Danielle McEwan Wins PBA International-WBT Thailand Title

Four-time PWBA titlist turns back England's Stuart Williams in two-game title match

BANGKOK, Thailand - Top qualifier Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y., turned back Stuart Williams of England in a two-game championship match to win the PBA International-WBT Thailand at Blu-O Rhythm and Bowl Paragon on Friday.

McEwan, a four-time Professional Women's Bowling Association titlist, won the six-game qualifying round to earn the top berth in the eight-player stepladder finals by seven pins over Malaysia's Rafiq Ismail, taking advantage of the eight handicap pins per game awarded to women in

the tournament.

Williams, who qualified third, defeated Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., 182-173, and Ismail, 206-205, to advance to the title match where he needed to beat McEwan twice to win the event. Williams won the first game, 232-218, but McEwan won the second, 225-179, to claim the \$31,908 first prize.

McEwan is a PBA member, but won't receive credit for a PBA title because she accepted the handicap pins.

Plans Moving Forward to Introduce Revolutionary PBA Playoffs in 2019

Historic competition with \$100,000 first prize will be a centerpiece of PBA's inaugural season on FOX Sports

CHICAGO – With the return of Professional Bowlers Association competition to broadcast television looming in 2019, the PBA and its new broadcast partner, FOX Sports, are finalizing plans for an historic PBA Playoffs series that will add unprecedented drama to the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's 61st season.

Beginning in January, PBA members will compete in a schedule of 13 PBA Tour events, earning points toward 24 berths in an all-new PBA Playoffs match play elimination series that will unfold over nine weeks of television coverage on FOX Sports' FS1 and FOX channels. The 10-event television series will begin with live coverage of the first Round of 24 matches from Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, on Monday, April 8, and conclude with live coverage of the semifinal and final rounds on FOX on Saturday and Sunday, June 1-2, also from Bayside Bowl.

Details for each tournament, including schedules, formats and more, are posted on pba.com under the "Schedules/2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour" tab. The winner of the PBA Playoffs will earn \$100,000.

"With the largest first prize in bowling at stake and live broadcast TV on FOX for the championship rounds, qualifying for the PBA Playoffs will be the goal of every player on the 2019 PBA Tour," said Tom Clark, PBA CEO and Commissioner. "At each of the 13 Tour events leading up to the Playoffs, points will be at stake, with only the top 24 making the cut. Keeping track of that points list during the first part of the year, and then watching all the intense elimination matches play out on mostly Monday nights in the spring on FS1, the Playoffs will capture the attention of fans everywhere.

"We couldn't choose a better home for the first PBA Playoffs on FOX Sports than Portland's Bayside Bowl, with its great fan base and unique atmosphere. Maine is going to host the most exciting tournament ever held."

Here's how the PBA Playoffs will unfold:

- PBA Tour players will earn points based on positions for both qualifying and final standings in 13 tournaments classified as Tier 1 (major championship), Tier 2 (traditional) events, or Tier 3 (small or limited field, short format) events. Tier 1 events will award 50 percent more points than Tier 2 and three times as many as Tier 3 events.

March 11-18 – PBA World Series of Bowling X Cheetah Championship, Allen Park, Mich. (Tier 3)

March 11-19 – PBA World Series of Bowling X Chameleon Championship, Allen Park, Mich. (Tier 3). March 11-20 – PBA World Series of Bowling X Scorpion Championship, Allen Park, Mich. (Tier 3).

March 11-21 – PBA World Series of Bowling PBA World Championship, Allen Park, Mich. (Tier 1).

March 26-April 1 – USBC Masters, Las Vegas (Tier 1).

