Which PBA Bowlers Have The Most Social Media Followers?

One of the great things about the sport of bowling is how accessible the players are, whether in a bowling center or on social media. So, that got us thinking, which PBA bowlers have the biggest social media following?

We looked only at the Top 50 players on the PBA points list so far this year and found that between Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, the Top 50 have a combined 883,000 followers. The most fans are on Facebook with more than 433,000, followed by Instagram at about 268,000 and Twitter had around 182,000.

To help you figure out who to follow, here's a look at the Top 5 heavy hitters on social media.



1. Jason Belmonte

Belmonte is a social media powerhouse and leads his peers on all three platforms. On Facebook, he has more than 108,000 likes, while tallying more than 71,000 on Instagram. He also has more than 34,000 followers on Twitter. There's a reason Belmonte racks up big numbers and it's not just because he's one of the best on the lanes. Belmonte is also one at the best at engaging with fans on social media.

2. Sean Rash

With a heavy Facebook following, Rash comes in at No. 2 on the list with a combined 54,000 followers across all three platforms. Rash is most active on Facebook, constantly posting content, including Facebook live streams.

3. Chris Barnes

At 48, Barnes is the oldest on our Top 5 list of social media PBA stars but he has embraced social media and is especially strong on Facebook and Twitter. He comes in with a total of just under 45,000 total fans, although very few of them are on Instagram as his account is set to private.

4. EJ Tackett

There's no doubt Tackett's success on the lanes the past few years have helped add to his social media following, especially among a younger audience on Instagram. Tackett has more than 35,000 social follows, with 13,500 of those coming on Instagram. Most of his content on Facebook and Twitter is shared or retweeted posts, so keep an eye on his Instagram for original content.

5. Marshall Kent

Although not super active on social media recently, Kent has put together a big following totaling 33,000. A vast majority of those come from Instagram, where he ranks among the PBA's best with nearly 17,000 followers.

MARIA JOSE RODRIGUEZ WINS 2018 PWBA TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP

RICHMOND, Va. - Colombia's Maria Jose Rodriguez capped the 2018 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour season Wednesday by winning her first career PWBA Tour title at the PWBA Tour Championship.

Rodriguez edged Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, inside the Old Dominion Building at Richmond Raceway, 236-228, to collect a major championship and \$20,000 top prize.

The championship round was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

The 29-year-old right-hander gained the early advantage against Kulick, posting six strikes in her first eight frames, but back-to-back 10 pins in the ninth and 10th frames gave Ku-



lick, who was working on four consecutive strikes, the chance to win her seventh major title.

Needing a strike on her first delivery for a chance to win, Kulick left a 10 pin of her own to record her second consecutive runner-

up at the Tour Championship.

"I could only control what I could control," Rodriguez said. "I made great shots and was happy with how I threw it. When Kelly left the 10 pin, I couldn't believe it. I started to shake

so bad, and I still can't believe it. I've worked so hard and fought so hard, and I'm so happy this happened."

Rodriguez used different bowling balls on each lane during her semifinal and championship matches, continued on page 8

Hurricane Florence Doesn't Damage PBA50 Invite Host Center

SHALLOTTE – A region hard hit by Hurricane Florence will still host the upcoming PBA50 Storm Invitational live on Flo-Bowling on Sept. 29-30 after host venue Planet Fun Bowling and Entertainment Center in Shallotte, North Carolina, escaped any major damage.

Located just a few miles from the Atlantic Ocean, Planet Fun is right between Wilmington, North Carolina, and Myrtle Beach, South Carolina but avoided any flood damage because of forward thinking when the center was built.

