame.

In Game 2, Anderson proved why he was voted the MVP, delivering three strikes in the 10th frame to force Portland anchor Kyle Troup to double. Troup left a 4-pin on his first shot, evening the match at one point apiece.

Then came Game 3, the defining game of the entire season. The High Rollers started with four straight strikes and then Anderson washed out. He later admitted he threw the wrong ball. But Anderson picked up the spare, as did Matt Ogle in the ninth frame to give the High Rollers the lead.

Roles reversed when Troup threw three strikes in his own 10th frame, forcing Anderson to double. As Anderson toed the line with a raucous hometown crowd cheering against him — a stark contrast from the Round 12 matchup with Portland in Anderson's hometown — the 29-year-old delivered three strikes that will stand the test of time.

The High Rollers never let the Lumberjacks even begin to think about a comeback. After Rash converted a 3-pin in the opening frame of Game 4, Las Vegas rallied eight consecutive strikes to shut out Portland.

After three seasons of finishing second or third in the PBA League, the High Rollers at long last hoisted in the first Elias Cup of the PBA Elite League era.

This mark's the first Elias Cup for each High Roller except Johnson, who also won the title in 2018 with the Silver Lake Atom Splitters.

# Bowlarama Sparks Memories

At one time there were eight bowling establishments in the greater Santa Rosa and Sebastopol communities of California, including at least two private clubs. The number was reduced to zero in recent years, for a region with close to 500,000 residents in the standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA). The last one to close was Rose Bowl, in the Roseland Shopping Center, in 2006.

The center was actually renamed Continental Lanes in 1987, when the first Continental Lanes in downtown Santa Rosa was leveled to make way for new retail shops on Mendocino Avenue. Vera Richardson opened the original Continental Lanes in 1963. During the day it had a thriving cafe and lounge that catered to businessmen and women looking for a quick bite to eat.

But at night the lanes in the rear of the building took center stage, featuring most of the top bowlers in the area during the 1970's and 80's, because of the well maintained lanes with easy scoring conditions. Tim Colgan, Vera's grandson, took over the business and in 1984 moved the lanes and fixtures to Windsor, a rapidly growing city just north of Santa Rosa. The 24-lane Windsor Bowl is still in operation today.

Three years later Colgan was back in Santa Rosa, renaming Rose Bowl for the razed Continental Lanes, and taking over operation of the center once owned by bowling mogul Jim Decker (father to past president of the Bowling Proprietors Association of America, Jim Decker III). Bowling had always been a fixture in the Roseland Shopping Center since the development opened in 1959.

An additional location in the area that is near and dear to my heart, L & L Lanes in Sebastopol, closed in the 1990's, becoming a Starbuck's and strip mall (the coffee shop is now Brew Brothers Coffee). Amazingly, the "B-O-W-L" sign is still there in the parking lot, most likely waiting for someone to retrofit the four letters to their business. Why do they always save the sign?

Another popular destination of mine in the 1970's was Holiday Bowl in Santa Rosa. The location is now a shopping mall anchored by Walgreen's Pharmacy. Back in the day it was home to some of the finest action bowling in Northern California. At a time when 200 average bowlers were rare (1950's - 1960's), the Central Sonoma County Men's Bowling Association would feature at least a couple every year, usually from Holiday Bowl.

#### **An Exception To The Rule**

There is still a "bowling center" of sorts in the Santa Rosa city limits. It's called Chuck's Bowling and Bar and is located inside Poppy Bank's Epicenter. It's the largest all-in-one destination for sports, fitness and entertainment in the area north of San Francisco (Sonoma, Marin and Napa counties). It's packed with a unique mix of indoor sports, a fitness center, trampoline park, arcade, advanced laser tag, and bowling lanes (string machines) with a lounge.

How a bank became involved in this endeavor is anyone's guess, but one can only assume that it was a business that went bankrupt, and Poppy Bank elected to carry on the operation rather than close. There does not appear to be any bowling leagues and the glow lights look to be on at all times, so Chuck's cannot be termed a bowling center in the traditional sense...

**OWLARAMA, THE BOOK** - While trying to decide from which online retailer to buy the Bowlarama book, I received an email from Tom Knapp, this column's number one fan from Minnesota. "Don't buy the book," instructed Tom. "One is on the way and should arrive on Thursday." Tom said that he also purchased a book for Bowling Hall of Fame member Bud Horn in Las Vegas. Tom was a longtime resident of Southern California, working for Horn at Park Lanes in Baldwin Park, as well as Western Columbia. His "real" job was at 3M. Many thanks for the book Mr. Knapp!!