- If any of the 2019 events includes a limited field, all PBA members will have the opportunity to advance into the field through a PTQ regardless of the size of the field.
- In each Tier 1, 2 or 3 tournament, up to 64 players may earn points for their finishing positions in both qualifying and the finals. The maximum a player can earn in a Tier 2 event will be 5,000 points per event (1,000 for leading qualifying, 4,000 for winning the tournament. In Tier 1 events, 64 players will earn points. The maximum will be 7,500 points (1,500 for leading qualifying, 6,000 for winning the event). In Tier 3 tournaments, the maximum will be 2,500 points (500 for leading qualifying, 2,000 for winning the event).
- Based on cumulative points earned at the completion of the USBC Masters, the top 24 players will advance to the PBA Playoffs. The top 8 on the points list will earn a bye for the first single-elimination match play round.
- The Round of 24 will include qualifiers 9 through 24 bowling one-game matches. The winners will advance to the Round of 16 (joining qualifiers 1-8) for best-of-three-game matches wherein the third game will consist of a two-frame tiebreaker if needed. The winners will continue to advance to the Round of 8, the semifinal round and the championship for the two survivors.
- Complete details including pairings, prize money & more will be posted on the PBA Playoffs page on pba.com in the near future.
- The PBA Playoffs will be contested in front of Bayside Bowl's enthusiastic fans in Portland, Maine, beginning with a live telecast on Monday, April 8, on FS1. Preliminary rounds will air for eight consecutive Monday nights through May 27. The semifinals and finals will then move to FOX for live coverage at noon Eastern on Saturday and Sunday, June 1-2.

Rich Lapiezo: A True Bowling Marvel

LA MESA. Calif. - Now it can be told.

Rich Lapiezo, the amazing 70-year-old from San Diego County, has carved a pattern of astonishing bowling feats.

It was chronicled on these pages how Lapiezo, whose right leg above the knee was amputated after a horrendous 1981 accident at the San Diego naval base, rattled off five 300s in league play within a month. The string of perfectos at Parkway Bowl in El Cajon started July 9. For good measure, Lapiezo tossed in a personal-best 834 (257-277-300) series on July 19.

But Lapiezo actually amazed a year earlier when he knocked down the 7-10 split twice within 10 days at Parkway Bowl. With his three-step approach, Lapiezo rolls the ball a mere 13 miles per hour so he devised a way to convert the dreaded "railroad."

"I can't overpower the pins, so I try to hit the seven pin as light as I can on the right side so it hits the side wall and hopefully it will carom off the side and hit the 10," said the right-handed Lapiezo, touting his cerebral approach.

And that's precisely what happened.

And darn if it didn't happen twice.

But there's more to the story.

After dropping the 7-10 for the second time, guess what he leaves the following frame?

Can you believe it's another 7-10?

But this time, no dice.

Lapiezo, a La Mesa resident, once again banks the 7 pin against the wall and it starts rolling toward the 10 pin. And wouldn't you know it? The 7 comes into contact with the 10, but the 10 refuses to go down.

Two 7-10s within 10 days is certainly a boast-worthy event, but the ever-modest Lapiezo would have none of it. "It's a fluke whenever you pick up the 7-10. You got to get a good bounce," said Lapiezo, who bowls with a

prosthetic leg. When asked if his pair of 7-10 conversions ranks with his flurry of 300 games, Lapiezo put it all in perspective.

"One 300 is way more memorable than [converting] the 7-10," said Lapiezo, a true bowling marvel.



Rich Lapiezo nailed five perfect games within a month this year, but his astonishing bowling actually showed itself in 2017 when he nailed two 7-10 splits within 10 days.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Beats Norm Duke to Win PBA50 Storm Invitational

Williams defeats Duke 259-237 in title match to win tournament

SHALLOTTE, N.C. - In a showdown between two of the Professional Bowlers Association's all-time greats, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. beat fellow hall of famer and top qualifier Norm Duke, 259-237, in the title match Sunday to win the PBA50 Storm Invitational at Planet Fun Bowling & Entertainment Center.

Williams and Duke were part of an elite 14-player field that competed in the "all-star" non-title special event that featured the top 12 in points from PBA's tour for players 50 and over plus invitees hall of famers Johnny Petraglia and Brian Voss.

Down by eight pins in the fourth frame of the title match, Williams, the PBA Tour's career titles leader with 47 wins and an 11time PBA50 Tour winner, took advantage of a missed 9-pin by Duke in the fifth frame and then struck on the next seven of eight

shots to take the title.

