PBA Tour Champion Tony Reyes Dies From Injuries Suffered in Car Accident

SEATTLE — The sport of bowling was shaken Friday with the news that PBA Tour champion Tony Reyes had been killed in a car accident in California.

Reyes, 38, who competed in 14 seasons on the PBA Tour, won his lone Tour title in dramatic fashion in the 2006 Motor City Classic in Detroit where he bowled the 18th televised 300 game in PBA Tour history in the semifinal match against Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III before going on to defeat Wes Malott in the championship match 255-238.

Reyes, of San Bruno, Calif., cut back on Tour competition in recent seasons to concentrate on his pro shop business and coaching. Most recently, he finished sixth in the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions, 21st in 2012 and 37th in 2011.

"It is a sad day for the PBA and bowling," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "You hear descriptions about people all the time as being 'great guys.' Well in Tony Reyes' case, that is an understatement. Tony Reyes was liked by everyone. He was a great bowler, a unique talent with a gift of spreading the virtues of the game, a wonderful friend and the sadness we feel is indescribable. Our thoughts are with the Reyes family.

Reyes, who also won eight PBA Regional titles, graduated from San Jose State University in 1998 with a degree in radio, television and film. He competed on the San Jose State bowling team from 1992-95 and was named First Team All-America in 1993 and '95. He was an assistant coach for the San Jose State bowling team.

"Tony Reyes was an amaz-

ing person," said PBA Deputy Commissioner and longtime PBA Tour Director Kirk von Krueger.

"When he walked into a room, you just couldn't help but smile; he simply made you feel good. Tony's '100 watt'

smile was a window into the man inside and it told you everything you needed to know about him."

According to the San Bruno Patch News website, the accident occurred in the early morning hours Friday in the

town of Redwood City.

Reyes was married to wife Nicole and had a one-year-old daughter, Gianna.

Additional details regarding his death were limited and information regarding services is still pending.

“Buddies for Tony” Fundraising Program to Benefit Tony Reyes Family

In the wake of the tragic death of popular PBA champion Tony Reyes, an outpouring of “what can I do to help?” messages have flooded the PBA office, Facebook and other community forums.

A number of tributes and fundraising programs to benefit Reyes’ family are under discussion, but one fundraising effort that is already in place was created by Chrissie (Beamish) Kent and her husband, 10-time PBA Tour champion Doug Kent. Chrissie Kent has launched a national fund-raising effort through “Scentsy,” a direct-sales company founded to market wickless candles and fragrances. The Kents also have established a not-for-profit bank account in their hometown of Newark, N.Y., to benefit Reyes’ wife Nicole and daughter Gianna.

“When we heard the news about Tony, Doug and I thought there had to be something we could do to help Tony’s family. He was such an amazing individual,” Chrissie said. “You don’t really know how many lives you have impacted until something like this happens, and Tony had an impact on thousands of people.”

To make a lengthy story shorter, Chrissie (who represents the product line) developed a promotion through Scentsy called “Buddies for Tony.” The program involves a stuffed animal called a “Scentsy Buddy” with a zippered back where a scent pak is inserted. Each animal normally sells for \$25, but there is currently a two-for-one promotion (two Buddies for Tony for \$25) – and all proceeds are being donated to the “Buddies for Tony” bank account at Lyons National Bank in Newark, N.Y.

Services Set For PBA Tournament Host Don Mitchell

INDIANAPOLIS – Funeral services for long-time Indianapolis Professional Bowlers Association tournament host Don Mitchell, who died at his home on Sept. 27 after a lengthy illness, are scheduled for Tuesday at Crown Hill Funeral Home Remembrance Chapel in Indianapolis.

Mitchell, who was 80, owned the Royal Pin Leisure Centers chain in Indianapolis, including Woodland Bowl, Western Bowl, Expo Bowl and Southern Bowl before his retirement. Woodland Bowl, which has hosted several major championships including the U.S. Open and PBA Touring Players Championship, will be the site of the 2013 PBA Tournament of Champions. An Indianapolis chain of Don Mitchell Pro Shops is named in his honor.

