Glover Masters Defending Champion Scott Norton Does A Repeat

BAKERSFIELD—This year's Step Ladder Finals final match between defending Champion and top seed, Scott Norton (San Francisco) and second seed Chad Uyhara (Fresno) set the stage, saving the best for last, as both players showcased a final match-up that went down to the last frame to determine the winner at the 3rd annual Glover Masters Scratch Bowling Tournament held September 26-27, 2009, at AMF Southwest Lanes in Bakersfield, CA.

Both Norton and Uyhara strung their share of strikes with Norton stringing 7 starting with the fourth frame and Uyhara stringing 5 starting at the fifth frame. But it came down to the tenth with Norton finishing with a nice 258 game to defeat Uyhara (245). Norton, who was hot off winning his third PBA Regional in Las Vegas the weekend before this event, was relieved to know his bowling skills are back after taking two months off to prepare for his bar exam. Added Norton, "There aren't many tournaments I can guarantee 100% that I'll be back to, but this is definitely one!"

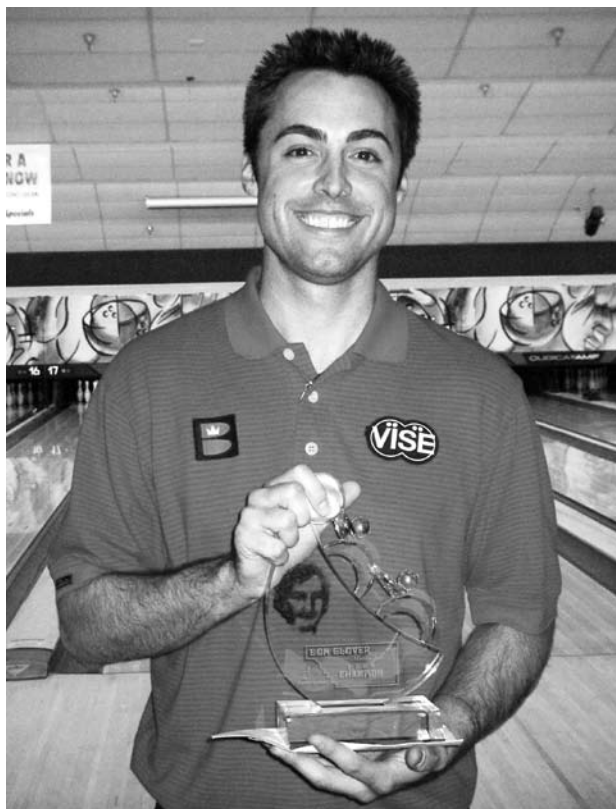
At the start of Sunday's Match Play Finals, it looked like it was going to be a show down of the former Glover Champions, Norton and PJ Haggerty (Clovis) as both were highest qualifiers in their Saturday Qualifying squads.

Haggerty won the 9 a.m. "A" squad while Norton won the 1 p.m. "B" squad. But when the Top 20 Qualifiers hit the floor Saturday night to cut the field to the Top 10 for Sunday's Finals, PJ Haggerty led the pack with +428 and Norton slipped to sixth with +193. Bakersfield had two local bowlers who also made the Top 10 cut—Junior Patrick Smith, seventh (+179) and Zack Newman, ninth (+133).

This year's event drew a total of 81 entries which included Brett Wolfe (Scottsdale, AZ) an ABC Masters title holder, Robin Romeo (Santa Clarita) a PWBA title holder and Hall of Famer, and Missy Bellinder (Fullerton), the first woman PBA member and PBA Regional title holder. JP Smith (Bakersfield) shot the highest game of the event—a 290.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico - Team USA's men and women swept the gold medals in trios Thursday at the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships.

Lynda Barnes, Shannon O'Keefe and Shannon Pluhowsky earned the American women their first gold medal of the championships by finishing with a six-game total of 3,980. For the men, Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones and Bill O'Neill earned the gold with 3,915 at Carolina Bowling Center.

"It was a total team effort by both the men's and the women's teams," Lynda Barnes said. "It was just plain fun out there tonight and we worked together as a team."

O'Keefe led the threesome with 1,353, an average of better than 225 per game, while Pluhowsky was a close second with 1,344.

Barnes finished with 1,283 as Team USA pulled away from the field in Game 5 with a 759 game.

Team USA Women Dominate Team Event at PABCON Championships

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico - The Team USA women put on a dominate performance Friday night as they rolled to a record-setting team victory at the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships.

The United States totaled 6,494 for six games at Carolina Bowling Center, easily breaking the previous record of 6,357 set by Team USA in 2008. Colombia took the silver medal with 6,146, while the Dominican Republic earned bronze with 5,969.

Lynda Barnes led Team USA with 1,315, an average of nearly 220 per game, and was joined by Diandra Asbaty (1,303), Kim Terrell-Kearney (1,283), Shannon Pluhowsky (1,250), Shannon O'Keefe (707) and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard (636).

"It was just so cool to be out there and play tonight," O'Keefe said. "We always come here hoping to win team event. We played well together and communicated well. It was a total team effort."

The Americans led the Dominican Republic by just 32 pins after three games, but pulled away to win the title by nearly 350 pins. Team USA had games of 1,089, 1,103 and 1,141 to close out the victory.