Despite more than a dozen inches of rain and having a river right behind



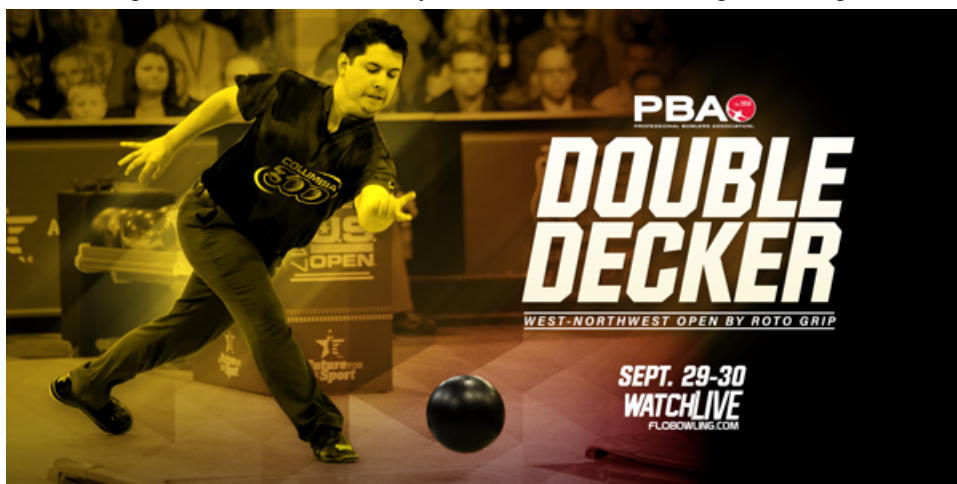
it, the center escaped flooding because "we raised the center about 11 feet to get out of flood plain when we built it," Planet Fun proprietor Brian McCall said in a PBA news release. "We got it about 19 feet above sea level. It certainly has paid for itself a couple of times over. The river has never gotten to our parking lot, but we can see it from there." The PBA50 Storm Invitational will feature a

star-studded field of the top PBA50 players competing in a special end-of-season event. Among those in the field are Michael Haugen Jr., Brian Kretzer, Ron Mohr, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Norm Duke, Parker Bohn III, Lennie Boresch Jr., Amleto Monacelli, Ryan Shafer, Bob Learn Jr., Pete Weber, Harry Sullins, Brian Voss and Johnny Petraglia.

McCall told the PBA

the event may prove to be therapeutic for the region.

"We look forward to hosting the event," McCall said in the release. "We know people will show up to support it. We hope it'll be a breath of fresh air for people around here. We had to shut down the center for a week because our league bowlers couldn't get here, but as bad as things have been, they could have been a whole lot worse."

WINNETKA – Skip Brown strode purposefully to the line in the 10th frame of the final game with the outcome in his hands.

Skip, averaging 165, needed a strike to earn his team a victory for the game and a sweep for the day during play in the Funtimers senior league at Winnetka Bowl. The right-hander sailed the ball wide and it hooked into the pocket on the Brooklyn side and splattered all the pins down.

“You won us the game!” his teammates roared in approval.

“At least I accomplished something,” responded Skip with a shrug. He felt he had not bowled up to his capabilities that Wednesday afternoon and wasn’t mollified by his team’s sweep.

Skip says he’s known as “Grumpy,” and is the Grand Poobah Grump of his team that is known as the “3 Grumps.”

I happen to be a charter member of that three-man team in my first year in the league, so I’ve become a Grump by association. Gary Covitt is the other member of the team though he disavows any link to grumpiness.

“You guys are lucky,” said Skip’s too-good-to-be-true wife Jaravee, who shows every week to support her husband and keep score. “He smiles at you. He usually doesn’t smile at anyone.”

One thing should be pointed out at this time. Skip calls himself “Grump,” but he’s actually not a grump whatsoever.

As Gary reminded Skip after the latter delivered the winning shot: “You’re not a Grump. You’re the nicest guy around.”

Still, it’s a great running gag about Skip’s grumpiness because, in truth, sometimes he can be grumpy – as we all can be when we fail to meet our often-lofty personal expectations.

“If I’m not bowling a 185 average, then I’m not really happy,” he says.

Fortunately for Gary and me, Skip likes us and we’re one happy “Grump” family. Perhaps it’s helped that Skip has turned in a myriad of clutch shots in the later frames to boost us into a torrid 14-win, 7-loss start after three weeks. As first-time bowlers with Skip, Gary and I have found him extremely supportive and simply a great teammate.

Gary, in his first-ever season of league play, may be boosting Skip’s mood because Gary has been radiating joy with a pair of out-of-the-blue 200 games the past week.

“I’m not a Grump,” says the always-cheerful Gary. “I don’t want to be part of that.”

Still, Gary and I go along with the team name, because, well, we told Skip to come up with a nickname that was a reflection of him.

Naturally, he picked the “3 Grumps.”

Even if the three of us really aren’t.

It just makes for a good story.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: SIMONSEN NIPS LAVERY-SPAHR IN KANSAS

Four-time PBA Tour champion Anthony Simonsen from Austin, Texas, won five of his eight matches to overtake Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, and claim his fifth PBA Regional title in the second annual PBA Liberal Kansas Southwest Open Sunday at Ayr Lanes.