"When I got done with practice I wasn't real excited about how I was going to play the lanes," said Williams, who turns 59 on Oct. 6. Going into the semifinal match I planned on playing the lanes straighter but I had to make an adjustment a little further inside and hook it a little more. When I go to the title match against Norm I started to feel pretty comfortable and

didn't miss the pocket.

"Both of us threw good shots in the title match," Williams added. "I was fortunate that I only left two 10 pins."

Both Williams and Duke, who is third on the all-time PBA Tour titles list with 38 wins and also owns five PBA50 Tour titles, have been bowling against each other in tour competition for more than three



"We've been bowling against each other for a long time and he's a great player," Williams said. "When you bowl someone like Norm, you always feel fortunate to come out on the winning end."

Williams finished the season fourth in points with three runner-up finishes and two other top-five finishes including fifth in the PBA50 National Championship. Duke, who finished the season fifth in points, had one title in 2018 and runner-up finishes in the PBA50 National Championship and USBC Senior Masters.

Williams, who qualified second for the finals after two seven-game match play rounds, defeated No. 3 qualifier five-time PBA Tour winner Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 256-212, in the semifinal to advance to the title match against Duke.

Shafer, who finished ninth in points, had six PBA50 Tour top-10 finishes including a career best of second.

In the second match, Shafer beat USBC Hall of Famer and 2018 PBA50 National Championship winner Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., who qualified fifth for the finals, 257-222, to advance to the semifinal match against Williams.

In the opening match Boresch, who finished the season seventh in points, beat 2018 PBA50 Player of the Year and season points leader Michael Haugen Jr., of Phoenix, 225-207, to advance to the second stepladder match against Shofer

05 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year after becoming the second player in PBA history to finish among the top five in all four PBA majors during the same season – finishing second in the USBC Masters and U.S. Open, fifth in the PBA Tournament of Champions and winning the PBA World Championship.

"I don't know exactly how I feel yet," Allen said. "People are always saying you're a lock (for hall of fame election), but you don't know until it happens. I'm just happy I finally got there. I'm going to embrace it, and now I'll have to figure out a speech.

"It was a helluva ride," the 48-year-old left-hander said. "It just went faster than I would have liked. You blink your eyes and wonder, where did it go? But the time comes for every professional athlete, and the results show that. Your mind says you can do it, but your body won't respond. You have to know when to say when."

Koivuniemi, who now resides in the United Arab Emirates where he is coaching the UAE national bowling team, is a 14-time PBA Tour champion who earned his nickname – Major Mika – after winning two majors before he won his first "standard" PBA Tour title. In his first PBA television appearance, Koivuniemi defeated PBA star Pete Weber by a pin to win the 2000 USBC Masters. A year later he won the U.S. Open, and he claimed the crown jewel of his PBA career in 2011, when he won the \$250,000 first prize in the \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions.

"I'm having a really good day," the 51-year-old Koivuniemi said. "It was a really great call (from Tom Clark).

"I was 32 when I joined the PBA, but I had my experience around the world before I joined. But back then bowling on tour was something you needed to learn about. To bowl every week and to realize how good the players really were was different. Even when you had a good week, making the top 24 or a (TV) show was really hard. I knew I had to get better.

"It's amazing how fast time goes," he added. "I can't believe it's been almost three years since I bowled on tour for the last time. But being in the hall of fame now is a great, great honor."

Johnson, who began his journey into bowling journalism at age 15, is the only person in the bowling family to serve as editor of four national bowling magazines, winning 75 national writing awards for his news, feature and editorial compositions, many of which directly involved the PBA. Currently Senior Editor of Bowlers Journal International and editor of the BJI Cyber Report, he is a recipient of both the International Bowling Media Association's Luby Hall of Fame Award and the Mid-America Bowling Writers Golden Quill Award.

"I have been blessed to be able to cover bowling competition at the highest level, to see the best players bowl in the most pressure-packaged situations, and to be able to talk to them and write about them is a privilege I've never taken lightly," Johnson said. "To be honored for the work I've done is really something I don't have the words to describe. If I was talking about someone else, I could describe, but myself? Well, that's difficult."