Barnes, Jones Win Doubles Gold in Puerto Rico

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico - A day after Team USA's Bill O'Neill broke the singles record, his teammates Chris Barnes and Tommy Jones smashed the doubles record at the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships.

Barnes and Jones combined to shoot 2,788 on the first of three squads Wednesday morning and held on throughout the day to win the title at Carolina Bowling Center.

Jones led the duo with 1,404 for six games, an average of 234, while Barnes totaled 1,384, an average of 230.67. Their total broke the previous record of 2,709, set by Mexico's Victor Mar and Vicente Mendez in 1989.

"We are really pleased with how we performed, especially since the lanes played completely different today than they did in the practice session a couple days ago," Barnes said. "We came in with a strategy and had to change that quite a bit. We could have given away a lot of pins, but we changed our strategy."

Barnes and Jones used a huge final game of 536 to push their score over the record mark. Jones closed with 279, while Barnes added 257.

West won his first two matches, before bowing out. His two match losses were closely contested, and were against bowlers who finished in the top eight. Each match was three games, and the tourney featured a double elimination format.

The Citrus Belt has produced five previous California Masters champions: Roy Dunn (1967), Gary Madison (1970), PBA great Walter Ray Williams Jr. (1982), Bob Warning (1991), and Marv Sargent (1994).

Yes, WALTER RAY WILLIAMS, JR. was a Citrus Belt league bowler in the early 1980s, before turning pro. Among others, he bowled in leagues at Arrowhead Lanes in San Bernardino and tournaments at the Bowlum, Del Rosa Lanes, Empire Bowl, and San Hi Lanes. At last summers Bowl Expo in Las Vegas, Walter Ray told me he has fond memories of his Citrus Belt days, and the weekend tourneys he bowled in that helped pay for his college tuition.



O'Neill Breaks PABCON Record En Route To Singles Gold

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico—Competing as a Team USA member for the first time, Bill O'Neill put on a record-breaking performance in winning the singles gold medal Tuesday at the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships.

O'Neill totaled 1,475 for six games, an average of nearly 246, to win the opening event at Carolina Bowling Center. He had games of 229, 204, 238, 279, 246 and 279 on the day's opening squad and broke the previous record of 1,428, which was set in 2001 by Canada's Danvyck Briere.

"This is all pretty interesting to me because I didn't expect it," said O'Neill, who was added to Team USA in January by the coaching staff after a strong performance on the Professional Bowlers Association Tour. "I just wanted to come out and bowl well to make the coaches feel like they made a good decision by picking me."

O'Neill said he entered Tuesday's event with modest expectations, hoping just to get his feet wet in his first international tournament as a member of Team USA.

"I really didn't plan on winning the first event," O'Neill said. "But hopefully this is a sign of things to come for the rest of the week."

Team USA earned two other medals in singles as Diandra Asbaty took the women's silver medal with 1,355, and David Haynes earned the men's bronze with 1,388.

Mexico's Jorge Rosado finished with 1,422 to take the silver medal for the men. Venezuela's Karen Marciano shot 1,364 to win the women's gold, while Panama's Tilcia Lancini took the bronze with 1,323.

As for the rest of the Team USA players, Kim Terrell-Kearney was fourth, 10 pins back of the bronze medal. Shannon O'Keefe finished fifth with 1,305, while Lynda Barnes was sixth with 1,300. Shannon Pluhowsky ended up 12th with 1,271.

On the men's side, Chris Barnes was eighth with 1,351, while Patrick Allen was ninth with 1,340. Tommy Jones finished 16th with 1,308, and Cassidy Schaub was 26th with 1,271.

Team USA Men Come From Behind to Win Gold in Puerto Rico

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico - Entering the final round trailing by more than 180 pins to Mexico, Team USA stormed back in dramatic fashion to win the men’s team event Saturday morning at the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships. The United States finished with 6,697 and easily pulled away from Mexico in the final three games while also breaking the event record of 6,464 set by Team USA in 2007. The Mexicans finished nearly 300 pins behind with 6,411. Venezuela took the bronze with 6,210 at Carolina Bowling Center.

Bill O’Neill totaled 1,456 for six games, including an 804 series Saturday morning, to lead Team USA, and he was joined by David Haynes (1,319), Tommy Jones (1,268), Chris Barnes (1,247), Cassidy Schaub (740) and Patrick Allen (667).

Team USA opened Saturday morning’s second block with a 1,278 to overcome the deficit they faced after three games and take a lead they would never give back.

“We knew we needed to get out of the gate strong today,” O’Neill said. “Three of us struck on six of our first seven shots and that really set the tone for the first game. It was pretty impressive how we all worked and struck together.”

O’Neill also dominated the all-events standings as Team USA swept the medals. O’Neill finished the 24 games with 5,589, an average of 232.21, and beat out Jones by more than 300 pins for the gold medal. Jones took silver with 5,287 and Haynes earned bronze with 5,285.

“To come here and bowl with these guys has just been amazing,” O’Neill said. “To perform this well in front of these guys and coaches means so much to me.”

Barnes finished fourth, Allen was sixth an Schaub was 11th as all six Team USA players advanced to Saturday afternoon’s Masters match play, which features the top 16 players in the all-events standings.