A Korean War veteran, Mitchell has been inducted into several bowling halls of fame. He is survived by his sons David and Craig, daughter Donna Leimgruber, their spouses, nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Of course the Shark is a sport pattern with a lower ratio of oil than the Mainstreet.

Some of our senior ladies are having a smooth stroll on Empire's Mainstreet pattern. The scoring trolley stopped on lanes one, seven, eleven, twelve, and twenty-four last week. The ladies on those lanes scored about fifteen pins above average to open the season in the Senior Laughlin League.

Father & Son Roll 300's Same Game

SAN DIEGO — Rolling a 300? Special. Two bowlers rolling 300s in the same game? Stunning.

One of the bowlers a right-hander, the other a lefty? C'mon. Father and son bowling the 300s, on the same lanes? Maybe in "Laverne & Shirley," but not in real life.

But that's what Jim and Will Boucher pulled off recently at Mira Mesa Lanes.

"Me, personally, it's probably the most memorable 300 I'll ever have," said Will, 28, who lives near Temecula. "The odds of ever doing it again are so astronomical, even to do it once. I think I was crying after he rolled the last strike."

Jim, 63, the lefty who lives in Ramona, has been sliding down lanes since he was 6.

Will, 28, started bowling at 9. Jim has bowled five sanctioned 300s, Will three. Their averages are almost identical. Dad: 225; son: 227.

Will rolled first in the four-man rotation. Jim bowled last. After father and son opened with seven or eight strikes, they sensed something special.

"It was a matter of looking into each other's eyes and saying, 'We're going to do this. We're going to make this happen,'" Will said.

Will did his part, knocking down three strikes in the 10th frame.

So what was on dad's mind when he grabbed his 15-pounder and stared down the lane?

"Ain't no way I can be second shoe," said Jim. "Being my son, I can't let him show me up."

And when he splattered all 10 pins on his final roll, what flashed through his mind?

"That he didn't beat me. My son and I are very competitive in the bowling atmosphere." Later, Jim reflected on their feat.

"It's one of those elated moments that you and your son will treasure the rest of your life," he said. "One of those special days you don't replace."

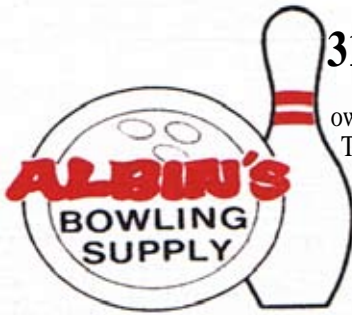

COVINA — We returned to Covina Lanes where we saw 168 entries come out on Saturday for an exciting day of bowling. The cut scores were +65 for the men and +14 for the women, on a semi-tough shot. Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) were Lonzell Burnett +52, Jun Contreras +36, and Sierrrie Herradura -34. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 42 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers were Matt Garcia for the men with a +129. For the women it was Deb Sanders with a +98. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$842. Matt would draw the score and he drew a 549. We had no bowlers that bowled this score so we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,000 at West Covina Lanes event. Joey Nepomuceno was last standing for the 3-6-9 roll-off. He got the chance to go for \$800. He was no able to get all five strikes or nine counts so he takes home a consolation of \$50. The pot will be at \$900 at West Covina Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were the Bowling Garcias—Matt and

Darren Garcia with a 1423 for \$110. Finishing in second was Vuong Do and Matt Garcia with a 1411 for \$90. There was a total of \$860 paid out in doubles and 19 paid spots with low to cash of 1335.

After bowling the semi-finals, finishing in first was Ping Romero with a +165 and will bowl for the title. Runner-up was Danny Guevarra at a +132. Danny will sit out the first round. Our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Ping drew a 291. We had no bowlers who shot that score, so it will continue to carry over. There are five full pots, and another building that is currently at \$2,475.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Bobbie McCullom, Deborah Martin Abahaz, Ricardo Baca, Fred Go, Sierrrie Herradura, Sandy Roseblum, and John Armenia. Each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Lonzell Burnett, George Marquez, Darren Garcia, who lost to his brother in this round and Danny Guevarra with each getting checks of \$105.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$43. Freddie Zamora, to a high of \$115, Pat Mana-