Simonsen began the eight-game modified round-robin finals with 102-pin lead over Lavery-Spahr, but dropped his first two matches before eking out a 177-163 win over Dylan Burns from Garden City, Kan. Meanwhile, Lavery-Spahr won his first three matches with games of 239, 229, and 247, to build his lead to over 120 pins. Simonsen then out-dueled Anthony’s twin brother, Sean Lavery-Spahr, to win a 279-275 decision in game 4 to narrow the gap as the top two players pulled away from the rest of the field.

Going into position round, Anthony Lavery-Spahr held a nine-pin lead, needing to defeat Simonsen for the title. But Simonsen converted the 6-7-10 split in the ninth frame and then filled the 10th frame with a strike and spare to win the match, 226-223, and claim the \$4,500 first place check. Simonsen finished with a 21-game total of 5,019 pins, including match play bonus pins, for a 24-pin margin of victory over Anthony Lavery-Spahr, who earned \$3,000 as runner-up.

• Ryan Ciminelli of Clarence, N.Y. defeated Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio by 42 pins to win the Professional Bowlers Association Sturgis Central/Midwest Open at Sturgis Bowl in Sturgis, Mich., Sunday.

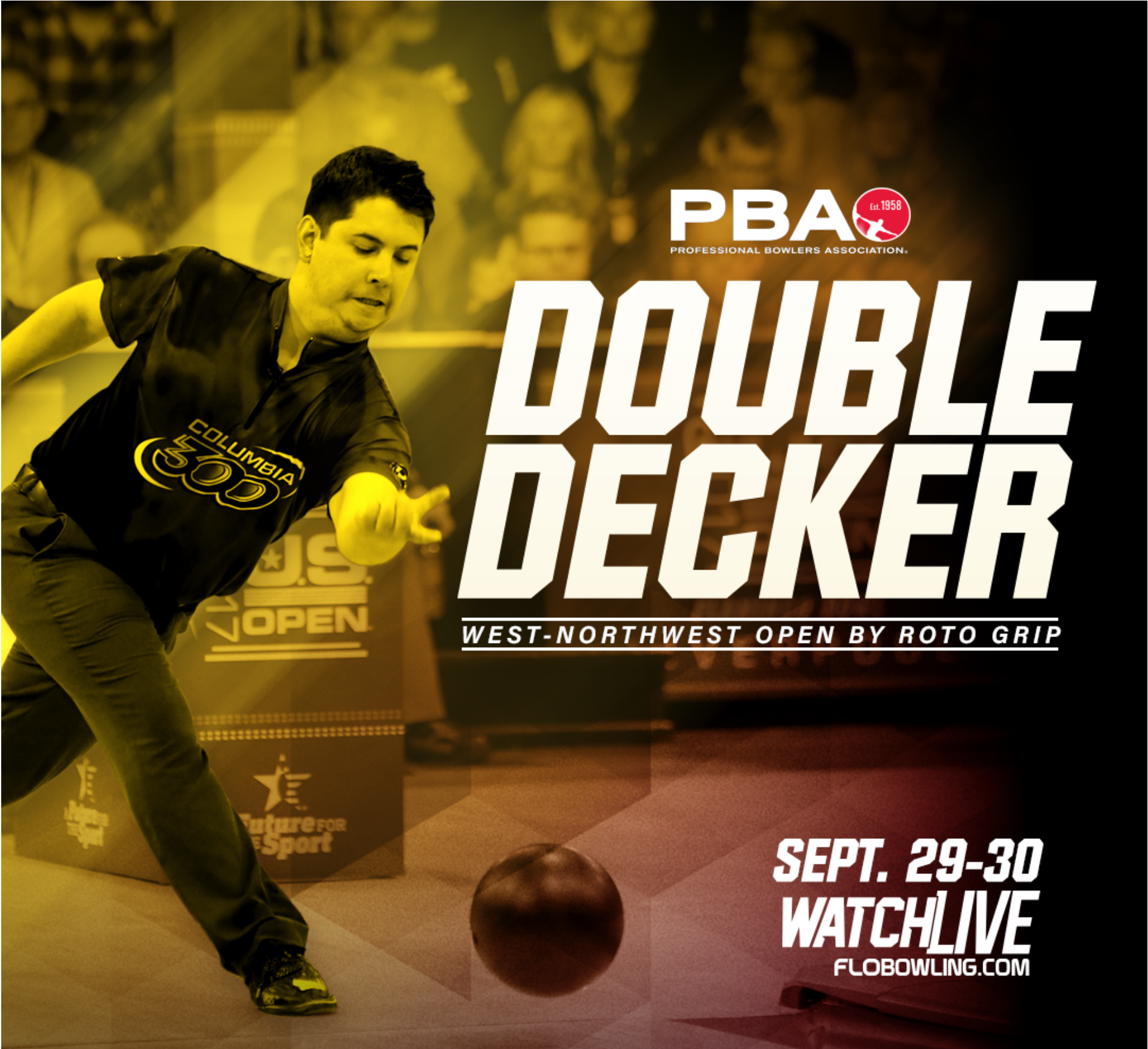
Ciminelli finished with a 6-2 match play record and a total of 4,738 pins for 21 games, including match play bonus pins, to win his 12th career title along with the \$2,600 first prize.