Doty, who has served as general manager of Indianapolis' Royal Pin Leisure Centers chain since 1996, has served as host for every major championship tournament conducted by the PBA at least once over the past two-plus decades. The 1971 Indiana University graduate joined the Royal Pin group in 1978, working under Royal Pin founder and 2018 PBA Hall of Fame inductee Don Mitchell as marketing manager until his promotion to general manager.

"It's a nice way to start your week," said Doty of his congratulatory call from Clark. "It was a surprise. I wasn't thinking about it, actually. I don't think you do what you do with the hopes of someday being put into the hall of fame, but it's always nice to be recognized for what you do.

"It's not only me; it's having a great staff of people who make these things happen," Doty added. "It's a continuing process. At Woodland Bowl, we have endeared ourselves to the PBA over the years. The bowling industry is changing, but traditions need to be retained and honored, and that's what we try to do."

Additional career details for the four inductees are included below.

The 2019 PBA Hall of Fame ceremonies will be live streamed by PBA Xtra Frame on FloBowling. Tickets for the event will be available online in the future (https://www.pba.com/Tickets).

PATRICK ALLEN CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Patrick Allen, affectionately known as "P.A." among his peers, had 40 top-five finishes in the 300 PBA Tour events he entered, cashing in 214 of them and averaging at a 218.9 pace for more than 6,300 games. He finished in the top 10 in PBA earnings six times, and won the 2005 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Award after earning \$350,740 – the second highest total in PBA history (behind only Walter Ray Williams Jr.'s \$419,700 for the 2002-03 season.

Allen won his first PBA Tour title in the 2001 Greater Detroit Open, and has two majors in the 2005 PBA World Championship and the 2009 PBA Tournament of Champions. The 2004-05 season was especially memorable because he became the second PBA player ever to place in the top five in all four majors in a single season (second in the USBC Masters, 2nd in the U.S. Open, first in the PBA World Championship and fifth in the PBA Tournament of Champions.

As a full-time competitor, the New York native also won 30 PBA Regional titles including posting victories in the PBA's East, South, Central, Southwest and West Regions. He has earned \$1,539,260 during his career.

MIKA KOIVUNIEMI CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Mika Koivuniemi, who didn't join the PBA until he was 32, quickly earned the nickname "Major Mika" after winning the 2000 USBC Masters and 2001 U.S. Open before winning his first "standard" PBA Tour title in 2003. His most memorable feat might have been his historic 299-100 victory over Tom Daugherty in the semifinal match of the 2011 PBA Tournament of Champions, followed by a victory over Tom Smallwood in the title match of the \$1 million event, winning the richest first prize in PBA history (\$250,000).

Despite his reasonably-late start in PBA Tour competition, the native of Finland bowled in 405 PBA Tour events and finished in the top five 45 times on his way to \$1,851,503 in career earnings. He finished in the top 10 in earnings eight times, averaged 219.21 for 6,774 games and won the Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Award in 2004 and 2011.

A member of the World Bowling Writers and Finland Bowling Halls of Fame, Koivuniemi has won titles and bowled 300 games in 21 different countries. He bowled the 17th nationally-televised PBA 300 game during the finals of the 2003 Cambridge Credit Classic – the first standard PBA Tour event he won. He is the only foreign-born player to win both the USBC Masters and the U.S. Open, and he was the first European bowler to win the Japan Cup.

In his second year as a PBA50 Tour competitor, he added another major – the 2018 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open.

BOB JOHNSON CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Bob Johnson started working for the Pacific Bowler when he was 15 years old, and he's still writing about bowling 45 years later. He is the only person to have served as Editor of the American Bowling Congress' Bowling Magazine, International Bowling Industry, Bowlers Journal International, and Bowling Center Management.

During his tenure at Bowlers Journal, he produced BJI's historic 300-page 100th Anniversary Issue and he wrote several key chapters in the PBA's "50 Greatest" book published by Luby Publishing.

