Pam Pancoast Brings Singles USBC Women’s Championship Title Home to Southern California

RENO — Pam Pancoast, a local Southern California Bowler, had her best finish ever at the 2012 USBC Women’s National Championships in Reno Nevada.

Bowling with friends, Hall of Famer Anne Marie Duggan and two-time Women’s Championship titlist Christy Asher, Pam began her quest in team event by rolling a nice 730 series. She then came back the next day and bowled a 710 series in Doubles before moving to her singles pair. Although the singles lanes were a little tighter, Pam moved around and finished her first game with a 213 by striking out in the 9 and 10 frames. She then continued to strike in game 2, and while leaving a pocket 7-10 pin split in the 6th frame, finished with a 266 game. She was not done striking there, and continued to throw the next 12 strikes in game 3 while bowing the 18th perfect game in championship history. When all was done, Pam ended up with a nice 779 series, and striking in 27 of her final 28 frames.

After her final 300 game in the Championship, USBC officials notified her that she has just taken over the scratch singles lead by a single pin. Also at that time, her 9 game block of 2,219 was leading in scratch all events.

Then the wait came. Still two more full weeks of Tournament play left. Would her 779 scratch singles and 2249 all events hold up? Probably not she thought, many of the Pro’s and College Team USA girls were in town to bowl the Women’s US Open and many were also bowling the Championship Tournament. Surely they would find what she had found on the lanes, but she was hoping one or both might hold up.

When the Women’s Na-

tional Tournament had finished, USBC officials called and said her Singles score had held, and she was now the 2012 Women’s Scratch Singles Champion, and a National Champion. Although her all events score was beaten during the final two week of play by 7 pins, Pam was very excited with her first National Title and second in all events. Not bad she said for an amateur who bowls one day a week to be able to accomplish so much

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

NAVARRO 853, BOB JONES 278 LEAD DEAF TRAVEL AT COVINA BOWL
COVINA — There was a surprise celebration in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League’s stop at Brunswick Covina Bowl when a birthday cake was brought in. It was announced the day happened to be birthdays of bowlers Dennis Vigil and Connie Marchione. Randy Salazar was added as born in the same month. All the bowlers and fans sang Happy Birthday in sign language to the trio.
With that done, the bowlers resumed bowling with all eyes on Francisco Navarro who in the previous session at Keystone Lanes tossed the league’s second 300 in its 53 years history. Thou Navarro tried but the best he could do after his first game of 180 was start in his second game with 5 strikes in row and finished with a 241. He added 215 and 217 for the day’s league’s honor roll high 853 series.
Thanks to a timely switch of balls for his 4th game, Bob Jones had struggled with 203-176-176 in his first three games. It helped as Jones rolled 5 in row, spared in 6th and struck 5 more times, left a 7 pin on his last ball for a 278 for a 833 series.
Robert Audette started with a 209 but came short in his next three games with 185-192-193 for a 779. League President Ed Abakumoff had a 225 in his 746, Leroy MacMonagle hit 717, Bob Bergan a 712 ad Gardy Rodgers and birthday guy Marchione, each hit a 201. Pat Morford was the day’s high lady with 150 and 605.
MacMonagle’s Orange County retains league lead with 26 points, followed by Audette’s Whittier and Bergan’s LA County, which are tied with 22.5.
The league thanks Brunswick Covina Bowl for hosting. The league’s next travel stop is at AMF Cerritos Lanes on Sunday October 7 with bowling time at Noon.