Top Performers on PBA50 Tour in 2018 to Compete in PBA50 Storm Invitational

10 Hall of Famers in 14-player field that will feature 2018 season's top 12 in points and two invitees

SHALLOTTE, N.C. (Sept. 24, 2018) – What has now become the aptly-named PBA50 Storm Invitational, showcasing 14 top PBA50 Tour bowlers in head-to-head match play competition, will officially conclude the 2018 PBA50 Tour season Sept. 29-30 at Planet Fun Bowling & Entertainment Center in Shallotte, N.C.

Named after tournament sponsor Storm Bowling Products (not Hurricane Florence), the top 12 players in points on PBA's tour for players 50 and over, led by 2018 PBA50 Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr., plus two invitees (Hall of Famers Johnny Petraglia and Brian Voss) will compete in the "all-star" special event.

Admission is free and fans will also be able to watch the event in its entirety beginning with the first match play round Saturday, Sept. 29 at 10 a.m. ET on PBA's online bowling channel, PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling, which will feature multiple streams that will cover all of the lanes used for every game. The top 12 in order of points ranking who will compete in the event along with their 2018 season highlights are:

Michael Haugen Jr., Phoenix, Ariz. – Five-time PBA Tour and three-time PBA50 Tour titlist earned 2018 PBA50 Player of the Year honors after winning Rookie of the Year in 2017. Won Johnny Petraglia BVL Open and River City Extreme Open to become only multiple winner in 2018. Also had two runner-up finishes and two third-place finishes including third in the USBC Senior Masters.

Brian Kretzer, Dayton, Ohio – One-time PBA Tour winner won season-ending PBA50 Cup for his first PBA50 Tour title. Also had three other top-five finishes including a runner-up finish in Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open.

Ron Mohr, Las Vegas – PBA Hall of Famer won Northern California Classic for his 10th career PBA50 Tour title. He also had five other top-five finishes including a third in the PBA50 National Championship and won PBA60 Player of the Year honors for the third consecutive year.

Walter Ray Williams Jr., Oxford, Fla. - PBA and USBC Hall of Famer who is the PBA Tour's all-time career titles leader with 47 wins, had three PBA50 Tour runner-up finishes in 2018. The 11-time PBA50 Tour winner also had two other top-five finishes including fifth in the PBA50 National Championship.

Norm Duke, Clermont, Fla. – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer won the PBA50 Security Federal Savings Bank Championship for his fifth PBA50 Tour title. The 38-time winner

on the PBA Tour also had five other top-five finishes including runner-up finishes in the USBC Senior Masters and PBA50 National Championship.

Parker Bohn III, Jackson, N.J. – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer, 35-time PBA Tour winner and four-time PBA50 Tour titlist had five top-five finishes with best of third in Dave Small's Championship Lanes Classic.

Lennie Boresch Jr., Kenosha, Wis. – USBC Hall of Famer won the PBA50 National Championship for fourth career PBA50 title and first major win. Also had a runner-up finish in the PBA50 Mooresville (N.C.) Open.

Amleto Monacelli, Venezuela – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer, 20-time PBA Tour winner and eight-time PBA50 Tour titlist had six top-10 finishes with best of second in season-ending PBA50 Cup.

Ryan Shafer, Horseheads, N.Y. – Five-time PBA Tour winner had six top-10 finishes including career-best PBA50 Tour finish of second in Security Federal Savings Bank Championship.