Through the years, Johnson has covered every PBA major tournament among other important events and has interviewed dozens of PBA players. He has written countless editorials and columns suggesting ideas or changes for the betterment of the PBA and the enrichment of its players. He has delved into some of the PBA's most sensitive moments, including Scott Norton's decision to "come out" as a gay bowler, how Ryan Shafer dealt with his wife's suicide, and Mark Baker's battle with addiction.

JIM DOTY CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Jim Doty is general manager of Royal Pin Leisure centers, the Indianapolis chain that includes long-time PBA host Woodland Bowl, Western Bowl, Expo Bowl and Southern Bowl. Doty, who graduated from Indiana University in 1971 with a business degree, worked at Nora Bowl while attending high school and college. He joined the Royal Pin group in 1978, serving as general manager of 421 Bowl and Woodland Bowl while also serving as marketing director for the chain. He was promoted to general manager of all Royal Pin centers in 1996.

Under Doty's leadership, Royal Pin Leisure Centers has hosted PBA events over a span of 20 years, including the U.S. Open, PBA Touring Players Championship, USBC Masters, PBA World Championship, PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA League Elias Cup finals among other events. Woodland Bowl is the only center to host all five PBA major Championships.

The Royal Pin group also has hosted the USBC Junior Gold Championships a record five times, the 1999 USBC Women's Championships and Queens. Nearly 20 local high school teams call one of Royal Pin's centers home. Doty also is a past president and currently a director with the Central Indiana Bowling Centers Association. He served multiple terms as a BPAA board member, serving on BPAA's marketing committee.

Last week, Cohen went from infamous to marvel-

In March, Cohen made a determined bid for his first 300 game – striking on his first nine shots only to throw a gutter ball on his first ball in the 10th frame. Cohen, a right-hander from Sherman Oaks, blamed jitters and a poor release for his errant shot. His near-300 was chronicled in the California Bowling News and Cohen said he awaited his "redemption story."

And here it is.

Cohen found his groove again last Tuesday night in the "Guys and Dolls" league at Winnetka Bowl in his final game and he never lost it.

Cohen rolled a no-close-calls perfect game en route to a 704 series (213-191-300).

Cohen had previously bowled a 299 at Mission Hills Bowl four years ago and had a 289 last year. His gutter-ball game in March ended in a 269.

"After [the 300] was over, I joked that the third time is a charm, but I think this was the sixth time, because I flirted with [a 300] five or six times," Cohen said. "It was a sense of utter relief because I finally got the milestone."

The 55-year-old Cohen said his past experience with near 300s was helpful this time around. "I think it helped a lot," he said. He also cited the fact that teams were still bowling while he was delivering his final three shots in the 10th.

"There were people bowling on the left [during the 10th frame] and that helped me to relax," Cohen said. "Other times people would stop bowling and the bowling alley would be totally quiet."

And there was something else that helped Cohen's magical night.

"Before I started the third game, I switched bowling balls to one I had been using consistently because it seemed to carry a little better," he said.

He stated emphatically that he had no flashbacks to his March pratfall.

"I didn't have the jitters or an adrenaline rush as in the past," Cohen said.

So now that he's reached his primary goal, what's next for Cohen to accomplish? "Now my goal is to get an 800 series," he said.



This was one of bowlings greatest years in Southern California. New centers, new products, new clubs and new opinions on how to manage it all. Part III will take us on an interesting trip. So let's get started.