JIM MOHR CASHED \$76.50 IN CAUSBC SENIOR SINGLES TOURNAMENT
SAUGUS — As one of the group of 6 deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers entered in last August 17-19 California USBC Senior Singles Tournament Jim Mohr was the lone casher of the group.
This handicap tournament held at Santa Clarita Lanes attracted a record over 600 senior men and women bowlers aged 50 and over entries. The bowlers were entered in 6 separate male and female classifications according to age divisions, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74 and 75- over.
Mohr, 79 of Simi Valley entered with 155 average in the 75 and over men division, bowled with the group on Aug. 19 Sunday morning 9 AM squad rolled games of 188-132-192 (512) on lanes 1-2. Then moved to lanes 3-4 to finish games of 167-181-159 (507) for 6 games total of 1019. That altogether with his handicap of 297 totaled 1316 ended up in a tie for 3rd place with a senior from Manteca, CA. Both split the 3rd and 4th places money for \$76.50 each.
A hometown (Saugus) senior Donald Lambert won this division \$200 prize with 1364 and Chuck Rose, Morro Bay, CA placed 2nd with 1319 for \$125.00. There were 52 entries in this age division and low to cash in 9th place was 1263.
Next year’s CalUSBC Senior Singles tournament will be in Stockton on August 23-25. 2013 at West Lane Bowl. The entry fee is \$40.00 per person for age 50 and up. Handicap is 90% of 210.

Target Shot- Dots/Arrows

Targeting at the same shot every single frame is an essential key in keeping consistency in your game. Most beginner bowlers would look at the pins. This is normal for most beginner bowlers as they’re thinking “thats the target!”. However, the pins are too far down the lane- 60 feet away! Why would you aim for something further down the lane when you can focus on “visual aids” closer to you? There are two “visual aids” on the lanes where you can look/aim. These are the arrows and dots

There are set of seven arrows located approximately 15 feet from the foul line- they are on the SAME boards as the dots, centered on board 20, spaced 5 boards apart. There are set of ten dots located approximately six feet from the foul line. Two sets of five dots are located 7.5 feet from the foul line. From right to left for a right-handed bowler, the dots are on boards 3, 5, 8, 11 and 14. After a gap of 11 unmarked boards in the center of the lane, the dots continue on boards 26, 29, 32, 35 and 37. The lane dots are located halfway to the arrows and provide the first visual reference for fine tuning the moving track of the ball.

These visual aids are much closer to you. Your targeting precision is greatly increased using the arrows/dots for targeting instead of the pins themselves. They’re another important tool because they tell you where to aim. As a beginner the recommended way to use these targets on the lane is to start (stand) with your feet around the middle dot (board 20). You should release your bowling ball in an area around the 2nd and 3rd arrows/3rd dot. Depending on the result of that ball - the next attempt might be by rolling ball between lane dots 3 and 5 and between arrows 10 and 15.

By focusing on the dots or arrows, this allows you to set up in the same place when you want a consistent delivery- thus, this will increase consistency, and your game will improve! This requires practice, practice and practice in shooting at the same target every time. Good luck and keep in striking!

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS LET’S DISCUSS BOWLING AS AN OLYMPIC SPORT!

...For decades bowling has spent millions attempting to gain admission as a medal sport. The best bowling has done is an exhibition sport. But bowling was represented in other ways and the trend is to cut sports, rather than add them.

Bowling, popular in more than 120 countries, with great administrative structures and competitive experience for all, has more than enough high plus marks, but never has received more than some kind words, but little action.

One expert suggested we come up with bowling on ice so we could qualify for the Winter Games. Bowling has been an international sport for more than 100 years and Tenpins is truly an American creation. The sport has been accepted in all types of all-sports world tests. Some day the Olympic officials will see the facts, but don’t hold your breath.

...The Professional Bowlers Association has an ambitious schedule starting in November of 2012 and running for 14 months through 2013 with new tournament spots overseas, a change in fields allowing more participants, added TV time, and other special touches that give the PBA an A+ in effort.

...Like it or not, we learn by looking, copying and repetition. So we naturally imitate winners, not losers. Top pros, male and female, and some top amateurs or outstanding league bowlers, must realize that they are indeed heroes and role models to others, young and old.

...This applies to all the so called unknowns who have been winning pro titles and other major events.

“Many a nobody who isn’t known by anybody becomes a somebody and is known by everybody, and everybody tells him they knew him when he was a nobody and they knew he would be a somebody someday.”