lo.. In number one match, it was Freddy Zamora the third seed versus Cezar Marcella the eighth seed. This was another of our fine close scoring matches that was seen during the first two rounds with Cezar taking it with a 228 to 212 final to advance. In the other match it was Matt Garcia the 14th seed versus Pat Manalo the seventh seed. This was another one of the high scoring matches that Matt was involved in, but this time it was Pat who won with a 270 to 226 to advance. Freddie and Matt finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$112.50 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the seventh and eighth seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Pat paying \$115 and Cezar paying \$61 if they would win their match. Cezar would lead off the match with a strike. Pat would open in the first frame and follow that up with a spare. Cezar would open in the second frame but follow that up with a spare of his own. After another open by Pat in the third frame, Pat was down by 14 at that point. After marks by both bowlers in the next two frames and an open by both in the sixth it was a 15 pin lead at this point for Cezar. After marks by Cezar in the seventh and eighth and opens

by Pat in the same frames, the lead was now 38 pins and that would be enough to send Cezar on to the title match with a final score of 165/202 to 134/168. Pat would finish in third place for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Cezar as a horse, he paid \$61.

The title game was set, and it would be two of the finest gentlemen in the Club. The top qualifier Ping Romero going for his third title and Cezar Marcella going for his first championship. Lon McEachern will be announcer and PBA Hall of Famer Randy Pedersen will be color analyst for all ESPN-PBA telecasts.

The schedule announced today includes only the winter and spring segments of the PBA’s 2012-13 schedule. Coverage of additional events, including the 70th U.S. Open, will be announced later.

“Since 1979 when ESPN made its debut, the PBA and ESPN have enjoyed a wonderful partnership that has allowed millions of bowling fans to watch the best in bowling,” Clark said. “We are, as always, excited to not only continue our relationship, but to expand our Sunday coverage to two hours for 11 of our 16 telecasts this season, and to include an all-new concept in professional bowling as part of our 2012-13 lineup.”

“We continue to work with our partners at the PBA to develop new ways of enhancing the bowling product,” Bernstein said. “The addition of 30 minutes of action to most of our Sunday shows this season is a great way to serve loyal fans of the sport.”

The winter-spring ESPN lineup will include six telecasts originating from the PBA World Series of Bowling IV in Las Vegas, followed by the finals of the Round 1 Japan Cup from Tokyo, the Chris Paul PBA League All Stars, five new PBA League telecasts – including live coverage of the first PBA League event on Sunday, Jan. 27, from Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich. - and live coverage of the United States Bowling Congress Masters from Brunswick Zone Carolier in N. Brunswick, N.J., on Sunday, Feb. 24, and PBA Tournament of Champions from Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis on Sunday, March 31.

PBA coverage will take a two-week break in mid-March during the NCAA basketball tournament.



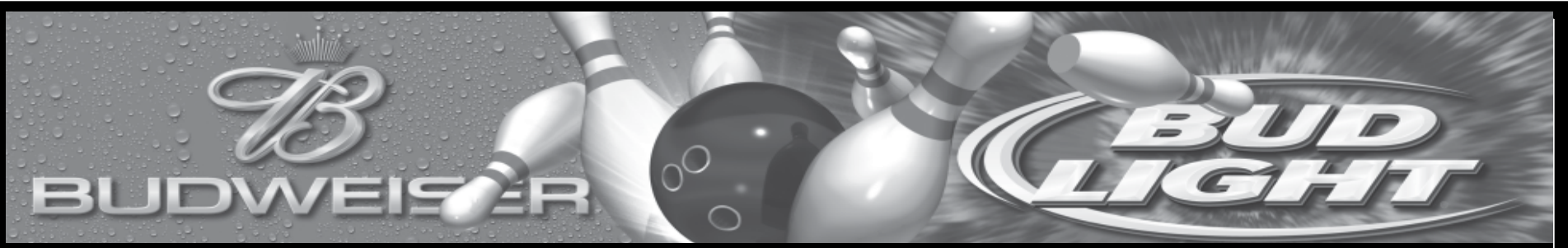