- New tournament club announced in May of 1986, Touring Amateur Bowlers. Must be a member to bowl in their first event at the SHOWBOAT. Will it be a hit or a miss??? Stay tuned.
- At the ENCINO BOWL auction, items went fast, from bar stools to pots and pans. The 30 lanes, machines and ball returns were sold as a package. (Maybe to the Museum!) HARRY GRANT said it was MUCH harder to close a center than open one.
- GARY FORD formerly the G.M. at UNIVERSITY LANES in San Diego was at the helm of BOWLIING SQUARE in Arcadia. (Remember all the turquoise jewelry he wore??)
- EDIE ADAMS was emcee for the annual Bowling Writers Award banquet at the Sportsmen's Lodge. She was once married to ERNIE KOVACS and was the spokeswoman for Muriel Cigars.
- TISH JOHNSON averaged 227 in the State Queen's Tournament, and re-peated her win of 1983.
- The "No Cash Tour" was designed for Junior hot shots to hone their skills for the J.A.T.
 Competition and bragging rights was the whole point of the tournaments. No prizes, no
 cash, no rewards just for the "love of the game".
- LLOYD STONE FRIENDLY HILLS Junior Coach had over 150 kids in his YABA program. MARLENE FONDREN, G.M. had a "whacky" idea for 9 p.m. leagues. She charged 25 cents a game. Soooo, league fees per night were \$3.00. That included lines, sheet service and prize fund. Her 9 p.m. lanes were packed.
- Bowling Writers Award Winners: TISH JOHNSON and JIM MURTISHAW, Bowlers of the Year. Over 500 had dinner and applauded the stars. MARK FISSER / Marchione Award. JACK PENNINGTON / Ray Hanley Award. GORDON MURREY / Executive of the Year. BERNIE WHITLOCK / Sponsor of the Year. Hall of Fame Inductee / RON WINGER.
- RUSTY BRYANT (Pro Shop Owner) shot 900 in the Travel League. O.K., so it's four games! 214, 218, 201, 267.
- The "HIGH ROLLER" projected a prize fund of over a million dollars in 1987. In 1986 they paid out \$912,000.00.
- RICK BARBARIA beat JIM HAMRICK in JAT at GARDEN SQUARE BOWL. That was Rick's third straight title. Top JAT girls this year; MICHELLE GARCIA, STACY RIDER and MICHELLE SILVER.
- GORDON MURREY SR. tested his Pathfinder Lanes and suggested a life-span of 40 to 50 years. Murrey International produced lanes, pin decks, approaches, ball returns, telescores, etc. GORDON JR. carries on - and on - and on.
- Old fact. The U.S. Postal Service issued an 8 cents bowling stamp in 1971.
- DICK WEBER won the P.B.A. at SHOWBOAT, banking \$13,000.00. Fifth place paid \$4,000. Hardly enough to travel to the next stop. 18th place got \$1,900.00. No sponsor? Poor parents? Tough way to make a living.


- PASQUALE'S ARENA BOWL was open 24 hours a day.
- VIOLETT WYKOFF was the President of the Los Angeles W.B.A. EVA MASON was secretary. Judy Lee was elected to Hall of Fame.
- 98 year old ETHEL BRUNNICK bowled in the W.I.B.C. Her doubles partner was only 78. KONA LANES was honored to have the ladies.
- VILLAGE LANES was sold to ACTIVE WEST CORP.
- DALE EAGLE was P.B.A. victor in Seattle.
- ROSA PECK, San Gabriel Valley scribe, bowler and 300 shooter (while 7 months pregnant) passed away. She always had her kids or grandkids with her on the lanes. She once rolled two 10 game marathons back to back!
- Active West Corp. bought up 25 Southland centers from San Diego to northern L.A. county.
- Noted bowling writer BOB JOHNSON revealed his first job at KONA LANES was bus boy under DICK STOEFFLER'S guidance. Their friendship and respect lasted until Stoeffler's passage.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE:

WALTER RAY WILLIAMS JR. WINS 108TH PBA TITLE IN CANTON

PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., defeated Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 237-203, to take the first prize in the PBA50 Canton South Open presented by Roto Grip at Cherokee Lanes in Canton, Ga., Sunday, improving his all-time PBA titles record to 108.

The 58-year-old Williams qualified in fourth place for the stepladder finals with a 3-5 match play record and a 16-game total of 3,699 pins, including match play bonus pins, and then won three consecutive matches to earn the \$1,500 first prize. Kretzer posted an 8-0 match play record and had 4,059 pins to qualify first, 360 pins ahead of Williams, but had to settle for the \$900 second prize.