...If you are bowling badly, just remember that for every bowler rated a 10, there probably at least 10 ones.

...Hall of Fame inductions are highly emotional. The late Dick Weber, a veteran of countless speeches, print, radio and TV interviews, was so filled with pride that he burst into tears of joy when he was inducted into the ABC Hall. He was able to say only a few words, but his actions said volumes.

...The way a lot of bowlers get along on their tournament winnings is with great reluctance.

...Look for some bright young bowler with a super computer to attempt to change bowling’s scoring system. But also look for some bright older person with a computer to block any move to change the scoring way.

...Back in 1959 Janet Harman had the highest league average in the nation for a woman—197. These days that doesn’t lead many junior leagues. Are the bowlers that much better?

...If every college that fields a football team would put as much as it costs to support one varsity football player into a bowling program, collegiate bowling would boom.

...Want a good mental exercise? Try to keep your bowling score in roman numerals.

2012 PBA World Series of Bowling Returns to South Point

LAS VEGAS – South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas will host the fourth annual Professional Bowlers Association World Series of Bowling, a multi-event international competition, Nov. 2-11, that will kick off the 2012-13 PBA Tour season, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced Thursday.

The 2012 World Series of Bowling, the third consecutive hosted by South Point, will feature four PBA “animal pattern” championships and conclude with the PBA World Championship. The package of events also will include six ESPN television events, plus the 2012 WTBA World Bowling Tour Finals presented by the PBA. Two PBA Regional special events also are in the preliminary planning stage.

“Since its inception in 2009, the PBA World Series has evolved into the true world showcase for bowling that we hoped it would become,” Clark said. “Our newly-adopted relationships with the World Tenpin Bowling Association to expand PBA competition around the world will only enhance the drama that will unfold when we return to South Point in November. World Series IV is going to be fun.”

The World Series, which last year attracted more than 200 players from a record 15 different countries, will get underway with an open practice session on Friday, Nov. 2. Over the next four days, competitors will bowl eight-game qualifying sessions in the Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon and Scorpion Opens, respectively. At the conclusion of each daily qualifying round, the top 16 players will advance to an additional six-game qualifying session to determine the four players who will advance to the ESPN eliminator finals.

Combined 32-game pinfall from the four animal pattern events also will serve as qualifying scores for the PBA World Championship. The top 24 after 32 games will advance to round robin match play on Nov. 7 and 8. After 24 additional games of match play, the top five players will advance to the stepladder finals.

Television finals for delayed telecast on ESPN will be conducted on specially-installed lanes in an exhibition hall at South Casino and Hotel. The preliminary schedule calls for the WTBA World Bowling Tour Men’s and Women’s Finals, Cheetah Open and Viper Open finals to be conducted on Saturday, Nov. 10, with the Scorpion Open, Chameleon Open and PBA World Championship stepladder finals (in two sessions) to be conducted on Sunday, Nov. 11.

WOODLAND HILLS — The JAT made their first trip to the Valley last Sunday and stopped in for our annual visit to AMF Woodlake Bowl. 21 bowlers took the lanes in the Open Division and scoring was all over the map on the modified house shot.

After 6 games of qualifying, Jerome Jordan Jr. was leading the field at +166. Keyon Lemus was close at +137 and Chris Valenzuela +79, Oscar Chan +78 and Brandon Pekins +64 rounded out the top-5. Low to qualify was Terrence Robinson at -19.

In the play-in round, the top-4 took a bye while the other 8 fought for the last 4 spots in the quarterfinal round. In the 8-9 match, Jacob Camacho swept past Bobby Hornacek 2-0 while in the 5-12 match Brandon Pekins took out Terrence Robinson in two. Last tournament's champion Chris Valenzuela couldn't take advantage of the 3rd-seed, falling to red-hot Rance Dvorak 234-208 in the third game.

In the semis, Keyon Lemus finally cooled down Rance Dvorak 188-175 and 284-193 to advance to the finals. On the other side, Oscar Chan needed all three to eliminate Jacob Camacho 192-214, 254-193 and 268-229 to advance to the championship match.

