WONDERS SWEEP LUMBERJACKS TO WIN 2023 PBA ELIAS CUP

The Portland Lumberjacks selected Kris Prather with the first pick of the 2019 PBA League draft. They had not lost since — until tonight.

The Snickers Waco Wonders, led by Ryan Ciminelli and Parker Bohn III, spoiled the Lumberjacks' bid for a fourth straight Elias Cup title, sweeping the hometown team to win the 2023 PBA League Elias Cup presented by Pabst Blue Ribbon.

Wonders The who include Ciminelli, Bohn, Jason Sterner, BJ Moore, Frank Snodgrass and manager Johnny Petraglia — traveled a long road to claim the franchise's first-ever Elias Cup.

Waco qualified in seventh during Saturday's seeding round, escaped the play-in stepladder

with wins over Milwaukee and Motown on Sunday, beat NYC in the quarterfinals on Monday, and out-struck Dallas in a three-round roll-off on Tuesday.

Tonight — with all four non-Bohn players rocking a vintage Parker Bohn mustache — Waco defeated Portland 247-204, 247-231 and 267of-five championship match.

Ryan Ciminelli was named the Mark Roth PBA League MVP by PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. Ciminelli struck on 70% of his shots (23/33) during the Wonders' nine televised games, which included multiple strikeor-go-home 10th frames.

"I might have the MVP trophy, but today that's

a team effort," Ciminelli said. "We had a strategy that worked almost flawlessly."

Ciminelli eliminated the team he played for in 2022, the Pabst Blue Ribbon Milwaukee Pounders, in the playin round, then took out another former team in Portland tonight.

"I had a chip on my shoulder, and honestly it just kept getting bigger," he added after tonight's victory. "I just wanted to keep proving myself — I don't feel like I should have to any more, before this week even, it gets frustrating — but I think I did it again.

"I'm an asset to any team," Ciminelli said on Sunday. "The fact that I keep getting dropped from teams and put back into that draft pool. It's continued on page 5

TOM DAUGHERTY WINS INAUGURAL PBA LBC NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS CLASH

Twelve finalists walked into the renowned Bayside Bowl hoping to leave with The Duke, the grand trophy commemorating the champion of the inaugural PBA LBC National Championships Clash.

On the very lanes where Norm Duke threw the final shot of his Hall of Fame career, Tom Daugherty raised The Duke as the event's first-ever champion.

Daugherty outlasted 11 competitors in the one-ball rolloff eliminator to earn the win and \$60,000. He struck on 10 of his 12 shots (83.3%), including a roll-off in the sixth round, and bested PWBA star Danielle McEwan in the final

The 48-year-old hoisted The Duke, but said the trophy won't be making the trip to Tampa with him.

"There's no way I can take this trophy home," Daugherty said. "This belongs at Bayside Bowl, so it's going to stay here for all the bowlers to look at."

Daugherty and McEwan were the last two players standing, but they were nearly the first two players eliminated. McEwan escaped the first round after two roll-offs against Carleton Chambers.

Daugherty knocked over just seven pins in the second round and thought he had no chance of reaching the third round. Trae Henrichsmeyer, the 17-year-old who won the Open Classic division, tallied a six-count at the end of the lineup, allowing Daugherty a second chance. After that round, Daugherty struck on nine of his 10 shots.

His only non-strike was a 7-pin in Round 6, which put him in a roll-off against McEwan and Liz Johnson. Daugherty missed left in that roll-off, but much to his surprise the ball held and struck.

"I missed in and I had zero expectations of hitting the pocket," Daugherty said. "But when it just laid there, it told me I could move over there and probably create even a little bit more area because it will hook from that spot.

From the leadoff position, Daugherty struck on his next five shots to win the event. He led off each round following Balinda Maple's elimination in Round 4.

"I wanted to go at the top (of the lineup) because I wanted to strike and get it over with," Daugherty said. "As everyone was striking or getting nine, it was just putting more and more pressure down at the bottom of the lineup.

"I made some blind moves because we had such long breaks and there were so many shots thrown between the first few rounds, but towards the end, like I said after that roll-off, I never had to move again."

The four-time PBA Tour champion earned \$60,000 for his efforts

Five "Wackos" From Waco Are Wonders At Elias Cup

It's fun to watch team bowling. There's an extra rush of adrenaline that's released into the body when all the members of a team are together and performing as one. That feeling of excitement was transferred into the crowd Wednesday night, to create what they like to refer to as the Bayside Bowl experience from Portland (in Maine, not Oregon).

The Waco Wonders — including Ryan Ciminelli, Parker Bohn III, Jason Sterner, BJ Moore, Frank Snodgrass and Hall of Fame manager Johnny Petraglia — went on to claim the franchise's first Elias Cup victory this week in the PBA League at Bayside Bowl. Another Hall of Fame member, sixty-years-young Parker Bohn III, was the sentimental favorite on the team from Waco, but it was Ryan Ciminelli that won the hearts of fans with strike after strike in crucial situations.

According to Nolan Hughes in an article that appeared at pba.com, Ciminelli struck on almost 70% of his shots (23 of 33), during the Waco Wonders nine televised games this week. That Included many "strike or go home" tenth frames, according to Hughes, which prompted Tom Clark, PBA Commissioner, to award Ciminelli with the PBA League MVP for 2023. "I might have the MVP trophy, but today that was a team effort," said Ryan in a moment of humility.

Ciminelli's comment reminds me of a humorous moment that I have shared over the years from the California State Bowling Association Tournament in 1977. I searched the internet trying to find my recollection of that event, but it must have been a dream I had about publishing the story, and not reality. In case anyone does find the story in print, my apologies just chalk it up to old age!