Williams, the all-time PBA Tour titles leader with 47, also has won 33 standard PBA Regional titles, 12 PBA50 Tour and 16 PBA50 Regional titles.

In the first stepladder match Williams defeated Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., 10-9 in a one-ball roll-off after they tied, 195-195. Williams then disposed of Greg Thomas of Irmo, S.C., 226-181, in the semifinal match.

- Kyle Mayberry of Mechanicsburg, Ohio defeated Zach Doty of Campbellsville, Ky., 204-189, to win the PBA Florence Bowling Center Central Open in Florence, Ky., Saturday. Mayberry, who earned his second regional title and \$2,000 for the one-day event, downed JR Raymond of Clinton Twp., Mich., 2-1, while Doty blanked Graham Fach of Canada, 2-0, in the best-of-three-game semi-final round to set up the championship match.
- Brad Miller of Lees Summit, Mo., defeated Tony Manna Jr. of Papillion, Neb., 2,930-2,854, to win the PBA Mockingbird Lanes Midwest Open and Jeff Johnson of Freeport, Ill., defeated Steve Rogers of Manteno, Ill., 3,045-2,922, to win the PBA50 Mockingbird Lanes Midwest Open in Omaha in a Sunday PBA Midwest Region doubleheader.

Miller won his third career regional title along with a \$2,300 prize for his 13-game pinfall total. Johnson won his first PBA50 regional title and \$2,000.

• Ray Edwards of Middle Island, N.Y. and partner Greg Ostrander of Freehold, N.J., defeated Don Herrington of Ballston Lake, N.Y. and Jeff Voght of Canajoharie, N.Y., 388-460, 421-384, 431-406, in the best-of-three-game title match of the PBA50/PBA Millsboro Lanes Doubles Sunday in Millsboro, Del.

The win was the 21st career regional title for Edwards, the reigning PBA50 East Region Player of the Year, and the third for Ostrander. Each earned \$2,000.

In the best-of-three semifinal round, Edwards and Ostrander defeated Darryl Bower of Middletown, Pa. and Kerry Smith of New Holland, Pa., 2-0, while Herrington and Voght eliminated Mike Taylor of Havertown, Pa. and Dave Knight Jr. of Glassboro, N.J., 2-1.

• Jacob Cutler from College Station, Texas, completed his quest for his first PBA title, throwing three strikes in his 10th frame for

a 258-254 victory over Trey Sledge of Amarillo, Texas, to win the PBA Lubbock Sports Southwest Challenge presented by Ebonite Sunday at South Plains Lanes in Lubbock, Texas.

After Sledge, a non-member, struck out in his half of the final frame, Cutler matched Sledge to claim the winner's check of \$2,000

Cutler had built a sizable lead by winning his first six games, averaging 252, but in game seven of the eight-game round robin match play finals, Cutler hit his first road bump, falling to Brian Bledsoe of Albuquerque, N.M., 200-172. At the same time, Sledge was winning his fifth match in a row, 267-253, over Scotty Pope from Midland, Texas, to set up the pivotal position round match.

• Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz.; Barry Tate of Wenatchee, Wash., and Catherine Rawsthorne of Federal Way, Wash., were victorious in a PBA Northwest Region tripleheader at Paradise Lanes Sunday.

Blanchard posted a 10-2 match play record and a 20-game total of 4,959 pins, including match play bonus pins, to win the PBA Always Painting Northwest Open, a standard PBA Regional event. Blanchard held off red-hot Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., to win his 10th PBA regional title and the \$2,000 first prize.

Tate won the PBA50 Gary Mage Northwest Open portion of the tripleheader with an 8-2 match play record and an 18-game total of 4,061 pins to top Hugh Miller of Mercer Island, Wash., by 31 pins for his second PBA50 Regional title and a \$1,500 first prize.

Rawsthorne had a 5-3 match play record and knocked down 3,469 total pins for her 16 games to top fellow non-PBA member Courtney Couch of Puyallup, Wash., for the win in the Diamondback Delivery Service Jeanne Naccarato Women's Open to earn the \$1,000 prize