Bob Learn Jr., Erie, Pa. – Five-time PBA Tour winner and three-time PBA50 Tour winner had six top-10 finishes including season-best second in River City Extreme Open.

Pete Weber, St. Ann, Mo. – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer, 37-time PBA Tour and 11-time PBA50 Tour winner had three top-10 finishes with best of fourth in Mooresville Open and sixth-place finishes in Suncoast Senior U.S. Open and PBA50 National Championship.

Harry Sullins, Chesterfield Twp., Mich. – USBC Hall of Famer, five-time PBA Tour and three-time PBA50 Tour winner had five top-15 finishes with best of eighth in South Shore Open.

Invitees

Johnny Petraglia, Jackson, N.J. – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer is a 14-time PBA Tour and eight-time PBA50 Tour winner. He is the only player to win a national PBA tournament (PBA Tour or PBA50 Tour) in six different decades.

Brian Voss, Cornelius, N.C. – PBA and USBC Hall of Famer with 25 PBA Tour titles, won Mooresville Open for second career PBA50 Tour title. Also had third-place finish in Suncoast Senior U.S. Open.

While the event will not award a PBA50 title, the players will be bowling for a \$10,000 first prize.

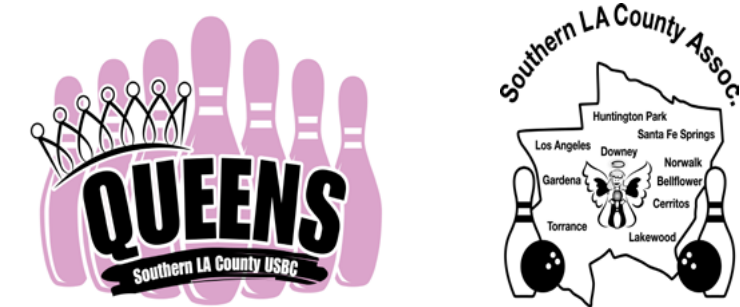

relying on the information she gained on that pair of lanes in bracket play.

"I bowled on that pair twice in match play, and I'm now thankful each match went to five games," Rodriguez said. "I got to see the transition and how those lanes ended up playing totally different. I just learned by watching and trying different things in match play, and I knew I couldn't use the same ball on both lanes."

Rodriguez burst onto the scene in 2014, winning the United States Bowling Congress Queens in Reno, Nevada. That title match also was against Kulick and ended in similar fashion. Needing a double to win, Kulick left a 10 pin to give Rodriguez the 190-189 victory.

In Wednesday's opening match, Rodriguez rolled eight strikes to hold off a charging Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, 237-224.

Rodriguez struck on five of her first six shots to build an early lead on McEwan, who opened in the fourth frame. McEwan responded with five consecutive strikes to put herself in position to advance with a double in the 10th frame, but she was unable to get the 10 pin out on her first delivery.

Kulick cruised in match play at the Old Dominion Building, getting more comfortable as she continued to move closer to the CBS Sports Network final, which included finishing with a 770 total in her final three games to close out Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York.

The 41-year-old right-hander was frustrated as she tried to get her fit to cooperate in both of her matches Wednesday, but she took solace in knowing she executed the way she wanted to in her final frame.

"I didn't have the feel I had all week long, and that's what I was searching for," Kulick said. "Once I found it against Maria, I executed the way I wanted. When I needed to make a good shot in the 10th frame, I did, so I'm walking away knowing I threw the best shot I possibly could. It ended up being a weak 10, but it was a pocket delivery that was well executed. I walk away knowing I left nothing on the table. Am I disappointed? Absolutely. But if I keep knocking on the door, it's going to push itself open."

Kulick's semifinal win was a rematch of last year's title tilt against defending champion and 2018 PWBA Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois.

O'Keefe started quickly in her return trip to the Old Dominion Building, rolling four consecutive strikes, but Kulick matched the effort starting in the sixth frame to bring the match within two pins.

O'Keefe, a two-time winner in 2018, put the match in Kulick's hands in the ninth frame with a 3-4-6-7-10 split she was unable to convert. Kulick closed out the game to win, 243-210.

The 16-player field at the Tour Championship included all of this year's eligible PWBA Tour champions, and the final spots in the bracket were filled in using the 2018 PWBA Tour points list.