The 1977 USBC (then ABC) tournament was to be held at two locations relatively close to my home — Kings Bowl and Millbrae Bowl, both located along the El Camino Real in the San Francisco Peninsula town of Millbrae. Due to the fact that I had been traveling the PBA circuit the previous couple of years, I decided to try and field a team with my newfound friends.

Larry Laub (my chauffeur) and Ron Lisher (my roommate) were the first on my list, and they both said yes. Next up came Rich Carrubba from Hayward, and Tim Harahan from Marina Del Rey. Carrubba was an instant yes, but I had to coax Tim into joining by naming the team after his new bowling center, Hawthorne Bowl, located about 30 minutes south from his home on "The 405."

We were all set to bowl when Lisher received a call the night before from Larry Laub. He had dislocated his shoulder, which was not uncommon. He told Ron not to worry and that he found a replacement (another pro) that would be there the next day to compete in the team event. The following day we literally tore up the lanes, with the exception of our last minute backup. Lisher led the team with 720, and I was fortunate to follow his lead with 685. I don't remember the actual scores for Carrubba and Harahan, but they were both in the 640-650 range.

Our substitute, who shall remain nameless, was not on the same wave-link as the rest of the team and checked in with a 495 series. In the last frame, he was working on a strike in the ninth frame and left the 7-10 split. In utter frustration, he just threw the second shot away. "What are you doing," asked Harahan. "You just threw away 2 pins that we might need." In the end, Tim's comment was psychic, as we did indeed lose the scratch title by one pin.

The Brooklyn Connection

It's only fitting that the Waco Wonders team, formerly known as the Brooklyn Styles (until 2020), is managed by Petraglia, whose heavy Brooklyn accent once kept him from being a part of the AMF Staff of Champions. That worked out just fine, as Petraglia went on to sign with Brunswick and placed his autograph on all those Johnny Petraglia LT-48 bowling balls that provided him with a giant royalty check each year.

The PBA League has now been in existence for more than 10 years, although no competition was held in 2021, due to the COVID confusion. The league has been dominated by three of the franchises: hometown favorite Portland Lumberjacks (3 titles), Silver Lake Atom Splitters, also with 3 titles, and the Dallas Strikers with 2 titles. The only other winner was the New York City Kingpins in 2013. This year the winning team received \$100,000, or \$20,000 per bowler.

It's interesting that the PBA league is named after the founder of the PBA, Eddie Elias. His dream, to fashion the Pro Bowlers Tour after professional golf, led to lucrative television contracts, but also completely stifled competitive team bowling. It's ironic that during the team era of bowling, keglers were earning well in excess of other professional athletes, including the highest paid pro baseball players.

So, you could say that the founding of the PBA significantly improved the situation of both television audiences and those behind the scenes; but put a damper on the income of the professional bowlers that are still struggling monetarily to keep up with other professional sports. You have to ask yourself what might have been if the National Bowling League — the PBA's rival bowling concept in the 1950's and 60's, would have prevailed...

TARGET STORES CLOSING LOCATIONS — Target Stores will close their Portland locations (in Oregon, not Maine), effective October 21st, 2023. The company cited ongoing retail theft, from which there appears to be no remedy, according to local authorities. One of the locations is at 939 S.W. Morrison Street - the retrofitted AMF Pro 300 Lanes that we wrote about in August-September of 2021.

really starting to piss me off. I'm not old yet. I still got it in me. Anyone's a fool to get rid of me."

Beyond Ciminelli, the entirety of the Wonders embraced the role of the underdog. The team averaged a finish of 52nd on the 2023 points list and ranked last in the PBA's stat-based power rankings before the league.

Regardless of any outside noise, the Wonders built their team with intent and conviction.

"We picked this squad because everyone bowls with a chip on their shoulder," Moore said. "We wanted a dog in every fight. We didn't want someone that came out with some talent and threw a pretty ball. We wanted some dogs that were ready to get down in the dirt."

"We didn't have a star studded team, but we had heart and soul," Bohn said. "We had five guys with Johnny behind us that were digging in every shot."

Bohn, who made the semifinals of the USBC Masters earlier this year and turned 60 years old in July, has achieved almost every conceivable accolade in professional bowling. But he hadn't etched his name on the Elias Cup until tonight.

"I've been very fortunate in the bowling world," Bohn said. "But when you can go out and win an event like this and share it with five guys, I'll remember this literally for the rest of my life."

A husband. A legend. His experience, passion, investment, ingenuity, loyalty, anecdotes and wisdom won't be replaced. He was so strong, he'll live in the game, forever."

Chrisman founded High Score Products in 1985. The company sold one product: a revolutionary bowling ball cleaner for urethane equipment <u>Chrisman developed</u> called "U Clean / U Score Urethane Bowling Ball Cleaner™."

Six years later, Chrisman brought in Keith Orton to help start manufacturing bowling balls. In 1994, the company adopted the name Storm Products, Inc.

Storm's innovation under Chrisman — including the first dual-color <u>logo</u>, three-color high-performance bowling ball, to their scented bowling balls — changed the industry.

PBA players from all brands wrote tributes and shared their favorite stories about Chrisman on social media.

Stu Williams described Chrisman as "the most influential person in the sport for the last 20 years."

Jason Belmonte, who has won a PBA-record 15 major championships, has thrown Storm equipment his entire professional career.

"Bowling is what bowling is because of what Bill did for the game we love," Belmonte shared on Facebook.