In the finals, Oscar Chan took game one 210-184 while Keyon Lemus came back to take game two 224-195. In the final game it was close all the way until Oscar Chan stoned a 9-pin and unexpectedly flagged it, giving the momentum and the title to Keyon Lemus 204-196. Congratulations Keyon on your first JAT Open Division title!

"Our paths didn't cross again until we worked together at the PBA Summer Shootout last summer, but when we met again it was like we were old buddies."

McEachern, who has served as co-host for ESPN's World Series of Poker telecasts with analyst Norman Chad since the show's inception, has covered a variety of ESPN shows since 1994, including the Tour de France, X-Games, World Cup Skiing, billiards and K-1 Kickboxing. Prior to his work with ESPN, McEachern called sporting events such as inline skating, martial arts and outdoor recreational activities for NBC, Fox Sports and the former Outdoor Life Network.

McEachern received a Golden Mic Award for his radio work in Southern California and was nominated for an Emmy for his X-Games play-by-play coverage.

"As an avid sports fan my whole life, the weekends were often filled with watching sports and the PBA Tour telecasts were a can't-miss show," McEachern added.

"The PBA Tour has always been in the upper echelon of prestigious sports properties and I'm thrilled to be a part of it."

During a 25-year career on the lanes, Pedersen earned his place as one of the Tour's top players, winning 13 PBA Tour titles. His skills led to his selection as the 35th greatest player in PBA history as part of PBA's 50-year celebration in 2009, followed by his induction into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2011.

Since becoming the PBA Tour's color analyst in 2001, Pedersen has witnessed many memorable moments in PBA history, but counts the major championships as the most memorable.

"What has been the most memorable for me over the past 12 years has been covering some of the greatest majors in PBA history," Pedersen said.

"The past three seasons have been good examples when you look at Kelly Kulick becoming the first woman to win a Tour event at the Tournament of Champions in 2010; Mika (Koivuniemi) winning the TOC with a 299 in the semifinal match in 2011, and Pete Weber's dramatic fifth

at a National event.

Funny story, while subbing in a scratch league at Lindbrook Bowl in 1997, Pam's team was opposing Mark's team when they both started with the first 9 strikes. Pam was up first and bowled her second sanctioned 300 game. Mark left a solid 10 Pin and is probably the reason for his quote in her book.

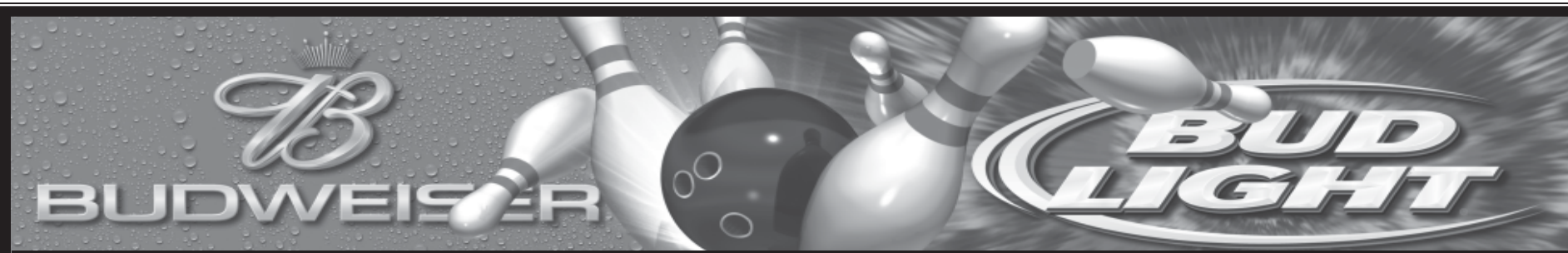
Pam wanted to thank Arvo Dygert and Barry Asher for drilling her bowling balls over the years. And of course, her husband Jon for his continued support.