Players were seeded into the bracket based on their ranking on the points list, and each bracket match featured a best-of-five format leading up to Wednesday's semifinals. The Tour Championship is a single-elimination event.

Four lanes were specially installed for the 2018 event inside the Old Dominion Building by QubicaAMF, the official supplier of bowling equipment for the 2018 PWBA Tour Championship.

All rounds leading up to the championship round were broadcast live on BOWL.com's BowlTV.

EIGHT MORE CHINESE BOWLERS QUALIFY FOR PBA MEMBERSHIP

Thanks to the on-going efforts of Frank Zhao, owner of Longmarch Bowling in China, eight more Chinese bowlers have qualified to apply for PBA membership by participating in the 14th Longmarch Pioneers Tournament at Tian-Cheng-Hong-Ri Bowling Center in Shenyang in north China.

To qualify for PBA membership, the bowlers have to average 200 or more over a minimum of 21 games on PBA-level lane conditions. In the Longmarch tournament, 25 players bowled 36 games in three days and eight topped the 200 average target.

Since China entered players in PBA World Series of Bowling VI in 2014, a total of 94 bowlers have qualified and applied for PBA membership through Zhao’s Pioneers Tournaments, including 89 men and five women representing players from Taiwan, The Philippines and Hong Kong as well as China. Six of the 94 were younger than 24; the rest were 24 or older.

Zhao hopes to bring a contingent of Chinese PBA members to WSOB X at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., in March of 2019.

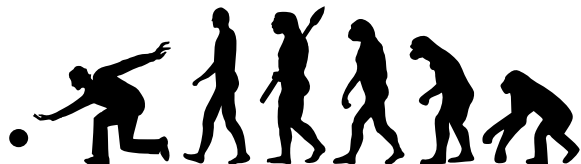

The fabulous Junior bowlers of the 80's became the stars of the next 30 years!

- Here are a few names that made the Junior results page every week. RICK BARBARIA, SAM CONSOS, MARK FISSEr, JEFF GOBLE, ED HARNSTROM, BOB LASTER, STEVE SMITH, PAUL VARELA, CHARLES WILLISON, DINA BRAASCH, MICHELLE GARCIA, JULIE GARDNER, POLLY HALE, STACY RIDER and MICHELLE SILVER. As we stroll thru 1986 more Junior news will make the head lines.
 - JOHN CHAPMAN rolled his first 300 game at **KEYSTONE LANES**. JOHN, what are you doing these days? Back in the "Saddle"?
 - FRANK PASQUALE, owner of **ARENA BOWL** in South Gate, was once the Mayor of Lake Elsinore!
 - The Sunbelt Bowlers Tour was going strong after 5 years! 2 divisions and paying out thousands of \$ \$ \$ every week.
 - HARRY GRANT wrote three "farewell columns" before his center closed in May. Imagine how many bowlers he knew after 40 years in business! More later.
 - HELEN BAKER was W.I.B.C. President.
 - GUPPY TROUP gave BOB COSTAS a pair of his wild pants.
 - WENDY MACPHERSON won the U.S. Open in Topeka, Kansas.
 - DONNA ADAMEK won 4 "Bowler of the Year" titles and dubbed "the greatest bowler in Southern California. (Maybe the greatest right hander. TISH JOHNSON had to be the greatest left-hander.)
 - 3,650 delegates attended the W.I.B.C. Annual Meeting in Orange County. AGNES DUFFY was First Vice President.
 - RICKY CORONA — no one wanted to see him signing in to bowl a tournament. He was good AND tough. Made many trips to the bank.
 - LILA BORNHAUSEN and her NBAC just kept on rolling. She wrote the longest stories every week!
 - Picture this. The W.I.B.C. Convention in Anaheim is about to open. The Convention Hall doors scheduled to part at 10 a.m. Who comes dancing out to meet the delegates? The Disney characters from across the street! What a photo moment for the out of towners.
 - Nineteen Pro Shops advertise weekly.
 - The Grant Classic in 1986 was scheduled to start July 12 at **Grand Center Bowl** in Glendale.
 - The High Roller, rollin' at the SHOWBOAT had a possible \$250,000.00 prize fund. Win only 2 matches and cash for \$1,000.00.
 - How about these ladies teaming up to bowl W.I.B.C. in Orange County. MARIANNE FU, LORI WILLIAMS, TERESE ABAlR, LAUREN TAKAHASHI and KIM TERRELL. News of the tournament covered 1/2 of every issue all summer. Writers loved to write their stories about the ladies and for the ladies. Big time action for Southern California.
 - One reason centers were closing in the 80's was insurance prices. Typical - - the \$75,000.00 a year was hiked to \$295,000.00!!!! That's a lot of shoe rentals. How about new scoring? Artificial lanes? Bumpers? Lane machines? Bowlers wanted all the best at old prices. Property prices were going up fast, leasing even faster. So Calif. had a lot of "outdoor" options for activities. How about beaches, mountains, deserts, AND DISNEYLAND??
 - BO BURTON was over-heard saying "The hardest shot to throw on T.V. was after the first commercial." Holman said BO was right!
 - RAMONA CLARK - Orange Co. President was untiring the whole summer the W.I.B.C. was here. She beat the drum, led the parade, swept the streets, made the speeches, took the bows, soothed the workers, encouraged the losers - - all with a smile. Her smile was bigger as she passed the torch to the Hartford, Conn. President. If there is a bowling heaven - - - she doesn't want to be president!
 - Here's a biggie! The Sunbelt Bowlers Tour was scheduled Memorial week-end at GRAND CENTRAL BOWL. Guaranteed prize fund of \$25,000.00. First place \$10,000.00. \$70.00 entry fee and you had to be a club member.
 - WONDERBOWL DOWNEY opened in 1959 and closed on May 18, 1986. They had hundreds of bowlers that found new homes at KEYSTONE LANES and DEL RIO LANES. (More later)
 - The oldest league west of the Mississippi celebrated its 75th birthday. The Telco Men's League was started in 1911 at the ANGELUS ACADEMY in Los Angeles. By 1943 Teclco leagues had filled three more centers, including SUNSET CENTER. (That building now houses KTLA and KMPC T.V. STATIONS.)
 - What does "B.V.L." stand for? Why do bowlers raise money for B.V.L.?" Bowlers Victory Legion (also known as "Bowling for Veterans with Love). Hospitalized military personnel are supplied with everything except doctor ordered procedures. T.V.'s, cards, vans, bowling equipment, sports gears, etc. are on their yearly shopping list. Everything from bombers to bowling balls, have been purchased with B.V.L. bucks.
 - OAK TREE LANES in DIAMOND BAR opened in May. 36 lanes and a night club.
 - BRUNSWICK CORP. had a Junior League promoter called "Chief Halftown." He beat the drum, excited the kids and signed them up for a league before the first lesson was over.
 - Fact: President Kennedy actually rolled a game at WONDERBOWL DOWNEY in its hayday. At one time WONDERBOWL had over 5,000 league bowlers! They hosted PBA event, T.V. contests, association tourneys, etc., etc. etc. What a loss to bowling!
- 1986 saw several centers close their doors forever. BUT, new centers in new neighborhoods connected by new freeways brought bowling out of the dark and into the automated era. 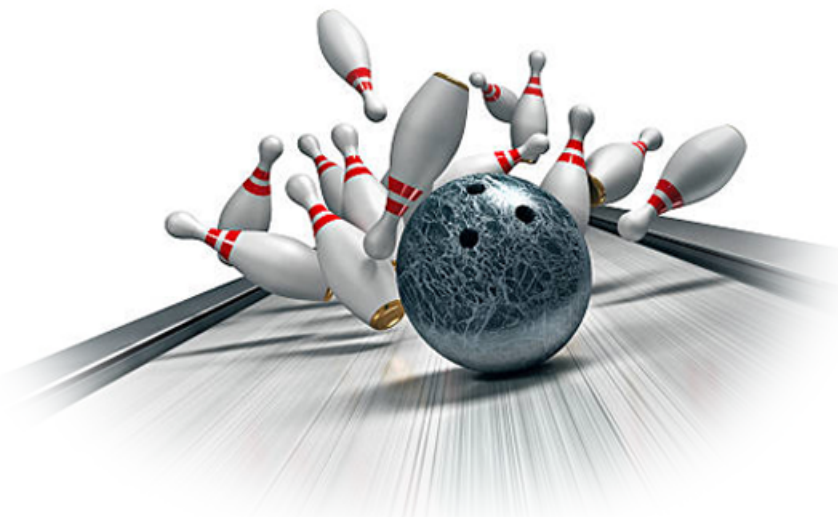
